EMF Fix For Interference Dispute? Give LPFM An FM Translator

Inside Radio March 26, 2019 Educational Media Foundation has found a unique way to settle a long-running dispute over whether a new low-power FM was causing interference to one of its Los Angeles full-power FMs. EMF has agreed to give the group behind the LPFM one of its FM translators in the market in exchange for it turning in the low-power station's license.



EMF first raised alarms about the proposal submitted by Razorcake/Gorky Press five years ago saying its plan to build what's since become KFFL-LP, Pasadena, CA (92.7) would step on the signal for EMF-owned co-channel contemporary Christian "Air1" affiliate KYLA (92.7) which is licensed to Fountain Valley, CA—nearly 50 miles to the south of Pasadena.

In a 2014 [petition to deny](#), EMF said the LPFM would create interference for "millions" of L.A. listeners since the low-power station would create "vast areas of interference" to KYLA, including in an area immediately surrounding the station's own transmitter, in part because the LPFM would be situated halfway up a mountainside maximizing its height above the heavily-populated L.A. basin. But the FCC consistently sided with Razorcake/Gorky Press, agreeing to grant it a license to build KFFL-LP in June 2016.

EMF filed several appeals however, arguing the proposal didn't satisfy the standard for a second-adjacent channel waiver, including the 2010 law which further opened the dial to LPFMs. But those efforts came up short. In a pair of 2017 rulings, the FCC again sided with the low-power advocates in a dispute about whether second-adjacent channel waiver requests should be approved in situations where the complaint is coming from a co-channel FM. "It makes no sense to require such an applicant to demonstrate why other parties which the second-adjacent spacing requirement was not intended to protect would not be harmed by the waiver," [the order](#) said, adding, "EMF does not challenge the Bureau's conclusion that Razorcake demonstrated that its proposal would not cause interference to any second-adjacent channel station and that it satisfied the minimum spacing requirements designed to ensure no interference to any co- or first-adjacent channel station."

Faced with the prospect of the LPFM soon signing-on, EMF has instead found an alternative solution to the problem. It has filed paperwork to transfer the Temple City, CA-licensed translator K212FA at 90.3 FM to Razorcake/Gorky Press. The translator—which is only about eight miles away from where the LPFM would have been licensed—would come without any monetary cost. But under a deal struck between the two companies, Razorcake/Gorky Press will surrender the construction permit for KFFL-LP thereby ending the long-running dispute over potential interference to KYLA before the low-power station even signs-on. "The parties believe that a settlement upon the terms set for in this agreement will serve the public interest in that it will speed the provision of service to the public by Razorcake, and resolve the matter without the need for the expenditure of time and sources of the parties and the Commission," said the [settlement agreement](#) filed with the FCC.

Because a translator cannot originate programming, Razorcake/Gorky Press will need to find a new source to feed programming 90.3 FM. While not including specifics in the filing, it appears to have found a solution via another new station coming to the Los Angeles market. The filing says KTCN (88.3) will feed the translator, presumably with an HD sub channel. KTCN is a Class A FM licensed to Acton, CA and owned by White Fox Horse Rescue.

Low Band VHF in Mexico?

One of the questions I've gotten from DXers is "wait, really?"

The combination of the 2018 repack authorization for Canal 51 to channel 2 and last month's court-ordered approval of a broadcast service on the channel have had people wondering, "wait they're actually building low-VHF now? Why so long?"



I wanted to explain why this has taken so long and why VHF may truly be the home of the most interesting developments in Mexican television

The Analog Days

When Mexican television first became a thing, on the night of August 31, 1950, it did so on channel 4. A high-VHF station, XELD-7 in

Matamoros, was the third ever built, signing on September 15, 1951. The wait for a UHF television station, however, would be much longer. On December 23, 1963, the only Mexican city ever describable as a UHF island got its first television station. XHS-23 Ensenada probably was on the U dial out of necessity and due to station spacing issues. When analog ended, Ensenada had managed to secure drop-in 2 and 13 (used by TV Azteca), but its other stations were 17, 23, 29 and 57.

