

No, we have not changed addresses. The graphic to your left was lifted out of an early 1970s VUD cover. It should bring tears to the eyes of many of you old timers.

WHERE'S MY STATION GUIDE? The answer is...it should be in the mail by the time you read this. You might even have it already. The books were at the printer as of the middle of March (the inclusion of some updated material held it up for a few days), after which the books were to be mailed to MN for distribution. As I type this we have had almost 100 orders for over 100 books. So there's a lot of folks out there waiting for 'em, including me. John Ebeling just can't wait to start mailing them out to all of you. And as soon as he gets them...out they go. From Rvan Grabow(NY): "I have enjoyed my membership to the WTFDA and hope that I can contribute more to the club in my second year...Due to surgery I will have to spend most of the next several weeks in front of my TV." Later on Ryan wrote that he went into the hospital for surgery, and was laying in the operating room when the surgeon noticed a problem with his toe and called the whole thing off and sent him home! I've heard that gain on the Crossfires on high VHF isn't as good as some of the Winegard Prostar or Chromstar antennas." Well, all I could think of at the time was to tell Bob to check out the websites for the various companies. I imagine the addresses are all there. I'm not too sure about antenna specs, though. The place I go to for specs is the Stark Electronics website at www.starkelectronic.com. It's an interesting place to wander around in. Other ideas??

<Mike-CT> Great story.

And folks this is just a taste of some of the interesting, funny, bizarre, amazing thing that get talked about on IRC chat! Plus we have a kid there(we think he's a kid ) who hates WABC and has a friend who is not only a kung-fu expert but also an ex LA Ram cheerleader. The folks on IRC would kill for a photo of her.

AND NOW A FEW WORDS FROM Sheldon Remington, our man in Hawaii. Here are a few excerpts from two of his emails concerning his tropo DX to Mexico: "After all that exposure, I received helpful input from WTFDA'ers which allowed identification of the previous mystery opening (several days in duration!) as also being from the Mexican mainland. What was not sufficiently emphasized in these published reports was that Mexico -- Baja, that is-- is extremely common out here on FM, but that no Hawaiian DXer had ever spanned the Gulf of California via tropo on any frequency, thereby reaching the mainland of Mexico. That was what made these observations very special, and record-shattering, distance-wise. Just to DX Mexico from here on VHF-UHF is nothing unusual, contrary to the front cover blurb on that VUD." And "The puzzle to me is why the southern Californian FM/TV DXers seem to have no interest in the Hawaii duct. With hundreds of hours of high-efficiency ducting on this path each year, it should not be difficult from there to log numerous HI stations. If I can hear QRP FM translators from California, as has happened 3 or 4 times, the big class-C transmitters on the Hawaiian mountaintops should be easy pickings anywhere south of S.F. when the duct exists." And more "at this point I still want to spot openings independently from any source of DX tips which would otherwise bias my long-term statistical study of the duct. I even avoid tips from the 2m group for that reason. A substantial portion of my observed openings occurs when the 2m guys are unaware of any ducting, and that independence is valuable scientifically. There are many events which occur late at night when the hams on the west coast are asleep, or on weekdays when they can't monitor as closely as on weekends. This of course is a huge advantage scientifically for broadcast DXing as opposed to hamming (though I am a lifelong ham and cherish it for communications in real-time about ionospheric propagation events). I have the tropo distance record now on at least 93 FM channels, and every VHF-TV channel".

