Here we are again for another month. It's late October and the wind is blowing most of the leaves in my backyard to the ground. In previous years I would just take the lawnmower to them and turn them into mulch, but not this year. This year my wife convinced me to let somebody else do it, so the guy who does my neighbor's yard gets one more customer.

Many DXers in the east had a decent first half of October for a change. Members around the Great Lakes did pretty well. But with cold fronts dropping down from Canada, those days are over. What's left are days with the solar flux in the 130s, and over 160 as I write this on 10/26.

What that means is F2 skip from Europe to North America from 27 mhz up to 35 mhz or better. When conditions are like this, European DXers do better than we do since we still have plenty of police, fire and medical utility stations in the 35mhz area for them to hear. There is not all that much left for us to hear from their side of the pond, except for French utilities up in the 37mhz band, if the MUF goes that high. So if you want to try for some of that, get yourself out of bed early and cut a dipole for 35mhz, aim it toward Europe and try for it. Easterners can try for for the CA State Police on 37mhz in the afternoons until about sunset, providing the MUF goes that high.

Gary Hickerson asked me what Bob Cooper K6EDX/ZL4AAA was up to. Bob has a very good website at <u>http://www.bobcooper.tv/</u>, in case you didn't know about it. In his spare time he writes books and you'll find some of them on his site. At the moment he's in the process of scanning all issues of DX Horizon and making them into a CD. Boredom is not an option for Bob.

I think you all know that Monitoring Tims is no more. But maybe you didn't know that it is back under a new name...Spectrum Monitor. This time, though, it's in digital (pdf) form and you cannot get paper. It appears to me that the entire publishing crew is back, including WTFDAer Doug Smith w9wi. I hope they do well. I might even subscribe for \$20 for one year as a charter member.

So, Spectrum Monitor is back. Now we find that Broadcast Engineering will be gone as of October 31<sup>st</sup>, citing low revenue as a reason. It's tough out there, no matter what some may tell you.



COMMENT: With the "Shutdown" affecting the FCC for 16 days, it may take them, and subsequently this column, a while to catch up with all of the updates which have piled up.

#### NEWS ITEM: As LPFM Window Opens, Groups Want More Time

The government shutdown meant the latest filing window for new LPFM stations got started two days late. It was to have run October 15-29. The FCC began accepting applications (October 18) for low-power stations without any notice, and now some public interest groups are asking the agency to either extend the deadline by 23 days — or suspend the window and reopen it later this year.

In a letter to acting FCC Chairman Mignon Clyburn, the groups say the shutdown not only delayed filings but the decision to take the FCC's website offline meant groups weren't able to do the necessary preparation to get ready for the window, and furloughed Audio Division staff wasn't available to offer support. Given those realities, the groups say sticking to the earlier timeframe "is now untenable." So Prometheus Radio Project, REC Networks, Common Frequency, and ColorOfChange.org are asking for the filing window to be open as long as the shutdown lasted plus one week, or 23 days.

There's been no response from the FCC so far, but the agency did clear up the last remaining issues. One change should make it easier for groups to find an available frequency, another will mean some short-spaced LPFMs won't be required to air periodic announcements about interference. The FCC also once again denied a request to allow 10-watt and 50-watt stations, saying the minimum will be 100-watts. Some LPFM supporters had sought the lower-power stations as a way to squeeze more outlets into crowded urban areas. [Inside Radio]

UPDATE From The FCC: The FCC has extended the LPFM filing date to November 14, 2013 at 6:00 p.m. EST.

But because the new transmitter location is about 60 miles closer to, and only 12 miles distant from Offutt AFB at Bellevue, Nebraska, the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) has had concerns that the new facility will cause interference to the Instrument Landing System (ILS) frequency (109.5) leading aircraft to Offutt's Runway 30. The new tower is inline with Runway 30's final approach. KIMI has been operating under the provisions of an Special Temporary Authorization (STA) with 500 Watts from the new tower. The FAA has indicated that the ILS frequency can be changed to avoid any potential interference, but KIMI has elected to request a Silent STA for 180 days until the ILS frequency can be changed and further modifications to the KIMI transmission facilities are completed.



