A quick note from **John Ridge** of Brooklyn: "I work three blocks from the World Trade Center. I happened to be out on the street when the second jet hit. I will never forget it! Two neighbors were lost and I seem to know a lot of people who were related or with friends or others."

HDTV PRICES UNDER \$2000

DTV Wow! or DTV Yikes! This post off the WTFDA list explores the pros and cons of HDTV. This from **Tim Cronin**:

"Actually, for what you get, \$2,000 isn't a bad price at all for an HD-ready set. However, there are caveats.

First, in virtually all cases (and I've prowled many an aisle of many an electronics store), it's a projection set, but the picture is better than NTSC projection sets at similar prices (Panasonic makes a sensational 47-inch 16:9 projection set that can be had for \$1,899 at our local Circuit City). If you prefer CRT-based displays, you're essentially out of luck. (And the plasma and LCD "Hang on the Wall" models are off the charts for all but millionaires, up in the "DOUBLE YIKES" neighborhood.)

Second, the HD tuner generally isn't included. As with component stereo or today's Dolby Surround and the like, that's a separate purchase. An RCA model with DirecTV tuner included goes for about \$550, probably less. So now we're up to \$2,500+.

Third, there's the paucity of HD material on the air. Of the major commercial networks, CBS is the leader, ABC a distant second, NBC well back in third, and Fox isn't even playing the game. (We're hoping Fox's experiments with HD slow-motion means the network will televise the Super Bowl in HD this year, as ABC and CBS did the last two years, but at this date, it's only a hope. Fox's only HD show so far was the movie "Independence Day" in May of 1999.)

Fourth, many people still don't know HDTV is out there. The networks mention a program's in HDTV, but if you're watching on a regular set and don't know what HD is, the uninformed might think they're already seeing it. (Remember how many people can't even program a VCR.) NBC's peacock told people watching in black-and-white they were missing color TV. So far, HD doesn't have a similarly easy method of announcing it's presence, or lack thereof, on a set.

Fifth, there's no easy-to-find listing of HD programs, except on the web, and that's not local. TV Guide could be a leader here, but isn't. Indeed, the digital channels aren't even listed (a signal from the transmitter automatically tells a tuner to list WGN-DT as 9 rather than the actual Channel 19 it broadcasts on, incidentally).

Having said that, I think at \$2,000, an HD-ready set is a bargain for those who want it. Consider:

First, we're only in the third full year of Digital TV, a.k.a. HDTV for the purposes of this note. Limited though network programming is (and local even more so, save for a few markets), there's far more HD programming on the air than there was color programming in 1956, Year 3 of color TV. What color there was could be found on then-RCA-owned NBC, with a few programs on CBS and a splash of color on a few local stations with visionary leaders. It took until 1965 for NBC to present primetime programs (plus The Huntley-Brinkley Report) in full color. That's the equivalent of 2009 in the HD timeline, but CBS's primetime HD lineup is already there, save for news magazines and taped "reality" game shows.

Second, add in satellite feeds of HBO, Showtime and the new HDNet (www.hd.net), a sports-oriented network half-owned by Dallas Mavericks owner (and Broadcast.com founder) Mark Cuban, and there's plenty of national HD programming available.

Third, even that vast majority of people who have 16:9 HD-ready sets but don't have the HD tuner can use them to watch widescreen DVDs. The anamorphic versions of DVDs are made for the 16:9 screen, and look terrific. They're far better on most DTV sets than NTSC in part because digital sets usually have 3:2 pull-down reversal (or whatever it's called), eliminating one albeit slight annoyance. And combined with a progressive scan DVD player, things get even better.

You're right that the price is still at the "YIKES" level. But I think the "WOW" factor will win people over, as it eventually did with color TV and the VCR."

LAST BUTTE NOT LEAST

One of our members asked me for a list of actual television transmitter locations. That would be a huge amount of work on my part plus I'd need to buy reams and reams of paper and take some vacation days to run it off. The better solution is for you to either buy a computer or run down to your local library and go to the FCC website TV query and look at the maps because every station has a map! Quick and simple! Now, go out there and have a super holiday season and look out for winter E skip!—Mike

Forum & Other Stuff

Thanks to Keith Smith, Joseph Martin, Danny Oglethorpe, Robert Seaman, Jeff Kitsko, Gord Lansdell, Fernando Garcia, and Jim Ayers for information in this month's column.

