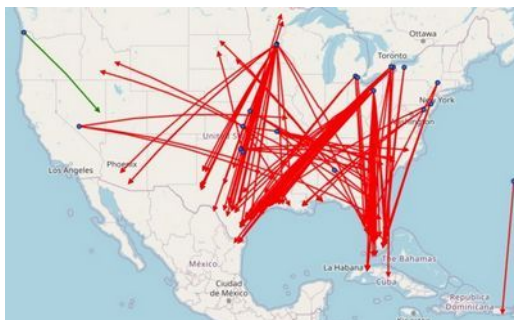

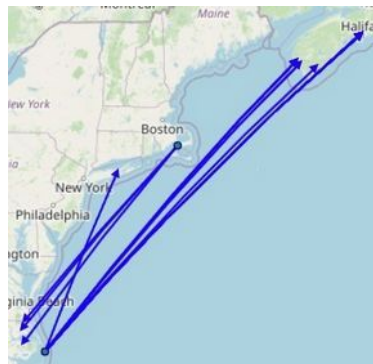
NEW MEMBERS. This time we welcome two more WTFDA members. Russel Lay (Nags Beach, NC) rejoins the club and we add our first Australian member. He's David Vitek in Port Holme, SA, where they are just beginning to enter skip season. Welcome to both of you!

AUGUST E-SKIP. August is considered by most of us to be the end of the skip season for the year. I think that a few of us were surprised to find out how good it turned out to be. The evenings of August 4th and 6th were good openings to the western US. August 11th was a big skip day for much of North America as were August 13th and 14th. August 22nd was a very good opening for Central and Western US from 4 to 7pm CDT. This opening should have been "it" for the summer but it wasn't. Skip returned one last time on August 24th where it was observed by Randy in Nevada and Mat in Palmdale, CA in their evening hours.

And double hop, yes, there was double hop. We have screenshots of some of it. One is from August 13th that shows Randy's reception of WOEX 96.5 in Orlando, Florida from Goldfield, Nevada. The screengrab on the right shows the full extent of the skip event in North America. Skip loggings are red.



Randy wasn't the only person with 2-hop in August. Pat Martin got into Alabama. Mat in CA caught skip to the mid-Atlantic coast. Bill Hepburn in Ontario found skip from Mexico. And I think it was Kyle in Washington (the state) who received double hop from Ohio. The winner of the double hop this summer is the west coast. (If your logs are not on this map, why aren't they??)



Yes, there was some really great skip in August, but there was some very special tropo received on August 17th at around 4:40pm ET. And it was TV TROPO. Rick Shaftan (Rodanthe NC, on the outer banks) was ready to go for a bike ride when he checked Rabbitears and noticed that something was up. What Rick found was CJCH-DT5 in Halifax, NS among other Nova Scotia loggings. CJCH clocks in at 1419km or 864 miles.

The crazy thing about this is that because of the high winds (from hurricanes and storms) that occasionally batter the outer banks of North Carolina, Rick keeps his antennas close to the ground. If Rick was using his 7 foot dish, the height above ground would be perhaps five feet.

Congrats to Rick on this outstanding reception!

