The other bad news I have is that I sort of goofed in telling you when the Persieds meteor shower was suppose to peak. I said it was suppose to peak Aug. 12-11 14 but instead it peaked on the 11th at 2300. I found this out from the weather man on WTMJ-4 while I was watching the weather at 2210. I didn't stay up to watch for bursts when it was suppose to peak because I was tired and had to go to work the next morning. So if you didn't see much during the 12, 13 and 14 you can blame all on my cotton-pickin' mistake. Hil

Well, I haven't seen much Es or Ms but trops have been pretty good lately. I saw six new ones via trops since last month. They are KSD-5(440mi) on Aug.1; WLWT-5(405mi) on Aug.17; WNBF-12(600mi) on Aug.18; WCAU-10 which was in for only 5 minutes at 710mi on the 19th and WABC-7(750mi) and WKBW-7(450mi) on the 24th. If this is any indication of whats coming up this fall in the line of trops, I'll be lookingand waiting for those extra long catches. My log is now at 256.

An educational UHF experiment is suppose to take place in Montpelier, Indiana next Month(Sept.). Educational programs are suppose to be transmitted on chs.72, 75, 76, and 78 from an airplane flying over Montpelier Indiana at 23,000ft. The exact date is not known yet but if you want to find out pick up the September edition of "DXing Horizons" as they are suppose to be covering the event.

I also had a visit about a week ago with David Combs of Columbia, Mo. He's a short wave dx enthusiast but recently turned to TV dxing. He came up this way on vacation so he thought he would drop in on me. He told me of his crude method of turning his antenna to get the best signal from the station he's watching. His set is in the basement and his antenna is in the attic on a box. He has to run from the basement to the attic to turn his antenna by hand to the best position to get the best picture on his set. He said he's going to get an antenna and rotor and and mount it on the roof of his house because he said he's tired of running back & forth.

I guess that's it for this month then. Sure hope I get a little more Ms next month. 73's

Meteor Scatter Propagation

One of the most fascinating end rewarding modes of propagation known to the DX'ers is meteor scatter (MS), also often called meteor burst reception. This type of propagation is much harder to receive than any other common propagation-type because of its weak, sporadic nature and extremely short duration. MS is the true DX'ers favorite made because along with a good receiving system, all the skill you have must be used.

It is estimated that 10 billion meteorited each day enter the ionosphere each day with enough force to reflect VHF waves. These meteorers themselves do not reflect the wave, but the ionized trail course the reflection. They are divided into two types, over-driven and under-dense meteors are extremely rare and cause enough ionization to bring in bursts of several minutes or more. I personally had a ten minute overdense burst two years which is the longest I have heard of. Underdense meteors are not large enough to cause complete feflection so the burst strength and intensity lower than the overdense type. These underdense meteors, which ionize only a small area around them, are the type usually seen. As frequency goes up signal strength goes down to the third power and duration decreases to the second power. Thus, high band bursts will be considerably shorter and weaker than low band bursts. Before looking for high band bursts, see if a good number of high intensity, long duration bursts are coming in on the low band; if they are, you should see some high-band DX.

It is interesting to note that the receiving antenna should not be pointed directly at the transmitting station, but seven degrees to either side of the direct path. This is caused by the meteors coming into the E layer (100km) at an angle. The ionization takes place in the E layer. One of the characteristics of Ms is the whistling which usually accompanies it. This whistling is a doppler shift in frequency. The shift will be large when the meteor is moving directly towards or a away from the transmitter or receiver and decreases as the meteor moves more perpendicular to the earth.

Since ionization takes place in the E layer, it is common sense that any rise in ionization in the layer will make MS ionization even stronger. Therefore during a sporadic-E or auroral opening, any further increase in ionization will at times cause the maximum usuable frequency, duration, and intensity to go up by an estounding degree. One evening last summer shortly after the peak of the Perseids shower (Aug 10-14) a sporadic-E opening occurred bringing fair reception up to channel 6. Turning to channel seven I was amazed to see well over ten bursts per minute coming in over the local ninety miles. After about twenty minutes the condition passed, but two high band stations were logged in the meantime. Thus, be on your guard during E openings (or aurors), for the results may amaze you.

Perhaps you have heard of ionospheric scatter which is actually the ionospheres ability to refract weak but even present signals. It is being thought more and more that underdense meteors by the billions are the cause for thes.

During non-shower periods the best time to try for ID's is just before sign-on, around 0600-0800. Many easily identified test pattersn are on them. When those bursts start coming in on top of one another, flip that switch to the highest vacant channel you have. Taking photos of MS is quite an art as Ron Boyd, who is pretty fast on the shutter can tell you. Bent expect to just flip to channel thirteen and log a couple. It doesn't work that way. Set up a schedule to watch during the early morning if you can end follow that schedule each morning, all year long if you can. You need plenty of patience however. During the geacobinids shower I had to wait approximately twelve hours before I got a clean high band burst. There is a small clan of true dx men who are willing to go after this way of boosting their logs, but if you read Billy Brabes column you will see that there aren't many. It is possible to log ten or more stations per day on the average day with hard work and a couple clear low band channels around you.

Have you heard of DX'ers getting stations 2000 miles away and laughed them off as tall stories? There is an explanation for this. The fartherest reception depends on the meteor ionization height and the wave angle. Once in a while a meteor