I see WCBS has learned not to keep all their eggs in one basket/all their transmitters on one building... Their new backup site is roughly ½ mile north of the Empire State Building. 228m isn't very high - I doubt this backup will have much coverage - but it's something. Elsewhere in New York, all the VHF stations except WNET-13 are now reported operating from the Empire State Building. WABC-7 kicked their FM (WPLJ 95.5) off their normal antenna to use the space for a TV antenna. WPIX also has an FM whose antenna they may have removed - to my knowledge the other stations don't, so I'm not sure how the space was opened. WPXN is reported operating at 250kw from the East Orange, New Jersey site of their LPTV W23BA. (40-48-08/74-14-48) The reports are unclear whether this means WPXN itself, on channel 31, is operating from here, or if W23BA received temporary authorization to increase power to 250kw.

We have two reports this month of newscasts airing on the "wrong" channels... Bob Seaman reports that WNEP-16 has been producing a 10:00 newscast for Fox affiliate WOLF-56. When baseball was airing on WOLF, "Newswatch 16 at 10 on Fox" would actually air on WB affiliate WSWB-38.

(Confusing enough?) Plus, the WNEP-16 6:00 newscast has been rerun at 7:00 on WQPX-64, and the 11:00 show reruns at 11:30 on WQPX. At the other end of Pennsylvania, Jeff Kitsko reports that WCWB-22 Pittsburgh is simulcasting WPGH-53's 10:00 newscast. Six stations, two news crews...

Gord Lansdell had more information on new religious LPTV CFEG-66. He says he understands the transmitting antenna is located on a church - given the mountainous terrain around there, I would imagine the HAAT is negative. Gord is also webmaster of some interesting broadcasting sites, including http://www.broadcasting-history.ca, http://nwbroadcasters.com, and http://members.home.net/okbroadcasters.

Joseph Martin is seeing KSMV-LP 33 from their new site on Mt. Wilson. It's a translator of KJLA-57. The KJLA ID shows five other LPTV stations, though Joseph didn't specify which ones. (And I forgot to ask him...) This is a replacement for a LPTV they were operating on channel 54, one which got bumped by new station KAZA-54. He also notes this channel 33 station is on the same mountain as full-power KMEX-34. This is a recent change in FCC policy, part of the DTV transition, which allows the use of adjacent channels by LPTVs. WFPA-CA 28 Philadelphia (until recently WXTV-LP) also coexists with WTXF-29 at a nearby site. Expect to see more of this.

Keith reports WLAJ-53 has shortened its 6 and 11pm newscasts to 10 minutes each. The rest of the half-hour is filled with the discussion show "53 On Point". Also in that area, WZPX-43 was off the air for several days in early November. Speaking of newscasts on the "wrong" channels, now that WZPX is back on, it's carrying WOOD-8's 5pm news, in parallel with WOOD. Keith thinks they're rebroadcasting WOOD's 11pm show as well but not at the same time. This seems to be becoming popular among Pax & NBC affiliates; WPXE-55 Kenosha/Milwaukee has been seen carrying WTMJ-4's news.

I now have local DTV service... WTVF-DT 56 appeared in October. They're carrying two virtual channels: 56-2 is mostly parallel to channel 5 analog, though they often run a CBS HDTV promo loop during local commercial breaks. You might see the same thing on other CBS DTV affiliates. WTVF's 56-3 is a simulcast of their "Newschannel 5+" cable channel. It's a mix of All News Channel, rebroadcasts of channel 5 newscasts, original talk shows, and syndicated fare. Kentucky Educational TV is reported working on the DTV facilities at several of their sites, there will probably be more new DTVs to report next month. Here's hoping for happy holidays and great DX for all!

Ask WTFDA

Q. I got my 7' dish w/amp up over the weekend. It is about 12" above the 1110. That is, about one foot. Is one foot too little separation for the two antennas?

A. Mounting UHF antennas too close to VHF is done all the time (even by "professional" installers), and yes, it will definitely have an effect on VHF reception. The Channel Master corner reflector yagis are the worst model to mount this way, as the elements in the corner reflector are resonant in the TV high band (ch 7-13). The elements at the bottom of the dish will cause high band problems, and the longer elements will rattle the low band.

Look at it this way: when designing a yagi antenna, directors can be as much as .4 wavelengths away from the previous director. At 54 MHz, that's 87", and at 88 MHz, it's 54". On the high band, the numbers are 27" and 22", which is why Channel Master used to say their C/R yagis should be mounted at least 3' away from the VHF antenna.

Word comes from Andy Bolin that The **Radio Shack** 15-678 attenuator is exactly the same unit as the 15-578 attenuator that Radio Shack discontinued a few months ago. How does he know? Easy...he took one apart.