AND LAST BUT NOT LEAST. As you can see, there was plenty of Dxing going on in August but if you weren't on the logger (or Facebook or Slack) you'd never know about it. It seems like some Dxers like to report their DX to their own little online "tribe" and forget about the WTFDA. Folks, if you are a WTFDA member I need your support. Eric begs for TV submissions. 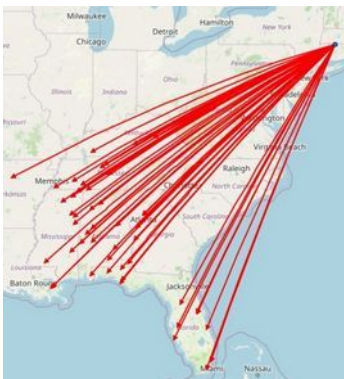
Another summer without E-skip so far...I have not had an E-skip opening since June 11, 2023. That will make two straight summers without an E-skip opening reaching the FM band. I was able to add five new FM stations from Missouri in early June, including my closest unheard, KCVX 91.7 in Salem. Missouri overtook Illinois as my most productive DX state in the June 9 opening, with the station putting my home state over the top being KCKP 100.9 from Laurie, near the Lake of the Ozarks. I nulled out locals on 88.1 and 88.7 to pull in DX. I was able to totally null out WSIE to hear KCVH, which was carrying the Bott Radio Network, the same group as my local KSIV 91.5. KHJR 88.1 was a pleasant surprise. That brings the Missouri FM total to 217. I also had an opening to Chicago on July 24 with one new DTV logged. I listened for several hours during the meteor shower of August 12-13 but only logged regional tropo. The tropo opening of the wee hours of August 15 was a pleasant surprise, not only adding new NWR stations from Minnesota and Wisconsin, but two new National Weather Service offices. WXX41's programming is from the La Crosse, WI office, while WXX88 originates from the Chanhassen, MN office. The FM total now stands at 1,393; the NWR total now stands at 145. 73 and good DX from the Florissant Valley Dial Twister.