Mexican UHF development was very slow indeed. The next U was in Mexicali: XHBM-14, which was approved in 1969. (Tijuana had two Us approved that would each take more than a decade to get going: XHAS-33 was initially approved in 1968 but began broadcasts in 1981, while XHBJ-45 ended up having a different applicant selected and started broadcasts in 1989.) In Mexico City, the concession for XHTC-16 was approved in 1964, but that station's lengthy history would see it move to 28 in the 80s, probably in order to allow land mobile services. (16 would not be home to another Mexican TV station until digital.)

The eighties, however, saw finally movement on the U front. In 1980, XHIJ-44 signed on in Ciudad Juárez, joined by XHTRM-22 Mexico City and XHMNL-28 Monterrey in 1982. More stations filtered in over the course of the decade, including more network repeaters like XHWDT Cd. Allende Coah. By the end of the analog era, however, 10 states still had no main TV stations on UHF, and Mexican policy had created a series of VHF drop-ins requiring channel adjustments (XHWX, XHMEN, XHIMT to name a few).

Digital Planning

With VHF stuffed, only one station was assigned a VHF digital frequency from the start. That was XHMTA-TDT 12 in Matamoros. By the end of the analog era, only two more had been approved, both intermittent operation/flash-cut cases: XHUS-TDT 8 Hermosillo and XHAMO-TDT 11 Colima (since moved to 30). The superior-for-digital UHF band was not that full in most places and straight up empty in others. There was room for almost everyone on UHF.

But when the analog era ended and repacking created additional constraints on UHF station space, suddenly there was room pretty much everywhere on UHF. Low-V was empty, but it was also inferior. We've seen a parade of new high-Vs in the months since. IFT-6 awarded three (XHQMUGU 9, XHROSL 10 and XHTDMX 11). The SPR holds seven unbuilt high-Vs on channel 13.

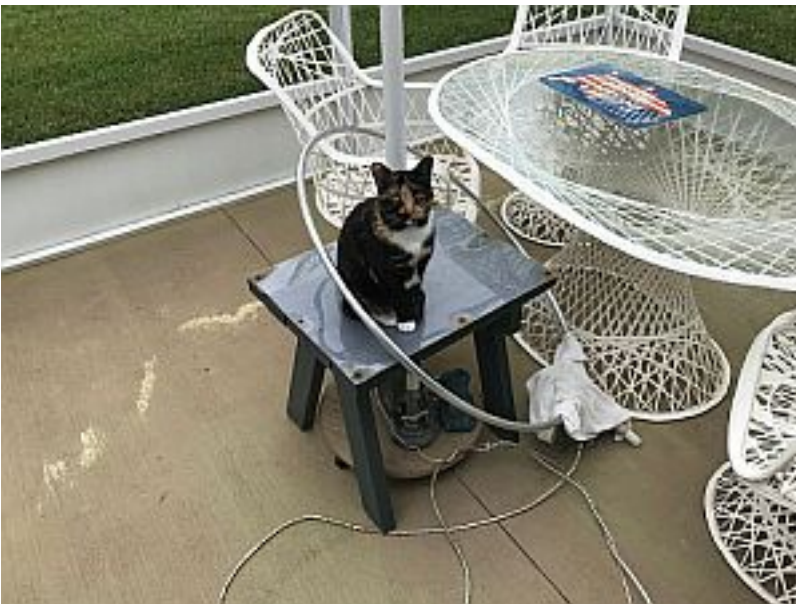

The fact that even in Mexico City there's room on VHF should indicate the magnitude of what's still available below channel 14. Some low-V assignments have been made available in recent PABFs; we'll see which is the first to be built. We'll also see how many people have low-V reception problems—and hopefully, this summer, we'll see some skip.

A New Log 23 Years Later!

Or Why Having Your Logs Published in the VUD is a Good Idea

So here I was, sitting at the computer like I usually do, back in 2017, when an email comes in, like they usually do. But this wasn't an ordinary email and it sure wasn't spam. It was an email from Raymie Humbert asking me a question. Here's the email...

On Tue, Jul 25, 2017 at 4:25 AM, Raymie Humbert <raymiex@gmail.com> wrote:

Hey Mike,

I was wondering if you have any 2Es logs in your books. Particularly to Mexico.