The 15-678 attenuator is a handy little gadget to cut down on overload on UHF and VHF television. The attenuator is also something you **NEED** if you have an antenna phasing unit like the **Bolin Phase Box**. You might even want to try it to reduce FM overload at your location. The unit costs \$6.99 and is available at Radio Shack online, in all Radio Shack stores or over the phone at 1-800-THE-SHACK. This message is not an advertisement for Radio Shack. It is only meant to let you know that this item is once again available. If you have a Bolin Phase Box and wear out at least one of these a year, you can now breathe easier.

Q. Some time ago I bought the Channel Master Probe 9 for FM Dxing. I haven't had a chance to put it up yet and lately I've been wondering about it's ability to out-perform a large VHF TV beam such as the Winegard PR5040 (175" boom). I'm planning to buy one of these for VHF trops to share the mast with my 7' UHF dish. I originally planned on putting up all 3 antennas (Probe 9, PR5040, 7' UHF dish) on one super-strong mast with a heavy-duty rotor. But lately I've been thinking that perhaps 3 antennas on the same pole could be a little risky considering their combined wind load and also it may cause interference with each other if the antennas aren't spaced properly. So I am considering using the PR5040 VHF antenna for not only the TV set but also to the FM tuner, to avoid the congestion on the mast. Here's where I need your help guys... Isn't a typical VHF antenna designed to receive frequencies between 54-216 MHZ?? If so, isn't it safe to say that the FM frequencies of 88-174 MHZ would be well covered with a VHF antenna such as the PR5040? Any advice for this new guy to the hobby would be appreciated.

A. No. It's designed to receive 54-88 and 174 to 216. TV's high band is the 3rd harmonic of the low band, and that's how TV antennas are designed.

Q.If so, isn't it safe to say that the FM frequencies of 88-174 MHZ would be well covered with a VHF antenna such as the PR5040?

A.Only if you're comparing the TV antenna to something like a whip or an omni-directional. If you're comparing it to an FM only antenna, then no. TV antennas start out fairly low in gain at 88 MHz, dropping as you go up in frequency so that by 108 MHz it's very poor. I know, I know, they TELL you it covers FM, but I've yet to see one that was good at it. But given all other alternatives other than an FM only, it's the best way to go. -EH

The station is now known on the air as "Q-106." Also noted new WCBW 89.7 East St. Louis IL on the air with the Here's Help Network, a ministry of the St. Louis-based New Life Evangelistic Center. Hard to believe that Rice put on his first broadcast property in 1982! The absence of KFMZ 98.3 has been noted here; it used to have a decent signal on strong openings to the Columbia/Jefferson City area, even with KYKY blasting away on 98.1 and KTJJ at semi-local strength on 98.5. The station is expected to be auctioned off in December 2001, along with WZZQ 107.5 and two AMs in the Terre Haute area. 73, Eric (NOUIH)





ASK WTFDA

Q. I Would like to know who in the club keeps 110 or 150 khz filters on hand? I have a small hand held Radio Shack am/fm digital I would like to put filters in (radio about the size off the old transistor radios) and see how it performs. Can someone tell me which filters would be the logical choice without hurting the overall performance of the radio? Radio Shack doesn't provide any spec info on this radio, such as sensitivity, selectivity, etc., so couldn't tell anyone what those numbers are. (Maybe I'm still a dummy after dxing for over 20 years.....do filters really help with selectivity in a radio, if the radio isn't a piece of junk?).

A. You will find a handful of FM Dxers with Murata filters. Just put the word out on the WTFDA list that you are looking for some. Narrow filters will make a junk radio much better and will even improve a top of the line tuner, which is why people put them in Carvers and Onkyos and Yamahas. The choice for your radio? It it's really lousy go for broke... use the 110s. You have nothing to lose.

Q2. Are there any filters available for the Icom R7100 for FM? Thanks.

A. The Icom R7000, R7100, and the R8500 receivers only use two ceramic filters for wide FM reception Typically these filters have a -3dB bandwidth of ~ 230 KHz. This is far too wide for TV or FM DX audio. The following comments from Ian Roberts, (ICDX reflector), will explain why:

"Note that increased IF filter losses have no effect on the sensitivity of receivers - assuming that they have sufficient RF gain and first IF gain in front of the IF filter(s). The noise-to-noise ratio of a receiver - derived from KTB - is bandwidth related, so reducing bandwidth from 230 to 110 kHz will increase sensitivity by 10log 230/110 = 3.2 dB. The visual effect is a possible reduced "s"-meter reading of ~3 dB, depending on where the "s"-meter senses the IF level. This reduction may be interpreted by the user to mean lower sensitivity, erroneously.

