

FM MULTIPLEXING

As you all probably know by now, the FCC has finally approved a system for FM multiplexing. Just what will this mean to the FM owners and the FM listener ? Before we venture out to answer that question lets look at some pertinent facts about the multiplexing game.

Multiplexing will allow the FM owner to receive stereo programs without having to tune on two radio stations. Under the new system, a single transmitter will send out two seperate signals simultaneously. With proper receiving equipment, the signals will be employed as in present hi fi reproduction.

A quick check of FM station owners reveals that about half of them are interested in stereo multiplexing. Long range outlooks seem to indicate that some stations will be employing the new system by late summer.

Manufactorers of hi fi equipment are busy with curcuits capable of receiving the soon to be famous signals. Some maufactorers have been working on the parts for some time as they forsaw the FCC approval of the Zenith and General Electric multiplexing system for quite some time. However, the first real market for a complete multiplexing system will not be seen for about two months. By fall, the warehouses should be flooded with multiplexing adapters and well as complete systems. The average FM enthusiast will be able to purchase an adapter for a price between 25 and IOO dollars. H.H.Scott has a 50 dollar one now for its FM timer, while Fischer has announced a QQ dollar adapter soon to be on the market.

The new signals will be compatable! If a tuner is tuned to a stereo station, it will receive combined stereo and monophonic signal. If the proper multiplexing equipment is used, stereo tape enthusiasts will go wild taping their favorite music. A 19 kc carrier will be transmitted, while a 38kc subcarrier will be transmitted and fed to the demodulator. The 38kc signal will be amptituted modulated, but the entire composite signal is Frequency modulated.

All right, the FM owner may say, but what about the difficulties connected with the new system? The new system may be likened to reception of a UHF signal. Proper anterna will be of utmost importance with the new stereo det-up. Also, ignition trouble will be more severe. The adapters made by the various manufactorers may not be properly designed for true stereo performance. Many manu. may rushout a few adapters just to keep up with the market. Unforseen interference probably will dampen the ego of some homeowners.

Taking everything into consideration, I beleive that the new system will add to the rush of those who want to get in on good music. FM receivers will sell at even a more rapid page that they have been, and the once dead FM bamd will be more popular than everl

I have 4 orders for TV factboobs, including my own. Come on, lets have one more order, what do you say? Maybe 2 or 3 of you would care to go together on one. Ch.7 has an ERP of 865 w CJCH-5 has a QTH of 743-5 Robie St. in Halifax. I've seen this one two times this summer already.

To correct a typographical error last month, CBAFT-11 is in Moncton and the new ch. 13 will be in Edmunston, N.B. I also incorrectly listed

CFCN-4 as transmitting on ch.5.
Does anyone know if CBXT-5 is on the air ? Billy Draeb and I saw it on May 28, we think. Possibly they were transmitting tests as they are not due on the air until Sept. 1. I had my doubts that CFCN-4 was on the air but Billy definitely saw it on June 19. I've seen CHCT-2 seve eral times but never anything that looked like CFCN-4.

The most outstanding DX here the past month was 45minutes of the TP for CMAB-2, which Arnaldo Coro recently statedin "TV Horizons" is no longer on the air. My logging wason June 9th from 1608 to 1655; 5 days later I had 2 hours of DX which sounded like Cuba again, although I can't be positive. It was very odd reception, coming from the SE at first with "Bat Masterson" at 1836-1855, and then the direction shifte to WSW for the next 12 hors. Castro was speaking at fadeout time, 2020, still from the WSW. WBBM-2 was unusually strong that eveving so theDN probably would have been much stronger from the SE if WBBm hadn't been in the way. This happens with WMT-2, and any DX on ch.4 and 6 which must override my locals, WTMJ and WITI. I didn't have a ch.6 for a few weeks but i have a new strip now and I'm ready for ch.6 DX again.

Skip has been pretty amazing this year with so many new stations and no time for FM skip DXing although I know it was there on several days. One-third of all my new stations this year have been on ch.5, my biggest year for that channel since 1956. Ch.4 also has been unusually good, despite the fact that WTMJ-4 is only 27 miles away. I have photos of WTVY and WJXT to pve it, and was just alittle too slow on the trigger to catch WTVJ. WHen WWL and KROD came in I wasn't ready for them.

About that second Cuban reception again, Arnaldo Coro says Ciego de Avilla is the only ch.2 in Cuba now, so "Bat Masterson" may have come from there. Maybe CMAB is just experimenting on ch.2. No communist country I ve heard of had 3 TV networks. The second network is under construction in many of them now, but not a 3rd new.

Besides CBXT-5 and CMAB-2, my other IDX includes such new stations as CJCH-5 and XEJ-5 on May 23; CKX-5 on May 25; CHSA-2 on May 28 and 10 June; also on June loth were CFCM-4 and CKMI-5, and on June 19th CBMT6. Many other Canadians were seen but these are only the new ones.

Billy Draeb's new foreign stations in June so far areCBFT-2, CBMT6, and CFCN-4. He also saw CHSA-2 and CHXT-5 in late May the same nights I did. He watched an hor of Spanish skip on ch.3 June 14th but it turned out to be WEDU-3. I had it rough too, Billy. I had 2 Spanish stations on ch.2 but one turned out to be WMT-2. They were interviewing some Latin American in the studio.

I've been so busy with DXing that my notes and information are all messed up so I'll quit for this month. I've received aTV station list from Europe and may start listing them next month. 73s and best of EX.

Hi! The sporadic-E skip which we have been waiting for, for such a long time, has finally hit--and since May 20 has been coming in loud and strong all over. Its strength is evident, because in many cases the Es signal has overridden local stations. Both the veteran and beginning TV-DXer have added many new stations to their logs.
