


These words in from Steven Sprachman (3939 Eve Drive, Seaford, NY 11783): "So much has been happening since the last time I wrote to renew my membership. First off, next semester I'll be doing my DXing (and studying) at McGill University in Montreal. I hope that the DXing is better there than in Plattsburgh. You should tell Greg Monti that I'm a big listener to WGBB. It's unfortunate that he's only on a few hours a week. My radio career ended with this semester. I'm not quite sure that I'll ever get on the radio again. One of these days, you may catch me on WPLT-91.1 Plattsburgh, if I ever go down there to visit. I would like to put forth this offer for anyone who needs a schedule from New York City and the vicinity. You can write me and ask me for one (the free kind, that is). Instead of return postage, please send me a schedule from your area. The stations listed are 2, 4, 5, 7, 9, 11, 13, 41- NYC and 3, 8- CT. These schedules are not too descriptive, but for most people's needs, it's OK. The offer stands till September first, and as long as they are available in the local supermarket. May this DX season be the best."

My apologies to Paul Krueger for incorrectly listing his address. Paul's correct address is 309 Charles St., Westfield, WI 53964 (WI not MI).

Here's some very interesting comments from Charles Mylod (P.O. Box 523, Charlottesville, VA 22902): "I feel somewhat ashamed about not sending you any DX reports, but I hope to be able to send some in for this summer's DX season. I'm planning on purchasing a house with enough land to set up an antenna farm, including two or so towers on which I could mount VHF/UHF/microwave antennas--and NO nearby high tension wires, radio and TV stations, radar stations, cheap imported junky TVs (which radiate their IF's 15.7 kc harmonic buzz, and even rebroadcast whatever station they're tuned to up to several harmonics and jam up any radios and TVs in a radius of up to a mile), CBers with 10kw linear, and leaky cable TV wires. In the last year I've added a Bearcat BC210 scanner and a CEI-901-5 receiver to my collection of DX machines. The CEI-901-5 is a tunable VHF receiver which was made by Watkins-Johnson for the CIA and other government intelligence agencies. This is not one of those "radar detectors" that have been gathering dust and spider webs in the basements of surplus stores, but a very sensitive and selective receiver. The CEI-901-5 covers 30-300mc with two separate front ends (30-60 & 60-300mc), switching between FM, AM and CW with a tunable BFO, 20, 30 and 300kc selectivity, and other features that are missing from most other receivers that attempt to cover that frequency range. Although I don't think I'll use it as a hi-fi tuner, it sure does an excellent job on FM DXing. I would especially recommend this type of receiver for separate TV audio reception. It does a good job in separating TV audio offsets. I'm surprised that I haven't heard of any other WTFDA members using Watkins-Johnson/CEI or similar receivers, since a receiver like this could solve a lot of the trouble involved in trying to tune in weak, snowy DX video without losing or distorting the audio. I would be interested in seeing articles in VHF-UHF Digest on television receivers suitable for TV DXing, including those with video monitor inputs and outputs (for use with VTRs and separate tuners), and TV demodulators such as those put out by Conrac and Setchell-Carlson. I'd also like to see more articles on VTRs and VCRs. I would be interested in getting a used reel-to-reel VTR or 3/4" VCR in the next year or two, but am confused by the various different formats. I would stay clear of any "home" VCRs, since those are designed for use by the general public (who are assumed to be functional illiterates) and therefore have lots of unnecessary features and undefeatable automatic circuits."

Good to have Bill Coleman rejoin the club. Bill writes that his DX equipment includes a Panasonic RF 2200 receiver and Technics by Panasonic, an FM/AM stereo amplifier receiver.

Hank Holbrook is obviously a Bruce Elving fan: "My favorite columns would be VHF Utility DX, Southern FM, and the column of real value, the one that brings me new stations has to be Elving's FCC FM News!!!! Without that and his FM Atlas, I'd be lost!!!!!!"

