HRO. Ham Radio Outlet has a Black Friday Sale going on and one item that sticks out is a \$50 discount on a RSPDX SDR from SDRPlay. The link to HRO is on the right column along with a link to information about the sale. Take a peek. (Note: it seems their sale is over and the RSPDX is back to \$214.95 but their RSP-1A is now just \$124.95).

AIRSPY. Airspy also has a Black Friday Sale going on where prices are marked down 30% on their SDRs. An Airspy Mini which usually sells for \$99USD is now going for just \$79.20. However, the shipping (Priority Mail) will cost you \$15.00 extra bringing the total cost up to about \$100.00. To me the shipping costs are a but much especially when the item is only the size of a USB stick. (Note: at this time the Mini is back up to its usual price of \$99).

SDRCONNECT. Preview #2 of SDRPlay's SDRConnect software software became available today (11/27). A list of improvements made can be found here. Unfortunately, the feature that FM DXers were most looking for, RDS decoding, was not included. Two new features added in this preview are direct frequency entry and a new notch filter, which seems to be modeled after HDSDR and if that's the case, they picked a good style to model.

<u>DATABASE HELP NEEDED</u>. Jim Thomas is editor for Mexico and Central America. Jim writes "I am curious if there is anyone that can assist me with Mexico DB entries as they come in from Raymie, at least until the end of the year? I am so far behind on updating Central America and Caribbean updates. It's going to take a bit just to get updates on Guatemala accomplished. Whoever could help needs to understand Spanish and be able to read the RPC/IFT pdf documents that show technical data. I can stay *in the loop* with the emails and answer any questions. I just would like to know if there is someone else that could be a secretary for a while. The biggest issue is the DB numbering assignment, which I keep in a spreadsheet. ANYONE REMEMBER CLARK INGRAM? Clark was a radio nerd who made it to the big leagues as a Top 40 DJ. He worked mostly in Pennsylvania, both Northeast PA and Pittsburgh, and along the Southern Tier of New York, but he also worked in Philadelphia and New York City. He died recently at the age of 66 partly due to health issues. You wouldn't recognize the name unless you were around the northeast during that time or a member of the WTFDA in the '70s.


Now, how all of this ties in with the WTFDA is that Clarke was a prolific contributor to the VUD back in the years 1974 to 1976 submitting columns and other original material. He was also part of the WTFDA's Board of Directors and was editor-in-chief and publisher of the VUD from January 1977 to January 1978 when he resigned the position. That period was a trying time for the club with membership declining and member submission dropping. In one year, Clark brought it back to life.
