



Tidbits.....

This is from Don Davis (107 Oakdale Drive, Warner Robins, GA 31093): "I'll be doing something shortly to get the QSL Bureau off the ground. I overloaded myself with college classes, and a new job recently. I was amazed to see Mr. Ross brag about his QSLs in the QSL column and not use any return postage! This is the #1 reason so many stations won't verify. SASE is the only way to go!" The QSL bureau was mentioned in the Mailbox several months ago. The idea is to get DXers to manage certain stations in their general area, and when a fellow DXer hasn't received a verification from a station in over three months, the manager will personally take a copy of the report to the station and try to get it verified. The bureau will also be used by IRCA and NRC members, so that we can get a great number of stations covered. For more information on the project, write to Don.

Good to have Bill Heusmann back in the club! Bill hosted the club's first convention many moons ago. He writes, "Lately I've been almost entirely inactive, partially due to my apartment situation making it difficult to get antennas up. I'm currently looking for a house, though."

Still looking for a Sony ST5130 receiver? Such a deal we have for you. David McLaren (RR #2, County Line Road, Rock Falls, IL 61071) wants to sell his. It's in good working order, and he wants \$200 for it, shipped postage paid. Anyone interested can contact him at the above address.

Member Robert Dally, Jr. writes with information about himself: "I am 37 years old, a foreign language teacher at both the university and high school levels. I have been fooling around with TV DX since the early 1950's and in the past five years have also gotten interested in shortwave and even medium-wave DX, mainly as an outgrowth of my knowledge of foreign languages, which I am able to maintain better with the aid of broadcasts. I belong to a number of DX radio clubs, such as NASWA, NRC, SPEEDX, etc., etc. As for television, my equipment includes: 1) 19" Magnavox color portable with unbelievable selectivity! (uhf tuner); 2) Channel Master VHF antenna (model number forgotten) next to largest size; 3) Winegard 75 ohm AC-2950 antenna booster for VHF with TWO FM traps installed to get rid of local FM signals. There are no VHF stations here in Youngstown; 4) UHF eight bay antenna with Channel Master model OO71 UHF booster also 75 ohm. We have four million watt UHF stations here and nevertheless this booster will accept their huge signals and still amplify weak ones!; 5) Both antennas are fed with 75 ohm coax line specially ordered at 50¢ per foot!, number 14 AWG wire, and has the lowest possible loss. It is RG-11/U foam and at channel 83 has 5.1 db loss per 100'. At channel 2 this loss is only 1.1 db per 100'; 6) Inside the house on VHF only there is also a Winegard distribution amplifier model A-215 75/300 ohm, with plus 15 db gain. The main reason for this huge system is to beef up the channels which we can get here regular and we are able to get nearly 20 channels regularly from: Cleveland, Canton, Akron, Youngstown, Alliance, and Steubenville, Ohio, plus Erie and Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, Wheeling, West Virginia, and often, London, Ontario. For DXing perhaps all this is not necessary, although it has helped to get some very interesting distances at times, such as Casper, Wyoming, Havana, Cuba, and Sydney, Nova Scotia. It is only recently that I became aware of the terms such as tropo and Es and that I began to understand the nature of what causes these distances. I do not have time to monitor a TV set all day long, but am interested in delving more into this phenomenon if possible. Can you give me the location of people or literature which describe TV DX in other countries, particularly how they cope with the fact that different nations use different line standards and even different frequencies. What can be done to receive such stations in the US or is this even possible?"

Non-member B.C. Dosi lists his DX achievements in his country, India: "Although here at Chandigarh we don't have any local TV stations, I get regular daily transmissions from Mussoorie (ch. E10) relay station about 130km far. During rainy and winter seasons we get Amritsar (ch. E7), which is 240km far, with fair to good signals. Lahore (ch. E5) also appears with fair to good signals on rainy and winter days which is 260km. Occasionally I have received by F2 such far stations as Calcutta (ch. E4) 2,000km, Bombay (ch. E4) 1,500 km, Madras (ch. E4) 2,500km, and some Pakistani stations ranging between 500-1000km on channels E8 and E10. What more interesting is that I receive fairly good (video only) from USSR station channel R1."(Catches sound more like Es than F2. His address is Post Box 53, Chandigarh-160017, INDIA-jz)

Because of a wonderful turnout at the excellent convention in Louisville, hosted by Ted Fleischaker and Wayne Murphy, many changes have been added to my FM station computer list by members. PTL TRANSLATORS? Voice magazine and TV's "PTL Club" have made mention of a proposal that will go before the FCC. The Full Gospel Businessmen's Fellowship International (FGBMF) wants to finance hundreds of translator stations in U.S. communities to rebroadcast the 24-hour PTL Satellite Network. This and the Iron Mountain MN application (see previous page) are the first two attempts that I know of to use translators to pick-up a satellite feed. The legal confusion alone will give the FCC some headaches. (See Feb. '77 CATJ Journal)