#### The Editor's Note

The first half of October brought some additional good tropo to portions of the northeast and the lower Great Lakes. As anyone who has done some DXing on the east coast will tell you, receptions across the Appalachians come with a high degree of difficulty, and Chris Lucas in NY, Roy Barstow in MA, and our esteemed editor Mike Bugaj in CT were able to notch just that, with DTV decodes into the Pittsburgh and Altoona PA areas on the 10<sup>th</sup> of the month.

For everyone else west of Lake Michigan or south of the Mason-Dixon Line, you're probably asking, what tropo? We could hardly find any reports of note throughout the month of October from anywhere else, and with a large trough digging deep into the continent, the current weather is supporting band conditions more suitable for the beginning of December. There were some signs of the Gulf of Mexico tropo pipeline starting to fire up as we approached the end of the month (DTV decodes from LA to AL and SC to AL on the 22<sup>nd</sup>), and there are hints of a moderating trend for temperatures as we turn the calendar into November, so don't stow away those antennas just yet.

The one other notable reception during October we found was Glenn Hauser's viewing of XET-6 Monterrey MX on the 4<sup>th</sup> via tropo, a distance of over 750 miles! \*\* MEXICO. RE: XEZ-3 comments in 2012

Glenn, As you know, I have great respect for you and the good work you do for DXers. I have appreciated your useful articles and reports since the late 1960s.

I took some time off from DXing last year, and I missed some reports on tvfmdxlist and other sources during that time. Recently, I ran across July 2012 reports in which you state that (in your opinion) XEZ-3 Cerro Culiacán GTO and XEZ-3 Cerro El Zamorano QRO use the same transmitter. You use the fact that Doug's data shows only the Zamorano station as evidence that there is only one XEZ-3.

I'm sorry, but I disagree with you about XEZ-3. I don't think those are the same station (transmitter).

Your comments from: http://contatodx.blogspot.com/2012/0...8-10-2012.html "UT July 10 0016 on 3, finally a supered local ID I can read at upper- right in white, stays on long enough during upfade:

XEZ-TV / C. Culiacan Gto, during net-2 novela. W9WI reconfirms the only XEZ on 3 is: 50 kW in Zamorano, Querétaro. The C. stands for Cerro, or mountain peak. This transmitter I have seen for some 50 years; its location has been referred to as EI Zamorano or Querétaro, but as in the ID, the axual site is atop that mountain, which Googling shows is WSW of Qro. city and closer to the SW of Celaya, Guanajuato. Elevation is 2820m.

Not, of course to be confused with the totally different Culiacán city = ciudad in Sinaloa which also has a channel 3, XHQ with local origination, and also frequently DXed. Photo matching what I saw: <u>http://tvdxexpo.com/tvsguan.html</u>``

"BTW, checking out Danny Oglethorpe`s <u>http://tvdxtips.com/multitransmitter.html</u> this shows a recent log of mine, XEZ-3 with C. Culiacan text ID seen, is a separate transmitter from another XEZ-3 in nearby Zamorano, Querétaro. Altho both IDs may be seen at times, I still have my doubts that there are two separate transmitters, as the mountaintop one should also serve Qro, with the same net-5 which would otherwise interfere with each other (unless terrain blockage??)."

While my knowledge of Mexico and Mexico TV is limited, years of experience with Mexico TV DX has taught me a few things. In fact, during the last fifteen years, I have put most of my DXing time into IDing Mexico TV stations. Yet, every time I log a new TV station from Mexico, it is with some trepidation - due to my realization that IDing Mexico TV stations is very difficult and very tricky.

At the same time, my take on this situation could be wrong.

My opinion is based on the following points:

1) Fernando García told me in the early 2000s (when Televisa and Azteca stations began using those small text IDs in conjunction with new transmitters) that the locations on Mexico TV text IDs are transmitter locations. Hence, locations on IDs such as Cerro Las Lajas, Cerro Burro, and Palmasola. Jeff Kruszka put a good amount of time into locating some of those places before good Internet resources were common.

2) Doug's "TV News" in the September 1999 VUD contains the following about a multiple transmitter situation at XHVTV-54: "Fernando says both Televisa and Azteca frequently do this, adding second or third transmitters on the same channel..."