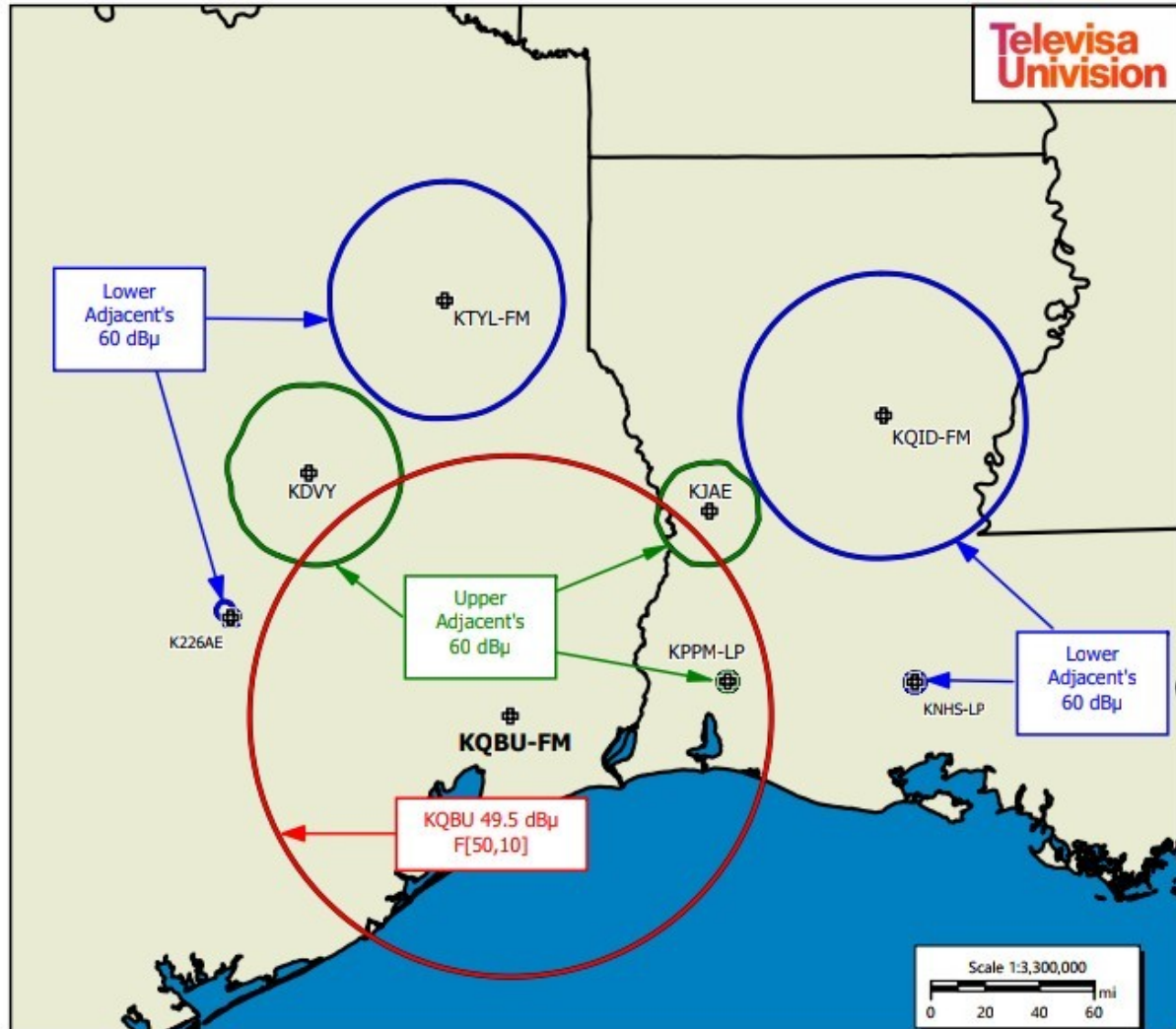

TelevisaUnivision, Inc, owner of Tichenor License Corporation, licensee of KQBU-FM ("KQBU"), hereby notifies that it commenced hybrid digital operation on 8/20/2025.

In accordance with Report and Order FCC24-105 and 73.404(f) of the Commission's rules, KQBU is operating asymmetrical sidebands of -13 dBc lower, -17 dBc upper for a total ERP of 100 kW analog, 7 kW digital. The relevant first adjacent stations are KDVY, KJAE, KTYL and KQID; and low power station KPPM that is not protected. As shown in this exhibit below, KQBU's 49.5 dBμ F(50, 10) contour does not exceed the lower adjacent channel station's 60 dBμ F(50, 50) contours.

HYDRASDR RFONE: A NEW UPCOMING SDR SIMILAR TO THE AIRSPY R2

Recently, we have heard news about a new [upcoming SDR called the HydraSDR RFOne](#), created by Benjamin Vernoux, who also worked on the design of the Airspy. The HydraSDR RFOne appears to be very closely based on the Airspy R2 design, and it has very similar specs, including a 24-1800 MHz RX range, 12-bit ADC, and up to 10 MSPS sampling rate output, giving 9 MHz of spectrum. While HydraSDR is very similar to the Airspy R2 in design, as it uses the same main LPC4370 and the same overall design and layout, there are a few minor changes. The HydraSDR RFOne uses a Rafael R828D tuner chip, instead of the Rafael R820T2 tuner. The R828D has three input pins; however, it appears that only one pin is connected to the SMA input port. The other two ports are connected to uFL connectors on the PCB, which are inaccessible from the metal enclosure.

A second interesting feature is that it comes with a much larger enclosure that can house up to three HydraSDR boards in one. Also, a USB-C connector is used instead of the microUSB (we note that the device would still be USB2.0, not USB3.0).

Another differentiating point is that HydraSDR will be made in the USA, versus China, where the Airspy R2 is made. This may be good for US customers now that the Trump-China tariffs have been implemented. But we have recently seen that iTead, Airspy's Chinese manufacturing partner, recently opened a US store with US stock. So it seems that the retail price of the Airspy will not appear to be affected by tariffs.

