Various Outlooks On RV DX

A fact that all ATPA members, and other TV-DXers must face, is that our hobby sooner or later will come to an end. This in my opinion, won't be from a falling away due to lack of interest, but for several other reasons that are already on the scene, ob will without question develop as time goes on. The Following is a brief outline of these various factors from

my standpoint. Even several years ago be ore the medium of television got "on the road", there were those in the electronics field who visioned the concept of television receivers, as a flat screen mounted on the wall, with all video in color, plus automatic this, that, and the other thing. Now today we find many of these ideas have come to past, and the flat-screen receiver is only a short time away from one's living room well. Now, I certainly believe in new ideas, and theory, but strongly against putting worthless Junk on the consumer market, and calling it an advancement because it appears different than last years model. This is especially true in the

Automotive and appliance fields.
Color television, a new medium, that is being pre-maturely pushed, is as I feel a "Rocket to the Moon" that hasn't left the ground of. There's been extra heavy promotion of every sort, yet the darn thing just sits there. It will in time get moving, and whom combined with all the other modern "features of todays and tomorrows receivers, will spell the one certain doom of TV-DX.

Next comes the subject of "Pay Tv". Some say it's "against the public interest, "(Who really cares about the public interest?), and others say it it will "afford viewers a better choice of programs, ", but all in all I must say trivia would still prevail, only you would have to pay for it.
Now this "Fay Tv" concept is without question outrageous in every respect, but the very idea of using on the air broadcast frequencies tops them all. I would much rather see AT & T get in on another "grab" via the lease of their lines for this purpose, then for the motor boys of video fare to have their solfish wey. Some even propose to have commericals no less! I don't however believe the FCC or Congress will over allow the use of broadcast frequencies for "Pay Tv", but it will probably be a long drawn out affair before the issue is closed. How it will turn out via cable, however is quite a thought! The effect of this on TV-DX would be minor unless numerous stations were transmitting scrambled signals, which could not be logged.

The most serious threat against our hobby is the equipment problem as outlined before. A not much thought of, but in their running element , is the possibility the government may someday desire the use of all or part of our low band channels for defense or other purposes. There has been numerous mentions of this in broadcasting trade publications, and stations operating on these channels have a real worry on their hands. Studies will be made of the spectrum by various sources, users of VHF bands from police departments, to gas companies, will all have their say, but the only group that has a real chance of using these frequencies is the military.

With the ever increasing use of radio controlled wespons, this may become a necessity for national defense, I presume. With all or part of our "good channels" gone, TV DX would become a rather shabby affair, but we all realize the well being of the nation is of primary concern.

Ramblings From Cooper

By this time my fellow AIPA'ers have read and digested the context of the message in the November bulletin, and have decided that: (1) The character Cooper is trying to throw some un-needed weight around, or (2) maybe he has something in mind that will help straighten out the verie situation. (Please note how verie is spelled..)

Some of the more left wing members wrote me letters to express their opinions on the subject, telling me in no uncertain terms that they didn't like being told which veries count, and which are not legit. That fine. I respect the opinion of everyone, no mapper how wrong he may be. Perhaps if I was to go a little deeper into this problem, we can bring the whole problem to a head without spilling any unnecessary bhood. (Especially mine, I have so little left.)

I think that we will all agree that a letter stating that the station appreciates your report, and thanks you for it, does not really convey the idea that your report has been checked, and is correct. The chance that they did check it against the station log, and find it correct, still exists. But, by the same token, it is just as possible that they did not check the report.

Thus, supposing that some DXer with a very vivid imagination thinks he sees a channel seven station from clear across the country. He writes the station concerned, and may put into his letter anything from I want to report my reception of your station, at 8 PM PST, at which time you had a station break with an advertisement for Nestles, a Beacon service station on 9th avenue, etc.", to "I would like to report that I saw your television station on July 21, at 9PM". To either of these letters, most stations have a standing policy to send out a form letter, or to write one especially, stating that they appreciate your report, and interest. This, then, is public relations, and they do want your interest, continued, and otherwise. But, this return letter does not constitute a verie. it amounts to a thank you letter.

But, you say, this is the only type of letter most stations send out. To this I have only one answer. it is possible that this is so, but not probable. I believe that my form of verification and report writing fairly standard, and therefor, I think that my reports which come back with a verification letter stating that my report of such and such dath is correct (has been checked, etc.) are representative. If you have trouble getting such veries, one of two things is wrong: You are not using tact when writing for vertes, and you only serve to antagonize the station personel, or you do not include sufficent information in your report towarrant a positive verie. I have been told by stations, that if DXers will include sufficent information, they will send what constitutions a positive verie. If not, then they will normally send a thank you type letter.

One more slant to this verie business. If you have ever made a record logging, you will most likely want to keep your logging from being topped. But if we, as DXer, begin to accept these thank you letters as veries, than someone will come up with some record breaking loggings which they think are verified by thank you notes. If we accept such verification evidence, there may be a deluge of such crack pot record loggings. May, I say, because I already know of nearly three dozen such loggings which some "so called DXers" try to pass off as real DX, and they swear to having logged it. This type of DXer is usually a psuedo electronic engineer, and can give you any number of helpful(?) hints on making your DX set up hotter, or tell you how he has. (My only suggestion, be were of such fellows. I don't want them in the DXing hobby. and I am very sure that we can get along just fine without them.

So lets boil this verie business down to just a few simple statements. Suppose we accept these thank you letters as veries, only when it can be assumed that no one---repeat no one---has ever gotten any other type of verie (meaning positive verie) from the station involved. In the case of verie cards (QSL cards) which station send out, lets assume that if these cards have a space for filling in the time, date, etc of your reception, that the reports have been checked for correctness. If not, than the cards are just another thank you. This should take care of all of the questions. Yes, photos also count, and although it is possible to fake, and exchange photos, I will assume that no one is that dishonest. If they are, it will eventually show up. Besides, if it gets down to facts, stations keep records of the particular ids used at any given time, and it is possible to check with them to see if the photograph taken of a record logging actually checks with the recorded data. Tape recorded data is also passable, although, again, it may ofcourse be faked. And, it may be checked for correctness, by electronically, and through the station involved. visc best burriognon

After all fellows, I am merely trying to set up high standards for our hobby. If you want them so low that any character with a typewritter and a newspaper from Mabana (with the TV schedules) can get a verie, all right. It's your hobby, and it will only be what you make it. What will it be. . high or form latter, or to write one capcolally, stating that they approciate
