### MORE MEXICAN ANALOG SHUTOFF

WTFDA Forum user Raymie reports on the analog shutoff.

The IFT is still unable to declare an analog shutoff in any area of the country, as the SCT still has not presented any surveys showing that digital signals are reaching 90% of the population in a given area, says IFT president Gabriel Contreras.

"We have received information from the SCT and we have worked with them, but so far we have not received information that confirms that there is an area of the country where 90% of the population can receive digital signals. Since that hasn't happened, we can't declare a shutoff," Contreras noted.

The SCT began in May with its distribution of free digital televisions to the low-resource population in some portions of northern Mexico, such as Nuevo Laredo and Reynosa, with the goal being to ensure that more people can receive digital signals and increase TDT penetration. Despite that, the SCT still has not proven that it has hit the 90% threshold in these areas.

Nice to see all is going well in Mexico! And that's all we have until next month! -Mike

All TV licenses (including LPTV) in a given state expire on the same date. For example, licenses in Arizona, Idaho, Nevada, New Mexico, Utah, and Wyoming all expired on October 1<sup>st</sup>. On December 1<sup>st</sup>, licenses in California expired. On February 1<sup>st</sup>, they'll expire in Alaska, Hawaii, Washington, Oregon, and the Pacific islands.

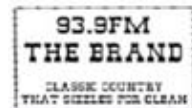

**NEWS ITEM: Radio Disney Continues To Broadcast**

On September 25, all but one of the Radio Disney stations were supposed to shut down, pending their sale. But, Disney reports the stations will remain on the air carrying the national feed only (no local breaks or announcements except for legal IDs). The only FMer affected is WRDZ-FM 98.3 Plainfield, Indiana which serves Indianapolis. The remaining 23 affiliates are of the AM variety. The only station not being sold serves the Los Angeles market.

**NEWS ITEM: NBC News Radio on the way out**

As part of the restructuring that saw Westwood One drop ABC News for a new CNN powered news service, Westwood One has notified affiliates it will also drop distribution of NBC News to affiliates on December 15. Affiliates will have the option to switch to the new CNN-fueled Westwood One News following the ceasing of NBC News Radio operations. In an ironic twist, the current incarnation of NBC News Radio was established by Westwood One (then Dial-Global) as a replacement service following CNN's closure of its radio network.

All TV licenses (including LPTV) in a given state expire on the same date. For example, licenses in Arizona, Idaho, Nevada, New Mexico, Utah, and Wyoming all expired on October 1<sup>st</sup>. On December 1<sup>st</sup>, licenses in California expired. On February 1<sup>st</sup>, they'll expire in Alaska, Hawaii, Washington, Oregon, and the Pacific islands.

License renewals are to be filed four months in advance – i.e., on June 1<sup>st</sup> for stations in Arizona & Wyoming.

The FCC does not immediately mark a station as deleted in their database when the license expires. Sometimes, Commission action on a renewal is delayed. For example, if a member of the public has complained about the station's operation, the FCC may wish to resolve the complaint before renewing the license. A station may continue to operate after license expiration, if the renewal application was filed on time and the Commission hasn't acted on it yet.