LAST, BUT...WHATEVER...Well, New York's WNEW-102.7 is at it again. Joe Fela (NJ) reports: "Just in time for the e-skip season, WNEW-102.7 N.Y.C. is testing inband digital audio again, full strength! The modulation seems to be decreased a bit as compared to two months ago, but the carrier is there and the signal is extremely wide. The digital audio seems to be broadcast on 102.6 and 102.8." Joe and Bob Smolarek(NJ) both report that WPST-97.5 Trenton is also broadcasting the "Bees". Joe says it's hard to hear WRFY-102.5 with all the



buzzing going on with WNEW.. Jim Thomas (CO)cracks a joke: "By the way guys, computers and television have really made the crossover. Have you heard of the new 'PBS computer virus"?? Every fifteen minutes it stops your program and asks for money." I think he stole that one from Henny Youngman. Well, folks, I think I've packed this Mailbox with about as much junk as I could. Remember, start checking for Es in April. You might catch an opening. And if you really want an "edge", then subscribe to the WTFDA list and you'll know about that opening when it happens! # More Happenings in the world of 30-50mhz MORE F2 REPORTS!

The following reports all appeared live on the WTFDA list/reflector at Topica.com

Feb 12 29.66, it's a amateur repeater in Dallas, and it is real strong! You can hear the skip that it is picking up, which can be pretty cool, in theory 3000+ miles from us if the F2 goes that far in the opposite direction. It also ID's every once in a while with "From The Republic of Texas, this is W5DFW, Dallas / Fort Worth"... 30.45, Fort Hood, TX is always there lately. They call themselves "Range Control" and handle war games, and tons of radio tests with at least 20 or more local bases BN-CT

March 8 42mhz F2 is in at 5:50pm EST...42.880, 42.120, 42.420, 42.920, 42.400...55 freeway at the 17th St offramp (Orange County, CA) /Also F2 reported in Finland down to Bahrain today. -MB-CT

March 8 I'm hearing mentions of Caltrans on 39.26. Un-IDable action on 40.31 Wallace Dixon -MA

March 8 F2 skip still strong here to CA with CHIPs noted on 42.5 42.54 42.56 & 39.6 at 1849 EST. FN-NY

March 8 This was one decent opening! For me it peaked around 6-6:20 with very strong signals, 3-4 on some frequencies. This is the best I've heard since Thanksgiving. Some logs:

5:14pm 42.920 Golden Gate/ 42.440 Redding/42.120 Sacramento/42.120 Bishop/42.400 Orange County/ 42.440 Indio

6:00 42.120 Orange County/ 42.080 Golden Gate/ 42.420 Los Angeles/42.440 Los Angeles

6:12 42.440 Redding/ 42.880 Golden Gate

6:25 42.120 Golden Gate

6:34 42.540 Monterrey

42.120 Bishop had a dispatcher mentioning that a local freeway would be closed for a while for avalanche control! F2 was out of 42mhz at 7pm. If the more intense openings hang around after local sunset, this must have been a good one. Equip: Bearcat BC-860xlt and a Scantenna on the roof. -MB-CT

March 8 I've been totally swamped, but if I'd had more time, I'd have reported the F2 yesterday. I was on day shift, so couldn't follow it up, but the F2 was in on 42.06 before 8 AM MST. Sounded like a southern state; one address given for a car registration was for Alabama, but of course, that doesn't mean it \*was\* Alabama. This is the very earliest I've heard 42 mHz F2, and I wished I could stick around for more. Sure hope it hangs in for the weekend. In the spring, I've seen the F2 33mHz signals begin coming in a couple hours before sunhset and get real intense; that was when things peaked at 33. I'm looking forward to some real fun action in the next few months! RL-Phoenix AZ

March 9 Home on a lunch break at 12:15pm... The west coast 42mhz highway patrol freqs are back in... 35mhz is pretty active. I have Spanish on 33mhz... Looks like another good day for F2 skip. Well, at 4:55 the cops from CA are still there on 42mhz. F2 skip appears to be in since noon EST. -MB-CT

March 10 I should come home for lunch more often:) Very strong 42mhz F2 at 1:00pm with the Calif H.P. all over the place. This is the 3rd day in a row! Also Spanish on 42.02 -MB-CT

March 11 It's back in again on 42mhz. Anybody know of any good F2 freqs to check on 46mhz (or higher than 42)? 3:05pm, -MB-CT