REVIEW OF THE HYDRA SDR

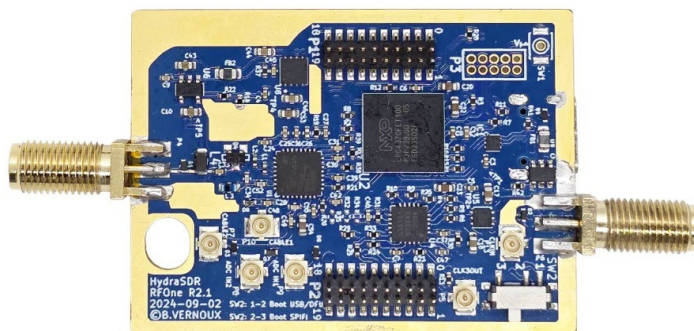
I like the Hydra, but SDR++, the approved software for interacting with it, needs some work. It's not very good at decoding RDS-throws a lot of fake codes which change rapidly, and you have to watch for the legit one amongst them to identify stations. It does work with SDR#; when you open the software it thinks it is an AirSpy R2. Playback of recorded baseband files within SDR++ is missing the ability to jump around within a recorded file; you can only play it from the start to end. If you stop mid-file, it resets to the start of the file. There doesn't appear to be an immediate plan to add this feature either from what I have read. If I access the Hydra in SDR# it will only record 8 MHz width instead of 10 which is a trade off for using software that will allow you to move around within a recorded file.

I was unable to open an SDR++ recorded file in SDR# though; I thought that could be a workaround. If you have an SDR that can record 10 MHz already, you probably don't need this one. But if you don't, this capability is nice, and has been useful in the past few weeks to capture skip signals and boost my logs. It seems to be less fragile than the AirSpy.

I was hoping to run two of them simultaneously from the same laptop, but when I do, the result is a stuttering sound on the second one, even if bandwidth is brought down to 2.5 MHz from the maximum allowable 10 MHz. This is on a new 32 GB memory laptop with nothing else installed but Microsoft 365. SDR++ does run fine on a 16 GB memory laptop as well, so there doesn't appear to be a minimum memory needed to effectively record 10 MHz at once, so this doesn't require a new laptop. That said, I guess I'll need two laptops to record 20 MHz at once which is cost prohibitive. With last night's skip I manually tuned 98-108 and recorded 88-98. I have about 35 minutes of audio to review. Recording at 10 MHz takes up about 2 GB per minute. I haven't tried writing direct to an external hard drive in real time; I'm just writing to the laptop's hard drive and transferring the files after the fact to a 256 GB flash drive to review on my main laptop I use for both work and home activities (I have SDR++ and SDR# installed on my work laptop so I can listen on the road).

SDR++ has a lot of adjustable parameters. I've found the maximum allowable gain largely depends on where I have my antenna pointed.

It ships with a USB-C female to USB-A female plug, but you can switch this to USB-C to USB-C with no issues (I'm limited on ports on my laptop). Antenna connector is the same small SMA like on AirSpy.

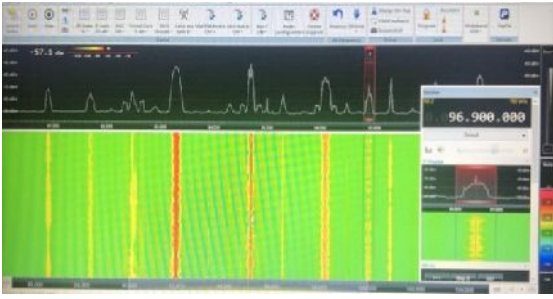

AL

WZTZ 101.1 Elba AL is still Classic Hits, but the branding has changed from “Z101” to “Retro FM 101.1.” The station positions itself as “South Alabama’s Retro Hits.”

CO

Frontier Frequencies has taken over formerly silent KSTY 104.5 Cañon City and brought it back to life as its old format, Country, as “104.5 Star Country.”

FL

“104.3 The Shark” no longer swims in Miami. Abandoning their Alternative format, WSFS 104.3 Miramar is now simulcasting WQAM 560 Miami with new WQAM-FM call letters. Sadly, for them, they’re stuck with the Miami Heat instead of the best team in south FL, the Florida Panthers.

MD

WTRA-LP 106.5 Berlin MD is brand new to the air. Format is listed as religious, which oftentimes means a bunch of paid programs.

