

IN TELEVISION AND FM

ANOTHER WEEK IN MEXICO gained us a lot more information about TV and FM, especially in the states of Coahuila, Nuevo León and Tamaulipas -- plus a crumpled fender!

TELEVISIÓN CULTURAL DE MÉXICO repeaters may spring up anywhere there is a microwave relay station and sufficient locally-raised funds to pay for the transmitter. The three we saw, in Piedras Negras, Allende and Sabinas, Coahuila were all 100-watt translator-type transmitters, fed to yagis mounted atop the microwave towers. It seems quite likely the unidentified ch 6 (actually about 88.1 MHz audio) we heard from the west in Von Ormy was the TCM repeater in Piedras Negras, which has been on ch 6 since its inception last August --despite various listings on 12 and others! It went out of order a couple days before we arrived 8 May, but they hoped to have it back on in short order. DXers should note that programming on TCM repeaters can originate from any of the Mexico City channels, with some TCM-only programming and TCM IDs (none local, of course). TCM isn't strictly cultural--it carries such things as sports, variety shows, and Lassie. The TCM schedule (as of March): Weekdays 1400-2430; Sat. 1020-1400 & 1600-2330; Sun. 1130-1400 & 1600-2320 (CST). TCM-originated shows one week were scheduled Tues. & Fri. 2200-2300; Wed. & Fri. 2030-2100; Sat. 2100-2200; Sum 2000-2030. Various sources give us these TCM repeaters in addition to the ones in our April article and on the next page; we are not adding them to our master list until certain of the channel and a power of 100 watts or more:

5 Altar Son Piedras Negras Coah viewers must depend on Eagle Pass TX CATV not only for US nets but for Mexican TV (aside from the sporadic TCM repeater). Their end-of-the-line microwave station has capability for only one TV channel -- TCM. So the CATV system thru its Mexican-side counterpart plays skewy tapes of some Mexican shows and carries KWEX-41, which airs other Mexican tapes of slightly higher quality. No one knew of a ch 12 CP in that city. XHBW-9 Monclova has a 2-bay antenna on a short stick, dwarfed by an immense, much higher microwave tower a block away; one wonders why the XHBW antenna isn't moved atop the microwave tower. No local IDs pass on XHBW-9 and there is no TCM repeater in Monclova. Monolova does have a CATV system, however, as do Monterrey and Reynosa, where we learned there has never been an IERV-9 or any other local repeater on the air, nor is one likely with the advent of CATV.

XEFB-3's unique ch 83 translator in Zapata TX has never been seen in Von Ormy; visiting the town we learned it had been off more than 10 years-despite much more recent listings in TV Factbook. Likewise, CATV has driven off the Carriso Springs TX translators.

MONTERREY NL is due for a fifth "Canal Cultural" come September. Under auspices of the Institute Tecnológice, ch 8 is under construction near the university in the SE part of hhe city. No power is known, but it should be low, as it is short-spaced to KGNS-8 Laredo. In last year's enigmatic Official Stations list, XHFN was the call given for Monterrey-8. Monterrey is cupped by high mountains from the north westward to the SE, but DX paths to We've long noticed that XET-6 the NE are unobstructed. know the reason. It alone gets out best, and now we transmits from the high Cerro de la Silla mountain up at night, easily visible from SE of the city. That inaccessible site is lit

the average terrain far below. Crews ascend for weekly or two-weekly shifts, reaching the top on muleback. XEFB-3 and XHX-10 transmit from the much lower Cerro El Mirador south of the city, tho the old self@supporting tower remains at the downtown studios. XHAW-12 transmits from the same 29-floor downtown building as XHSRO-92.5 (no relation), but plans



a move to Loma Larga, not far from . El Mirador, where room has been reserved for it and two more FMs in the XHRL-98.1 transmitter building. This Loma is only about 250m above the city, lower than both the other sites; a nearby airport pre-

vents towers very far above the ground. At XEFB-3 we had a very informative visit with CE Ing. Alfonso R. Tames, who showed us his 1972 DX report file, from such people as Goldman, Hostetler, Kirkpatrick and several potential new WTFDA members: XET-6 studios were a depressing shell--not only because local production has been eliminated, but because a lightning strike had burnt out most of the house lights. We did learn that some filmed programming is still shown locally (see the updater on next page).