Guessing, it seems that ICOM uses ~230 kHz WFM filters to enable users to make use of the 10 MHz output on the 10MHz/AGC voltage connector on the rear panel (of the IC-R8500, also IC7000?) for external stereo decoding. The receivers themselves do not decode stereo so there is every reason to reduce the WFM bandwidth. Mono TV sound has a deviation or around ~50 kHz and mono FM broadcasts ~70-100 kHz. The additional deviation due to stereo and information subcarriers can be dumped in the narrower 110 kHz filters without harming the DX performance of the receiver. Also services such as satellite APT (WEFAX) require 50 kHz at most - one would have thought decent filters for these ICOM receivers would have been 15 kHz standard communications FM, 50 kHz TV sound/WEFAX/weak TEP broadcast FM, etc and 110 kHz for strong FM mono broadcasts."

I suggest Murata SFE 10.7 MHY-A 110 KHz filters are ideal for wide FM in Icom receivers. It is interesting to note that even though I have four Murata 110 KHz filters in my ONKYO T-9090 11, there is no loss of stereo on weak signals.

I just bought a IC 8500. Replacement filters for wide FM in the 8500 is more difficult due to the use of surface mount chip Murata 230 KHz filters. I can only cut across the stock chip filters, and leave enough lead protruding from the pcb for the replacement 110 KHz filters.

Item one for December 2001 is to extend my personal best wishes for this holiday season to every WTFDA member. This was an emotionally draining year; and while it's true that time heals wounds, the scars from September 11 are deep and will not quickly disappear. Now, more than ever, we need all the cheer we can get.

This month's title was selected mainly because I wasn't able to come up with anything else that seemed appropriate. It's one of those times when inspiration is in short supply, and the keyboard seems as cold as Blitzen's nose.

Backtracking a bit, I'd like to mention that when I made the commitment to publish Jeff Miller's "U.S. Television Chronology", I knew that it would be lengthy but didn't expect to wind up with 11 months worth of copy.

Considering the time span covered, along with the myriad of industry-related developments therein, I suppose I should be amazed that it wasn't twice as long.

For those of us who saw TV take it's first faltering steps before getting on the road to maturity, it was a wonderful nostalgia piece. For those who came on the scene later, It's my hope that you were able to transport yourself back to those times by means of that "TV Time Tunnel" feature.

Since 1968, when Jeff's commentary wrapped up, an enormous number of technical advances have been made. While it might be successfully argued that many of the basics of

television have changed little since the FCC adopted the NTSC system, a lot <u>has</u> changed.

At the time those changes were taking place the transition was subtle. Yet when we look at tapes made as recently as 10 years ago, the contrast to today's overall quality and production techniques is astounding.

Of course satellite delivery of programming has evolved from a luxury to a necessity. The switch from film to tape to live satellite feed has revolutionized every facet of the industry...particularly newsgathering

Cranky tubes and bulky circuitry have given way to smaller and more reliable components. A device that once occupied 6 feet of space in an equipment rack has been replaced with a chip the size of a fingernail. Changes took place everywhere..and continue at this very moment.

From a DXer's perspective a lot of the new technology is a bit mysterious, sometimes baffling, and increasingly frustrating. I'm referring, primarily, to the arrival of DTV.

Much like Cooper and Seybold, as they unraveled the quirks of click detent tuners, antenna designs, and propagation in the 50s; those among us who are currently pioneering in DTV are blazing trails that will be traveled for years to come. We already know a little about these new byte size signals, but it'll take years to amass knowledge equal to that which we now possess of analog television.

In all likelihood, some in our midst won't move along with the changes and eventually abandon the hobby. But the guard WILL change and younger soldiers with inquisitive minds and unbridled zeal will take their places.

While the focus will increasingly shift to DTV, I personally suspect that NTSC will survive much longer than anyone had thought even as recently as a couple of years ago. Don't toss out your analog gear just yet!

TV DXing will be around for a long time (and DTV itself may change radically before all is said and done)!

IN CONCLUSION: After nearly 13 years, this column's status will change from that of a regular monthly feature to an occasional presentation. There are several reasons; foremost among them my desire to enjoy retirement to the fullest, travel extensively, and free myself from as many deadline driven duties as possible. While there'll probably be a "Time Tunnel" more months than not, don't panic if there's an occasional lapse.