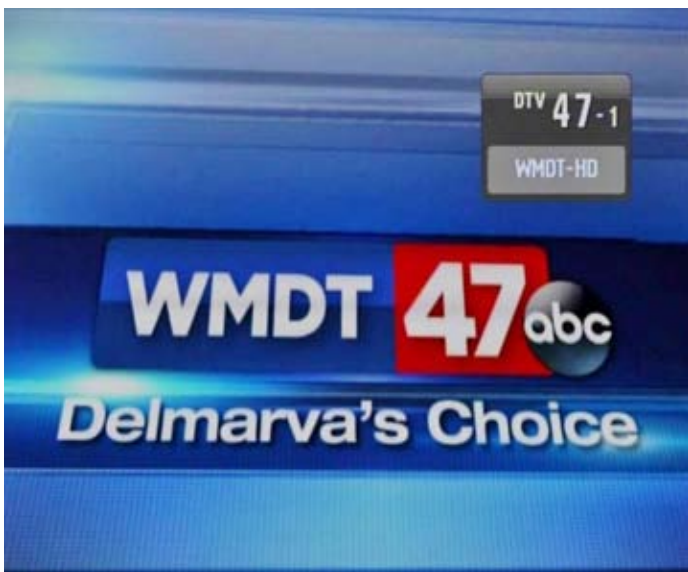

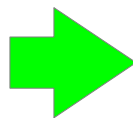
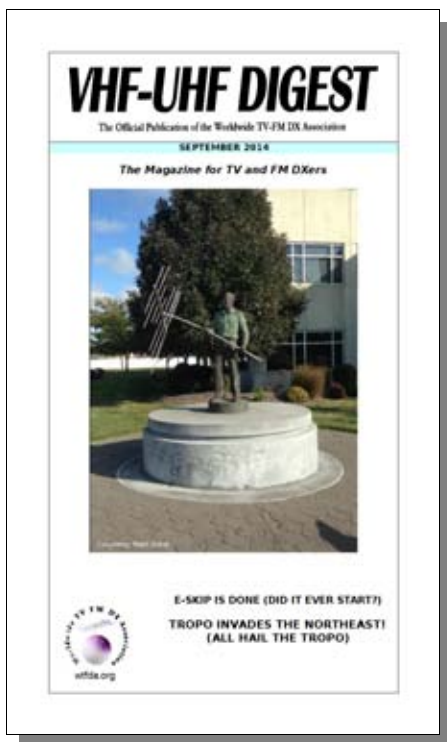

\*\* U S A. RF 22, Aug 17 at 1410 UT, morning tropo from Kansas is up with the usual Wichitans, and as far as Great Bend, KSNC ``2``. Now I can tell that it provides no 2.2 with Telemund[o] like its parent station RF 45, KSNW, 3.2, now does (Glenn Hauser, OK, DX LISTENING DIGEST)

\*\* MEXICO. A tease of sporadic E appeared on channel A2, antenna south toward Mexico, as I still leave the analog TV on a lot of the time for the snowstorm to be interrupted. At 1556 UT Sept 3, fade-in some weak Spanish video grafik and then audio, but gone in about a minute never to return. Too long to have been meteor scatter. Es MUF map for 6 meters showed a patch over Ciudad Juárez reaching 33 MHz. If that was it poking briefly up to 60 MHz, the area propagated would be around Sinaloa, common here during the season (Glenn Hauer, OK, DX LISTENING DIGEST)

\*\* MEXICO. 55.25 MHz, give or take, Channel A2 analog video, snowstorm quickly interrupted by a meteor burst, Sept 8 at 2146 UT: tentatively XEPM, Juárez, as glimpse of bug in UR reminds me of its

TU CANAL format I have seen many times by Es, altho I cannot read any details in this split-second; antenna SSW rather than WSW, but appropriate distance circa 600 miles for MS.

Channel A2 analog video, 55.25 MHz give or take, Sept 9 at 2058 UT, some weak signal fades in and out, as I keep the snow blowing in hopes of some random meteor scatter DX; better luck at 2133 UT, when a signal is in for a couple seconds, long enough to recognize the italic-2-in-oval Grupo Pacífico bug upper-right with XHI-TV below it, i.e. Los Mochis, Sinaloa. Since there is another XHI-TV on channel 2, note this from <http://tvdxtips.com/mexlogosch2.html>

``NEW TIP FROM MIKE PERRON: Mike's research indicates that most-likely XHI Los Mochis has "XHI-TV" below the "2" logo, whereas XHI Cd Obregón does not have the calls below the "2" logo. Unfortunately, during the time Los Mochis relays Cd Obregón, neither station has the calls below the "2" logo. Thanks, Mike.