MS

Another LPFM is on the air and DX ready. WZHI-LP 95.5 Maben MS airs a mix of classic hits and Gospel music.

OH



Yet again, for the second time this year, WIRO Ironton OH has changed format. This time, tho, they’ve also changed frequency. Early in the year they switched to Classic Country as “107.1 Hank FM.” Now, with a switch to 106.7, they’re Conservative Talk as “106.7 The Eagle.” And if that wasn’t enough, the switch moves them to the Portsmouth OH market from Huntington WV.

Oldies formatted “97.7/106.7 The Oasis,” hitting the Dayton and Cincinnati markets, is now a trio. WOXY 97.7 Mason OH and WNKR 106.7 Williamstown KY welcome WYDB 94.5 Englewood OH as the third signal of the group. WYDB had been Conservative Talk under a \$10k per month LMA with Salem Media.

PA

The 800 pound gorilla of radio isn’t getting its way in Williamsport PA. iHeart is being denied access to its transmitter site for W235BA by the property owner. “Rock 94.9” is the translator for WRKK 1200 Hughesville PA, and it’s off the air. To keep the Rock format going, it’s been moved to WBYL 95.5 Salladasburg PA as “Rock 95.5.” That station was half of the Country “Bill 95” simulcast, which will remain on WBLJ 95.1 Shamokin PA.

SC

AAA “105.5 The Bridge” WCOO 105.5 Kiawah Island SC is changing things up a bit. Going deeper into Americana music, its positioning statement is “The Sound of the Lowcountry.”

TN

Regional Mexican WPFT 106.3 Pigeon Forge TN is no more, replaced by Conservative Talk “Talk 106.3.” It’s heavy with syndicated shows. Will Dolly Parton listen at Dollywood? Maybe.

UT

KCAY 100.7 Enterprise UT is now Oldies from the ‘60’s and ‘70s. Using *Scott Shannon’s True Oldies Channel*, the station now bills itself as “True Oldies 107.7.” KCAY is one of 5 Redrock Media stations in the St. George UT market.

VA

Soft AC is the new format for WNOH 105.3 Norfolk. The iHeartMedia station had been stunting with Christmas music prior to the change. I remember visiting the station in 1979 when it was owned by CBN as WXRI.

WI

Liberal Talk WGBW 1590 Denmark WI and its translator, W250CV 97.9 Green Bay, has flipped to Oldies. Once upon a time the station had aired Scott Shannon’s “True Oldies Channel.”

EMF grabs two more WI stations. WLUM 102.1 and WLDB 93.3, both in Milwaukee, are the latest acquisitions for the 800 pound gorilla of Christian radio. \$4 million is the price tag for the two, which join WLVE 105.3 Mukwonagois in their Milwaukee area stable. Gotta figure the new two will be K-Love and Air 1. How about Radio Nueva Vida for Mukwonagois? Maybe.....

OK, so it’s not about a station changing format, but perhaps some of you knew this gentleman (and I sincerely mean that word). Per HisAir.net: “HisAir is deeply saddened to report the passing of former KSWP/KAVX/Lufkin GM Al Ross. Al served the radio ministry over 25 years. Al suffered a stroke nearly 3 years ago and never fully recovered.” In OKC and Tulsa, he was better known on air as Benjamin Cain. He hired me at KJYO 102.7 OKC in 1981, and I’m still in the iHeart OKC cluster (Insilco owned KJYO then). RIP, my friend.

