



TPOPO, TROPO AND MORE TROPO... The reports in this month's DX columns appear to be just a primer for next month. Throughout the month of September, tropon openings did abound. There were many duct openings reported on both VHF and UHF. Of this month's reports, September 10th was a standout day. Certainly, many DXers have added plenty of new stations totals.

Bill Draeb, now closing on the 500 station mark, has done one equipment step beyond Bob Cooper. In an effort to keep adding new stations, Bill is now using two B-T CMA-U preamps! One for the normal UHF band and the other a translator range unit, peaked for the channels above 65. Bill switches them back and forth with coaxial relays.

OSL CORNERS RETURN... As our cover indicates, October brings the return of the OSL columns. In the coming months you will see a few changes in the OSL columns, which we hope will allow more effective use of space. From time to time, OSL cards and letter veries will also be included. More on this in future OSL Corners.

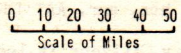

Mike Dorner, Jr., claims WPQR 99.3 Uniontown PA is deleted. Another company has applied for WPQR's frequency. He also notes that KWAW 95.9 Webster City IA, although long silent, is not deleted. He also says both WBAQ 97.9 Greenville and WDRU 95.3 Drew MS are mono, even though WDRU's letterhead says its stereo. Listening from Metairie LA, he reports the new KOB5-FM 104.5 Orange TX has top 40 music, mono, and unbelievably bad sound. . . with a very obvious hum."

Off the Air?

Shelby Remington, New Haven, on a drive to the Gaspe peninsula, discovered that CJRM 93.5 Montreal and CHGB-FM Ste. Anne de la Pocatiere PQ were not heard, and wonders if they have been deleted. [CHGB-FM operates or operated on 102.9.] CFDM 104.3 Drummondville apparently is not on the air yet, while both Montreal's CBC-owned stations now have stereo: CBM-FM 95.1 and CBF-FM 100.7.

And, Mike Dorner is quite correct in stating, as he did in a letter, that WBND-FM 97.9 Charlotte Amalie is deleted. Hereafter this column will note U. S. territorial FM station changes. By the time the next FM ATLAS goes to print, I expect to list all the FM stations of Cuba, Haiti, Dominican Republic, Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands. Helping in

this project is Dick Clark. Publication, however, is nearly a year away, and awaits the sale of some 3000 copies of the present edition still on hand.

On the map to the left, WORO's transmitter is about 10 miles south of Corozal, and gives city-grade coverage to San Juan, Guayama, Utuado, and Arecibo. Ponce is outside the WORO coverage area, shielded by the "Cordillera Central." WORO's music is mostly Latin, easy listening, with ballad type vocals.

Shelby Remington, New Haven CT, notes that WFCS *90.1 10 w New Britain should have begun operations Sept. 11. WNYC-FM 93.9 New York is stereo at times, while WFME 94.7 is mono [Newark] with a poor signal. WMMT 94.9 Mt. Washington signs off at 0100; WDNH 97.5 Dover NH operates 0600-0100. WQXR-FM 96.3 is now 100% Dolby "B," "probably involved big deal by Harman Kardon to sell Citation 14-Dolby tuners!" In other Canada news, Shelby found CJBR-FM 101.5 Rimouski PQ to have an excellent signal [their transmitter is 10 miles south of town], in French with solid rock ["This station was really impressive, sounded like a French version of Pacifica, homebrew drama, etc."]. CHLT-FM 102.7^W Sherbrooke is French, MOR, had a very abrupt 0600 sign on. Shelby "played with AJ-1510 [Heath receiver], and it sure is a nice toy, but the lack of off-tuning hurts. Also have used the SEL-300 and was quite impressed with the Sherwood's sensitivity.

Mike Collins, 2021 Main Street, Stratford CT 06497, quite an FM history buff, sent some exciting histories on WHCA-FM/WHOM-FM 92.3 New York, WDRG-FM 46.5, 93.7 and 102.9 Hartford, also WLAE, WSCB, WLVI 93.7 Hartford and WHCN 105.9 Hartford. I doubt that space will permit publication of all or any of these, so if you're interested try dropping Mike a line. Another source that researches station histories is Broadcast Pro-File, P. O. Box 982, Hollywood CA 90028. They have a free listing of stations profiled (each station profile is \$2.50 for FM; \$5.00 AM). I have profiles for WGNV 44.7 and 97.9 New York and WCFM 99.5 Washington DC. He wondered why some of the early FM stations had two sets of call letters. WDRG's FM affiliate was known as W1XPW and W65H. The last two digits of the FM frequency were given, followed by the initial of the city. The first call [such as W1XPW] was experimental, while I believe the second was the "permanent" call.