If you don't, I may have discovered one. In 1994. More specifically, June 26, 1994 (VUD screenshot enclosed).

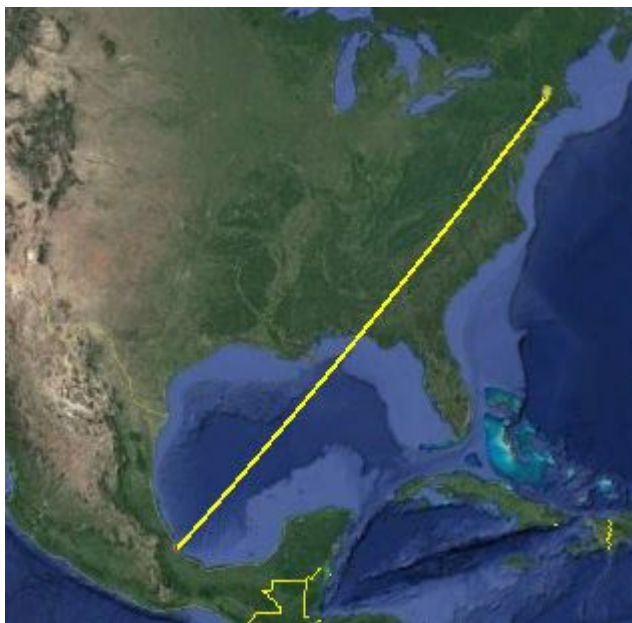
Normally, I would not have the confidence to dump this on you. But a 99.7 named Mar FM? It can only be one thing.

It's XHPB in Veracruz Puerto. It's *still* named Mar FM and has been known as such for pretty much its entire existence (and was the market's first FM). The path is nearly 2,100 miles. No other station would make sense. In the summer of '94, just a few 99.7s were on air: Veracruz Puerto, Ciudad Acuña, and Monterrey. Mar FM couldn't be any of the other two.

Let me know what you think.

I do remember hearing Mar FM on 99.7 during a skip opening and I remember including that in a report to the VUD, but of course, there was no reply and I shortly forgot about it, thinking it wasn't Mar FM but something else. And there it ended, or so I thought.

Who would have thought that 23 years later someone would be rummaging through the old scanned VUDs (which I myself scanned...every one of them) on the WTFDA website (wtfda.org), found my report and saw that logging and would ID it! It's crazy!



What this boils down to is that the VUD can be a permanent record of your DX loggings, if you want it to. Your logs are still available long after you threw away those sheets of paper with your logs on them. In my case, I've since thrown out all my scribbled DX log sheets prior to 1996 (everything since 1996 are scanned and on my own website (mikesdx.com)). Before 1996, the VUD is the only way I can find my logs before that year.

So consider cutting and pasting your logs to send them for publication in the VUD after you post them on Facebook and the online DX groups. Those are fleeting. The VUD is permanent.

And the log of XHPB 99.7, well it's not only the 4th Mexico station I've received here, but it's my longest double hop catch at 2095 miles in my 50 plus years of FM DXing from Connecticut.

Double Hop FM E Skip...It Happens!

With E skip season right around the corner, let's take a little time and review a few double hop events that have occurred over the past few years. You can read all about these at the WTFDA Forums (forums.wtfda.org) in the Got FM DX Forum.



Our most recent double hop event happened on July 31, 2016 when Bryce Foster, vacationing in Puerto Rico, heard CHLQ 93.1 Charlottetown, PEI and CIHI 93.1 Fredericton, NB via E skip. The distances are about 1904 miles.



Our next example of double hop FM skip was in May of 2013, when Chris Dunne in Pembroke Pines, FL heard KEWQ 92.5 in Warroad, MN. That's 1774 miles.



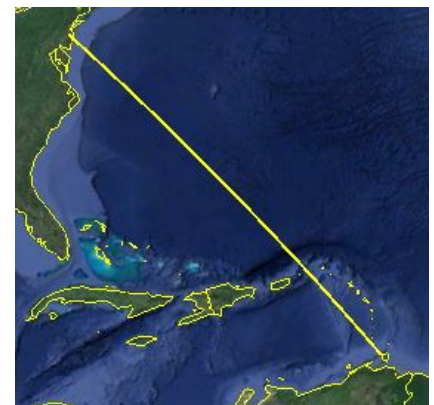
Moving along to July 24, 2013, Nick Langan snagged KAFF 92.9 in Flagstaff, AZ. That was a 2,000 mile logging!