CANADIAN NEWS: The CRTC has decided against issuing licenses for the low-powered rebroadcasting stations provided in some remote Northern Canada communities by David Brough. (See April '78 VUD, p. 28). Reasons given include failure to obtain program rights for the taped programming, failure to meet Canadian content requirements, and the proposal to use scrambled signals to restrict reception to those who pay a fee. (Pay-TV!! Shrewd cookie, this guy...). Areas already served or soon to be served by Mr. Brough's transmitters include South Bay Mines, Ear Falls, Ignace, Sioux Lookout, Nakina, Longlac, Wawa, Couchenour, Pickle Lake, Matabbi Mines, Moosonee, Kenora, Fort Frances, Atikokan, Druden, Terrace Bay, Geraldton, and Caramat, all ON; Leaf Rapids, Lynn Lake, and Gilliam MB; Uranium City SK; Frobisher Bay, Inuvik, Pine Point, Fort Smith, and Hay River, all NWT. Several of these areas have existing television service. The announcement was accompanied by a request for legitimate applications for new stations in remote, unserved communities. (Perhaps some Canadian readers can verify the existence of these stations when in the various towns.)

NOTICIAS DE MEXICO: XEFB-3 Monterrey NL, and XHAE-5 Saltillo COAH are now running parallel programming at least part of the time, as seen by this editor. I have viewed separate IDs for both stations, as well as a joint ID, over XEFB-3. XHAE-5 was listed as being Net-2--this, too, may have changed. Those who know of Mexican travelers, please attempt to obtain recent TELE-GUIAS. The most recent ones I have seen are about two years old--not much help!

MISCELLANY: Construction was expected to begin during July on the multi-station RCA tower atop the World Trade Center in New York that will accomodate 10 TV stations and up to 15 FM stations. The structure will rise 351.5 Ft. above the 1353 ft. building. Construction is expected to take about six months.....In Providence RI the applicants for Ch. 16 want to change that CP to Ch. 64.....Two groups, one a Palm Beach concern, the other from WPBT-2 Miami, are vying for the open Ch. 42 ETV spot in West Palm Beach FL. The Palm Beach group wants to erect a 2000-ft. tower, which would be the second tallest in the U.S., and rent space to Chs. 5 & 12, as well as the not-yet-existing station on 25.....WTOG-44 has been seen with live baseball via satellite from WGN-9 and WOR-9. Also seen was an L.A. vs. Pittsburgh game--from KTBN-40 or who? Perhaps Bob Cooper could supply a list of independent stations that are known to be on the satellite.....Ch. 26 will be applied for in Daytona Beach FL. The application, not yet official, is by Springfield Television Corp. of Springfield MA. The station would be independant with a 1000' tower. They hope to be on the air by fall of '79 as there are no other applicants and no apparent opposition.



During the fades (which occur about eight per minute, and last up to two seconds each), the audio is completely captured by a male announcer in Arabic, and Arabic/Middle Eastern music. This was noted along with severe offset het. during the fades. No picture was ever seen while the Arabic signal was in. At 1829, WPBT gave a clear I.D. , but no type of break was heard in the Arabic program at the half-hour. The levels and fade rate continued more or less the same until 1842 when WESH came on with an announcement that they had been off during the last hour due to technical difficulties. From this time on, WPBT and WESH were fair to strong with each fading in and out over the other. The Arabic program was noted only three times after 1842. During the entire reception period, there was no sign of KPRC or the various Spanish stations which usually come in from Mexico during tropics. My equipment is: Sony KV1710; B/T all-channel antenna at 30ft., oriented Southeast, no rotor. Belden 8290 lead-in.

The Houston station is North of my antenna pattern, and the Mexican stations are South, but Miami is "right on target". A visit to the library to consult their globe, shows a great circle course on my antenna bearing goes through the South Atlantic to, more or less, Durban, South Africa. My antenna is subject to peculiar reception due to what I believe is called the "knife edge" phenomenon, which Mr. Cooper has described. I have a very sharp hill about $\frac{1}{2}$ km in front of my antenna.

Does Cuba have anything on channel two which might carry an uninterrupted Arabic program??(possibly; from what I've heard they run foreign language programs occasionally.--wd) Seems unlikely.(perhaps some of the DXers along the Gulf may have some ideas; my international DX information is limited, to say the least.--wd)




It appears the skip season here fell apart after the 7-25 opening with just a few lo-band openings observed since that occasion. Perhaps we'll be pleasantly surprised by a few scattered August openings, though. Most of the July skip was to FL, which sort of got dull. The 7-15 Es opening had a lot higher MUF (WSHE 103.5 heard tentatively) than my loggings would indicate, but the high MUF didn't hold up for long. July tr began with some decent openings on the 3rd and 4th (reported last month) and the pattern repeated itself during late July & early August. Unfortunately, nothing over 550 mi. was heard during any of the openings. Early July had record-breaking temperatures (107 F here). Then things turned around completely when trop. storm Amelia dumped close to 3 ft. of rain less than 100 miles away.

