WHAT CONSTITUTES A VALID VERIFICATION ?

(Editor's note: I realize that this subject caused a great deal of controversy once in the past in the AIPA. Therefore, let me make it clear that I am giving my opinions with the full and complete knowledge, permission and approval of AIPA President, Art Collins, However, unless other wise, all opinions given are my own and not necessarily held by any one else in the AIPA, though I hope this won't be true.

The following rukes were decided upon to avoid possible trouble. All correspondence concerning the contents of this page is to be sent ONLY to John Owen Broomall. No men-

tion of this matter will be made of this matter in any other ATFA column.

Please send your comments and complaints to me. I will change my opinion upon the presentation of sufficient evidence and I will NOT get into a fued with anyone, so feel free to write. Selected "Pros and Cons" received will be printed next month here.)

What is your pet peeve in TV DXing? Is it poor conditions, low-band locals, or DX fadjust before the station identification? None of these have be avoid. Or does your peeve concern a situation which can be bemedied such as unidentifiable test patterns (this will be discussed in a future column) or the "Thank you veries" sent out by some station. The last one - "Thank you veries" is mine. They cause trouble for the station, the person who receives them - and the person does not. First let me state a few DX theories or principles which, I feel, you will agree with.

There are three reasons why I feel DKers try to verify their DX 1. Prove to non-DKers that distant TV stations can be logged and that they have done it. (This reason is getting rare since TV DKing is getting so much publicity (TV GUIDE, etc.) Most people will either believe in TV DK without seeing veries, or will not believe even when they

SEE à positive verie!

2. Collecting veries (as some people collect stamps, etc.) as "rewards" for logging the station. This is by far the most common rason Dartry to verify reception. Many of you propably consider it as a "side hobby" to Daing with 100% verification as the ultimate goal. Some Dars, I'm afraid, try too hard.

3.Determining whether or not a certain station was actually logged when the DXer is uncertain. I feal that this is the most important reason for veries so that I may know whether to add a station to my log. However, I do not know how many DXers send reports for this reason. Some DXers, I know, never send for veriesunless they are 100% certain of the logging. (What about you? Do you send reports for reason # 3 ?)

Anything which proves your logging of a station is a valid verification. By the same token, anything which does not prove your logging is not a valid verification. Cards, letters, photos, tape recordings, etc. are all acceptable. The favorite form of verification for most Diers (myself included) is, I believe, photographic verification.

Verifications are not absolutely essential to the hobby of TV DXing although they are very nice. On this page I am assuming that all AlPA members are honest concerning veries. Since a dishonest person could easily get false veries a number of ways, a DXer loggings should be believed whether or not his loggings are verified. I have logged stations which I could not possibly verify because the DX faded immediately after the station ID yet I was positive of the logging. Heart this happened to you also? A DXer word is to be taken even if he get a false verie. One of our member was 100% positive of a DX logging yet the station said the report was incorrect because of a mistake they made. In the case of a tentative logging the station's word would be final.

A Dier can collect and keep "Thank you" replies if he wishes. So far I do not believ that I have said anything that you could disagree with. The next may be controversial.

ANY FORM "VERIE", CARD OR LETTER, WHICH HAS ALSO BEEN SENT OUT FOR INCORRECT REPORTS IS NOT A TRUE VERIE EVEN IF YOU ARE POSITIVE OF THE LOGGING BYEN IF THE STATION IS A LOCAL! If I send a false report on purpose to a "Thank you" station and got a "verie" identical to yours would you still call your a "positive verie"?? If you collect verie for reason # 2 you should NOT include "Thank you's" in your verified totals unless the AIPA decides that all non-positive "Thank you veries" shall be called, "Class H veries (More next month on this problem with suggested solutions and "Pros& Con" reactions.

Special Notice to new AIPA members.....

Aug.6, 1959

If for the first time this month you are receiving the AIPA Bulletin, there may be certain aspects of our format which you fully don't understand as yet. Therefore, I hope the following will make certain points concerning the bulletin and the reporting of DX more

clear to you.

You will notice there are three basic columns in the bulletin for listing of DX logged (received) during the past month or period. The primary concern is to submit your report to the editor early enough for publication deadlines (usually the 25th each month) If your report is received too late by the editor it will be processed the following month. As to where to send your reports, depends upon where you live. Starting this month, we have begun a new "SOUTHERN DX " a column that is described in the Editorial. Listed there are the states for this new column. If you live est of the Mississippi and are not in the listed states, then send your reports to the Eastern DX Editor. If you are west of the Mississippi, then mail your reports to the Western DX Editor.

Up to now we have been referring to DX reports of the SKIP, SCATTER, (MS) and TROPS, nature. you will notice there are columns in the bulletin dealing with other aspects of TV-DX. After looking over these columns, you may feel you have data that some of these other editors can use. Of course your submission will be welcomed and your data will be used whenever practical. The AIPA runs monthly two additional columns which you won't find in this months issue. One is IDX column which deals with foreign DX logging=F2 reception and propagation predictions. Gordon Simkin the IDX Editor is currently in the process of moving, but will be back with his interesting column soon. The other column is the CCI Column. It deals with the identification of unknown DX, of program or test pattern nature. This format will be back soon also.

It should be known however that in order to be an AIPA member in good standing, monthly reports, or any at all are not required. However if you have something to pass onto us please feel free to do so. The

bulletin is only as good as everyone makes it.

Again on the subject of reporting DX.. we have available free of charge a report form or sheet which makes it easy to report your DX, saves you the bother of letters to the editor. It's very easy to fill out. (you don't have to fill it out entirely if desired). This form is mailed along with the monthly bulletin. If you want to be on the Report Form List just drop me a line, name & address.

We hope this above information has been helpful to you, and that

your AIPA membership increases your enjoyment of TV-DX