And last, but not least, Nick did it again logging Red FM 96.7, Trinidad and Tobago for a 2,200 mile catch back on July 5, 2012. This one is 2,200 miles.

Can it happen again? Of course it can! Northeast FM DXers just need to resist the urge to aim your antennas at Florida and aim them around 130 degrees instead. We might not log too much (most of us already have too many Florida stations in the log already), but what we hear may be new and exotic!

The bottom line is that double hop skip is there but sometimes we miss it because we concentrate on single hop skip instead.

This summer be on the lookout for double hop skip!

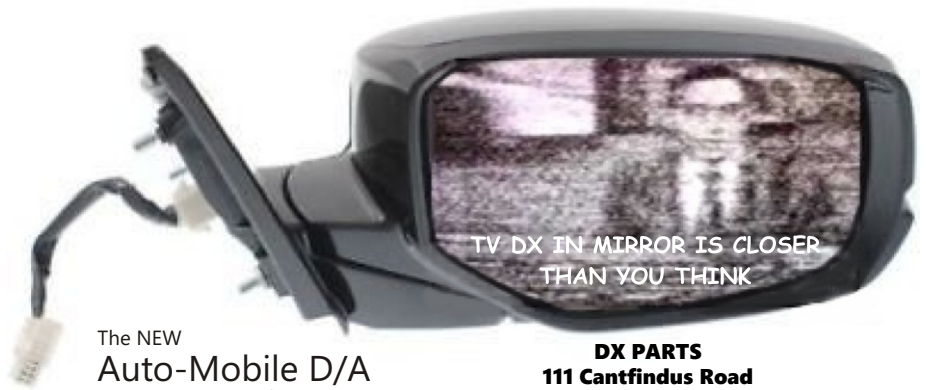

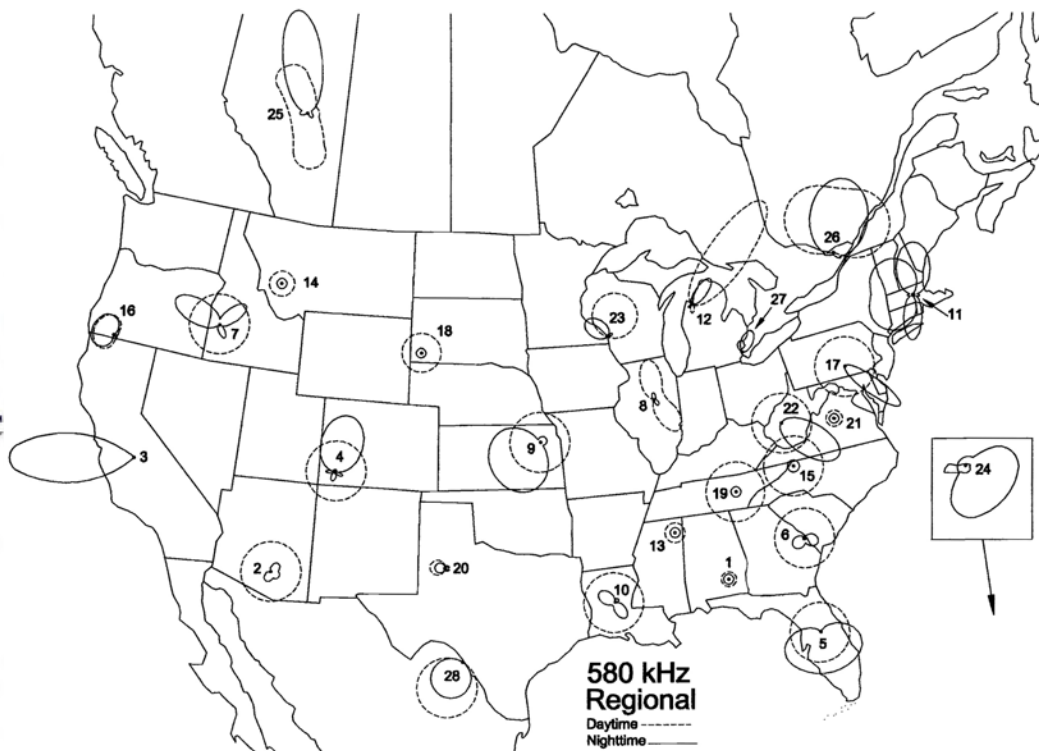

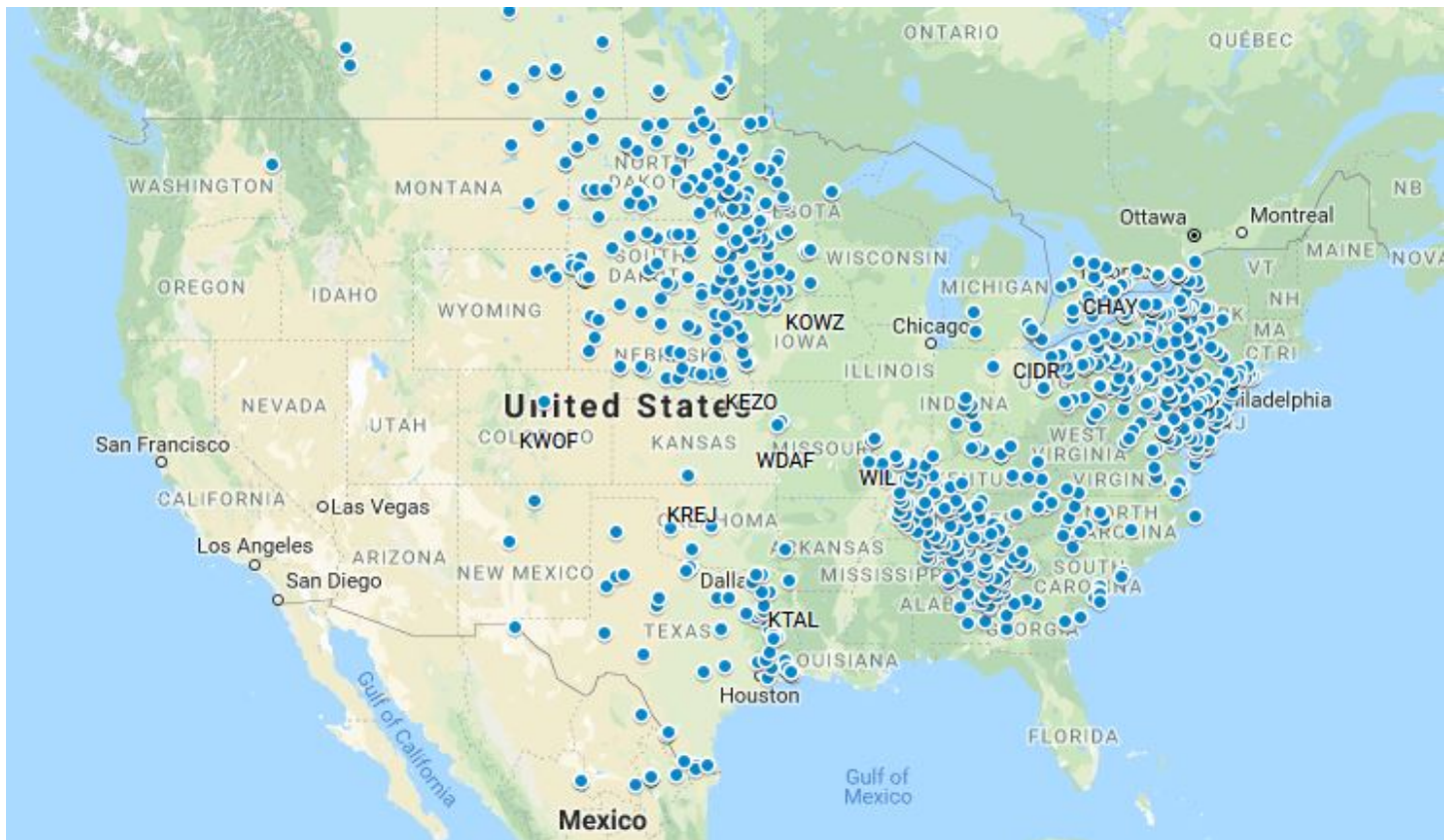

FROM A POST ON THE TV AND FM DXING FACEBOOK GROUP

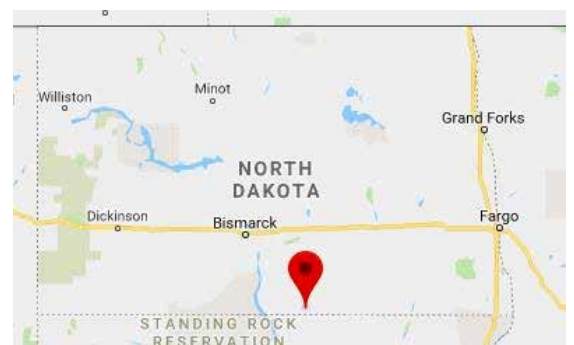
One of the best days of Eskip I have ever enjoyed from one of the best locations I've ever been at for a summer FM DX trip to Zeeland, ND. In about 10 minutes I figured out how to display everything (already in Excel) on a Google Map, pretty easy in fact although I don't think multiples from the same city are displayed. Anyway what you see is the 200 or so stations received during live DXing the week of July 9th, 2018 within 400 miles plus the SDR captured Meteor Scatter catches that week plus the incredible Eskip of July 10th. I still have plenty more to add but figured I'd share the map as it looks now.