 "Had I written this letter a few days ago I would have said that this was the most disappointing E-skip season since I started DXING a few years ago. That statement still largely holds true but with one exception. The skip on 7/30 yielded what I believe is my first double-hop reception—that of WAPA-4 San Juan, PR. At roughly 1650 miles, I assume that this is too long for a single Es hop. The opening was nothing out of the ordinary: typical WPBT-2 Miami, WTVJ on 4, and WPTV briefly on 5. Cuba made an appearance also on ch 5. There was an SS stn noted on 4 at 1935 EDT. I assumed it was Cuba but it was unusual in that it wasn't in parallel to ch 5 which is the same network. At 1938 I noted a commercial and color reception also started breaking through. Obviously not Cuba but it wasn't until 2100 EDT that I finally got an ID (have a beautiful tape of it). They had been running 'Logan's Run' dubbed in SS at 1945. From 2000-2100 there was a sort of variety programming featuring disco mix/dancing. Signal at 2055 suddenly became very strong (as strong as any typical Es) whereas it had been in/out from 1935-2055 (mostly out). Surprising picture quality particularly since this was on indoor rabbit ears antenna."

In May I bought a Blonder-Tongue CMA-U-14-59 UHF preamp from Morris Goldman. I can only use it when there are no local U's on. I even get VHF overloading on UHF with it hooked up (that's what I get for being 3 miles from the Chicago mtrs). Equipment here consists of a Sony TV-131, an Archer V-125 VHF-FM antenna and an 8 bay bowtie, along with numerous traps (mostly used to eliminate overloading on VHF). The log currently stands at 264, with 181 verified. The WLDS-13 logging of 7/29 was a new record distance for me, beating the previous record (WDBJ-7 & WSLS-10) of 533 miles, via tropo."

NOAA Weather Radio stations transmit on the frequencies of 162.40, 162.475, or 162.55 MHz. These stations are operated by the National Weather Service and broadcast weather info 24 hours a day.

The average format of a Great Lakes NOAA station includes a brief description of weather systems affecting, or forecast to affect the area; the latest forecast for the vicinity and an extended outlook; climatic data; local, area, and Coast Guard weather observations; a radar summary; open-waters forecast; and a near-shore marine forecast.

2) WEATHERADIO CANADA

The Weatheradio Canada network is the Canadian version of NOAA Weather Radio. These stations will also give 24-hr. weather information on 162.40, 162.475, and 162.55 MHz.

Currently there are no stations on the air in the Great Lakes region. The first station to go on the air will be located in Toronto. The station will begin testing in early September and should be on the air by late summer or early fall. An application has been made for a license, but as yet, no frequency, call, or power output has been assigned. The probable frequency will be 162.40 MHz. The transmitter will be located on the CN Tower and will be directional with a cardioid pattern centered to the northwest. Future plans call for the installation of stations in Thunder Bay, Sudbury, Windsor, London, St. Catharines, and Ottawa.



WNMU-TV (Channel 13) has joined the nation's first and one of the world's most extensive system for the regular distribution of television programs transmitted nationally via satellite. The satellite dish is located on Northern Michigan University's campus.

The \$39.5 million system, principally provided by and constructed under the supervision of the Corporation for Public Broadcasting (CPB), replaces public television's terrestrial distribution system of programs. The past system allowed for only one program to be transmitted at a time to the local stations. By 1979, the satellite system will link more than 270 public television station in the U.S.


The new satellite system provides advantages for public television viewers in four major areas:

A Wider Selection of Programs - More than one program may be fed from PBS at a time so local stations can "tailor" their programming to serve community needs.

Superior Technical Quality - Under the present, ground-based method of distributing programs to the station, program quality diminishes at locations distant from the point of origin. Under satellite operations, distance from the point of origin is not a factor, so all stations will be receiving programs of consistent excellent quality.

Reduced Costs - The costs of leasing telephone lines from AT&T to transmit programs have been rising in recent years; the satellite interconnection guards against future increases in the cost of distributing programs.

Radio Simulcasts - By 1980, National Public Radio and its more than 200 member stations will also be interconnected by satellite. WNMU-FM will be interconnected sometime in 1979.



The PBS Main Origination Terminal, near the Washington suburb of Springfield, Virginia, is the hub of public television's new satellite system. From here, up to four programs are simultaneously transmitted to Western Union's WESTAR I domestic communications satellite, orbiting 22,300 miles above the earth. WESTAR I then re-transmits the programs to public television stations in the continental U.S., Alaska, Hawaii, Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands.

It was that great mirror in the sky, the ionosphere. Television signals are usually too high in frequency to be reflected by the ionosphere, an atmospheric layer about 60 miles above the surface of the earth. Lower frequency AM radio signals often are bounced long distances during nighttime hours, but TV signals usually pass through the ionosphere and head out to space. When conditions are right, the ionosphere becomes so electrically charged that it reflects television signals thousands of miles, sometimes with greater power than local stations. You can expect this phenomenon to increase during the next few years because of the earth's position in the 11-year sunspot cycle, said Ralph Haller, a Federal Communications Commission engineer.