Member Mike Worst is finally settled down: "Having temporary addresses for two months has kept everything pretty well stirred up. It's a real relief getting settled in a permanent place. Vidor is a small town seven miles east of Beaumont, which is where I work for the phone company." Mike's new address is 425 Archie, #18-Vidor, TX 77662. Mike is the former editor-in-chief for IRCA, and lived previously in the Seattle area.

From the land down under, we have these words of wisdom from Terry Robinson: "There's been quite a lot of DX around lately. In fact, right up to the moment there's almost continuous DX available on TV. Now only if I could turn my aerial around in different directions! This is not possible at the moment, however, due to a siezed rotator. I wonder if my rotator failing after 10 months is some kind of record. Probably caused by the terrible storms up here (not helped by being about 561 metres above sea level, either). Still hope to have the system back in operating condition one day. Your club bulletin continues to get better and better and I enjoy it more all the time. Your stories of pirate TV stations are interesting. No one would ever dare try anything like that in Australia! FM broadcasting will become more exciting in Australia in the future. At present there are three FM stations in Melbourne (70 kilometres away from where I live). The most recent one broadcasts about 20 hours a day and is an educational station located at the Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology. It uses a frequency of 102.7 MHz and broadcasts mainly hard rock programs in stereo. I also understand that operators of B class radio stations in Australia are trying to get on the FM band. At least one has announced that they are ready to go in stereo two weeks after a license has been granted. Would be interesting if the Australian government got off its backside and started really looking at the FM band rather than trying to run an English style of broadcasting service. TV could be in for some surprises soon, too. I understand that the government that was elected in Australia last year promised ethnic TV stations in Melbourne and Sydney. Because of the scarcity of TV channels in the VHF spectrum, they might have to go to UHF. More later. Your recent story on videotape recorders was interesting. The giant Philips-TMC group has been advertising their VCR that records for about 3 hours recently. Price is around the \$1,000 mark, so think I'll hold off for a while. I have seen quite a lot of programs reproduced from VCR's lately (I am an electronics student at the Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology) and I think VCR's have a great future in front of them. Don't laugh, but maybe one day I'll be repairing them. Your tenth anniversary issue of the bulletin was quite superb. I liked your article "DX'ing Frustrations". The "Strangest DX" article was recently picked up by Roger Bunney in English 'Television'. As far as I can remember tho, he got some of his dates wrong. The articles on FM in the car were very interesting. We have a new car here and would you believe the aerial is inscribed on the back window! Seems to work reasonably well, tho. Apart from somewhat pronounced multipath distortion, it is generally good. Don't know why Toyota couldn't have followed Honda's lead and put the radio aerial on the right hand side (driver's side) A-pillar. Seems to be about the best position there. The old Toyota Celica liftback had the aerial in the pillar, so don't know why the new one didn't follow suit. I was interested in the article "In Britain...." in the February 1978 bulletin. We have a similar system operating here in Australia. It is called the now generally accepted term "Teletext". Last year at the RMIT open day I saw a demonstration on Teletext and it was really good. The colours were sharp and vivid, certainly the PAL colour system was giving off its best. Surprisingly, a very clear picture is not required. The TV station carrying the Teletext was being received only fairly with an indoor aerial, yet the Teletext didn't suffer at all. I understand that the Teletext signal is received either very well or not at all. Recently, the English magazine 'Television' carried an extensive series of articles on construction of a Teletext decoder. I will construct a decoder if and when 'Electronics Australia' features one. Until then, I can only roll the frame down, look at the squiggy lines, and hope."

Member Bob Steadman adds these words: "I was much impressed by VHF-UHF Digest, especially the anniversary issue. I've done little FM DXing and know little about it. At least now I've got a start. The SCA has really got me interested. There's nothing like something you're not supposed to do to make me want to do it."

Joe Longmoore is back in WTFDA! He has a few brief comments: "I'm getting back into the organization. I've let things slide, but the spring season and news of sunspot activity has got me thinking again. I'm strictly into UHF TV really, but I hope to set up for lowband VHF within the month. I've got a 15' Sony color TV, a 7' Finco dish at 40' with a 30db Delhi preamp. With lots of local stations, I've got problems with images and overload all over the dial. Would appreciate any suggestions."