3) There are numerous unknown, unlisted, unofficial TV transmitters in Mexico that are \*not\* on the official Cofetel-SCT government lists. Doug uses government information, which means some Mexico TV stations are missing from his otherwise-excellent data. (Network status is also incorrect for some Mexico TV stations.) Cantú does show a few of the unknown stations on his site.

As a matter of fact, one of the stations reported in your DX reports is unofficial: XHCNL-2 Saltillo COAHUILA (MTY TV). Per information provided by Fernando years ago, that station was a XEFB-2 relayer in the past. It has never been listed on Doug's site, yet it has been logged by many other DXers (including Jeff Kadet and Ed Phelps).

An unknown channel 6 translator of XHDY-5 Chiapas is often reported by DXers in the South. Louisiana DXer Mike Perron has even received an unofficial XEFB-2 translator a number of times on channel 59.

4) Due to rough terrain, close-spacing and directional antenna patterns are common in Mexico. Consider the distance between XEFB-2 Monterrey and XHCNL-2 Saltillo.

5) It is my understanding that Cerro El Zamorano QRO and Cerro Culiacán GTO are \*not\* the same location. In looking at my "Guía Roji Gran Atlas de Carreterras," Zamorano is north of the city of Querétaro, while Cerro Culiacán is near Cortazar and Celaya GTO. 6) As few people live near those mountainside locations, why would a station even want to ID as "C. Culiacán" rather than Celaya; "Las Lajas" rather than Jalapa; or "Atenquique JAL" rather than the city of Colima? The answer is that transmitter location is used rather than City of Service.

These are locations from the XEZ text IDs that I've seen in recent years (all numerous times, in fact). I think each one has its own transmitter. XEZ-2 Querétaro QRO XEZ-2 San Miquel de Allende GTO (My mostcommon XEZ ID) XEZ-3 Cerro Culiacán GTO XEZ-3 Zamorano QRO (Danny Oglethorpe, Shreveport LA, Sept 11, DX LISTENING DIGEST)

Danny, Tnx for such a detailed analysis of this convoluted situation. I would certainly defer to your conclusions, and will put this in the next DX Listening Digest. Too bad there is no authoritative official source for exactly where all these are. Tnx also for keeping your very useful website going! 73, (Glenn to Danny, via DXLD)

Glenn, Here is something to think about. According to coordinates from Doug's site for XHLGT-2 León GTO (cdc) and XEZ-2 Guanajuato GTO, the distance is a mere 18 (eighteen) miles using the FCC site and the Indonesia site! Using a ruler on the Guanajuato map in my Mexico state atlas, the distance (from center of city to center of city) is about 25 miles! In other words, that is a very short distance.

These are the XEZs from Cantú's site, Doug's site, and my own DXing:

Cantú's site: 2 XEZ San Miguel de Allende, Gto. 2 XEZ Querétaro, Qro. 3 XEZ Guanajuato, Gto. 3 XEZ Querétaro, Qro. 50,000 watts Doug's site

\*\* OKLAHOMA. 48, as of Sept 14 I have not seen even an analog frame bar for at least a month from KOCY-LP OKC, the Estrella TV affiliate. Mountainlake tropo map for VHF hams shows huge red blobs all the way from the Tex/Mex border to the Great Lakes, so I turn on DTV at 1437 UT Oct 1, finding nothing very far beyond Wichitans, except:

RF 49, KTKA 49-1 Topeka KS, with local ad, Rachael Ray; also 49-2 is

KTKA-WX, a.k.a. Storm Track Weather, map and forecasts, current conditions rotating in Topeka, Emporia, Manhattan, Concordia, etc. with music track including cinematic. Also 49-3 with KTKACW+ ID on PSIP. In solid for a while past

1500; took a few photos: 49-2: <u>http://www.w4uvh.net/ktka-wx.jpg</u>

49-3: <u>http://www.w4uvh.net/ktkacw+.jpg</u> (Glenn Hauser, OK, DX LISTENING DIGEST)

RF 18 at 1451 UT, KCPT-1, KCPT-2 and KCPT-3 virtual 19s are also in with PBS varieties from Kansas City.