March 11 42 mhz is open in Oregon to the east: 42.62...US70, Hillsboro County, 42.92..."..out of St. Augustine..." 42.38...Charlotte PD(?) and a bunch of others without Ids. RM-OR

March 12 Once again F2 is here on 42mhz with the highway patrol. Some Spanish mixed showing up on 42.820 and 880. First noted at 11am local time. Still going great at 2:30pm -MB-CT

March 12 For the first time this cycle, I've heard some VHF F2. Noted spots of Ecuadorian stations on the 50MHz ham band, and upon turning on my rig, heard HC5K in Cuenca on 50.105MHz. Didn't try to work himbetween having only 10 watts of power, and using a HF trap-vertical antenna ground mounted, figured there was no chance <g>. -D.Smith-TN

# Forum & Other Stuff

Thanks to Will Hepburn, Fernando Garcia, John Ebeling, and Jeff Kitsko for material appearing elsewhere in this column. Jeff reports information from the Global webpage about major network affiliation changes in western Canada. The CHAN [8] change would also include that station's massive network of relays throughout British Columbia. Some of these relays are of high power and operate on low-band VHF, so you might expect to see these changes on Es. Just assume any station in B.C. currently carrying CTV will switch to Global, and you'll be pretty close to right. Again, remember that this doesn't take effect until next year. Jeff reported that the CHAN change also includes CHEK [6] Victoria, though I'm not certain of that.

Be careful about taking technical details in this month's column too seriously. The FCC has switched to a new relational database system, and there seem to be serious inconsistencies in it. (Mostly, multiple records for the same station without adequate information as to which parameters are actually authorized. Actually, we're lucky - my understanding is that the AM radio database is even worse...)

Bob Stephens writes that KBEJ [2] Fredericksburg, Texas is to be on the air by the time you read this. He hasn't been able to obtain programming information but suspects it'll be UPN. (Just what we need only two UPN affiliates on low-band VHF, and they're both on channel 2 serving adjacent markets!) It's pretty common for station owners to be tight-lipped about programming plans for new stations, and this is no exception.

John Ebeling sent an item about DTV from the Minneapolis Star-Tribune. As of November 8, there were two DTV stations operating in the Twin Cities. (KTCA [10] and KSTP [50]. KTCI [16] has since come on.) A buyer for electronics store Best Buy told the paper that as of that date, "more than 50" DTV receivers had been sold in the Minneapolis area. The DTV tuners are selling for as little as \$650, with a 32" 4x3 aspect ratio display screen selling for \$1,700. If you're really a videophile, you can get a 65" 16x9 aspect ratio display for \$6,000. (Personally, I didn't spend that much for my last car!)

- LPFM update: The NAB has officially filed to block LPFM in federal court, specifically, a "Petition for Review" in D.C. Circuit Court of Appeals. In addition, bills are gaining sponsors in the House (Mike Oxley's HR3439) and Senate (Judd Gregg's S.2068) to block the proposal from ever being implemented.
- KPRR in El Paso, Texas (102.1 "Power 102") got in trouble with the FCC for a humourous parody of the popular TV show Who Wants To Be A Millionaire. The trick was the "Who Wants to Win 10,000" payout was actually in Italian lira, worth about \$53. The winner was not happy about this, and filed a complaint with the FCC. I came across the material featured here about 25 years ago. The credits go to a Canadian publication "Engineering Journal" and while most of the content is unchanged, I did take a few liberties by modifying the setting and updating the time frame. What with all the confusion swirling about these days in the forms of DAB, IBOC, DTV, LPFM and maybe even EIEIO; it just seemed appropriate to select "metric time" as our April Fool's topic.

