WTFDA CONVENTION COMING SOON... The first weekend of August (2nd thru 4th) is just around the corner. Plan now to attend the WTFDA convention in Topeka, Kansas. If you've ever been to a WTFDA convention, you know how enjoyable they can be. If this is your first WTFDA convention, you're bound to be glad you came. The convention itself will be held in a studio of KTMU, channel 11. Motel rooms are available at the Holiday Inn Topeka West, and the Universal Inn (motels adjacent to each other). The Saturday evening banquet will be at the Holiday Inn. The Universal Inn rates are lower than the Holiday Inn, but the Universal does not have a pool. Dave Pomeroy reports that the "Universal is new-- quite clean and nice." Both motels have color TV sets. Rates are as follows:

Holiday Inn: Single \$15, Two people \$21, Family \$23.

Universal Inn: Single \$8, Two people (1 bed) \$11, Two people(2 beds) \$12.42. No charge for children under 6.

TV DX FROM SPACE... On May 30th NASA launched ATS-6, "the most complex, versatile, and powerful communications spacecraft ever developed." For a period of one year, ATS-6 will be in a geosynchronous orbit (fixed), beaming television signal in the 2600 MHz band toward the US. This same satellite will later be moved over India to provide direct transmission to small, low cost, receiver sites. NASA feels that all that will be required for adequate reception will be a \$60 converter and a 10' dish antenna made form "chicken wire and wood". Several US government agencies plan to broadcast signals to the Rocky Mountain region, the Appalachian states, and the states of Washington and Alaska (during different months). Believe it or not, one of the main receiver sites for the Appalachian educational TV project is in Fredonia, New York (in Seybold's back yard??). We hope to bring you a full report in a coming VUD on the chances of receiving these broadcasts on a home brew converter. (circuits anyone??) The converter would also be useful for DXing the many earth bound Instructional TV Stations. In fact, in the Chicago area, a "Catholic TV Network" is planned for the ITV band.

WTFDA Member Survey

. A survey of WTFDA members was taken in late September of last year, and the results are ready for publication. The survey covered members' areas of DX activity; interest in various types of columns, and opinion of the columns that presently appear in the VUD. Specific questions in the survey included the possible limiting of members' DX reports to 1 page per month, and the use of the paragraph as opposed to the column format in the DX report columns. Almost 100 members sent in a survey. Here, starting with some numerical data, is some of what these members had to say.

First, members were asked to rate their level of DX activity on VHF-TV, UHF-TV, FM radio, and VHF radio. This was the response:

63% of the members that answered had been DXing at least one of the above areas of interest for 5 years or more.

Zenith TV sets were the most common rx's of TV DXers. On VHF-TV for antennas most had either yagis or log periodics. Parabolic dishes were popular among UHF-TV DXers, with the Finco 7' dish being the one used most. CMA-Ub pre-amps were also popular among the UHF-TV DXers. The Heath AJ-15 seemed to be the most popular FM set. FM antennas were mainly yagis. VHF radio DXers used various brands of rx's, with Realistic and Regency seeming to be the most often used.

Members were asked to rate some 19 columns that appear in the VUD. Here are the four columns that were rated highest:

Aside from rating columns and activity, members were asked to comment on WTFDA and its publication, the VUD. One item that members wanted was an article reprint service. Additionally, in support of this item, an NRC member said "Lest reprints appear to be a money-losing operation, bear in mind that here in NRC we have sold about 40,000 pages of reprints in the past 3 years; at even a fraction of a cent profit per page it'll help underwrite club expenses to an unexpected degree!" Other common requests were for more feature articles, and for more photos. A high percentage of those that indicated an interest in VHF radio asked for a more expanded column on this topic. One member said "... I believe that your little one-page column lets readers down... It needs new products for monitoring to be listed. It also needs info which can be related to most every reader, not just those in the logged areas."

There were some comments on the club organization. All but one was favorable, the exception being this one; "Club lacks democracy. Hq fails to answer mails. All important issues should be voted on by the membership. Glad to see the 1974 convention site voted on." In almost direct disagreement, another member said "WTFDA should continue to emphasize DX and DXing and play down organizational trivia such as club gov't, etc. DX clubs exist to provide up-to-date DX information for the membership; since DX clubs exist strictly by virtue of their volunteer workers, WTFDA should continue to resist the trap of 'democratic' government which has plagued or kill clubs such as IRCA and CDXC. The people that do the work should make the decisions." Another comment on the subject took a seemingly more middle-of-the-road view: "The club is growing rapidly, but its editorial membership is restricted to original members in a limited area. Newcomers pay up and read, exert not much influence. Perhaps an advisory board made up of members in various parts of the country, with various DX interests would make for a more broadly based, broadly appealing club. Hq does a fine job, but more club members must be involved."

By far the topic that drew the most comment was the issue of how DX reports should appear in the VUD. Whether or not long reports were boring, and should be limited to 1 page per month was the subject of much debate. Answering the question "Do you consider long reports boring?", 57% said no, and 43% said yes. Those that opposed the limiting of FM DX reports were in the majority, 61% to 39%. The limiting of reports to 1 page per month for TV DX reports drew more opposition, as 65% opposed thepossible limitation, and 35% supported it. Those that made written comments concerning DX reports, however, were more often than not opposed to lengthy reports. The member that seemed to be most in favor of limiting DX reports said "Even 1 page per month may be too much for members who ramble and repeat and for editors who lack the guts to edit... I am glad I do not edit a reporting column, for if I did I would get in there and really dig. I'd weed out all the irrelevant and cut almost everybody's 'DX' report down." Most comments in favor of stricter editing policies went along the lines of "Eliminate relog after relog!", and "Cut out the bragging and the repeats, and in my opinion all should be a lot better." There were a number of comments opposing the limiting of reports. One comment read "I think that member reports should not be limited because of the valuable content that would be lost if it was done... Before you know it, we will be like the IRCA and limiting reports tole lines." Another member said "Active DXers should not be penalized for their activity. Real DX never boring."


An interesting point was brought up by these comments: "If you asked 13 (question 13 read 'Do you consider long reports boring?' - jja), you should also have asked 'Do you consider heavily edited reports useless?' VHF-UHF DX in particular pours in when it rains, thus it should not be subject to arbitrary page limitations.", and "The purpose of a report, in my opinion, is to report conditions, not necessarily to name each and every catch, espe

The question of the use of the paragraph as opposed to the column format was much more decisively answered. For FM reports, 67% favored the column format, and 84% favored the use of the column format in the TV DX report columns. Written comments also heavily favored the column style. Typical comments were "Reports in paragraph style are a real chore to plough through", and "Use column, rather than paragraph form for TV or FM reports - makes it much easier to read, and later especially easier to find or pinpoint information you may be looking for."

Still another question pertaining to DX reports was whether or not program material received should be included in TV and FM DX reports. On TV reports the answer was 56% yes, and on FM 68% yes. Written comments were mainly along the lines of "Program material should be included with TV or FM DX reports if the DXer cares to send it in, but it should be limited to what may help other DXers."

There were suggestions that DX reports be removed from the VUD in their present form. One member suggested having the reports broken down by days instead of by DXers. "Accomplishments of DXers will appear in the Statistics column. The 'report' columns would be <u>digests</u> of what happened on particular days, sort of like QST's 'World above 50 Mc.'." Another member suggested that the reports be mimeographed and sent as a supplement to the VUD. With the offset space saved, there would be more space for photos, equipment reviews, and construction projects.

What do the members think of WTFDA as a whole? Probably the best indication comes from the answers to the question "How would you compare the VUD with other clubs' publications for overall quality and content?". Almost all that answered compared the VUD favorably. "As good, if not better" and "very good" were very common answers. If the rating of the VUD is any indication, members think highly of WTFDA.

The author's employer, Bob Cooper, president of CADCO, Inc., encouraged the writing of this article after the results obtained in my apartment DX shack.

Nothing new is claimed about this design, called a Quad Loop, but it is apparent that the design has been neglected by TV DXers. The quad was developed in 1939 by WPLZX for shortwave broadcast application at station HCJB, near Quito, Equador. The Quad Loop may be the Es antenna answer for many who live in apartments, or similar, and do not have the benefit of outside antennas. The Quad Loop is a single band, or channel, antenna because of its high "Q". It is a quarter-wave length on a side, figured by the formula: 248 divided by the center frequency of the desired television channel. (See Figure 1) For example, channel 2 is 54 to 60 MHz, so the center frequency is 57 MHz, making each side of the Quad Loop 4.35 feet. Similar calculation applies to whichever channel(s) you choose to DX. The

The loop may be made from electrical zip cord, (typically 5¢ per foot) split apart, and soldered at one end to form a single wire 8.7 feet long. The wire may be nailed to a wall (using small wire brads) in the shape of a square. It should be fed where the ends meet, either on a vertical or on a horizontal side. The feed must be at the center of either side. If the loop is fed on the vertical side, the antenna will exhibit predominately vertical polorization, and if fed on a horizontal side will have horizontal polorization.

Polarization shift of a signal propagated by Es may or may not allow it to arrive at your receiving site in the same plane as transmitted by the television station. It is therefore questionable whether a vertical or horizontal polarized receiving antenna is important. If, for instance, you have a local station adjacent to the channel you wish to DX, vertically polarized antenna will serve to reduce this interference by perhaps 30 dB, while having little or no effect on the desired Es station. Most TV stations transmit a horizonally polarized signal, so in a adjacent local channel situation, there is a definate advantage to make your Quad Loop vertically polarized.

The Quad Loop's maximum gain is breadside to its faces. Ideally, two loops should be used on opposite walls of the shack, two kneeks shaukalone facing north-south, the other east-west, but the choice is yours. I have my Quad Loops covered with a decorative fish net. The white zip cord is all but unnoticable, which my wife appreciates.

The Quad Loop may be directly fed with 75 ohm coax, the center conductor soldered to one end, the shield to the other. For the perfectionist; yes, an unbalanced condition does exist which could cause a standing wave problem, but for our purposes, may be neglected. Another advantage of a shack wall mounted antenna is that the 75 ohm coax feedline length may be kept to a minimum. In fact, if you need adjacent channel protection and/or voltage gain, a trap or preamplifier may be placed right at the feedpoint.


About performance... from personal experience the quad loop far outperforms a standard dipole. Theory says the Quad Loop has a 9/10 gain over a standard dipole. In practive, the gain appears to be much better. Single channel tower-mounted antennas obviously are better, but the so called all-channel antennas are a compromise at any channel in terms of gain, feed point impedance and similar parameters, all of which are compounded by lengthy feedlines. A typical 100 foot feedline can cost you many dB and in fact, a

simple indoor antenna such as the Quad Loop may well outperform an expensive outdoor array for Es reception.

I do know that my simple 45ϕ Quad Loop holds its own against larger expensive arrays, and is likely the best you can do with an indoor antenna, because I've tried them all. I needed a system that would allow me to meet Bob Cooper face-to-face every morning at the office when we compare Es results. In all fairness, the Quad Loop finishes second to a log or Yagi over tropo paths.

One last thought... 5 to 6 dB gain over a single Quad Loop may be had by mounting a second closed loop of the same size behind the driven element, by a distance of the center frequency divided into 118 (Figure 2). For channel 2, the distance is 2.07 feet. The antenna could be closet mounted with the loops attached to opposite walls, or on either side of the same wall, depending on the channel design. Maximum gain is off the face of the loop that is fed. Back signals are rejected by as much as 25 dB.



The length of each side of each loop is determined by formula $L = \frac{248}{C_F}$

TX El Paso KEZB 96.3 90000 h.v; 730' TX Houston KIKK-FM 95.7 48000 h.v: 700' VA Exmore WEXM-FM 107.5 28000: 260'.

In the February VUD a question was raised about the power, height of WRUT 97.1 Rutland VI. It was correct as given: 830 h,v; 2580'.

Silent, But to Resume Operations . . . IN Angola WAFM 100.1. Station has been sold, subject to its returning to the air within 60 days [100.1\$ 3000; 210'].

In Philadelphia, WDVR 101.1 and WRCP-FM 104.5 withdraw their plan to swap frequencies; to stay where they are!

MN Alexandria KCMT-FM 100.7\$ changes from rock to country music. WATK-FM 104.9 Antigo WI \$ on 6 am to 10 pm.

The Nevada Public Service Commission orders Teleprompter's Reno cable system to resume carrying KSAN 94.9 San Francisco, following a campaign by local citizens demanding KSAN service. KSAN had been dropped from the system because of interference from a station on an adjacent channel (most likely KNIS 94.7 Carson City NV). Now the cable company will have to spend the money necessary to bring in KSAN with a satisfactory signal. From a country music newspaper, it was reported that WCYN-FM 102.3 Cynthiana KY is

country from 6 a. m. to 6 p. m; WVCM 100.1 Carrollton KY is country, as is WPDH 101.5

Poughkeepside NY, having recently switched from MDR. KTRM-FM 95.1 Beaumont TI is country

"10 hours a day, including gospel."

In Connecticut, WLAD-FM 99.3 Danbury, now on with full power, went \$tereo, MOR, 6 ammidnight, "Music for all Seasons," and 100% separate from AM. WINE-FM 95.1 Brookfield CT now 24 hours. WTIC-FM 96.5 Hartford now automated all-classical (except simulcast of WT-IC overnight), and WICH-FM 97.7\$ Norwich is now country, 2h hours, "Easy Lovin' Country." WNYC (AM) New York each week has a program, "Visitors From the Other Side," interviews with people from the city's commercial stations, including FM stations. WERI-FM 103.7 Westerly RI, which simulcasts its AM 100%, does carry Holiday Inn's Dolly Holiday all night show--one of the few stations still doing so.

The FCC has proposed a rule that would reduce the amount of AM-FM program duplication that goes on. In larger cities, virtual 100% separation would be required, while the FCC is looking to others for comments on population sizes for smaller cities, and if the rule should be 50% nonduplication or not. It's my feeling the rule should apply to virtually all AM-FM stations (public AM-FM included), with maybe only 2-3 hours of separate programming in the very smallest markets. A WTFDA member Mike Collins opposes this proposal, thinking the present rule, applying to the largest cities, is sufficient. He doesn't want to see small coverage AMs with full service programming and wider coverage FM affils, like NJ's WJLK and WCTC have to separate their programming -- especially in the mornings when school closings, etc. are broadcast. Thus, "if the FCC extends the hours of nonduplication in major markets, I think it should be 9 am-midnight (instead of 6 am on) so the morning services can still be available on FM." New York's popular Don Imus is simulcast on WNBC-AM-FM from 6-9 a.m., for example.

WEZN 99.9 Bridgeport and WCTO 94.3 Smithtown NY, formerly directional, are both believed to now be nondirectional. WWRL-1600 New York is trying to buy WRNW 107.1 Briar-Cliff Manor NY, and simulcast WWRL's black format 50% of the time; they hope to use WRNW

to get into Westchester County and the Bronx, where WWRL signal is weak.

KUHF *88.7 Houston reported back on the air. KWGS *89.5 Tulsa fears it will be off until September, as antenna blew down in mid-March; expects to relocate mast on a downtown tower. KIOQ 106.1 reportedly moved from Lyons to Sterling KS; not known if this is a change in city of license or a move of tower and/or studio. Apparently, Ellsworth and Great Bend translators of KLOQ to stay on the air. KHIB *91.9 Durant OK, 10 watts with a 130' tower, plans a power uppage and \$.

WJOJ 106.3 Picayune MS heard with MOR in \$; WBSJ 102.3 Ellisville MS seemed to be \$. KLEB-FM 94.3 Golden Meadow LA country and mono days; \$ rock nites. Hawaiian Telephone is phasing out its use of 98-108 mHz, so it's possible that eventually the entire FM band will be available in Hawaii, not just 88-98 mHz. With the deletion of KRSS, the only Indian-owned FM stations are KTDB *89.7 Ramah NM and *100.1 Sitka AK (at Mt. Edgecumbe, a

large boarding school with Indians, Eskimos and Aleuts attending).

Mike Dorner's 7th Progress Report is now available -- a 10-pager, with tables, reports on FM's growth, and an analysis of the US-Mexico FM treaty. All this for 40¢ in U.S. stamps to cover postage and handling. Order from him at 1409 Hymelia Ave., Metairie LA 70003. When you're ordering and you know the heights and exact radiated powers of any 10 watt FM stations, let him know, as he's compiling a list that includes such data.

KOMS 103.7 Lebanon OR, now on the air, with MOR, with signal weak in Bend. In Bend, an FCC hearing will be held to determine who will get the last vacant channel. KFMA 92.7 Jerome ID is asking that 102.9 be assigned, presumably so KFMA can go to a full 100 kw.

Rexburg 94.3 and Burley 98.3 have both been applied for.

In MI, WOLO 98.3 Munising MI recently tone testing; look for regular programming soon. WQXO and WGON (AM) are now cooperative weather reporting stations, so designated by the U. S. Dept. of Commerce. KPIK-FM Colorado Springs now operating on 93.9, \$, country, but exact powers and height unknown (from 94.3). As of May 1, WQXK 92.1 Hialeah FL changed to WCMQ-FM, Latin, soul, 24 hours a day, the first Spanish FM in the Miami area. WVUM *90.5 Coral Gables is \$, even though 10 watts. WDAE-FM 100.7 Tampa and WPRK *91.5 Winter Park, supposedly \$, are still reported to be mono. WMEA *90.1 \$ Portland ME id's with the Maine Public Broadcast Network, including WMEH Bangor. WERS *88.9 Boston went full \$.

WSMD-FM lol. 1 La Plata MD now country music; station may change or move. WGUL-FM 105.5 New Port Richey FL is reported to have switched from MOR to country music.

Richard Wood provides some observations updating last month's updater. XHZM-92.5 Puebla Pue is now a <u>Stereorey</u> station(not to be confused with Monterrey on the same frequency). And XEJE-96.4 Guadalajara Jal has standardized to <u>96.3</u>; classical music. While Mexican studio-transmitter links are supposedly being moved to the 217 MHz band, some may linger in the 88-92 MHz band (such as 88.335 and 90.9 in México DF itself!) For this reason, we present another compilation from CIA listings as of <u>March 1965</u> to aid your search for these weak but DXable possibilities during intense summer Es openings. Do not try to use this list without comparison to more recent ones published in VUD, such as in May 1973:

We haven't analyzed DX conditions here since March, so let's go right to it. February was nothing special; as usual, it represented a low point for most Eastern DKers, and especially those in colder climates. There was some activity in the Northeast with tropo "up" around mid-February, and of course some ever-present Gulf tropo. Only one reporter saw Em during that month with openings confined to the 23rd and 26th noted and seen in Florida. Things picked up slightly in March with Es seen on the 2nd, 4th, 16th, and 26th with Floridians again watching most of the action. Reports received here so far for April show that the Es season is off to an early start in deed. April Es days at this point are the 14th, 15th, a great opening on the 16th (four have reported activity; it was a multi-cloud day with skip lasting past midnight EDT), the 21st, 25th (another good day with the MUF into FM), 27th, 28th, and 29th. Your editor and others have noted much activity in early May also. No significant tropo reported so far.

Attention TV DXers in PENNSYLVANIA, WEST VIRGINIA, KENTUCKY, TENNESSEB, LOUISIANA, MISSISSIPPI and ALABAMA: Beginning with the July VUD, you should send your reports to the CENTRAL TV-DX column.