RF34 at 1452 UT, WDAF 4-1 Kansas City barely decodes. Many other DTVs with BAD signals. Also scanned channels 2-59 for any signs of analog signals, but none seen, not even KWKD-LP 28 Wichita; is it still on?

Nor KETM-LP 17 Emporia; is it still on?

I also rotated southwards but nothing unusual breaking thru from that direxion.

28, Oct 2 around 0400 UT I am now getting signs of NTSC video frame bars, but not locking in, while pointed at Wichita when KSNW-DT 45 is in solid, so apparently KWKD-LP Wichita is still on the air in analog, Daystar. KSNW is generally the prime DTV signal from Wichita, but unfortunately the one without any subchannels, just NBC on 3.1. It's the one not blocked by imaginary K45EJ in Enid of KSBI-51 (Glenn

Hauser, OK, DX LISTENING DIGEST)

\*\* OKLAHOMA [and non]. Heavy tropo opening from Lawton/Wichita Falls TX area, Oct 4 starting at turn-on 1356 UT:

RF 11, KSWO-DT Lawton on 7-1 (ABC); TELEMUN on 7-2, LWN on 7-3

RF 18, OETA as 10-1, and OKLA as 10-2. Still according to W9WI.com this must be K18IZ-D in Grandfield. This strange

situation was discussed almost two years ago in DXLD 11-43. OETA moved it from

Frederick to serve the L/WF market better. There never was any channel 10 around there; virtual number chosen to be amid the existing 3/6/7/18 stations. Yet two years after we got this info from OETA, their own website

\*still\* doesn`t include anything from Grandfield, but with Frederick:

Channel 34; Lawton: Channel 36, not making clear whether RF or virtual channels, but I think in most cases for the translators (other than

this) they are the same. BTW, the OK page of W9WI.com also seems to be incomplete as far as all the OETA translators. 18 is still in solid at 1445 UT.

RF 22, KAUZ-HD 6-1; did not get any subchannels checked (CBS)

RF 28, KFDX-DT 3-1; no subchannels; still in at 1514 UT (NBC)

RF 15, surprised to see an 18-1 KJTL-DT PSIPonly ID, as it must have overcome KTBO briefly, with antenna away from OKC; KTBO is 700 kW, KJTL 1000 kW from Wichita Falls.

RF 15, shortly after the above, I also see a DTV 15-1 label, but only a `bad` signal. There are a surprising number of ``15s on 15`` in W9WI.com around here: low powers in Salina KS, Springfield MO, Houston TX, Laredo TX (15 kW KLMV-LD, on the way to Monterrey?), but I suspect it`s 31 kW KXVA in Abilene TX.

On the other set I also keep checking all the channels in analog, and see a weak frame bar on 44. W9WI.com shows the likely one is K44GS, Wichita Falls 3.34 kW translator of KERA Dallas. At 1448 it lox in enough to see a toon with Dr Seuss character. Check! With KERA schedule ``The Cat in the Hat Knows a Lot about That`` (not including tropo TVDX, I assume).

My analog channel scanning really pays off when I then see tropo on lowband ch 6 from MEXICO! q.v. (Glenn Hauser, OK, DX LISTENING DIGEST)

\*\* OKLAHOMA. RF 31 & weaker RF 32 intercity relay, Enid`s only TV station, KXOK-LD continues to be all SNAFU`d with its two subchannels: Oct 8 at 1413 past 1520 UT, 31-2 M - FOX PSIP, so supposed to be Mundo-Fox, is just color bars, seven of them top to bottom --- which hardly any TV station broadcasts intentionally any more, and silent sound. 31-3 is still labeled Azteca but is black and mute. You never know when one or the other of these will axually present the programming. Meanwhile main channel 31-1 continues with TV-OK on RTV network. BTW, the color bars on 31-2 can have aspect ratio changed, while 31-1 and 31-3 are stuck at full-screen only, why?