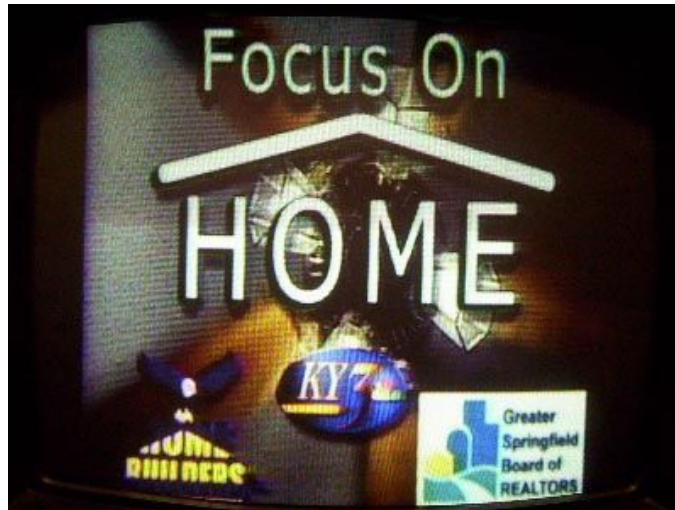

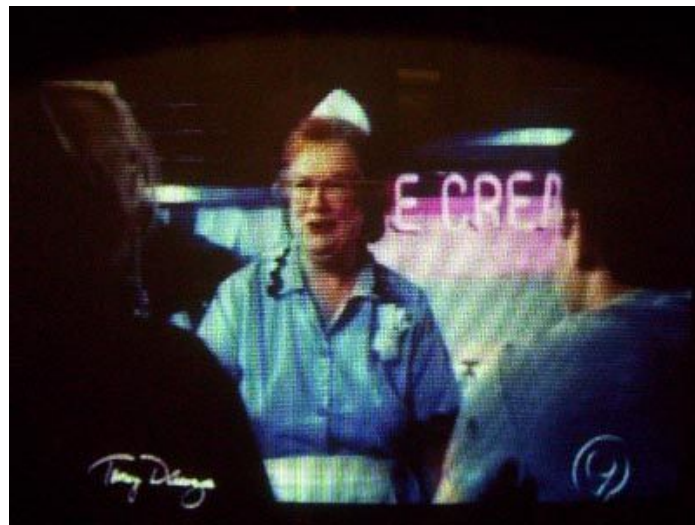

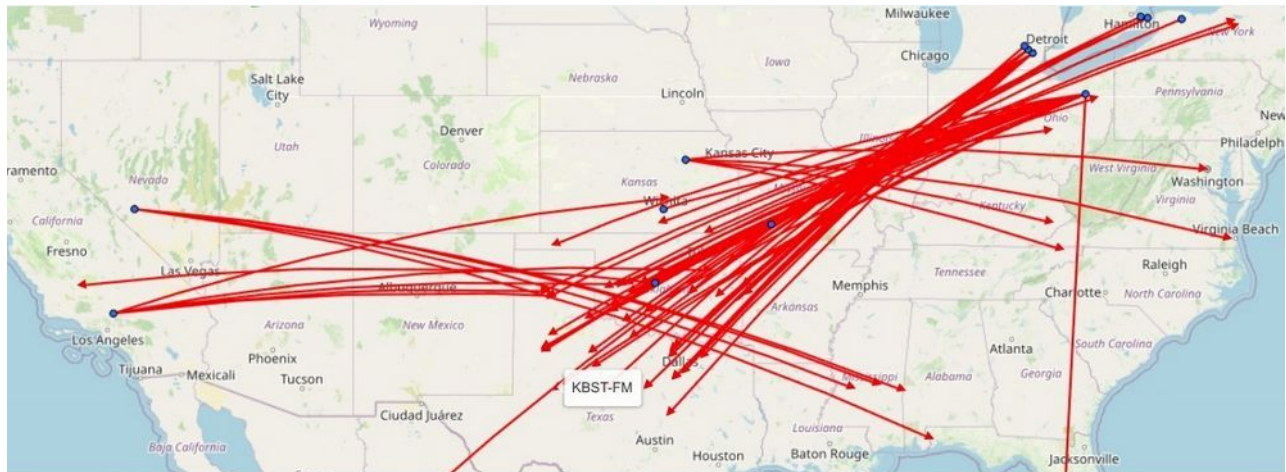