XHI-2 Los Mochis is not a full-time relay of XHI-2 Cd Obregón, Sonora, in spite of what other sources say. Therefore, check the program schedules and live video streams on the Pacifico site.`` (Glenn Hauser, OK, WORLD OF RADIO 1738, DX LISTENING DIGEST)

\*\* OKLAHOMA. Tropo opening Oct 7 brings in some OK TV not that far but not normally visible, all times UT: see also USA for more

1429 on RF 26, KTENNBC as 10-1, KTEN-CW as 10-2, and KTENABC as 10-3. These are Ada OK, 1000 kW

1430 on 48, KOCY-LP, OKC is still in NTSC, barely locking in video, no audio, at 1439, presumably still with minor Spanish network Estrella. 18.2 kW with APP to lower to 13.5 from same coordinates, why? CP for DTV is 15 kW, also same site. No other NTSC DX to be seen on complete VHF/UHF analog bandscan

1442 on RF 17, TBN with 5 channels, despite antenna to SSW, also seen earlier, has to be KDOR Bartlesville from the east, 1000 kW, the only full-power TBN anywhere on 17. Did not copy down all the sub-IDs, but later checked on // RF 15 KTBO OKC:  
 14-1 KTBO-D1 [so did KDOR run own ID on 17-1?]  
 14-2 Church [you mean 14-1 is not??]  
 14-3 JUCE [formerly JCTV], for youth  
 14-4 Enlace [Spanish, cómo no]  
 14-5 SOAC [Sound of a Child], for kids, also a newish monicker

BTW, at 1738 UT checking this out I find that only 14-5 has a continuous Mexican-like small white text ID bug in LR:  
 KTBO-TV / OKLAHOMA CITY OK  
 Why, for benefit of DXers? Ha!

1447 on RF 12, KXIICBS as 12-1; KXIIMYT as 12-2; KXIIFOX as 12-3. This is really Ardmore OK, site in OK, but long ago hijacked by the Texans to COL Sherman, only 35 kW

Despite RF 17 KDOR, on RF 36, during this opening, could not get KRSU Claremore to decode, due to CCI? among many `bad` signals, as I wanted to check whether Classic ARTS is still being carried as 35-2; W9WI.com shows only 35-1, as Edu.

{BTW. RF and virtual 13, KETA OKC via Suddenlink cable in Enid is suffering some IADs, just like we get all the time on our antenna --- belying Suddenlink`s claim they get all OKC channels by fibre-optic. Looks like DX QRM is degrading their OTA pickup} (Glenn Hauser, Enid, WORLD OF RADIO 1742, DX LISTENING DIGEST)

\*\* U S A. First decent tropo DX opening of the fall here, Oct 7, all times UT: [see also OKLAHOMA]

1416 on RF 18, KFSM-DT as 5-1, and KXNW-MY as 5-2, the latter with 34 bug in LR; photoed. KXNW major channel is 34 in Eureka Springs, but also on a bunch of minor channels including this, from Fort Smith: KFSM is 550 kW. City to city distance 333 km = 207 miles  
<http://www.w4uvh.net/KXNW-MY.jpg>

1423 on RF 9, KAFT-1 as 13-1, Fayetteville AR, 37.9 kW; no time to check subchannels, presumed same as before including reading on 13-4

1423 on RF 27, ``no`` signal from KFOR OKC, implying that there is DX CCI at least when aimed east. So probably caused by KFTA-TV in Fort Smith, 600 kW. Other OKCs OK on same heading, e.g. KWTW-39

1431 on RF 14, KERA-HD as 13-1, World as 13-2; no others, but my STB makes it hard to unmix from RF 13 OETA with 4 channels. KERA: 975 kW from Dallas TX

1436 on RF 41, KXAS-DT as 5-1; Cozi-TV as 5-2; 891 kW, Fort Worth TX

Tropo maps show heavy opening into S Texas, even Tamaulipas, but nothing further than The Metroplex for me: 432 km / 269 miles from Cedar Hill site antenna farm