(Speaking of color bars, one good thing about DTV (and digital cable)

is that hardly ever is it necessary to adjust the tint, once set; but some channels/program have `weak`, pallid hue, requiring that to be turned up on the set, notably NHK World news which we get via OETA OKLA at 1600 UT M-F; why?} (Glenn Hauser, Enid, DX LISTENING DIGEST)

\*\* MEXICO. After getting even translators from Lawton and Wichita Falls, less than 200 miles away, see OKLAHOMA [and non], I keep checking all the channels in DTV and on another set in analog, split fed from the same antenna, and am astounded to see a weak but steady signal on channel 6, a toon with the net-5 oval-italic logo in the lower-right corner, which I have seen on so many transmitters via sporadic E, but this is tropo! A duct extending far beyond the OK/TX stations I was getting.

Ch 6, Oct 4 at 1451 UT, first seen; no sign of Es DX on the lower channels, nor on the maps, nor any

expected at this yearpart. Checking W9WI.com, and Hepburn's channel 6 map, the nearest and most likely one is XET, 75 kW in Monterrey NL (which I have seen before by Es), but there are two other net-5s on 6 along the east coast, XHAJ, 20 kW in Orizaba, Veracruz and one in Chetumal QR, both of which would be very long shots, but proto-hurricane Karen in the Gulf could really kick up the DX. Notably, Hepburn's tropo maps at 1200 Oct 4 do not show activity as far inland as Enid or Monterrey! But heavy along the coasts and further east in OK.

On the TV-FM Skip Log, Mexican DX authority Danny Oglethorpe in Shreveport replies, `` Glenn, nice catch on XET. XHAJ-6 relays XHAJ-5, which is TeleVer, independent. XET does run a text ID every thirty minutes. The drifting time of the XET ID was about :09 and :39 on July 30th. There is no telling about the time by now``. Lots of great info at his site: <u>http://tvdxtips.com/index.html</u>

So that rules out Orizaba; rechecking W9WI.com it does show it as a Televisa 5 relayer: http://www.w9wi.com/web/tv-channels/6.html

Jockeying the rotor, it does seem to peak from the direxion of Monterrey (somewhat west of south) rather than the others, south or eastish. Before 1500 UT I have the ATS-909 tuned to 87.75 (whip only but picking up bounces from the nearby TV antenna), and I can hear Spanish audio while the video on the TV is not strong enough to pass the audio. That fades in a few minutes. Of course, there's no local ID audio, and any video ID would not be legible. Frame bar still visible at 1510, then gone.

Then from the W9WI.com listings, I check the other Monterrey channels:

analog on 2, 4, 7, 10, 12, 22, 28, 47, 53; DTV on 23, 25, 31, 39, 44?,

47, 48, 50. Many of those are blocked here of course, but nothing showing on the ones which are not. I do see some frame bars on other VHF channels, but always suspect those of being local cable radiation. Normally one would expect (much) stronger tropo signals from the same area on hi-VHF and even UHF, than on Io-VHF channels.

The city-to-city distance calculator shows Monterrey to Enid as 1215.79 km = 755.45 statute miles = 656.47 nautical miles.

1214.37 km is the more refined great circle distance calculation from XET transmitter site at 25-37-52N, 100-14-03W, to Enid, bearing 10 degrees (Glenn Hauser, OK, WORLD OF RADIO 1690, DX LISTENING DIGEST)

That must have been fun to get low band tropo from Mexico. I had a couple of stations on UHF (very weak) from northern Mexico, but my tropo international reception favorite was the day in August 1995 when I had UHF tropo from western Ontario. CMFT-69 from London, Ontario was extremely strong and I got some photos. Without looking it up the most distant was CITY-47 (I hope I have the right call letters, channel number). In 32 years working at KTWU this was the only day I called in sick when I wasn't. Congratulations on XET-6 (Dave Pomeroy, Topeka KS, DX LISTENING DIGEST)

\*\* MEXICO. 71.75 MHz, Oct 5 after tuning thru all the TV channels in analog and in DTV (output channel 4 from the Zenith box), I turn it off but leave the TV on channel 4 analog, to be jarred by a meteor burst of Spanish audio circa 1330, and some more for about a second each at 1406, 1425, 1441, 1445, and a longer one at 1521 UT. They really stand out, breaking the Broksonic's muting on an `empty` channel before it times out and turns itself off (and I turn it back on). I'm running the other Zenith TV set too, which doesn't always pass the audio at exactly the same time: no muting, but more dependent on some video carrier being present.