Of course, not all comments received at HQ are completely complimentary to the club. Following a recent mailing to former members, we received comments from Michael Schoenfuss, now of Wausau WI. Michael told us he'd like to see more articles on localized scanner radio and lower club dues. (WTFDA is still a DX club with almost the lowest dues among ANARC member clubs-jz). He writes, "I just didn't feel I could afford to pay \$11 for only limited articles on scanner radio. Also, the annual convention was always someplace way far out, and I couldn't afford it."

#### Members' Reports

The Duluth News-Tribune came through with a nice article, "'Subcarriers: A Controversy in FM,'" written by George D. Johnson of the paper's staff, and a ham. In it he quotes Harold Allen of the St. Paul MN office of the Federal Communications Commission when asked what would happen to a person who started manufacturing subcarrier adapters and advertising them for sale. "He said nothing would happen, as long as the adapters were free of spurious radiations on frequencies above 30 megahertz." I am quoted as "waging a battle to bring the subcarrier transmissions out into the open." George describes building an SCA adapter using my schematic and the 565 IC circuit, and said it took him one evening, but hooking it up to a portable radio took most of the next day, so it is no easy task to connect SCA in a radio. The article appeared in the Sunday, June 11 paper. "Elving Science" is on the way to making SCA easier to hookup for anybody. In R&D is a project to sniff out the SCA signal in portable radios, making use of the earphone jack. A prototype unit has been built, complete with audio amplifier and speaker, and a few should be available for WFTDAers at the convention. Price will be about \$25. Ken Simon says KPFT \*90.1 Houston says they will be going to 100 kw with a 1500' tower in two years. WHRS \*90.7 Boynton Beach FL is facing funding problems and may lose school board backing. Ken is looking for a used AR-15 (Heath, I believe) receiver for \$100 or less; contact him at 528 Pilgrim, West Palm Beach FL 33405.

John Timm reports WZUU-FM 95.7 Milwaukee, after losing their main tower, is now at about 120' with a single bay antenna, giving about 18 kw ERP. WMIL 106.1 Waukesha still silent. New owners looking for a tower site in or near Milwaukee for better coverage; stereo to be added.

Rod O'Connor took the scenic route by ship and stopped into KRBD Ketchikan AK. Their antenna is about 200' atop a hotel. "It is a nice little station, with a varied format (cprm and j). They are hoping, with their power boost application for 7300 w to 'squeak' into Prince Rupert, BC." The KFSK Petersburg AK tower was atop a school or municipal building on a 50-foot tower. KMXT Kodiak is about 260' high, but mountains east of town probably bring their HAAT down to 3 feet. About the Atlas. "I think adding interstate highways to the maps would be a good idea, but I would imagine it would involve re-tracing a lot of maps, and I doubt you would be very enthusiastic about it. The maps, as they are, are quite good. It amazes me how you manage to fit in some of the stations in the larger cities (NY for example)." Rick Samford says on p. 28 of the Atlas (map) I show KOGM 107.1 Opelousas LA as KSLO. WUOL \*90.5 in the convention city of Louisville now on until 12:30-1 a.m. most days. Brad Carey, chief engineer, verifies, according to Ted Fleischaker.

WBLK 93.7 DePew (Buffalo) now in its 14th year, according to an article sent by Bill Thompson, and unusually successful with a format (soul) that critics said would never work. "WBLK takes pride in its community involvement with projects like public affairs programming, a telephone talk show known as 'Express Yourself' and Sunday gospel and religious programming." 1<sup>o</sup>-rock fans are trying to win WWOL-FM 104.1 to that kind of music, but the station is shifting more to m, now mk. The movie FM opened and closed very quickly in Buffalo; perhaps the movie will be on network TV for those of us who missed it, Bill muses. Finally he says "The new FM Atlas is the easiest one to use yet. The logos do break up the monotony of using the by-frequency listings. . . ."

In Italy the RF pollution worsens, reports Antonio Randaccio. He says if you listen to any FM station in your car in Rome and drive around the AFC will keep your receiver changing to different stations every two miles because of the crowded band conditions. He's experimented with traps with no success. But the bootleg stations are all vertically polarized, while the legit. stations are h, so there may be some opportunity to use polarization as an advantage. He sent pictures of his own antennas, going from 75 mHz to 16 GhZ, at a height of 17 meters.

Pittsburgh's Walt Kowalczyk, an engineer at "96-KX," says he's glad I am publicizing SCA. "I've often thought of getting in touch with the local newspaper radio/TV editors to maybe have them do an article on SCA and what is available on SCA." With my success and Ted Fleischaker's success in Louisville in getting such articles published locally, this may be an idea for other WFTDAers who have enjoyed SCA listening and who live in areas having large-circulation daily papers.

On the 95.9 listing in the Atlas it should be Lewistown Mt, not Lewiston; under FMakings: the correct spelling of the Idaho town is Coeur d'Alene, points out Ralph Strobel, who says Coeur d'Alene is his home town. On 93.3 it should be WKZW, "KZ-93," not WKSX Peoria IL.

WTLR \*89.9 State College PA announces they are on from 5:55 am weekdays (11:55 am Sundays), with sign-off not indicated. Gospel music. Lawyers and listeners representing WXPN Philadelphia argued before the FCC to allow WXPN and the U. of PA to keep its license. The station license renewal is in doubt on a variety of charges; the FCC's decision is not expected for another two months.

WAKX-FM Duluth argues quite astutely in comments before the FCC to allow FM translators to continue operating outside the 1 mV/meter primary area of FM stations, taking issue with the National Assn. of Broadcasters. WAKX-FM says the public thus better served, that big-city stations do not monopolize the audience and advertising of smaller-city FM stations, and translators help to minimize the coverage inequalities between regional AM stations and FM. All of which points are, I believe, well-taken.

WDCG 105.1, "G-105," Durham is "now a hard-rock station here in Durham," reports David Sears,

who designed this logo for WDBS 107.1 there: Robert Zent said of SCA activity in Indiana: "I was surprised at how few stations in this area have any SCA activity. The quality of the audio varies considerably, from a good, clean FM-like sound from WSMJ 99.5 to the tinny, distorted WMEF 97.3, both of which carry similar music. WMEF's subscribers are really getting ripped off." He finds SCA listening quite interesting, and "it was quite easy to find the take off point within the receiver. One of the test

point binding posts comes directly at the output side of the detector."

In Connecticut with WIOF Waterbury abandoning country music, the only such station in the area is WCTY Norwich, "and their power is only 3 kw," says Paul R. Anderson. "WEKT (AM) in W. Hartford was also k, but new owners changed the calls to WMLB and the format to the syndicated Entertainers. I feel this change in many stations to the bland sameness will stop soon as once again stations, to make out, will be forced to vary their programming to be different from others in the market."

Dave Grim says that WWWM 105.7 Cleveland had to install a small, less-efficient antenna atop the WKYC-TV tower to prevent overloading of the tower. WWWM cannot move to a new tower without losing grandfather status at a higher power than most area stations have for their tower height. "If that's true, and it seems to make sense, then how did WNCI 97.9 move almost 10 miles south to downtown Columbus and not lose their grandfather?" Also Dave muses: "Should be interesting to see how things with Sino (Sinus?) Radio turn out. I don't see where they have much to stand on. Hope to see you in Louisville. 





# IN SEARCH OF DSB

In the four years of my public service DX'ing, I have come to appreciate several ways to indicate the presence of E-skip in public service frequencies. My best initial indicator of any E-skip is the pager; universally on 35.22 & 35.58, these pagers are located throughout the country including Alaska and Hawaii. There is at least one in each state and one is even located in Puerto Rico.

My first investigation of a possible opening is to attempt to ascertain the direction of the skip. If the skip is coming from the South, for example, I try for 45.06, used statewide in Florida for highway patrol. Florida also utilizes 45.10 and 44.90. If you attempt much skip, try buying the Police Call Magazine, available at most Radio Shack Stores or through Police Call Lebanon, NJ 08833.

Several frequencies are good buys for several areas and are good indicators of the presence of E's. One of my best frequencies has been 39.50. This particular frequency has netted me 41 QSL's from Virginia, Louisiana, and Illinois. The reason this particular frequency is such a good buy is that every police agency in these states must maintain a base station on this frequency. In the case of smaller agencies, it is the only base station they maintain. Some of the larger agencies use it as a point to point frequency.

There are, however, frequencies that are utilized only as point to point frequencies. A good example is the frequency 39.46 mhz. My encounter with this frequency is its use in Illinois and Kansas as a point to point only frequency. A call on this frequency is easy to identify, as they call from agency to agency; i.e., "Logan County from Sangamon County".

This is self explanatory. The Sangamon County Sheriff's Office is calling the Logan County Sheriff's Office. With the time and date you have all you need for an excellent reception report.

I address my report to Sangamon County Sheriff's Office c/o Communications Department Springfield, IL. My report goes to Springfield, as Springfield is the county seat of Sangamon County. No other address is available, but universally the post office knows where the police department or sheriff's office is located.

The remainder of this month's feature will attempt to focus on the highway patrol/state police throughout the continental United States. Keep in mind that I am working strictly with information I have gathered through my own research in Police Call Magazine. If you find the information not current, please don't hesitate to drop me a line.

The intention of this feature is to provide you with information on public service DX'ing. Much of what I have to offer will have to come from you, the reader. I have some ideas on features of interest, but my scope of information is limited.

Please also take note that some agencies have undergone changes, and I need your help to determine the scope of such changes. Please keep me posted!!!

Solar flux levels in May slowed down somewhat but Cycle 21 is still rising at a much better rate than 20 did. At least this fall F2 season should be the best since 1970. The British and French TV audio are very probable. The north-south F2 MUF's from here have been holding well into the mid-30's or better (when magnetic disturbances occur).

The Es season so far has been considerably down from recent years. So far only one good opening into the VOR-ILS band (May 12).

During the summer some ionospheric modification experiments will be done using the "ionospheric heater" (2 Megawatt h.f.) at Platteville, CO. VHF and even UHF frequencies will be affected. Barium releases from rockets over Nevada in May proved less productive than expected on VHF.

Good aurorae up north in May-June so far. As yet no one has sent any DX via that.

## 11 Month Unidentified ID

Rome was not built in a day, god did not make little green apples and it does not rain in Minneapolis. Bull feathers or whatever the same pertains to unidentified stations. Let me tell you a story, a true story with facts that lead to the (11 month ID) title.

It all started when I was sleeping, yep your reading correct, I was sleeping but do not get ahead of yourself, no videotaperecorder had been used. Bill Thompson, editor of Eastern TV-DX and I communicate quite frequently, one would actually say we make sure both of our telephones work properly. Getting back to the story, it was Wednesday June 8th, 1977 and I was checking the dials that evening. Can not recall how good signals were, I would imagine not too hot because I went for some shut-eye before midnight. On June 9th, a few minutes after midnight I got one ring on the phone (one ring is a sign that E-skip is in, sort of a code between some of us TV DXers.) I called Bill back and he gave me the run down on what was up. Skip was in and not much longer double-hop occurred and that is happy days for a DXer.

We made a decision that early morning to keep both phones off the hook so we could talk back and forth while monitoring this driving E-skip until it petered out. Between the two of us we made out alright.

One ID was seen on ch. 4, KGIN, but that is channel 11. Could it have been a translator, 10 watts by E-skip? This peculiar station puzzled us. At first we thought it might be KSNB-4 relaying KGIN by mistake but a letter from them proved no. For many months this was a puzzle.

I wrote letters to Nebraska inquiring about reception received with a KGIN ID on channel 4. On that morning we watched three different channel 4s sign/off in that area. This left the strong possibility of our unknown to be a translator. Bill also payed a visit to our local library to research into TV FACTBOOK for information on KGIN's translators.

Three translators were found to be of importance; KQ4CV Broken Bow, KQ4CN McCook and KQ4ED North Platte. One which one did we receive? Figuration comes to mind at this point. A letter from KGIN in Grand Island, Nebraska received after many months of waiting was of great use. We were informed of another translator, KQ4HL Ord, Bill and I had no idea of its existence until then and the letter was very appreciated. The information made the possibility of identification by signal directional transmitting antenna. Also the path of E-skip both single and double-hop and time of reception (12 minutes prior of last logging, KORK-3) were of great importance.

My conclusion, reception of which translator received, on an extraordinary early morning E-skip opening, the one and only VHF translator on KGIN-11 on channel 4 is KQ4CN McCook. I claim it by its directional signal, E-SE, 1,137 miles from its normal signal coverage area (see PHOTO-NEWS, April 1978). Received in Buffalo NY by Bill Thompson and Paul Traska on June 9th, 1977, a record that stands out to be beat.

The E-skip season got off to a fair start in May. Major sporadic-E activity on TV didn't appear until after May 15, and the first half of May was almost completely without Es for all but the most southerly DXers. Although there were a number of openings reported in late May, HUFs this year seem to have been below par for that period. Only on three dates has E-skip been reported to channel 6. Many of the late May openings didn't seem to reach higher than channel 4. An Es chart for the month will appear when more of this column's regular reporters have been heard from.

As will sometimes happen, the early part of the skip season has fallen into a very definite slump during the first part of June. Usually, early June is an outstanding period for Es openings, but you can always expect E-skip to do the unexpected! Hopefully, activity in the later part of the month will make up for the slump.

Tropo conditions in May were excellent at times. The month began with another spectacular Gulf tropo opening noted by John Combs, with lowband VHF TV tropo out to over 1000 miles on the morning of May 5! John reports highband VHF and UHF TV to around 850 miles during that opening. In the Midwest, good tropo conditions prevailed May 21-22.

We still haven't had many reports of auroral activity following the giant solar flares of April and early May. If you saw anything unusual, send in a report; auroral TVDX catches are hard to come by, and of great interest to many VUD readers.

Incidentally, if the new postage rates are driving you up a wall, don't let it cut back on your DX reporting. Many DXers have found that a postcard will do fine for reporting their loggings. If you print carefully, you'd be surprised how much you can fit on a card.

"I am experimenting this year by building quad loops. They are made of stripped lamp cord attached to cardboard mounts. My gigantic channel 2 loop hangs on my bedroom window. Since getting a job this year I spend the working week at this city location where I do just about all of my TV DXing. I am bothered by some cable interference on all channels which isn't too much of a hinderence to skip. Also, CB interference on channel 2 with the passing of certain 'ratchet jaws' in cars. To begin with, I'd like to explain an error that I made in last month's report. On 4-23 I noted that KOBS 104.5, Orange, TX had changed its CL to KZMR; it turns out that the new CL is KZOM. Since the signal was weak to begin with (and KTE in San Antonio usually screws up that frequency for me) I apparently misinterpreted "KZOM-Orange" as KZMR. This probably isn't the first time this situation has arisen, and it probably won't be the last, but I'll continue to strive for greater accuracy in reporting. By the way,

this station uses a "Zgom 104 and a half" non ID. Now, on to my more recent DX: there hasn't been much. If April tropo was termed disappointing, then I'll have to say that tropo fell flat on its face during May. Some of the mid-May tropos had good signal, but there wasn't much heard. It looks as though the true Gulf trop season ended with the 5-16 opening, as we're now into mid-summer trop conditions. May was warmer and drier than normal with the temp. on the biggest DX day for '78 thus far (5-12) hitting 101 degrees before the cool front that eventually helped to set off the 5-15-15 ducting to FL passed through later that evening. Hasn't been that hot since, but will be by the time this appears in print. At least we've missed the spring storms, which other nearby places haven't. As bad as the tropo has been, skip has been much worse. As you can see, there was only one good day (but it was of the intense June variety) and I wish I could have stayed at the dial for seven hours straight. May skip was way below the '77 levels and June is starting out with the same low MUF openings. I've seen some skip on the TV but very few in ID's in the ed. FM band. Let's hope things pick up very quickly.