Rich Bosse, 12 Lennox Avenue, Windsor CT 06095, who is starting out in FM DX listening and verification collecting, would like to get in touch with other club members in his area.

KBIM-FM Roswell NM [94.9 mHz] notes that they were not stereo this summer, but John King, general manager, expects they will be back on \$ before the end of September. "We program the IGM series of country and western music with Chris Lane announcing from sign on 'til 6 p. m., Monday through Sunday. From 6 p.m. 'til midnight, we program easy listening music. This will be our stereo portion." Michael Drew, Milwaukee Journal columnist states that WFNO 102.9 will become WBCS. WFNO, with its "for women only" format lost some \$80,000 in 14 months of programming separately from WRIT (AM). Now, with the loss of WNIL (AM) as a country station [it is now rock along with WZOU-FM 95.7], WBCS will stand for "big country sound." They are reportedly spending \$40,000 on new equipment. Automation, no doubt.

From Manhattan KS, Les Prus notes that KMKF 101.7^W is on the air 0600-0100 daily, while little KSDB *88.1 returned for the school year. Equipment is being installed in Great Bend for the 100-watt [ERP, no doubt] FM translator, stereo, to re-broadcast the signal of KLOQ 105.5 Lyons on 99.3. KLOQ calls it "the first high power FM booster station in the United States!"

Bill Dickerman, Williamsport PA, reports that WCNV-FM *91.3 Syracuse NY uses a Gates 20 kw transmitter with an ERP of 18.6 kw h & v, and is interested in hearing from distant areas about reception.

I joined the club in July and this is my 1st. time to report in this column. I am not sure where to send my rpt - to the Southern section or to the Northern section. (Just keep on sending them here, Lowell, but please give specifics of stns hrd, dates, calls and times, REW) How does once go about finding what (club news) goes where & what (club supplies) can be obtained from where? I first became interested in FM DXing in July 1970 when I accidentally tuned in some Es & hrd a stn in CO, 1 in TX, 1 in OK and 1 in MA. I sent ltrs to them & they all verified. I went ahead to verify about 20 other semi-locals, & then after a couple of months I lost interest & did not DX any more until I stumbled on to the big Es opening on June 2, which rejuvenated my interest again. Since Jun. 2 1972 I have rptd 22 states & Bermuda. I am still in the process of getting my log straightened out & I have no idea of how many stns I have rptd; however, I will send in a more detailed rpt on what has been hrd and verified (veries go to D. Noe, REW) here next time. There have been several good Es openings here since Jun. 2. All the stns hrd. were from the W, SW or NW. I sure would like to get an opening from New England as I haven't hrd anything from that area this summer. (Same here, REW). w/ the exception of Jun. 2, all ES have been hrd in afternoon. I have found great pleasure in FM DXing because it does not seem to require elaborate equipment. Set-up here is a Heath AR-17 rx & antenna a folded dipole of 300 ohm twinlead hanging vertically from the eave of house. Tried horiz. doublet, but did not do as well. 73.

Back now from Europe and teaching a pleasant course at Université de Liège. Tuned FM there and noted the dominance, there in E. Belgium, of W. German stns throughout the European band, w/ magnificent CL pgms, European folk & other formats. FM is really flourishing on the continent, especially in those countries which, like W. Germany, were missed out when the major MW frequencies were assigned under the Copenhagen plan. Countries hrd in Liège were W. Germany, Holland, Belgium, France, England and tentative Switzerland. Turkish-language programming proved to be a German service for Gastarbeiter (foreign workers). Many European FM rx's cover only 88-104 MHz. The band is very crowded. Only fixed services were heard in the upper band, and directly below 88 MHz.

Since returning, tropo has been in full swing, w/ a single fine opening as far N as Waterloo IA (a full 840 mi.), but more typical ducts spreading W & E along the Gulf. FL is now my #3 state and can be expected to move into #2 position ahead of LA if current tropo keeps up; of course, TX maintains its lead and is unlikely ever to be unseated.