XET-94.1 now uses the self-supporting former XET-6 tower at the former studios. "Stereo 94"
operates from a penthouse atop the vacant building, accessible only by spiral staircase or
ladder. Most broadcasting in Monterrey is organized into extensive "grupos". Estrellas
de Oro, for instance, comprises 6 AM stations and 2 FM CPs in one studio complex, XHAW-12
in another place (XEAN-1280 being the group's key station), and the separately-owned sub-
group of XHRL-98.1 and two sister AM stations including XEG-1050 (yes, the one with all
the preachers:) whose studio it adjoins. Chica's manager agreed with me that fuller IDs
would be a good idea!
Grupo Radio Alegría studios house the XHRK-96.5 and XENV-90.0 transmitters; neither is le-
gally allowed to serve as an AM link any longer. Still, they continue simulcasting XEBJB-
570 and XENV-1340. XHRK-96.5 carried experimentally for a short while XEFV-1110 programs
to extend daytimer "R. Kono-La Mascota Musical" into the evening. XHXL-90.1 still hasn't
been born the it appears in GRA publicity. Talk was that these two FMs plus the next two
would organize into a "Grupo FM".
XHSP-99.7 is the newest FM, having come on in April, with IDs only as "Stereo Ritmo"; it
nevery mentions Monterrey and has no proper sign on/off announcements. To top this, XHSP
is operating on approximately 100.2, putting it uncomfortably close to XHMG, which in turn
seems to have slid closer to its nominal 100.5. We left a message for XHSP's manager,
urging full identification and frequency correction. Both 100 MHz stations have 4-gain
antennas on their low downtown buildings. We tried to visit XHMG-100.5 three times on two
days, but despite its 24-hour schedule, no one ever came to the opaque wooden door with
crudely-painted call letters-the city's only AM, FM or TV we didn't succeed in entering:
KEFM-104.1 Edinburg TX almost amounts to another Monterrey local, since it's audible on
the car or portable radio just about anywhere in the city--even inside Huasteco Canyon.
Monterrey's 148-174 MHz band is chock-full of FM links for various AM and FM stations; we
heard them all; some are about to move above ch 13 to relieve the congestion: XENV-1340
has often had its programming relayed on competitor XETKR-1480 after the latter's adjacent



TEST YOUR E-SKIP KNOWLEDGE WITH A TRUE/FALSE QUIZ

- You need a rotable, high, multielement fringe area antenna to log most E-skip.
- E-skip starts at the lower channels first, then moves up to the higher channels.
- If you log a channel 5 or 6 skipper, there is a good chance you will identify a channel 2 station transmitting in or near the same town.
- Diagonal bars and unusual offset during E-skip openings are always due to the fast fading signals.
- 1.) FALSE. The directional qualities of a good, rotable deep-fringe antenna system are obviously desireable to null out locals on the same channels. However, since E-skip signals are usually strong, many E-skippers can be logged on modest gain antennas at low heights, even rabbit ears, if local interference is minimal. In fact, unless good trapping systems are used, excessive antenna height in areas close to many strong locals can cause severe adjacent channel interference that inhibits E-skip reception.


Surprisingly, rabbit ears are often preffered to an antenna system that cannot be rotated (assuming your skip stations don't come from one direction only), since the ears can be repositioned for best picture. Besides pivoting and arranging the ears so that they are 180° apart, try changing the polarization by holding the antenna perpendicular to the ground (pointing up and down) or diagonally for the best picture.



2.) TRUE. Skip will almost always start at the lowest open (ie, not strong local) channel and work its way up. However, if a DXer is so located that no lower channels (2, 3, for example) exist in a given direction, skip may begin at channel 4, for example. Obviously, when the receiving and transmitting points are within the USA with its multitude of stations, skip signs virtually always start at the lower channels.

3.) FALSE. For two reasons, this statement is generally untrue. First as skip becomes more intense and increases to higher channels, the optimum distances over which the lower E-skip channels return to earth decrease. For example, during an intense opening, channels 5 and 6 might be received at 1000 to 1200 miles, but channels 2 and 3 may be received in the same direction at 500 to 800 miles. Pat Dyer has often published data relating skip cloud heights and distances over which radio waves may be received at various frequencies.

Second, as skip intensity increases and the higher channels become visable, the lower channels often become jumbled with several DX stations, sometimes making identification difficult.



4.) FALSE. Although rapidly-fading E-skip signals can cause unstable horizontal and vertical sync in poor receivers, diagonal bars and/or offset bars not of the usual 0, 10, or 20 kilohertz variety are not due to poor sync. Most likely, the received station is running "off-frequency". This is especially common among Mexican stations as noted by several southern USA DXers.

Also, the horizontal and vertical standards of some countries differ. This may make any attempt to stabilize the picture impossible because receivers used may have limited horizontal and vertical range.

The Department of Commerce in behalf of the National Bureau of Standards has requested a practical use of television blanking intervals (those black lines separating image frames when your TV picture is rolling vertically). They would be used to send useful information if a change in broadcast rules is approved by the FCC. National Bureau of Standards TV Time signals, capable of transmitting up to 600 words per minute, would be carried on a single line of the blanking interval, leaving normal TV pictures unaffected. An adaptor would be required to decode signals for presentation in caption form on the screen. Possible uses would include captions for deaf or foreign speaking viewers, as well as disaster or emergency alerts.

In addition to 931 U.S.TV stations presently on the sir, did you know there are presently 2791 translater stations currently licensed? 1903 of them are VHF and 888 operate on the UHF band (mainly in the 70-83 r range). So if you are sitting there with a measly 500 or so loggings and think you have just about seen all there is, just hang in there!!

WJCL-FM, in its promotion, says it programs only four commercial breaks per hour, and is "Savannah's only fulltime stereo sound and with 100,000 watts both horizontal and vertical . . . our coverage area exceeds by far any other broadcast signal in the Savannah market."

WMHT-FM *89.1\$ Schenectady NY recently added morning programming, now operating 7 days/week 7 am to 1 am. The U.S. Office of Education has awarded grants to make new public FM stations possible in: Sumter SC [not yet granted by the FCC]. Rushford MN, Fairmont WV [see "construction permits" preceding page]. Facilities expansion grants have been awarded to: KVCR *91.9 San Bernardino CA to increase effective radiated power to 24500 (-320'); please note this as an addition to the "changes in facilities" column of the preceding page. Also, WVUB Vincennes IN, KTEP El Paso TX and KCUR Kansas City MO, all of which are listed in the same column. New changes on the way will affect KNCT-FM Killeen TX. KLCC *90.3 Eugene OR. KPFA 94.1 Berkeley CA and WKCS *91.1 Knoxville TN.

WBEZ *91.5 Chicago writes: "We will be going to stereo transmission in the very near future when our equipment installation is complete." Tests in Milwaukee show WBEZ has vertical polarization; WMBI-FM *90.1, supposedly with 52000 v, appears not to be broadcasting vertically. A call to WEFM, which is supposed to change to WICV, confirmed that WEFM's viability continues. The man I spoke to rather confidentially expected WEFM to be the calls and classical to be the music format until well after snow falls this coming winter. Another call to WITN-FM 104.7 Watertown WI confirmed that WITN-FM plans to move to 94.1 when the new Hartford application is approved for 104.9. When I told them Hartford [WI, of course] had received its grant from the FCC, this was news to them, and will undoubtedly prompt WITN-FM to hasten its frequency change.

In rather interesting news from Michigan, WSVC *99.7 University Center, mentions in a letter of verification that "WSVC is the successor to WQDC Midland. The owners of WQDC donated the station, and some operating funds, to Saginaw Valley College about two years ago, and we have been on the air since November 10, 1971. We don't broadcast in \$ because the stereo generator used by WQDC became obsolete, and no longer meets the minimum FCC specifications. At this moment, we are broadcasting for six hours a day, five days a week,

selling the station, however, to a religious corporation in Midland because they [the college administration] consider it a 'luxury' too difficult to support. We are awaiting FCC approval of the sale at this time, but we will continue to operate until it is sold. . . You are our furthest listener." From Pat Whelan, program director. Subsequently, I have noticed that WQDC has applied to move to Midland MI and increase to 100000 h.v; 818'.

KHKE *88.1 Cedar Falls IA, which has a permit to change to *90.9.is now on an 18-hours-per-day schedule Sunday-Thursday; 20 on Friday and Saturdays. They are supposedly on the air until 3 a. m. "Friday and Saturday," which may mean Saturday and Sunday morning-the continuation of Friday and Saturday night. KUER *90.1 Salt Lake City UT now signs off 1 am seven days a week, instead of 11 pm as previously. The Jamaica Broadcasting Corporation sent a map which essentially corroborates the information given by Bill Dickerman as to the locations of Half Way Tree and Coopers Hill, Jamaica [see p. 17 May VUD and p. 9 April VUD]. Furthermore, the JBC says its Montego Bay station (92.1) actually transmits from "Flower Hill," about five miles NE of Montego Bay.



Recently, I received a copy of the CRTC's proposal affecting FM broadcasting, as hinted at in the Billboard quote (see May VUD, pp 16-17). The proposal for Canadian FM boils down to three parts: 1) AM and FM should develop distinctively, with FM developing a diversity of programming aimed to attract audiences on a selective basis as an alternative to AM, which provides a more general service to its audience. 2) "Holders of AM and FM licenses will be required to reduce simulcasting by one half immediately after publication of the final policy document and to eliminate it within six months, except in specified unusual circumstances." 3) Discussions will go on to determine whether the public interest will be served by requiring all radio receivers for sale in Canada to have both AM and FM capability. These chances would initially apply to private FM stations but could be extended to the CBC stations.

As far as Canadian rules are concerned, this writer fully agrees with Rosenberg and Lewis (pp. 19-20 May VUD) about DXers' trying to bring about change in Canadian stations' identification requirements. I doubt, however, that if U.S. members contacted the FCC and requested bi-lateral agreements with Canadian authorities this would work. Knowing how hard it is to get action out of the FCC, it would probably be better for Americans to try to exert gentle persuasion on the Canadian stations directly — especially if they convince the stations that they regularly listen and enjoy their programming from across the border. May I add parenthetically that I do not require the hearing of "frequency" in an identification announcement to count a new station as heard; and my new DXing Constitution has eased up on the former requirement of having to hear city, state, or province in addition to call letters.

Perhaps taking taking a cue from Canada, the U. S. Federal Communications Commission is asking manufacturers of car radios and the big car makers why there are such great cost differentials between FM-AM and plain AM car radios, how much more money it would cost to make a car radio if all sets had AM-FM capability, and sources of car radio supply. The gathering of this data presumably would precede any FCC endorsement or rejection of legislation that would make all-channel, AM-FM radios mandatory in the U. S. Such a bill, with what I consider to be an unfortunate loophole that would allow for the continued sale of AM-only radios selling for \$15 and under, has been introduced in Congress.

All that out of the way, here now is the roundup of FM news reported by this column's readers.

Frank Aden, Jr., Boise ID, says KGVM-FM 99.1 Idaho Falls is still off the air as the result of a fire several months ago, and no one he contacted knows when they will be back on.

Joseph Bahr, Hato Rey PR, says the AFR-FM 90.5 station in Roosevelt Roads PR with 2000 watts is mostly rock and country, Mutual news, and Army and Defense Dept. programs. Applications for new stations have been filed in Vieques 98.9, Luquillo 92.1; with Cabo Rojo and Hormigueros competing for 92.1.

Robert Baker, Humboldt IA, gives further information on the shift of KHKE Cedar Falls to "90.9 [May VUD, p. 14]. "The antenna will be on the KCRG-TV tower near Walker IA." When KHKE moves to "90.9 and to the new tower this fall it will be \$tereo. "Incidentally, the present KHKE daytime schedule is nearly all off-the-air pickup from WOI-FM Ames. This is the beginning of a state-wide public radio network for lowa." KLYF 100.3 Des Moines (formerly WOI-FM) was to have begun broadcasting in stereo April 23 on a 6 am to 1 am basis from the 2000' Alleman lowa tower, utilizing the syndicated Stereo Radio Productions service. I recently read where the FCC has returned the University of Northern lowa's application to use KHKE's old equipment to run a second station on "88.1.

Andy Bolin, Charleston IL, reports that WIUM *91.3 Macomb IL is now \$ and rock; WISU *89.7 Terre Haute IN is not and never has been \$. WJDJ 94.1 Cincinnati (former WSAI-FM), "DJ-FM," is still automated rock, while MOR formats survived recent call letter changes at KEZO 94.1 Little Rock AR and KFMS 92.3 St. Louis. WLRW 94.5 Champaign IL is now Hit Parade. The new KHAI 106.3\$ Lincoln NE announces 24 hours country music. This column congratulates Andy, who just heard his 100ist FM station: WMPS-FM 97.1 Memphis. "They were \$, but compared to the other Memphis stations they were extremely weak in signal strength." This would indicate that WMPS-FM, contrary to an earlier report, is still not operating with full authorized power of 100000 h,y; 530'.

W. Bruce Dean, Seekonk MA, says WBLM 107.5 Lewiston— Auburn ME, went on the air March 1 with 30000 h,v; 610'. They program MOR music 5 am to 7 pm and progressive rock 7 pm to 5 am; not certain if the operation is 24 hours on Sunday night/Monday morning. "I received a friendly note from the station requesting reception reports, and am certain they would welcome responses from others." WCCM-FM 93.7 Lawrence MA advised Bruce that the long-awaited power increase to 430', 50000 should be available by the time this is published in the VUD. Bill Grant, Worcester, MA, reports hearing WCCM-FM with a much better signal recently, but still announcing as using the old power. Continuity departments in some stations are often slower in changing copy than engineers are in improving equipment. Bruce Dean sent an article from the Providence Journal-Bulletin in which it is stated that WTEV. a channel 6 TV station is withdrawing its objections to applications filed for some 11 educational FM stations in New England. Some of these applications go back two years, and if WTEV eases up on all of its objections, new public FM stations may spring up at Bryant College, Smithfield RI; Dean Academy, Franklin MA; Bristol Community College, Fall River MA; a day school in Weston MA [recently granted on *88.3--WRSB 10 w]; Rockland MA public schools; Clark University, Worcester [WCUW *91.3]: WHSR *91.9 Winchester MA; "WLSR" in Sudbury MA; and WTBS *88.1 Cambridge MA. Stations listed that are already on the air may be expected to receive power/antenna height in-

Richard Clark, Lighthouse Point FL, sent several letters full of FL FM format information, noting that WEZY-FM 99.3 Cocoa is now \$ MOR, and that WRMF-FM 98.3 Titusville has dropped \$ and duplicates an AM station 24 hours. WTHS *91.3 Miami (soon to be WLRN-FM) is now with National Public Radio. AFRIS 103.0 Guantanamo, Cuba, is the second station there. [Ken Simon, West Palm Beach, claims my Guantanamo Bay 102.0 listing is incorrect, according to the station's (or stations') chief engineer. VUD April, 1973, p. 9.] Dick also notes in Haiti the existence of Radio Lumiere (4VUE-FM) 88.1 and a Radio Metropole 99.1, both Port-au-Prince. The latter, I believe, is 4VGA-FM 100.0. Dick also sent information on the FM stations and program formats of Mexico City and Guadalajara, which is essentially the same as given in Glenn Hauser's extensive Mexican FM listing of last month. Dick traveled to those cities and had the opportunity to tune in first-hand to their many and interesting FM stations. The Mexican government, incidentally, did write back and they cleared up several mysteries. Regardless of what others may think of government lists, I like them. They have the imprimatur of an official agency, and are presumably more reliable than what can be obtained by random listenings, travels, or interviews with equipment boys. Virtually all my powers differ from Glenn's. for example, and a few stations found in one list are not in the other.

In the second report and letter from Mexico, I gleaned the following: XHRM 99.3 Tijuana is deleted or will soon go off the air, perhaps a casualty of the U.S.-Mexican frequency allocation treaty affecting FM, while those surviving, "por convenio bilateral," are XHQS 96.1, XHQF 97.7 both Tijuana, B.C.; XHRZ 89.1, XHQT 93.9 both Nogales, Son. XHMS Monclova is corrected to read 99.3 [see April, p. 8], and XHIS Tijuana is included in the revised listing. The links are all listed (sans frequencies, some of which may be, as Glenn indicates, outside the FM band). The way I count up the FM stations, Mexico has 99 FM stations, excluding links, while Canada has only 92, including weak repeaters, like the CFFM-FM1,2... group in B.C. These totals include both on-the-air stations and those holding construction permits.

From Nevada, Cliff Denney, KNIS 94.7 Carson City, says KNEV 95.5 and KSRN 106.9 Reno have MOR, with KNEV also classical music. KNIS is gospel, monaural, but will go \$ when permission to add vertical polarization is received. KUNR *88.7 Reno (2000 -450') has an educational format, featuring classical music.

Michael F. Collins, Stratford CT, mentions that WWPT *90.3 Westport CT [Staples High School] was to have gone on the air for one day, May 26, so that area residents can see if there's any interference to their FM and TV sets; this before the Wesport Zoning Board will give its approval for the transmitter site. If there is no objectionable interference, WWPT "will begin regular operations June 2, and will be on the air all summer long" with 330 h.v; 145'. WPKN and WSHU continue to operate in their fight over the town of Trumbull over alleged interference [see May VUD, p. 17]; they're taking the case to the Court of Common Pleas. Another station on the same hill is WPSB 99.9 Bridgeport, increasing to 25000 h.v: 660', but directional to protect WEEX-FM Easton PA. CKRL"-FM" *89.1 Quebec PQ has been on the air since March; by July 1, WENU (former WATR-FM) 92.5 Waterbury CT will be \$ MOR. New York's WNBC-FM 97.1 will switch to a top 40 format, while the ABC-FM stations, Mike says, will be switching to a new and as yet unannounced format; "KSFX 103.7 San Francisco will be the first to switch." In a list Mike sent, he does not list 97.5 WALK-FM Patchoque NY as \$, which I thought it was. WHOM-FM 92.3\$ New York has MOR with Spanish announcers. Contrary to the April report [p. 10 VUD], WQAQ Hamden and WQTQ Hartford, both on *88.3. will not share time. For *88.7 correct the WNHU listing to read "West Haven CT" 1700 h,v; 150': the sole surviver on this frequency of what had thought to be a threeway share-time arrangement. [WNHU moves from New Haven CT.] Finally. Mike sent an ad from the 1951 Broadcasting Yearbook in which WASH 97.1 Washington DC claimed that "Thousands of WASHington listeners no longer tune in, or rarely tune in AM." which was probably true, since Washington was one of the early markets with a high FM set saturation, and, of course, WASH still exists [22500 h,v; 690'].

Bill Dickerman, Williamsport PA, says neither WRAK-FM 102.7 nor WILQ"-FM" 105.1 have \$, nor plan to add it. But WVIA-FM *89.9 Scranton PA is now on the air fulltime: studios Pittston PA: transmitter on Penobscot Knob. WEEP-FM 107.9 Pittsburgh is now \$.

In local schedules, WWNO *89.9 New Orleans operates 8 am-12 am 7 days a week now; WCKW 92.3 LaPlace LA does not operate 24 hours, as reported before, running only 6 am-10 pm Sun-Thurs., 6 am-2 am Fri.-Sat. "I taught the boy who runs the weekend late show and clued him on the WTFDA and DXing. His name is Jerry Lousteau, and he's likely to QSL DX reception." Mike comments on Allen Rockford's observations in the April column re WIBX-FM 96.9 Utica NY. which operated with 9 kw ERP from 1946-54. "They have held their new CP since 1968--a heck of a long time; I wonder what made the FCC let them keep it inactive for so long." (Present permit is for 98.7.) "Speaking of inactive construction permits mono by skip, and not \$ as previously listed. WNHV-FM 95.3 KIKS-FM 96.1 Lake Charles, along with KIKS Sulphur, has been s sold to a local entrepreneur; KIKS-TV 26 has been deleted, I understand. Victor Muscat, previous owner, has a good track record of letting CPs remain fallow. Perhaps the station will be activated soon. Fallow WFXM 95.5 Jackson MS has received an mal use of 100,000 watts (sic) of power has yet to be devised. extension of its CP to July. I wonder if the CP for WFPR-FM 107.1 Hammond LA has expired; it was granted a year ago, and I note that WFPR (AM) is being sold; no mention of a WFPR-FM at all."

Mike Dunn, Armdale, Nova Scotia, says CHFX"-FM" 96.1 Halifax NS has an application in to increase power and go \$tereo, and a format switch to easy listening. Mike, I wonder if you could check on the radiated power of CJCB-FM 94.9 Sydney NS? | list it at 31500, but recent CRTC data show it as 675 watts.

Pat Dyer, San Antonio, heard KWIC 107.7 Beaumont TX testing with 54000 249', and he's getting together a list of baseball FM networks with help from Frank Merrill.

John Ebeling, Bloomington MN, says rocker KESD *88.3 in Brookings SD operates 6:40 to midnight, 38000 h, 17500 v; 610'. That's from 6:40 a.m. CST or CDT.

Richard T. Eddie, St. Louis MO, sends much St. Louis FM information, noting that KDNA 102.5 is a hodge-podge of programs, seeking a frequency in the educational band, while rumor has it the new owners of KDNA's 102.5 facility will boost power to 100 kw go top 40 rock and change calls to KEZK.

Robert Eddy, Newport OH, says WCMO *89.3 Marietta is seeking higher power (9234; 188') on 88.3. He sends a clipping concerning the fact that the FCC has been ordered to conduct a hearing on the format change of WGLN 105.5 Sylvania OH with progressive rock to WXEZ with MOR. Anyone know if WXEZ is \$?

Al Ellis, Brantford, Ontario, sent a tape of good WQLN-FM *91.3 Erie reception, with broadcasting changing physically from one campus studio in the area to another. Al Claims that he has written to "ye little old powerful five watter at Tillsonburg" (CKOT-FM 100.5), but no answer yet; they did apply for higher power, however. "CFRS Simcoe ON, I understand, has been granted permission to operate a new FM station, but I do not know the frequency." The provincial government is apparently going to save CJRT *91.1 Toronto [see May VUD, p. 16], but a union officer was mad that the move would deprive 48 Ryerson Institute floor cleaners of work.

Bill Frahm, Boise ID, says KEBK 92.3\$ Boise is now 24 hrs. rock, while KBOI-FM has finally upped modulation to a point "where you can hear something besides the SCA! This should improve the DX receptionability of KBOI-FM 97.9 Boise. Both KBBK and KBXL 94.1 Caldwell are planning to move to the same tower on Deer Point, 16 mi. NE of Boise, about 2000' above the average terrain, and one of the Nampa AM stations will apply for FM and join them. In Oregon, Bill reports good long-distance reception of KBOY-FM 95.3 and KTMT 93.7 Medford, while the east and south; 50 to the north of its site. K265AA should be a good possibility for E's, thinks Bill; even for meteor scatter and aurora! Bill says KBOY-FM's audio is badly distor-

Bill Grant, Worcester MA, sends a map showing Bermuda's Devonshire Parish, and Prospect site therein, which is just W. of the town of Hamilton. ZBM-FM 89.1 and ZFB-FM 94.9 both transmit from Prospect, but are probably "licensed" to Hamilton. WCUW *91.3 Worcester has completed its tower installation "and should begin operation in June. WERS *88.9 Boston is conducting a \$5000 fund drive to add \$ next school year; WLTI *91.5 Lowell MA is mostly rock and is \$; ZBM-FM & ZFB-FM have a varied musical format and are both \$. ZFB-FM simulcasts ZFB from midnight to 6 a.m." Bill heard WEZZ 97.7 Clanton AL in White River Junction VT is \$, MOR, as is WNBH-FM 98.1 New Bedford MA. Bill sent along an interesting, but sarcastic review of the Boston area FM stations from a local paper. Typical comment: [Concerning WCOP-FM 100.7] "More muzak. A more dis-Dead air would be an improvement.".. or WSSH 99.5 Lowell: "The station refers to itself as 'Wish' radio. The listener should be wishing for the right to change the dial. The only way you could ever remember a station like this is by the name

created by the loose phonetic interpretation of the call letters." A number of station powers were incorrectly reported, which prompted reader Richard B. Wood, Boston, to write a letter to the editor which said in part: "Since the relative merits of programming are subjective I won't argue with David Bieber's opinions. However, I was disappointed to find several, readily available, figures incorrect. This leads me to suspect his research. Mr. Bieber gives some stations more power than they have while gyping others of what is rightfully theirs.

Some he says are stereo when, in fact, they are not. For instance, WAAF 107.3 Worcester MA is 1750 watts, not 50,000... WERS *88.9 Boston got the worst deal of all. They are 18,000 watts, but were allotted only 10..."

Glenn Hauser, Von Ormy TX: "Texas noncommercial stations are having their problems. KPFT *90.1 was off about 10 days in mid-April due to transmitter failure and lack of money for parts; off and on sporadically since (normally 24 hour schedule, silent period 2-6 AM Wed.). KNCT-FM *91.3 went off for spring vacation but, strangely, has not returned as of early May [see report about grants, 2d page of this column; they are probably installing new equipment]. KUHF *88.7 Houston has been off more than on since it returned last December; quite sporadic; no NPR affiliation resumed; sometimes comes on to cover ball games. Both KUT *90.7 Austin and KPFT have significant blocks in Spanish (or rather lex-Mex, hi). I have my doubts about the Nicaraguan list [VUD Arril, p. 9]; why would YNW-FM 97.9 (certainly more than 30 waits) be the only one I get on Es?"

Jim Hughes, news director of WCEN-AM-FM Mt. Pleasant MI, and "Trout King" of the Kalkaska trout festival, says WCMU"-FM" *89.5 is blocking TV channel 6 in Lansing and, in some places, Bay City channel 5. "Local viewers went 'up in arms' but have simmered down now. However, many feel that educational institutions should not have radio stations to the point of interfering with other stations. WMHW *91.5, the 10-watter, is a training ground type of station and has a varied format of music and CMU sports. WCMU, the 100000-watt baby, is on 24 hours a day in stereo."

John Haralson, Memphis, says local *88.5 owned by the city school board will broadcast in \$ and have vertical; WLYX *89.3 has applied for a power increase from 10 watts; the new KASU *91.9 Jonesboro will have \$,V when the power increase to 100, -000 (510') comes through. KBFC 93.5 Forrest City AR is \$.

Hank Holbrook, Chevy Chase MD, mentions that MMYU *89.1 is on regular schedule with rock, sharing time with MFDU Teaneck NJ. WNYU is in New York city. Hank heard WAFL 97.7 testing May 12 with country mustc (Milford DE). WYIA-FM *89.9 Scranton PA heard testing April 21 and on Monday April 23 they were on regular schedule. "Said they would have country, folk, classical music and information programs...WKDU *91.7 Philadelphia gets out pretty well for having only ten watts!"

Fred McCormack, Des Lacs ND, reports great difficulty in DXing stations in nearby Montana. KMOI-FM 93.7 Minot, he says, has changed from rock to MOR "with a very good sound."

L. R. Mitlin, Rock Hill SC, notes that WSMU 106.3 Starkville MS is now \$; rock day, country after 4 p. m. WBIE-FM 101.5 Marietta GA is now \$, as is WPLO-FM 103.3 Atlanta.

Eric G. Norberg, KMPC radio, Los Angeles CA, sends detailed FM format information for CA, including some possible deletions or other changes. KIBS-FM 100.7 Bishop CA he believes is deleted, while KMAX 107.1 moves from Sierra Madre to Arcadia. "When owner-operator moved to Arcadia, he had the station relicensed to Arcadia. It's a real mom-and-pop operation." Similarly, KJLH 102.3\$ moves from Long Beach to Compton CA. 93.1 KGBS-FM Los Angeles is not \$, while KTMS-FM 97.5 Santa Barbara is.

Fred J. Nordquist, North Syracuse NY, sent detailed FM format information for his state, noting that the music of the Christian Broadcasting Network [WOIV DeRuyter, etc.] sounds almost like rock and roll. WHLD-FM 98.5 Niagara Falls NY does not have \$, while WPDH 101.5 Poughkeepsie and MOR music does. WRUR *88.5 Rochester is not allowed to operate the full power of 19500; 120' [still 10 watts?]. Without \$ is WBLK 93.7 De Pew NY, while WMRV Endicott 105.5 has it; MOR.

Les Prus, Manhattan KS, mentions that both Hutchinson KS stations have \$: KSKU 102.1 MOR and KWBW-FM 102.9 with country music. KJCK-FM 94.5 Junction City is confirmed with \$ and rock. Local KSDB *88.1 is off the air until classes resume in the fall. KMKF 101.7\$ Manhattan has MOR from 0600-1900 daily; rock from 1900-0100. KSKG 99.9 Salina, mono, used to be religious programming but now appears to be all rock. WIBW-FM 97.3 Topeka \$ has been sneaking more pops and soft rock into their formerly all-country format.

Shelby Remington, West Haven CT, notes that WNYU *89.1 New York took the air May 4 and is stronger at his location than share-timer WFDU Teaneck NJ. Both WSHU *91.1 Fairfield and WHRS 104.9 Middletown are mono, not \$, as previously listed. WQAQ *88.3 Hamden, WMNR *88.1 Monroe, WGCT *90.5 Guilford, WJMJ *88.9 Hartford, nor WNHU *88.7 West Haven, all CT, not on the air when Shelby wrote; he was not sure about WWPT *90.3 Westport and WQTQ *88.3 Hartford.

Allen Rockford, Syracuse NY, had earlier reported that WKAL-FM 95.9 Rome NY was in \$, but about 2 weeks later they stopped and have not been \$ since. Paul Traska, Buffalo NY, sends word on 93.3 Jamestown NY, which is changing its call letters from WJIN-FM to WESE: "The Wonderful World of Stereo Entertainment." MOR music will be heard, except for Concert Hall weeknights from 9 to 11.

David L. Walcutt, Carbondale IL, says WDNS 98.3 Bowling Green KY is \$, MGR. KSGM-FM 105.7 Ste. Genevieve MO, which is going to 70000 h,v, claims they will "soon be stereo." WITAO 104.9 Murphysboro IL will soon be moving its antenna to atop a forest station tower to eliminate local TVI. "WITAO is one of the nicest radio stations I've ever seen . . . their buildings blend in with the surroundings in a residential area. In your February column, I noticed Richard Wood's question about the programming of WMGL 98.3\$Pulaski TN. They advertise; ads were heard for the <u>Pulaski Citizen</u>; also for a local milk company." They're country late night; MOR the rest of the time.

Richard E. Wood, Baton Rouge LA: WQXY 100.7 B. R. was off the air for about a day because of fire. The new AK station is in Shemya, a well-known Aleutian I. base. CHOM 97.7 which is listed to Montreal [May VID. p17] is sometimes considered a Westmount PQ station: an English-speaking city within French Montreal and PQ. Thus, if Westmount is its "coverage area," the majority language would be English: otherwise French.



My call is WBØIWG. Much of the information I will be supplying in my reports will therefore concern activites on 6-m. Hopefully, this will be of interest to those of you who DX the low-band channels. I am always interested in knowing when channel 2 opens, hence I scan all the reports carefully, but tend to get rather upset whenever I discover that I've missed an opening...Hi!

My equipment for 6-m includes a Swan 250C transceiver with NS-1 noise blanker. The antenna is a six-element beam at 70 feet. The TV here is a Zenith 21", and the antenna is a 10-element all-channel model.

Wisconsin, Ohio, Michigan, Indiana, Illinois, New York, Missouri, Iowa, Tennessee, the state of the stat Kentucky, Nebraska, Kansas and South Dakota were the states heard and worked during this period. On April 14, from 0230 to 0400 more aurora was noted. New York, Michigan and South Dakota were worked, and Wyoming was heard as well. On April 26 at 2214 more aurora was noted, but only the northernmost areas were affected. A Minnesota station near the Canadian border was worked. (Were these on CW, AM, or FM, Jim? dps)

In case anyone is interested, I have several Channel Master #7008 traps for sale. The units consist of two tunable traps each, and when tuned to any frequency in the range from 50 to 108 MHz attenuate it by 60 db...great for adjacent-channel interference. Also I have a dual gate MOSFET preamp tuned to channel 3. Its bandwidth is about 3 MHz, noise figure is about 2.5 db, and the gain is in excess of 30 db (there is a manual gain control on it). While there is some distortion of the picture (it loses some resolution), it is still quite easily viewed...and it can't be beat for weak tropo DX.

A rather lengthy report this time, but almost every scrap of it is tropo. Es has been ominously slim in its display so far, and I'm not as optimistic about the summer season as I was in February (which so far has been the best month of the year). The old Alliance T-12 rotor pretty well gave out (though not from all the DX turning, hi) and I'm now using an Archer servo-rotor. As the indicator on the T-12 never did work properly, this is an improvement indeed.

## New"DX"Stamps


The U. S. Postal Service has announced the design of four postage stamps that point to Progress in Electronics. The stamps are to be issued in New York City, July 10.

The four stamps, in as many denominations, span development of electronics from Marconi's turn of the century spark coil to the transistor.

An 8-cent stamp for first class mail commemorates the transistors and a printed circuit board... A 6-cent stamp, intended for post cards, shows Guglielmo Marconi's spark coil and spark gap... The ll-cent airmail stamp shows Lee De Forest's refinements to Marconi-- the Audion and the Audion tube... In a 15-cent stamp for international surface mail, three nostalgic electronic elements-- an early microphone, a goosenecked speaker and a vacuum tube, are combined with a TV camera tube,







Each stamp will contain one plate number and will be issued in horizontal format, commemorative size, in panes of 50.


Collectors desiring first day cancellations may make requests to "Electronics Stamps, Postmaster, New York, NY 10001", enclosing the proper remittance and with request postmarked no later than July 10. Price for the set of four stamps is 40 &. A specific stamp or stamps may be ordered.

## DX THE UHF PUBLIC SERVICE BAND WITHOUT BUYING A NEW RECEIVER!

VHF utility DXers that would like to start DXing the UHF Public Service Bands, can do so with little or no added expense. A new receiver is not needed!

If you now own a 30-50 MHz receiver, simply connect a UHF TV converter output to the antenna terminals of the receiver. [Thus far, you are putting your receiver in the place of a TV set.] Now tune the receiver to around 48 MHz and tune the converter to about channel 19. The UHF converter should now be tuned very close to the UHF PSB [assuming the converter output to be channel 5 or 6].



As you tune the PSB receiver down, you are effectively lowering the tuning range of the UHF converter. To tune the band, use the UHF converter and leave the PSB receiver on one setting. The receiver setting can be used as fine tuning as well.

If a UHF converter is not available, you might consider using a UHF tuner. Replacement types for TV sets are available in the 4 dollar range from many surplus stores. They can usually be powered on a battery and easily mounted in a mini-box or rack panel. The only DXing procedure change that is required, is to tune the PSB receiver lower. How much lower will have to be determined through experimentation.

Using an outdoor UHF TV antenna, local stations should come through quite clearly. You may even hear local ham radio operators talking on 432 MHz. As with any receiving installation, a better antenna will provide better results.