Following yesterday's terrific catch, if I do say so myself, of XET-TV channel 6 in Monterrey NL via a tropo duct around 1500 UT, I have left the antenna aimed that way, altho the chances of that recurring are minuscule, as weather patterns move on.

Now however, a likely source of this analog Spanish via meteor scatter on channel 4 is another Regiomontanan, 100 kW (visual) XHWX in Monterrey, as ~750 miles is an ideal distance for MS if not for lowband tropo; however, there is one other full-power in the area, XELN in Torreón, Coahuila. These could be from either or both.

Were these six bursts random meteors? No more caught past 1525 UT. Meteor shower schedules at Earth & Sky list the Draconids but not peaking until Oct 7-8, so maybe precursors to that; and the visually-limited astronomers are downplaying the greater Orionids due to moonlight, only on October 21.

This report is for a 2-month period—most of August, September, and into October 2013. I missed reporting last time because my computer temporarily went bonkers. No harm done except for this delay.

Ocean water temp started Aug at 59F/15C, then rose steadily to Aug 23 at 64F/18C. Sept 2 saw max of 68F/20C, then down Sept 7 to 65F/18C. It averaged about 64F/18C through early Oct. Air temp highs in Aug varied from apx 75F/24C to 83; inland from 80F/27C to 102F/39C. But then, last week of Aug <u>here in SBarb</u> started warmer at mid 80sF/high 20sC and Aug 27-Sept 7 went up to 93F/34C. Remainder of period varied from mid 70sF/20sC to 90F/32C until Oct-9 showers at barely 70F/21C. Distances are approximate. So-Calif tropo ducting to San Diego/Tijuana/Tecate up to 220 mi/350 km:

Aug 26: At Don Voegele's place, about 0730+ PDT, tropo was decidedly fair, almost good. Nothing new. On DTV, lots of full-power SDiego/Tijuana/Tecate, along with LP RF-25 "17" San Diego (Univision, 175 mi/280 km) (I have not been sure of its call). Analogs KZSD-LP 39 (Azteca America) San Diego and—not logged for a while—K35DG 35 La Jolla (Univ.Calif.SDiego) (175 mi/280 km) were seen, both poor. Analog XHDTV-49 Tecate (My Network, 220 mi/350 km) was very good...but there was no sign of analog XHUAArelay 56 Tecate—maybe off air from Tropical Storm Ivo damage?

**Sept 10:** At Don's place again, close to 0800, XHUAA-relay 56 Tecate was noted back on.

Nothing notable to report since then.

As noted before, I am assuming that Ensenada was not involved in the July-2013 Tijuana analog turnoff, but I don't know for sure. It is about 50 mi/80 km SSE of Tijuana, on an isolated west-coast bay with high mountains around it that block Tijuana signals, so it has its separate set of Mexican network affiliates. (Some of its xmtrs are on <u>same</u> <u>channels</u> as Tijuana stns[!].) Its distance from me is about 250 mi/400 km SE, but I have never seen any Ensenada TV in SBarb. Its xmtrs are on low ridges in town, and surrounding mtns then block its signals from getting out on coastal tropo. <u>E</u>s possibilities? Good question.



The directional characteristic of the folded dipole can be improved by adding a reflector. The impedance is somewhat lower (approximately 250 ohms) when the reflector is about 1/4 wavelength from it. It is common to match this combination to a 300 ohm transmission line. The small mismatch does not interfere with a satisfactory signal pickup. It is common to space the reflector about .15 wavelength behind the antenna.

If a director element is added to a folded dipole, the directional pattern is still further sharpened – an aid in cases where interference is severe. Since these parasitic elements make the antenna frequency sensitive and cause response over a narrow band, they are not the best solution of the antenna problem.

A folded dipole with a reflector only represents a good compromise, since it has a fairly sharp pattern with broad frequency response and easy matching to a 300 ohm line.