If I may quote Mr. Dick Womack, CE of KRES, 104.7, Moberly MO: "Apparently, FM DXing is becoming increasingly popular, as our mail flow has certainly picked up during the past 3 years. FM DXers seem to be outnumbering their AM counterparts at least five-to-one." Need I comment? My Popular Electronics article on FM DX will, by the way, largely be rerun in Communications Handbook 1973, to be on the newsstands Nov. 1972. We'll try to catch up this month. My moving around this summer confused some of you who sent reports to the "wrong" address, but we think we have them all now.

There has been some increase of tropo through August in the upper Midwest. Average conditions have picked up with decline of Es, and there was a good opening around 13-14 Aug. noted in North Dakota and Manitoba. Es was observed on many dates throughout August, but conditions were not as good as July, which is normal. Even then, the MUF managed to push into FM at times. The only highlight was an after-midnight Es opening on the 16th, upping totals by one to 266 stations, from 37 states, 1 province, 7 countries. UHF total is 65, w/16 of those on xltr band. Best single channel is 3, w/44 stations; worst VHF is 13, w/only 7. Propagation breakdown: Es, 95 stations; tropo, 172; MS, 3 (2 of them hiband); duplications, 4. Best state, not surprisingly, is Texas, w/70 stations; next is Alabama, 19, and Louisiana, 18. From all of Mexico, I have 21 stations (Es and tropo). These totals are after 17 months of activity in the San Antonio area. Enjoyed very much meeting all the conventioners, and special thanks to Ron Le Blanc for hosting the affair.

Recently, I've been getting KTXL 40 Sacramento in late afternoons (around 6 PM) with fairly good video and audio. Sometimes I see it mornings before going to work at 7 AM, but with lots of snow and no audio. The only antenna is the built-in UHF loop on my Zenith B&W receiver. The xmtr is some 65 miles away, at walnut Grove, between Sacramento and Stockton, but over some rough terrain.

Also, around 2 AM lately, I've tried for some early Es, with no success. Along with all of our locals, ch. 6 is covered with FM stations all bunched together. Old KCPT-19 transmitter will be used to boost the power of KPOB-15 in Poplar Bluff, MO, so UHF DXer's should keep a lookout for these two. 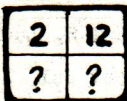

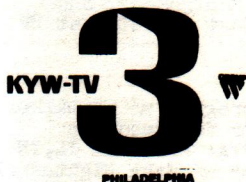

With this month's column, CCI begins carrying "public service spots" in the form of TV station identification slides. Many stations use very distinctive (and sometimes unique) styles in their IDs, and often retain these particular styles for several years. If the TV DXer becomes familiar with these styles, this knowledge will definitely help in identification of loggings which otherwise lack sufficient data (LSD) for identification. Example: KYW-3 in Philadelphia frequently runs the ID slide at left during the early morning hours. When received by meteor skip, however, identification is extremely difficult due to the tiny call letters and city name. Yet the style of the "3" can be easily made out, and is a dead giveaway to this station's identity. In this column, all such ID slides will be located on the left of each page - material concerned with unID loggings will remain on the right to avoid confusion. DXers are also reminded to familiarize themselves with ID styles that may appear in DX photos and other columns elsewhere in the VUD.

MORE ANTENNA QUESTIONS

QUESTION: I can't fit a 7' dish on my mast with separate LB and HB yagis, but a 5' dish will fit. How will UHF reception be affected?

ANSWER: This question requires two answers: (1) differences in performance between 5' and 7' Finco's and (2) possible interaction between VHF and UHF antennas.

The gain of a 5' Finco is about 2.5 to 3 db less than a 7' Finco. Parabolic gain is about proportional to dish area. A 7' dish has about 38 feet of mouth area, whereas a 5' dish has about 19 feet of area. The twice as large 7-footer produces from 17 to 21 db gain as opposed to 14 to 18 db gain for the 5-footer.

Expect the front lobe on a 5-footer to be 30% wider than on a 7-foot dish. The overall pattern of the 5-footer may not be as "clean" due to poorer focusing or less effective feed antenna.

What this means to the "eye" is that local reception won't seem effected much. However, since the capture area of a 5-footer is only 1/2 that of a 7-footer, daily scatter results would be noticeable. If 200 mile scatter is just barely there on the 5-footer, the 7-footer should produce much more sync-in stability and almost constant signal. Range should be extended by 50 miles, all things (terrain, station power, antenna height, etc.) being the same.

However, VHF and UHF antennas may not cooperate together on a common mast. Several incidents of degraded U or V reception have been reported due to objects in the field of a dish.

A long all-channel (especially log periodic) antenna mounted just below the dish could degrade U and V reception. Such an incident has produced poor VHF gain on channels 2, 3, and 4 in one case. Rotating the UHF antenna by 90° with respect to the VHF antenna can reduce or eliminate this, but how performance suffers is difficult to predict.

In another incident, some UHF stations were weakened, others improved, by phase shift due to a V antenna mounted close to a dish. An extremely long (15 foot or more) VHF antenna may cause interaction even if mounted several feet below a dish. A very short-boomed VHF antenna may cause no bad effects.

I cannot really predict what interaction you might get, since this is a problem entirely based on spacing distances and VHF antenna pattern.

QUESTION: If separate LB and HB yagis or log-yagis produce better results, why do installers use the log-periodic all-channels? Some even discourage use of "old-fashioned" separates.

ANSWER: Ignorance and cost are probably the answer. It's much simpler to stock a few versions of the latest line of Winegard or CM antennas, for example. The "top of the line" all-channel versions constantly change. Makers pass off these changes as "improvements". We know better.

Most distributors and/or installers are probably an ill-informed lot. Or, they supply primarily local needs and get very little requests for fringe systems. Consequently, either they swallow manufacturers' claims without finding out for themselves or they just don't give a hoot.

As the typical middle-class American, you must be as knowledgeable as possible on all subjects, or risk putting your money in the hands of an ill-informed "professional". Today, however, where too much money is often given for too little (or no) services, people sometimes don't care.

In the past few years, a great deal has been said about the Conrac AV-12E television receiver. Much of this comment has been favorable, but a near equal percentage has been unfavorable. Having now used an AV-12E for about three years, I think that I can review the situation with some insight. I have also visited or communicated with five other DXers currently using the AV-12E and have spoken to Conrac engineers on several occasions.

For the record, the Conrac AV-12E is now no longer available as a new item. It was replaced earlier in the year by a solid state version, priced in the \$700 class. At last production, the AV-12E sold for about \$435. This does not include a video monitor (display unit with picture tube) at either price.

"What really is the AV-12E and what makes it special?"

Conrac's installation and operation manual describes it as follows, "The AV-12E TELEVISION AUDIO-VIDEO RECEIVER is particularly designed for monitoring, video recording, or rebroadcasting applications." It is a receiver primarily designed for the cable TV industry for "off-the-air" reception at the head end site.

As previously stated, the AV-12E has no video display circuits. A video monitor (if purchased new costing anywhere from \$100 on up, but commonly available used at reasonable prices) must be used in addition to the AV-12 if it is to be operated as a complete television receiver. It also only has a small internal audio output stage sufficient only to drive a small speaker or headphones. For additional volume an external audio amplifier must be used.

Despite this seeming loss of "regular" features, the AV-12E has features not to be found on a consumer television. The front panel controls resemble those of a communications receiver more than television. From left to right, a power toggle switch, audio level, video level, manual RF gain, AGC bias selector, AGC delay and the channel selector. On the rear apron, detector level, two video outputs, external sync input, audio output, antenna input and the fuse holder. From a DXer standpoint, the AGC delay and detector level are "set and forget" controls. Unless some very elaborate other equipment is also used, the external sync input is also of no value to the DXer. The other features, as we shall see, are often of value.

The AV-12E has four stages of IF amplification, aligned for an unlimited full channel bandwidth... All 4.5 MHz of video. The tuner (VHF) is mounted on a plug-in drawer which slides into the front panel. (The AV-82 is basically an AV-12E with a built in UHF tuner). Adjacent channel rejection is said to be better than 40 db.

"Is the AV-12E a 'super' DX receiver?"

Well, that rather depends on your definition of "super". I suppose that in this case my own definition would imply something clearly superior in all respects to all other receivers. By that criteria, the AV-12E is certainly not "super". It does possess many advantages over consumer television sets, but has a number of shortcomings as well. To examine both sides of the coin in detail, let's continue on in two categories... Advantages and Disadvantages.

Advantages and Strongpoints of the AV-12E

Flexibility... That's a broad term, but it's certainly appropriate here. Starting with the "extra" front panel controls first, the AGC bias selector and manual RF gain control are very helpful. The AGC bias selector allows you to disconnect the regular ACC (automatic gain control) entirely for full manual control, or switch to a manual position with a delayed AGC. In the AGC off or no delay position, meteor bursts pop in quickly with no reduction in receiver sensitivity. In a normal receiver, unless modified, the ACC is always on and can't adjust quickly enough for most bursts. The result is lost sensitivity and weaker bursts.

The manual RF gain control is also handy for accurate fine tuning adjustments and preamp tuning. By turning down the manual RF gain control, the signal is in effect weakened. So what's the good of making a signal weaker? Small changes in signals can be more readily discerned when the signal is weaker to begin with. This trick allows you to peak a signal with accuracy very close to that of a signal meter. For the preamps, I'll turn down the RF till the signal just begins to vanish, peak up the preamp-- then turn the RF gain down further and repeat the process until best possible results have been obtained. When completed, the RF gain is either turned back to full, or the bias selector is switched back to ACC. There are also a few incidents where slooover is affecting the AFC and reducing on channel signal strength. When this occurs, a manual gain setting can often produce better results.

The video level control is the next "extra" control. Just as a volume control adjusts for more audio level (not RF signal), the video level control adjusts for more video level control. "Video level" refers to contrast and plenty of it! This three stage video boost often aids in reading call letters in weak, washed out pictures. I also usually turn mine up during meteor scatter reception. The video level control will not give you any more signal-- only help you to make the most out of what signal you have already. For video recording, the added video gain and second video output simplify the hook-up and operation. By the way, the same video monitor used for the video recorder can be used for the AV-12E.

Depending on what type of video monitor is used, two more side benefits appear. Using a 14" Miratel monitor (purchased used for \$40), I find that virtually no signal is too weak to lock sync. After adjusting the vertical and/or horizontal controls, sync on weak signals usually remain quite steady.

The wide horizontal range of a professional monitor (like the Miratel) means that the horizontal control can be adjusted to any no. of horizontal lines that you're likely to encounter. I estimate that mine tunes from about 400 to 800 lines. In fact, it even stays in sync on a video tape played on fast forward. Tho this is getting off the subject, most monitors have all important controls on the front panel.

As for performance, the AV-12E does quite well with weak audio; even when little or no video is present.

The plug-in SU-213 tuner is mounted in a very handy fashion. By unscrewing one knob and unplugging two cables, you can slide out the tuner for easy contact cleaning or tube changing. The tuner itself is made by Standard-Kollsman and is no better and no worse than the best tube type tuner on any set.

The AV-12E is very well built. The construction is as if it were designed for military use. Servicability is excellent. Parts are well laid out and clearly marked. So far it would appear that the AV-12E is highly reliable, as it is intended to be used 24 hours a day. The manual is also laid out well and very detailed.

Disadvantages and Weaknesses of the AV-12E

Probably the greatest shortcoming of the AV-12E is that it isn't the "super" receiver many people think it to be. It is not noticeably more sensitive than many well designed consumer television sets. It does not have exceptional adjacent channel rejection. In fact, adjacent channel rejection is only fair at best. And this set has four IF stages?

So why doesn't this "professional" receiver run rings around everything else? First of all, it's not because I, or any of the other DXers using AV-12E's have duds or don't know how to use them. All the sets that I've seen were performing to their fullest unmodified capability.

All right... So why isn't the AV-12E more sensitive? It has four stages of IF amplification... Doesn't it?? Yes, there are four stages, but their total gain is about equal to three stages on a modern consumer television set. All four video IF stages use relatively low gain, "out-dated" tubes. Conrac uses four IF stages not for greater sensitivity, but for greater video resolution. Four stages can be staggered to produce a more uniform response than three, insuring an unclipped video signal can be retransmitted to CATV subscribers. All this brings us to the adjacent channel rejection...

As a result of full channel bandwidth design and alignment, the adjacent channel rejection must suffer. Most black and white consumer sets have a band width for video of anywhere from 3.0 to 3.8 MHz. The AV-12E has a video bandwidth of well over 4MHz. That's fine for super sharp pictures, but not so fine for best DXing performance.

IF alignment for a narrower video bandwidth also increases IF gain. The amplification is simply concentrated on the most useful segment of the signal. And with less bandwidth, there is less of a "window" to pick up noise. Less noise, less snow. There is also less sharpness, but for DXing purposes 3 MHz should not be objectionable. (reduced sharpness is noticed less on small and medium sized screens than on large screens.)