1448 on RF 21, KHBS-DT as 40-1; ARK-CW as 40-2. Photoed the latter; still in at 1528. Clock on program guide/ID registers CST 9:00 AM at 1500 UT, not CDT! 325 kW from Fort Smith AR, 333 km = 207 miles  
<http://www.w4uvh.net/ARK-CW.jpg>  
[flash by accident, yet produces sharper image than some others]  
(Glenn Hauser, OK, WORLD OF RADIO 1742, DX LISTENING DIGEST)

\*\* U S A. Another tropo TV/FM DX opening morning of Oct 8, from further west than yesterday, around the Texas Panhandle, all times UT:

1443 on RF 9, DTV 2-1 as KACV-HD, and 2-2 as KACV-SD (but no others), i.e. PBS from Amarillo. 2-2 is in Spanish! with PBS` V ME network with kidvid but after 1500 tips for expectant mothers. V ME means ``watch me``; why they don`t spell it VE ME is not clear. First time I`ve seen it on any PBS

outlet, certainly not on the others around here. 1458 ID break says it`s sponsored by, ``un servicio de Panhandle.``

Full VHF/UHF bandscan finds no other AMA stations decoding, altho KACV is in solid. Other major RF channels there are 7, 10, 15, 19, of which 7 and 15 are blocked by OKC. City to city distance to Amarillo: 380 km = 236 miles

1447 on RF 44, intriguing Bad signal here, but there are no full-powers in the TX panhandle, just a bunch of LPs or translators, closest being Gruver, K44CC-D, 420 watts relaying KFDA-10 Amarillo. Also no greater than 15 kW in Hereford, Lubbock, Memphis, Midland, Wichita Falls.

From OK I am also getting as far east as KTEN RF 26 Ada; also KWET RF 8 Cheyenne from the west.

I also do a full analog bandscan, but nothing seen. It appears all the western OK/TX panhandle analog translators ch 52-69 are now gone, migrated to DTV lower channels, as none listed in W9WI.com presumably drawn from the latest FCC info. The \*only\* possibility listed in this DX area is, but not seen:

Analog 69, KDFL-LP, 15 kW in Lubbock with Azteca network; really ON? There are still a few in the 52-69 band in extreme S Texas, Mexico, Montana and Canada. Listed at channel 67 is an application from K48NY-D in Gainesville TX (near the OK border toward The Metroplex), which would be an interesting catch if it really exist on 67 instead of 48 (Glenn Hauser, Enid OK, DX LISTENING DIGEST)

This report is from September 12 to October 12, 2014. Still no skip seen.

Air temps here along the coast have continued above average, still between 80F/27C and 90F/32C. Ocean water temp continues in range of 66F/20C to 71F/22C. Weather mostly calm and stable. So there has been some coastal tropo ducting, most of the time. But, very DRY here—no rain from north or south. And most of USA is flooding. Not good.

Distances are approximate. So-Calif tropo ducting to San Diego/Tijuana/Tecate from 175 mi/280 km up to 220 mi/350 km SE:

Sep 12 – 18 Var. fair to poor

Sep 19 – 20 None

Passing low pressure cell

Sep 21 Very poor

Sep 22 - 25 Poor

Sep 26 – 29 None

Wx front, windy, rain further north in Calif

Sep30 - Oct2 Var. fair to poor Calm, warm

Oct 2 - 3 Out of town, in WASCO

Oct 3 – 12 Var. fair to poor Calm, hot

Once again, I was at the Wasco motel on Oct 2-3, with a third-floor room on the south side this time, still 30ft/9m above ground, with my LG flat-screen TV & carry-around antennas of UHF 4-bay conical & VHF bunny ears. The emphasis was on Bakersfield, southeast 35mi/55km to 45mi/70km. These new loggings, not seen in Wasco before.

## **In historic first, LA pubTV stations agree to share spectrum for auction proceeds**

Pubcasters KCETLink and KLCS in Los Angeles will participate in the upcoming FCC spectrum auction through a channel-sharing partnership that could earn them more than \$32 million.