At points remote from the transmitter, where greater signal strength is required, the antenna height can be increased. Or an antenna made of two or more dipoles, one above the other, can be used. There are several types of omnidirectional antennas. One of them, with the elements arranged in the form of a cross is shown. A quarter wave matching section usually connects the two dipoles.



Where it is difficult to pick up a sufficiently strong signal from all the desired stations with one antenna, the use of several antennas may be helpful. Several dipoles can be erected at different locations or one below the other, each one facing the desired station. A simple switch or jack-and-plug arrangement permits the operator to connect any one to the receiver. An alternative is to use one antenna which can be rotated. Sometimes the antenna requires tilting at an angle because of changes in the polarization of the high-frequency waves.

#### TUNING THE FM ANTENNA

While FM antenna adjustment is not too critical, care should be taken when it is erected.

Mount the dipole broadside to the transmitting station. Adjust the length of the dipole elements for maximum signal strength and also the gap between the inner ends of the elements. About 1 to 1.5" is a common gap length. Experiment with the distance between the reflector and the dipole for best results – about ¼ wave length is suitable for FM. If the length of the reflector is adjustable, vary it too for maximum signal.

It is often best to turn the antenna for the strongest possible signal from the weakest stations. The strong signals will take care of themselves. Keep the lead-in cable away from metal tanks and pipes and support it away from the building, wall and roof with suitable highfrequency insulators. Anchor it in place so it cannot sway in the wind. Bring the cable into the building through suitable insulators. One method is to use a sheet of polystyrene in place of a glass window pane, passing the lead-in through a hold drilled in the center of the polystyrene panel.

Connect a vacuum or other approved type of lightning arrestor to the lead-in. Attach the ground wire to the nearest water pipe or a piece of pipe driven into moist earth. Some types of antennas do not require separate lightning arrestors.

#### FCC Reaffirms That There Will Be No 10-Watt LPFM Stations

FCC LogoToday, on its first day back at work, the FCC released a Sixth Order on Reconsideration of its Sixth Report and Order on low-power FM. Basically, this means the FCC received a number of filings challenging LPFM rules, along with suggestions and requests for clarification. While today's order mostly reaffirms the status quo for LPFM, the Commission says it released this order because it is in the public interest to formally explain why it is rejecting most of these requests, while making some minor modifications.

Perhaps most significantly, in today's order the FCC reaffirmed the elimination of the 10-watt LP10 service, in addition to

reifying its rejection of a suggested 50-watt (LP50) service. When the FCC eliminated the LP10 service, it reasoned that such stations would not have large enough broadcast area and audience to be economically sustainable.

A number of groups subsequently challenged the Commission's reasoning on the LP10 issue, also urging that a level of service at or below 50 watts should be available. The group Let the Cities In (LTCI) argued that the very low powered LP10 service would still reach a substantial audience in densely populated "urban core" areas where available spectrum is so limited that even an LP100 will not fit on the dial.

The FCC rejected LTCI's arguments, standing by its original justification that LP10 station in such areas would be "susceptible to interference" and to other obstructions that would impede reception, such as "such as natural and manmade structures that lie between the transmitter and the receiver." The Commission also notes that this same reason is why it ceased licensing 10-watt class D stations in 1978.

The Commission also rejected the reasoning that LPFMs operating at 50 watts or less would be just like translators operating at those power level. The FCC said the services are not equivalent because translators do not originate programming nor do they requires a staff to operate. These facts make translators more economical to operate under the aforementioned technical compromises than a full-service LPFM.

The FCC also provided a little clarification to the rules governing how a new LPFM must protect this input to a translator from interference. Many translator repeater stations receive their audio program from a full-power station's over-the-air broadast, which the translator then rebroadcasts.

Even though it was released on October 17, this order was actually adopted on September 30, one day before the government shudown. Therefore it does not address the delay of the LPFM window nor the request to delay the LPFM application deadline.

#### U.S. Broadcast Stations Tops 30,000

The FCC has released its numbers on official licensed broadcast stations. According to the agency there were 30,367 as of Sept. 30. Rough totals are over 22,000 radio stations of some kind. That total includes translators, boosters and LPFMs. That number could pop when LPFM licensing gets into full swing. For television the number is 8,194 — including Class A, translators and LPTV stations. Here's the breakdown:
