

CRTC Extra!

Your Canadian Report editors recently led an energetic but futile battle a few months ago in the license hearings for some new UHF stations which will be operated by the Ontario Educational Communications Authority (O.E.C.A.). In the initial proposal, the OECA sought licenses for stations in S.Ontario at Toronto(CICA-19)(already on the air), Paris Ch.28 @165 kw--grade B coverage 38 miles; London Ch.18 @ 18 kw"B" coverage 27 mi.; Chatam Ch.59@17kw "B"-24mi;

Windsor Ch. 32 @180 kw "B" 33 mi.

We viewed the xmtr. sites closely, and the anticipated coverage, and after viewing the O.E.C.A. license and technical applications, concluded that too many transmitters were being applied for, and at the expense of Ontario taxpayers! We calculated that most UHF stations operating at the megawatt level have a "B" coverage of nearly 60 miles(radius). The terrain of southern Ontario was favourable for UHF propagation so that Megawatt UHF stations at Toronto, London and Chatam could service more people at a lower cost, with fewer transmitters than the OECA plan. We journeyed to WUTV, the Buffalo independent station which beams its 1,050,000 watts into populous Southern Ontario, reaching many viewers in Toronto, Hamilton, and Kitchener at more than 55 miles. We asked Gary Cooper Chief eng. of WUTV what their "secret" was. There was no secret. Any decent UHF station in Southern Ontario should get his results. We looked further. Most of the cities which OECA planned to serve with UHF were heavily wired for cable-tv. In fact, London and Kitchener rank among the most heavily saturated in terms of CATV, in the entire world. (London=81% of all households) Hence, "off-air" reception of UHF educational TV would be unlikely in the future in many of these cities, what with ETV, on a "priority" cable channel!!!

More complicating factors: CICA-19 Toronto, at the time of the filing of the network applications, was committed into moving its antenne to the world's tallest building...the CN tower. Perched up at 1805' chaat, and with 1,080,000 watts, CICA's coverage area would mushroom out drastically, wiping out the need for another transmitter in the Kitchener area at Paris. Thus we concluded, after examining topographic maps, CATV coverage, and existing UHF stations in certain areas, OFCA could well serve Southern Ont. with high pwr. at Toronto, London, and Chatam. To further our speculation, we wrote to a major UHF Xmtr. manufacturer and asked if our projections were as feasible & economical as the OECA plan. The reply favoured us. We appeared before the CRTC Nov.26/73, when the CRTC heard OECA's application to move its existing Ch.19 xmtr. to CN Tower. Admittedly it was a "last-ditch" effort and we lost, and all the transmitters were approved.

Perhaps we should back up and give some reasons for our failure to achieve our objective. The OECA was somewhat less than co-operative in their dealings with us. The original hearing for the OECA application was late June '75, but due to "internal scandals" within the OECA, the application was withdrawn till things cooled down. A few days before the "cancelled" hearing date, the chairmen of OECA, Ranald Ide appeared before a governental enquiry into educational expenditures. At than enquiry, our brief opposing the OECA proposal was read by our Provincial Member of the Legislature. He was assured that we would receive a full reply to our opposition well in advance of the rescheduled hearing date. Unfortunately, the OECA people avoided us like the bubonic plague, and it was not until after the date for filing papers with the Cdn.Radio & TV Commission, that members of OECA would "consent" to meet Joel and provide some answers to questions. A technical study rebutting our proposal was not provided prior to the hearing.

The "public hearing" was resheduled to September. Neither of us could attend due to time limitations. Nevertheless the CRTC was armed with many pages of our information and argument.

At the hearing, the OECA finally brought forth their own technical report which scrutinized our proposal and alleged that our system was a poor one. Note! this study took 3½ months to submit and at the hearing date, we still did not have our copy.

The fact that CICA-19 would be applying for an antenna move to the CN tower at a November Hearing was inadmissible as an argument when OECA applied for chs.18,28,59 & 32. When it was considered that CICA-19 operated with 600 kw on a poor towersite, Ch.28 Paris would At any rate, the Ottawa hearing did us no good. almost make sense. We decided to try to stop OECA when they applied for the power-antenna change of CICA. After much haggling, we were FINALLY provided with a copy of the report which rebutted our proposal. We might add, the OECA technical report was filled with inconsistencies. When the date dawned for the CRTC hearing to examine CN-Tower applications, the CRTC did not want to hear our submission. Due to some slight procedural errors on the part of ourselves and the CRTC, we were to be prevented from airing our case. This was in spite of long-distance calls and letters which attempted to allow us to be heard. We resolved the situation. Mark, came to the hearing armed with "the law" under which the CRTC was obligated to operate. Threatened with a legal action in Federal Court, the CRTC Counsel decided it might be wise to hear our submission.

But OECA had woven their web well. We were "estopped" from bringing up the network license application because "this "hearing was to deal specifically with the CN-Tower application and the Ch19 Toronto applic.

We argued that the "network" and Ch.19 applications were not mutually exclusive. Superpower from CN-Tower would make our proposal for South Western Ontario workable, and hence make ch.28 Paris redundant.

In effect, we were (as the old saying goes) dammed if we did, and dammed if we didn't. In spite of the broken promises which OECA used on us, and violation of CRTC procedure on the part of OECA, the CRTC Legal Counsel would not permit the bulk of our submission. Coincidentally, during rebuttal, OECA was allowed to bring up points which we were prevented from mentioning.

The outcome, as you well know, was in favour of OECA. They got all the stations they wanted, including a power increase for "mutually exclusive" channel 19. We are quite disillusioned by the CRTC "Public Hearing". For what it was worth, the CRTC could have examined the application behind closed doors "in camera". Perhaps educational TV is a sacred-cow because it is run by the Provincial level of government. Perhaps when Mark Lewis is a member of the Ontario Bar rather than a law student, and Joel Rosenberg is a licensed Medical Boctor rath r than a "med-student" more political and economic clout will be wielded, and both OECA and the CRTC may be more responsive. Mere interested parties and DXers, for the time being, are people to be 'tolerated' and dismissed. There will be a 'glut' of educational UHF stations in Southern Ontario, on frequencies we can scarcely afford to waste. Some "Global" notes:... CKGN-TV, the Global Network, ids. all its xmtrs. with a slide listing the "B" contours of all its xmtrs. This slide is telecast generally, between programmes. The drawback is, there still is no individual station break for the ch.6 or ch.22 xmtrs. As there are two of each, (6 Ottawa & Paris, 22 Uxbridge & Cottam), there is really no way for a DXer to tell which of those stations he's seeing. One plus however: Global runs colour-bars during the morning and afternoon hours. In the top-central section is a digital clock, electronically keyed, and in the lower right corner is the word "Global", also keyed. Early afternoons, Global usually has the evening's program schedule "supered" over the colour bars.

How can a Dier differentiate the ch.6 and ch.22 xmrts? During a few evening hours each week, the Xmtrs. chs.22 Cottam, & 29 Oil Springs are fed programming which is different from the programmes fed to the eastern stations. Generally, these separate feeds take place when U.S. network programming is fed to the eastern stations. A British comedy or detective programme is usually telecast on 22 & 29. Hence it appears Global can microwave feed their xmtrs. singly or in clusters, and perhaps they have the capability to id. xmtrs. singly, or in clusters. Ie. Chs.22 &29 Oil Springs and Cottam could be identified separately from 22 Uxbridge. 6 Paris and 6 Ottawa might also get separate ids. Wewill enter into discussions with Global, on this point. Diers might send letters to Global—TV at 78 Barber Green Rd. Don Mills, Ontario, requesting proper ids. Incidentally, Global signs—on daily at 3pm with hout Sex" over all their xmtrs. excent Cottam—22 and Oil Springs—29....those stations continue with colour

Dear Morrie.

East Coast TVDXer's now have another challenging target, WR4AAG. That's the call of the world's first amateur TV repeater, which began transmissions on March 1st. A group of hams in the Washington, D.C. area (myself included) formed "Metrovision, Inc." last autumn in order to set the repeaterup. The FCC finally came thru with a license in February. Our "channel 13 3/4" is actually 427.25 (video), with an ERP probably around 2 KW. Operation will be from 2000 to 2400 Eastern time every night. The club has about 45 local members, many of whom already have TV rigs on the air and who will be feeding their signals into the repeater. Needless to say, all DXers (hams or not) are urged to be on the lookout. (Input, by the way, is 439.25.)

A standard TV receiver with a slightly modified UHF tuner is all that is needed for reception equipment. The most popular approach seems to be modification of a UHF-to-VHF converter like the Blonder-Tongue BTX-111, which takes about three minutes (all you need to do is take the bottom off the BTX-111, bend the oscillator capacitor C16 metal strip from an angled to upright position, and also bend the metal strips C3 and C4 upright, 427.5 will then appear around channel 14, with output to the TV set on channel 2 or 3).

However the signal is vertically polarized, and although standard UHF antennas work tolerably well for reception (not transmission, though) they must be turned vertically -- even at close ranges -- to get a usable signal. This is crucial.

A transmitting rig is a lot easier to assemble than most people would suspect, now that plenty of used cameras and used 450 mHz commercial FW transceivers are on the market. Anybody that wants to get the info on this sort of thing should write for a subscription to the amateur TV journal, A5 Magazine, Box 6512, Philadelphia, Pa. 19138.

We hear that amateur repeaters will probably be licensed in several other cities if the FCC looks favorably on our operation here. So keep your fingers crossed for more DX targets. In the meantime, send DX reports to WR4AAG, Metrovision, Box 408, Falls Church, Virginia 22046.

From the bulletin of the Double Helix Corp., St. Louis, which is an offshoot of the former KDNA 102.5 that city, it was learned that KDNA-type programming would be continued on *88.1 if a "petition and order to show cause" for KHRU *88.1 Clayton MO to switch to *89.5 succeeds. At my Downsview home site, only 25 miles or so from Global ch 22 Uxbridge xmtr, there is no problem receiving adjacent channel WXXI-21 Rochester NY, © 110 miles and conditions tonite (2-25) are your average winter doldrums. WXXI's beam is only 40 degrees of the CKGN-TV xmtr. Of course, WXXI is very weak...at times no more than a frame bar. I recently picked up a real 'DX machine'. I bought a 20" General Electric Colour TV, with UHF detent tuning. The readout on the tuner dial is about 1" so there is no eye strain or guessing. The accuracy is almost perfect from ch 14 right up to 79 and the translator channels. The only problem is it takes 7½ dial turns to tune from 14-83, but there will be no guessing during DX conditions...so I look forward to 'some' DX. As I sit here and type this letter, I am tuning around UHF. The temperature will fall to about zero tonite, but there is some UHF in the air, albeit no more than frame bars. Right now, I'm getting weak signals from ch 40 Binghamton, ch 36 Elmira, ch 34 Binghamton, ch 21 Rochester, ch 24 Erie, ch 35 Erie, 54 Erie, 61 Cleveland, 43 Lorain, 27 Youngstown, 33 Youngstown, 45 Salem, ch 50 Detroit, plus our 6 locals. 19 UHF stations may not seem like many in the dead of winter, but on a 7' dish, without a preamp, at these temperatures, it really warms one's heart to see frame bars from stations at 2004 miles!"

When I crank it all the way up, it's the tallest thing in Orcutt including trees! I've noticed now that most L.A. U's are there most of the time—also KBHK 44 San Francisco, strange because S.F. V's aren't there or not too good if there. 73's.





PREPARING COLUMNS AND ARTICLES FOR WIFDA

WTFDA depends on volunteers. Because of our limited budget, WTFDA cannot pay typists to retype columns or feature articles. The quality of the finished product, appearing in the VHF-UHF Digest (VUD), is almost entirely based on the quality of the original. Good planning and proper preparation will yield a more readable and more attractive article or column.

PAGE SIZE... To make maximum use of our offset printed page area, it is suggested

that 11 1/2" of typing area is perfect for our purposes (from top of heading to bottom of last line). This will require your typing paper to be longer than the normal 8 1/2 x 11" paper, but please do not exceed 11 1/2" of typing. The side margins are also of importance. For 8 1/2" paper, margins must be 1/2". This leaves a total typing area of 7 1/2" x 11 1/2".



PAPER QUALITY... Almost any white paper will do nicely. The only exception is slick, bond paper, such as "onionskin". This type of paper is not porous enough to absorb ink and as a result, promotes smearing. Only use one side of each sheet.

TYPING... A manual or electric typewriter can be used, with the electric usually giving better results. The ribbon must be dark (black or red). If your typewriter has provision for a carbon ribbon, this will reproduce best. Before typing, clean your typewriter keys. Lighter fluid or alcohol can be used as a cleaning solution, in conjunction with a brush (an old tooth brush will due) and a rag.

ILLUSTRATIONS AND UNDERSCORING... Draw all lines and illustrations in ink. Black, red and very dark blue are the best colors to use. Pencil does not reproduce well and should be avoided. Light blue pencil guide lines can be used to help lay out your illustrations. Offset layout paper with "drop-out blue" lines (very light blue) may help.

CORRECTING TYPING ERRORS... If you should make an error, don't just X it out or type over on the error. Use KO-REC-TYPE, SNO-PAK, LIQUID PAPER or similar products. If you erase errors, (and I don't recommend it) watch out for smearing. Large errors can be corrected nicely by pasting on a strip of paper (or using white correction tape) and retyping. Neatness does count.


DEADLINES AND MAILING... For regular columns, the deadline is the 20th of the month. This means that a column should be received (at 5815 N Christiana, Chicago 60659) by the 20th, not mailed on the 20th. If the deadline cannot be met, an explanitory post card is appreciated. Non-regular features, such as feature articles and photos, should be received by the 10th. Columns or articles can be mailed in a standard 4 x 9" business envelope. There's no need to use an oversized envelope.

FORMAT... How you construct the first page heading of your column or article is pretty much up to you. Unless a part of a pre-printed heading, we do prefer that you type your name and address in the upper right hand corner. All pages following page one are to be headed as shown below:

(Do not type in a page number. Pages can be numbered in pencil on the blank side.)