As you can see, all this is leading up to something. It is very possible to narrow the video bandwidth on the AV-12E and improve its performance as a DX receiver. The IF transformers could be realigned or the values of their swamping (bandwidth increasing) resistors changed to achieve a 3 MHz video bandwidth. This would increase the receiver's sensitivity and should improve the adjacent channel rejection to a noticeable degree. For someone with the necessary servicing equipment (oscilloscope, sweep & marker generator) and some alignment experience, this should be no major chore. I have neither by the way, and conscientiously have not attempted this change. It should be pointed out that attempts to realign any television without the proper equipment or direction can very severely degrade performance. I do hope that at some future date I will be in a position to properly realign my AV-12E and evaluate the results.

In the meantime, there are improvements which can be made without "modifying" the AV-12E itself. The "Bridged-T IF Filter" described by Jerry Pulice (in the March 1971 VUD) will improve the adjacent channel rejection of any set, including the AV-12E. A selective tuned IF amplifier placed between the tuner and first IF stage would also help. This could be basically a simple FET circuit similar to those used by many DXers for the VIF channels. Of course, in this application the amp would be fix tuned to the IF frequency. Again, this should help any set.

Conclusions

The operating ease, flexibility and reliability of the Conrac AV-12E cannot be denied. When used with a good video monitor, it is indeed a pleasure to use. However, it is not a "super" receiver. For that matter, I don't believe that such a thing presently exists. The sensitivity of the AV-12E to weak signals is only average or slightly better than average. It does, however have a very distinct ability to bring in audio when there is little or no video... A rare quality. Adjacent channel rejection is not good. It is possible that by realignment, the AV-12E's sensitivity and selectivity can be greatly improved. Of this only future results will tell.

ASSOCIATION OF NORTH AMERICAN RADIO CLUBS

The Association of North American Radio Clubs (ANARC) is an organization of representatives from each of the major DX clubs in Canada, the United States, and the West Indies. The objectives of ANARC are :

- (a) to promote closer ties between radio clubs
- (b) to promote interchange of ideas and information between radio clubs
- (c) to work for the common good of the hobby
- (d) to provide for a forum to work out differences and problems involving radio clubs
- (e) to provide a medium to speak for radio clubs and listeners in North America.

In practice, the operation of ANARC is carried out almost entirely by correspondence between the representatives of the clubs and the ANARC executive secretary. The secretary sends out a monthly newsletter, containing the reps comments on current topics. There are also a number of committees of ANARC, to deal with specific items. For example, the manufacturer's liaison committee, and the frequency recommendations committee.

During 1966, a code of ethics was written, to define the responsibilities of all parties involved in DXing and listening. The code is printed below.

A CODE OF ETHICS FOR DX'ERS

I. Definitions

- A. A DX'er is one who listens to stations in the radio and television spectrum for the purpose of hearing the station without regard to content.
- B. A 'listener' is one who listens to stations in the radio and television spectrum for program content or message content.
- C. A DX'er can be a listener, but the average listener is NOT a DX'er.

II. Scope of responsibility of a DX'er

- A. The DX'er is responsible to the station he hears
 1. Contact slanted toward the station's interest.
 2. Contact to reflect the standards of the hobby overall.
- B. The DX'er is responsible to his fellow DX'er
 1. Exchange of information.
 2. Maintenance of reputation of the hobby.
 3. Maintenance of personal honesty and integrity ... in all relationships.
- C. The DX'er is responsible to the club he joins
 1. Utilization of the club as a medium of exchange.
 2. Cooperation with the club in its projects.
 3. Adherence to club rules.

III. Scope of responsibility of the club

- A. The club is responsible to its members
 1. To provide information of value in pursuit of the hobby.
 2. To engender a friendly spirit among all DX'ers.
 3. To insure upholding of standards throughout the hobby.
- B. The club is responsible to other clubs
 1. To exchange information provided by the respective members.
 2. To work cooperatively in areas of mutual interest.
 3. To avoid antagonism in areas of disagreement.
 4. To assist in policing violations of ethics.

IV. Scope of responsibility of the station

- A. The station is responsible to its listeners
 1. Providing the programming.
 2. Maintenance of good public relations.
- B. The station has no responsibility to the DX'er
 1. Unless the DX'er also is a listener.
 2. Unless the station requests the DX'er's cooperation.

V. Summation : A. The hobby of DX'ing is basically a personalized, one-man thing.

B. The club should try to prevent individual actions harmful to other hobbyists.