The boards of KCETLink, an independent organization, and the Los Angeles Unified School District, licensee for KLCS, each unanimously approved Tuesday a memorandum of understanding to share proceeds of auction revenues that they would gain by giving up part of their channel capacity.

It is the country's first finalized channel-sharing agreement in anticipation of the auction, according to FCC spokesperson Kim Hart.

If the FCC approves the stations' plan, the two stations will relinquish a total of 6 MHz of TV spectrum for auction to wireless carriers that want to purchase bandwidth for wireless devices. The stations would then share a single over-the-air television channel.

KCETLink President Al Jerome and Sabrina Fair Thomas, KLCS general manager, declined to discuss the value of the deal with Current. Michael Alcamo, whose firm M.C. Alcamo & Co. Inc. has advised other noncommercial broadcasters in station and spectrum transactions, estimated it could bring more than \$32 million.

The stations will "chart new waters together," Jerome said in a joint announcement. He called the collaboration a "bold partnership."

"We feel the spectrum auction is a great opportunity to potentially gain significant resources that we can reinvest into programs and activities we provide to the community in support of our mission," Jerome said in the statement.

Thomas noted that technology "allows us to continue to offer high-quality public media content over the air without compromising the viewer experience."

Each station will retain its individual license and schedule.

Channel-sharing is one of several options broadcasters are considering leading up to the FCC's spectrum auctions, which are set for mid-2015. Each TV station also may opt to sell all its bandwidth and drop out of broadcasting, move from a UHF to a VHF channel or decline to participate.

Broadcasters in certain areas — including Los Angeles, the country's second-largest media market — could potentially come away with millions of dollars for their spectrum, Alcamo said.

Aggregate value for spectrum includes cash paid at the time of a transaction and the portion of the auction proceeds paid later to the licensee. A full-service licensee in a market where wireless companies want spectrum should be able to sell spectrum for \$3.25 to \$3.75 per resident within its signal's contour based on Census figures, according to Alcamo.

If a signal reaches 9 million residents in covered population — Alcamo's estimate for both these stations — the licensees should be able to ask at least \$32 million in aggregate value, he said.

Los Angeles is attractive to wireless carriers due to its above-average population density and growth rate, Alcamo said. Coastal areas such as Los Angeles and border regions are also in "particular demand," he said, due to market crowding and the fact that the FCC controls only half of spectrum allotments along the border.

At KCLS, which is struggling financially, the infusion of capital "will relieve the burden of financial support from the school board," Thomas said. "We've been asked to do that for many years."

Meanwhile, KCETLink sees channel-sharing as a first step toward greater public service. Since merging with satellite distributor Link TV in January 2013, KCETLink content can reach 34 million homes on DirecTV and DISH.

"Combine that with the Los Angeles Unified School District and its 700,000 students that represent one of the most diverse communities in the U.S., and you have a living lab of students and faculty and administrators," Jerome said. "It won't happen soon; we have a lot of work to do. But we have the potential over the years to make an educational imprint nationwide."

Many details about the channel-sharing partnership remain to be settled. Alan Popkin, KLCS director of TV engineering, said the two stations are still deciding exactly what spectrum to relinquish. "To the viewer it will make no difference," he said. "This is really the most important point. The channel share will be invisible post-transition to the viewer. That was proven in our test results."

Earlier this year, [KLCS tested the technical limits of channel-sharing](#) with commercial station KJLA in the nation's first such experiment. After weeks of tests, Popkin reported to the FCC that broadcasters can combine two high-definition television streams into a single channel with no loss of signal quality.

The channel-sharing announcement is "new evidence of public television's commitment to innovation and excellence in pursuing our public service mission of education, public safety and well-informed citizenship," said Patrick Butler, president of the Association of Public Television Stations.

"Public television was first to multicast, first to datacast, first to provide closed captioning, first to offer descriptive video for the visually impaired," Butler said, "and we look forward to further pioneering efforts to use our broadcast spectrum most effectively in the service of the American people."