# METRIC TIME


Insofar as the United States is sadly lagging behind in the international effort to establish the metric system of measurements as the universal standard, it is proposed that beginning April 1, 2000, the nation adopt "Metric Time". Rather than the confusing 'base 60' system, there will be 10 seconds to the minute, 10 minutes to the hour, 10 hours to the day, and so on; delineated in the following table:

Old Time New Time 1 second 1 milliday 1 minute 1 centiday 1 deciday (or millimonth) 1 hour 1 day 1 day 1 week 1 decaday 1 hectoday 1 month 1 kiloday 1 vear

# **IMPLEMENTATION:**

From an employment perspective, due to the fact that one hour (deciday) represents 5/12th of an old one, staff might be expected to work longer hours, i.e.: 3½ decidays or millimonths per day. However,

(A "METRIC Clock" is illustrated below)



as this is inconvenient for administration and payroll purposes, it is intended that the luncheon break will be shortened by 1/2 of a new hour, thus making a total daily working time of 4 new hours.

It is not expected at this time that compensatory uplift will be made to salaries, except in the case of leap kilodays, where an adjustment will be made at the end of the hectoday every 1.46 decamonths. Overtime and meal vouchers will be issued to non-management hectodaily payroll employees for the time worked in excess of 5/6 of a deciday, provided approval from the management has been obtained beforehand. The Pension Plan will not be affected, but a superkilodayuation will be adjusted accordingly.

A further bulletin will be issued closer to Deciday; but, if these arrangements present difficulties or if you have any queries, please do not hesitate to contact your immediate supervisor.

# LEAVE:

Leave will be affected only so far as the change to metric time is concerned and no one shall be worse off than previously. Thus, if an employee was entitled to 22 days (old time) he/she will now be entitled to 22 decidays or one hectoday plus 20 decidays for every hectoday over and above 20 kilodays service since the 10th deciday of the third hectoday over and above 20 kilodays service since the 10th deciday of the 3rd hectoday of 1976.

# **HOLIDAYS:**

July 4 will be reduced to 5 decadays, but 10 demidecidays will be added where relevant to the Christmas break which will be moved, after 27 hectodays, to Labor Day (to be eliminated) to take advantage of the longer shopping decidays.

# MISCELLANEOUS:

The term "a month of Sundays" is not to be used on official documents. The correct term will be "a hectoday of Decidays.

Your immediate supervisor has been allotted 3 centidays per capita to clarify any points which may arise prior to Deciday.

# The *LPFM* Debate

Dxing as we know it will soon be a thing of the past...or will it? Here is what some WTFDA members think. Tell us what YOU think!

For a while now, your fellow WTFDA members have been debating the impact of LPFM on their hobby and on the radio industry in general. Here are some selected posts from the WTFDA list at Topica.com.

Mike said:

<<p><<The guys who started in the hobby recently don't know what they missed. >> Right, and when these LPFM's start coming on it will make today seem like the good old days. -Bob S.

Do you never give up? -Luke S.

I'm not giving up, I don't want to see our hobby die, but thanks to Kennard and the FCC it looks like the hobby is dead once these LPFM's come on. Plus I'm sick and tired of the big companies getting bashed. When you think of great radio stations of the past, like WABC, KHJ, WLS, WOR-FM, WNEW-AM, KFRC. All were owned by big companies like ABC, RKO General, Metromedia. Not all big companies are good, I have problems with Disney and Time Warner. But these are exceptions. -Bob

Look, call me a heretic. but I'd give up a bit of DX to hear some good local radio. Sometimes when I DX, it's just hearing that radio sounds pretty much the same in Toledo as it does in Tulsa. I still like the hobby though, and I don't think that SO MANY LPFMs are going to come on the air (or survive very long, frankly) that the DX hobby will "die"??? That sounds a bit extreme. Oh, and name me one truly UNIQUE trendsetter TODAY owned by a large company. WOXY? No..KPIG? No..WRNR..No..Hmm. Well, I'll think and get back to you. - Luke

The corporate world of broadcasting is now a lot different than it was when Rick Sklar programmed WABC, John Rook programmed WLS, and Bill Drake programmed KHJ and the RKO stations; and I don't have any respect for modern broadcast conglomerates. Nevertheless, I agree with Bob that LPFM will bring more CCI to the FM band, while bringing to the airwaves very little in the way of alternative or interesting programming. -Dan O.

I agree whole heartedly with Bob and I don't work for any broadcast group. -Joe F.

Ok, fine. Let me ask you...do the airwaves belong to the PUBLIC or to the companies? Are they for OUR benefit, or theirs? Does each American have the right to a FAIR chance at being on the air, or does that right only belong to the wealthy and powerful? -Luke

I think you're pointing fingers at (at least some of) the wrong bad guys. Jacor, et al wouldn't be running wild if it weren't for our esteemed elected officials in Washington. For many years Congress respected the role of the FCC as regulator and overseer of communications in the country, and more or less left it alone to keep the industry out of the ditches. Big was not necessarily bad...in a lot of instances it was very good. Now, thanks to many years of lobbying, schmoozing, and probably out and out bribery, the politicos have seemingly reached their goal of neutering the FCC. With most regulations now out of the way, the empire builders of broadcasting are legally able to steamroll (read that \*BUY OUT\*) darned near anything in their way. The real culprits for most of the ills of the industry are not the broadcasters themselves...they are the lawmakers who caved in to the pressures exerted over a long period; and bought into the premise that a broadcasting infrastructure more representative of free enterprise and the diversity of the populace would evolve. Admittedly a lot of broadcasters were behind this push...but had the legislators held their turf (in behalf of the FCC AND the American people), little if any of the mess we're experiencing could have happened. The bottom line is that now, it's all about money...NOT about either politics or broadcasting. Don't expect that to change anytime soon. The toothpaste is out of the tube, so to speak, and I doubt that there'll be much of an effort to get it back in. BTW...Two years ago I retired from a 42 year stint in commercial broadcasting. I am no fan of the huge conglomerates. I despise how radio is being molded into tasteless muck that's all the same flavor and texture. -Tom B.

Agreed, Tom. I think you raise some VERY true points. And, to be fair, I remember the days when a few companies were innovating in some degree. Before they felt they had to buy out their competition and pay HUGE prices, they actually payed some attention to the sound and programming of their stations being individual. -Luke

Agreed..in those days, there was competition..WLS vs Super CFL, WABC vs. WINS, etc..now, they own the competition! Aren't WINS and WCBS both owned by the same company now? Anyway, how do you KNOW it will bring "very little" diversity?? We've not even HEARD these stations yet. Give them a chance to at least start programming! -Luke

You have hit the nail squarely on the head. Deregulation turned broadcast companies into monsters. And the feds told taxpayers the usual lie: The public (citizens, consumers) would reap many benefits as a result of dergulation. Stockholders are generally the only ones who benefit in such situations. As for LPFMs being a solution, think again. Most licenses in this part of the courty will likely be gobbled up by small TBN-imitating religious groups, which will spend much time begging for money and little time on doctrine. However, LPFM won't mean the end of FM DXing. LPFM will just make DXing more difficult (and in some cases, a lot more difficult). Diehard DXers will continue to DX. -Dan

Who owns the airwaves? The people/companies who have purchased the stations, that's who! And these stations deserve signal protection! A company that pays millions for a station should not have to put up with some screwball interfering with their station! This current FCC is worthless, they don't police the airwaves and shut down pirates, they levy obscene charges on your telephone bill every month, and they tell the NAB that we don't care about your stations and we're gonna put stations on so your station is only listenable about 20 miles from the transmitter. The FCC is out of control. -Bob

No, exactly the opposite: the FCC is UNDER the control of the politicos and Big Business because that's where the Money comes from. It's no longer an agency that looks out for the airwaves in the interest of the people of the United States. Hasn't been for years. The hams have known that for several decades although few of us anticipated the situation becoming as bad as it is now. What's been done, is done; and I rather doubt that even if you were a Big Politico yourself, that you could change it. All that DXers can do is what the weak-signal V/UHF hams have to do: wait and see how things shake out. -Steve H.

I'm going to side with Bob on this one....Look the FCC has no b\*lls....they don't police the airwaves in the manner in which they should....they will go ahead and fine some people for obscenity and not others (I'm not trying to reopen the Stern thing here just making a point about the FCC)...they can't shut down the pirates who kill an open frequency and send splatter on adjacent frequencies.....and while the companies who broadcast on the spectrum don't own it---they do deserve the protection of that spectrum (and the frequencies they broadcast on) by the FCC.....I

have a feeling that most LPFMs will end up doing just what the pirates do and that is interfering with adjacent channels, etc.....what they should do is expand the spectrum down to 80 mhz or so just like they did with MW....while I realize that there are potential problems with this it seems like one solution that could be looked at. -Keith M.

Keith, The reason the FCC doesn't police the airwaves is because they are not funded to do this. Fifteen years ago the Boston office had two engineers and no clerk/typists, and those two were responsible for all of New England. All they could do is handle the most urgent situations which at that time were false maydays on the marine bands (which resulted in fatalities). Now we don't even have a Boston office. The problem is with Congress for not appropriating money for personnel, offices and equipment. -Allan D.

There was some apparent Es noted on Feb 13 in Santa Barbara from before 1600 to after 2000 PST. MUF to at least ch 5. Seemed quite a long opening for a winter occurrence and quite steadily in, but a constant jumble with no one clear signal on any channel on my indoor equipment and no IDs. This may have been a particularly large Es patch/patches to last that long at this time of the year, perhaps while drifting eastward. Then, I heard on the news that after midnight EST on Feb. 14, if I got the date right, particularly severe tornadoes hit Georgia. Since the 1950s, there has felt to be more than coincidence with timing of Es occurrence and severe tornado-type weather. Since I have not kept up with this over the years. I don't know if those who study these things have found what the connection is.

If there is a downside to modern Mexico IDs, it is that some of them are not as large and easy to read as those big call letters that were once the norm. For example, the ones on XHCH-2 Chihuahua and some other TV Azteca stations contain full ID information, but they are tiny. The XEPM-2 ID was larger than the Azteca station IDs.

\*\*1 Farthest station north, 48.5 degrees.

\*\*2 While hurricane in central Florida, Georgia coming in, then as it became a tropical storm in Georgia, stations inland from Virginia and Tennessee coming in. Hurricanes are unpredictable, some times one will get DX, other times zilch, only other tropo station (ever) from TN was WKPT-19 Kingsport, and that was picked up only twice, both times hurricane related DX. (I'll never forget when I lived in Kingsport and first read of that logging of yours... I was amazed, and still am! -mcs)

\*\*3 Sometimes it happens here on Cape Cod. After the front (moving east) washed away the inland DX it reaches the east coast of North Carolina. At that point only thing jutting out is Cape Cod and South Florida. This is the extra bonus I sometimes receive. In this case there (was) a high over New Brunswick and over Georgia and local temperature 50 degrees. This is the minimum temperature I find for normal tropo DX. I love that water path! (I calculate the distance from Teaticket to WBZL-39 as 1210 miles... WOW!! -mcs)

\*\*4 "CJCB" in frame bar. After the Florida DX I was setting up VCRs for MS and lo and behold local 4 Boston off the air, what luck!

\*\*5 Twice picked up TVA test card. There are 3 TVA stations north of my local on channel 4 (CFCM, CIMT1 Edmundston, NB, and CHAU7 Riviere au Renard, PQ -mcs). (I) have never picked up a TVA station on channel 4 so will for now pick the highest powered station CFCM. I have my fingers crossed that Canada goes HDTV sometime (a long time) after the USA becomes digital-I will have a blast with trops and MS and for that matter with E-skip as well.

\*\*6 This was a very active 24 hours of DX, with trops, MS and E-skip. What more could one ask for? Who said December was a non-DX month!

No DX in November. New antenna set up. Will give more info. Next time. Roy.