Technical Topics

Now we have an equation for our effective earth model which could be used to describe DX conditions. For a given radio path, θ and a are known, and n could be measured or at least approximated, leaving the dn/dh term our main variable.

Practically speaking, dn/dh is the rate of change of the refractive index, i.e. the rate at which n varies with altitude. A specific calculation of k implies $\frac{\Delta n}{\Delta h}$. From the equation, one can see that dn/dh must average to a negative value for

k>1, and hence, potential DX conditions. (Incidentally, note that as θ increases, k decreases. This is another justification for getting that antenna up high.) dn/dh is the magic number that pops up all the time in propagation literature. But what they never tell you is where to get dn/dh! Because n varies with height, some device must be employed to take measurements while flying up into the sky.

Normally, n is not measured directly. For some propagation studies and in experiments conducted by hams and at least one WTFDA member (see reference), radiosonde readings were used. Radiosondes are weather balloons sent up with instruments and a small transmitter which measure altitude, temperature, pressure, and humidity, and relay that information back to earth. From such data, n can be calculated with a reasonable degree of accuracy. For your information, the formula used is:

$$N = 10^{6} (n-1) = \frac{77.6}{T} (P + 4810 \frac{e}{T})$$

Where T = temperature in degrees K ($^{\circ}$ K = $^{\circ}$ C + 273), P = pressure in millibars, and e = partial pressure of the water vapor in mbars.

The hobbyist probably does not have access to a radiosonde, but we can still benefit from past experimentation. By looking at the equations, we can tell exactly what conditions are needed for long-distance propagation, and then make the associations between observable weather and actual DX. These are:

- 1. The greater the change in –dn/dh, the greater the degree to which a ray is curved toward the earth. Remember, as –dn/dh approaches ∞, the curvature of the ray approaches the earth's curvature.
- 2. The greater the change in n, the greater the change in N as well.
- 3. N increases with pressure and humidity, and decreases with temperature.
- 4. Atmospheric pressure P always decreases with altitude, but temperature and moisture can vary with height—and *that's* the secret!

Therefore, cool, moist air is necessary for high values of N, while warm, dry air results in low values. Under normal conditions (no tropo enhancement or ducts), temperature and moisture gradually decrease with altitude. Thus, a graph plotting N versus altitude has a plain, continuous downward slope (Figure 4a). Instead, what we're looking for is a sudden change in dn/dh, remembering that reflection or refraction occurs where there is a sudden change in n.




Figure 1 Refractivity and temperature profile examples

Figure 4b shows a discontinuity in the dn/dh profile about 300 m up, a condition which will bend the radio signal back to earth. The sharpness and altitude of the break in the profile will affect the degree to which the ray is bent, and hence how far away a station can be heard. This is a "ground based duct," as the ground serves as one wall of the pseudowaveguide. The ground-based duct generally brings us the DX over fairly wide areas up to a few hundred miles out.

Figure 4c shows an "elevated duct," which is formed from two discontinuities in the dn/dh profile. In Figure 4c, these breaks occur at 300 and 250 m in altitude, producing a duct which is described as having a thickness of 50 m. The thickness of a duct (generally ranging from 10 to 100 m), referred to as the "inversion depth," determines the minimum frequency that is superrefracted. The horizontal dimension of a duct may run several dozen kilometers. The elevation and length help determine propagation distance. It is this kind of situation that brings us the long-distance (over 500 miles) tropo DX we desire. For example, there are documented cases of VHF contacts in the ham bands (144, 220, and 432 MHz) over a 2500 mile transcontinental path! This would indicate the transmission of VHF signals through even a very long duct is good.

Notice how, in Figure 4, temperature profiles are also plotted (using dotted lines) with altitude. Breaks in the T profile coincide with the breaks in the dn/dh profile. Because, in this situation, the temperature rises with altitude instead of decreasing as it normally should, an "inversion" is said to exist. An inversion is defined as increasing temperature with altitude, a condition which can be easily created by weather fronts and convections.

To summarize: VHF/UHF signals can be propagated through a duct whose walls are located by the "corners" of the dn/dh profile. Often those corners are formed by a temperature inversion. The walls effectively make up a waveguide. Like any waveguide, its dimensions affect the frequencies which are transmitted. The height of the waveguide above ground affects the distance over which signals can travel. As atmospheric changes vary the dimensions of the box, the MUF (Maximum Useable Frequency) changes. Often the duct starts narrow in thickness, so that the shorter wavelengths of UHF TV channels are transmitted first. As the inversion widens, the MUF drops, sometimes into the low-band VHF TV range.