# FCC PITCHES \$38 BILLION REASONS TO PARTICIPATE IN INCENTIVE AUCTION

Uses high clearing estimate to outline potential high-end payouts to broadcasters

According to FCC officials speaking on background, a high-end estimate of revenues from the incentive auction could mean as much as \$38 billion to compensate broadcasters for giving up spectrum for that auction.

That will be among the takeaways in an information packet the FCC is publishing Wednesday and sending to broadcasters as it prepares for the incentive auction, scheduled for mid-2015.

FCC Chairman Tom Wheeler announced the effort at a press conference Tuesday. Wheeler has been arguing the auction is a unique, virtually risk-free opportunity for broadcasters to capitalize on their spectrum, but said with the packets, broadcasters don't have to take his word for it.

The \$38 billion figure is using an estimate of 100 MHz up for bid in the forward auction on an estimated 126 MHz reclaimed from broadcasters in the reverse auction. The difference is the spectrum used for guard bands and the duplex gap (buffers between TV and wireless services sharing the band), and so not available for auctioning.

Some estimates have put the eventual spectrum take at more like 84 MHz, or less, but the officials said even then there would be a lot of money available — essentially two thirds of that \$38 billion or about \$26 billion) in the case of 84 MHz.

They conceded that was a high estimate, but they also said they thought clearing 126 MHz — even more than the 120 target the FCC initially set — is still in the realm of possibility, though clearly the high end of the spectrum, as it were.

The FCC is express-mailing information packets to eligible broadcasters — full-powers and Class A stations — Wednesday making the economic case for why the auction is the once-in-a-lifetime, no risk opportunity Wheeler has been pitching. Wheeler directed the FCC to undertake the educational outreach. It will also be posted to the FCC's LEARN (Learn Everything About Reverse-Auctions Now) website.

The idea is to take the auction and recast it as a business opportunity, which is why the packets were produced for the FCC by investment banker Greenhill & Co. It is the work product of FCC economists and the FCC's auction design team, and was produced in the interests of better educating broadcasters and at the direction of the chairman. It is also responsive to calls from other commissioners for more info, said the officials, though it was not something voted on or vetted by them.

The packet is organized by themes. One is that the auction is a unique opportunity. Greenhill says that broadcasters can make more in a one-time payout than trying to hold onto spectrum and lease it to a wireless carrier or create their own wireless channel because repacking will unlock the value of the spectrum by freeing up a near-nationwide swath of contiguous spectrum.

A second theme is the attractive prices broadcasters can get, meaning there is a lot of money to be made.

A third theme is that the auction is voluntary, with a significant potential for upside with no real risk. It makes the point that broadcasters can decide to offer up a bid, then if the price gets to low, drop out at no penalty for testing the waters, with no effect on how the station will be repacked.

The info includes the highest valuation valuation as well as the median estimated value (FCC economists did the estimating) in all 210 DMA's, based on their value as spectrum, not enterprise value as stations, and weighted according to their value in the repacking process.

The methodology is similar to what the FCC is working on for coming up with opening bids for the auction. It values the stations according to how important getting that particular station is in the Rubik's cube of repacking.

The methodology gives each station a weighted interference value that reflects its footprint and its impact on adjacent stations it overlaps with. A station with a big footprint and a lot of overlap with other stations will have a higher interference value — and command a value — than one in a more rural area that may not overlap with many stations or cover as large a number of people. That is because if the FCC doesn't get that one station with the bigger footprint, it might have to buy three or four stations to achieve the same repacking result.

The FCC was assuming the 100 MHz to sell at about \$1.50 per megahertz POP (an MHz pop is arrived at by multiplying the number of megahertz associated with a license by the population of the license's coverage area), times 300 million Americans. The result was a forward auction revenue of \$45 billion.

Subtract the estimated \$7 billion to pay for the FirstNet interoperable broadband emergency communications network, cover \$1.75 billion for reimbursing broadcasters for repacking and moving expenses, and the cost of running the auction, and you get \$38 billion available to pay broadcasters, although some legislators are hoping for some excess for the treasury.