You, too, can experience super Es just like this! Here's the recipe for success: 1. Use an outdoor fringe antenna 2. For a receiver use an SDR instead of a conventional radio/tuner to capture 6,8 or 10 mhz of spectrum, up to the entire FM band with an Elad FDM-S3 3. Record the opening and play it back at a later date, logging every station you heard.

Do your DXing from a remote location, if possible (Zeeland, ND qualifies as remote).

And even if you can't take off to the middle of nowhere, DXing with an SDR will still deliver better results than DXing with an XDR-F1HD or an FM tuner, no matter where you live.

As noted last month, the KSNV STA in Las Vegas is for a Single Frequency Network during the NAB Convention in about a week. This STA covers a transmitter in the parking lot of the Las Vegas Convention Center, where the Convention is being held.

Reduced-power STAs in Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands are, of course, due to lingering damage from Hurricane Maria.

Regarding WFLD Chicago... yes, I realize neither of these buildings still officially carries those names...

WNWO-TV Toledo has requested an extension of their repack construction permit. They report the company that had been contracted to do the work has gone bankrupt & ceased operation. There are a limited number of tower companies capable of doing this kind of work – losing one may cause other delays in repack work.

You may note HAATs listed for a couple of LPTV changes. The FCC still does not report HAATs for low-power stations. However, they offer public access to a Web service which will quickly calculate HAAT given antenna coordinates and height above sea level – and that information is easily available for each technical change reported.

Bell TV in Canada has requested permission to shut down more of their relay transmitters. These transmitters are all still operating in analog and approaching end of life. Most are low-powered; however, common skip target CJOH-TV-6 Deseronto, Ontario and two skip targets in Saskatchewan are affected.

As always, thanks to Raymie Humbert for Mexican information. Many of the Mexican stations listed below are not entirely new. They're listed here because the government recently released technical information.

Thanks also to Jim Thomas for information from southwest Missouri.

There are no DX columns in this issue of the VUD because the editors received no reports. However, there were two TV reports by WTFDA members on Facebook that we were able to find, and here is one of them.

The winter DX drought is ending with this morning's first tropo DX over 150 miles since Jan 4th here in Poughkeepsie.. Signals in down the East Coast, with new log #341 with WUNJ 29/39 (UNC) Wilmington, NC at 566 miles. This is my first Wilmington station on DTV or FM. No other NC stations this morning, but several from Norfolk area, WHRO-16/15 and WTKR 40/3 the best. Also of note WMAR 38/2, WBFF 46/45, and WMPB 29/67, plus WRC 48/4 and WFDC 15/14 from Washington... WRC's signal was quite nice and was in for a while. And autologger caught WRIC 22/8 Petersburg, VA through local W23ER splatter.
