This project has traditionally moved slowly due to both its size and lack of fulltime volunteers for it. Recently, one member who offered to computer typeset the station lists had to pull out of the project due to time problems caused by family responsibilities. At the same time, we discovered that maps used in the rough draft could not be used for the book due to copyright problems. We are obviously now in need of volunteers, especially those who have the equipment to draft new maps--preferably by computer. Additionally, much of the data now needs to be corrected, because it's been almost a year since EASTERN TV DX editor Bill Draeb worked up the first draft. Bill tells us that he wonders why it should take so long to get a finished version ready; the answer seems to be that few club members are as willing to volunteer and work as hard as he did on the project, and that's really a shame. Don't let this important club publication go unfinished!

READERS' REPORTS AND FM NEWS

The ultimate in program format simplicity may have been reached in Canada when the CRTC reduced and broadened the format categories to just four: MOR, Rock, Country, and None of the Above. Now, wouldn't that simplify my work and make life easier if we boiled all radio to just those four, or simpler still, if we adopted a change suggested earlier by a VUD reader and called it all "sound"? But Walter Patton says, "Mind you, in new and renewal applications they are still expecting a precise description of the station's format though careful categorizing of music for the program log is simplified. It is not exact. . . from having heard some of the stations, the match between the published information and the station's on air format is sometimes problematical." [That's why, Walter, I am not mentioning several changes the CRTC is listing as going from r to mr or mr.]

"A committee made up of the CBC, CRTC and DOC has prepared its report on the CBC's long range frequency needs, the original objective of the CBC had been to move much of its CBC Radio Network from AM to FM. This was scotched by the CRTC on the grounds that in order to reach the density of transmitters the CBC felt were required would result in a dearth of channels for other interests. The CBC also expected to have duplicated service on AM and FM transmitters during a long transition period. In areas where the conversion had already been implemented—Halifax NS, Marystown and Goose Bay NF, Moncton and St. John NB—the CRTC has now told the CBC it should close its AM transmitters by November of this year."

"Of the CBC's 70 proposals for FM channels the Tripartite Committee has made recommendations in 43 cases. FM will be used in 21, in nine improvements will be made to the AM facilities and field tests will be conducted in a further 13. The remaining 27 were left unresolved. While the freeze on FM applications has been lifted for other parties, applicants for channels which the CBC had proposed using will be required to produce a detailed argument as to why their applications should be granted in preference to the CBC's wishes for the future. The CBC has, on occasion, violated the spirit of the CRTC's ruling restraining CBC Radio to AM. While the Corporation was, where possible, to extend its service using AM transmitters, in several recent cases the CBC has applied for FM transmitters while admitting that suitable AM frequencies were available. The rationale was that the cost differential between AM and FM facilities would, as a result of budget constraints, needlessly delay the expansion of its system. Therefore, at the urging of the CBC, the Tripartite Committee has agreed that FM transmitters would be acceptable in the place of suitable AMs but only outside the critical Vancouver, Montreal and southern Ontario areas where available frequencies are severely limited."

I sent a copy of Radiophiles, in which San Francisco radio was analyzed, to John Jefferson, who comments: "As for KCEQ *100.5 Walnut Creek, when I heard them their signal was confined to a small canyon perhaps 1/2 by 2 miles in size, with some mixing with KEBR for a couple miles down I-680. A listener in downtown Walnut Creek would never hear them without a directional antenna. Also very limited schedule, with sign on at something like 2 p. m. Quite possible they still operate, and were missed by the Radiophiles reporter. On the other hand, there's a good chance KSFH *95.9 Mountain View is gone at last. They have been on sporadically at best for a long time. But please realize Pleasanton is a terrible spot to hear them (no hope when KVHS is on), and Dad's rotor is still frozen, so I can't check from there. Now, some other news:

1) KERQ 104.7 Garberville is now on 104.7 with its Class-C transmitter. So far I haven't been able to pull them through KSNM Los Banos, but have gotten a background fizzling from their direction which suggests they're right underneath.
 2) I accidentally overlaid the May report with the current one, so am not sure whether I reported on KXGO 93.1 Arcata. They are now on 93.1, making much of their 100 kw. They were heard here right through semi-local KOSO Patterson.

3) It's not CA news, but today I received KNFO 95.5 Waco with their new 100 kw directional signal (a phone call confirmed the new transmitter is operating). Comments Nick Lombardi on the June VUD column: "I think your Atlas is PLENTY readable the way it is; it conveys a maximum of information in a minimum amount of space. Eliminating certain data to allow for a larger typeface would be a serious mistake, in my opinion. Calling WLET-FM 106.1 Toccoa GA an Atlanta rim-shooter seems a bit far fetched. At a distance of 83 miles from the center of the city, it's difficult to imagine how it could have any impact here at all, even when its new 1500-foot tower becomes operational." Then Nick comments on the July VUD:

"YOUR NEW IBM ELECTRONIC COMPOSER PRODUCES CRISP, CLEAN COPY (LAST MONTH ALSO), BUT THE ULTRA-STRONG SQUASHED LOOKING 'COPPERPLATE GOTHIC 10-POINT DOUBLE-CASE' (PAGE 26) ALMOST GAVE ME A HEAD-ACHE! I SHUDDER TO THINK WHAT THE NEW ATLAS WILL LOOK LIKE IF YOU FEEL COMPELLED TO USE EVERY SINGLE ONE OF YOUR 28 NEW TYPE FONTS." [YOU ARE RIGHT, NICK, I WILL USE RESTRAINT. MY FATHER-IN-LAW, WHO IS A PRINTER, SAYS A PERSON ONLY NEEDS A FEW FONTS. AFTER A CERTAIN POINT YOU GET TOO MANY WITH ONLY MINUTE DIFFERENCES AMONG THEM. ONE FONT I AM CONSIDERING GETTING, AND WHICH IS AVAILABLE FOR THIS MACHINE, IS OLDE ENGLISH. HOW WOULD YOU LIKE TO SEE THIS COLUMN TYPED IN OLDE ENGLISH? THEN I COULD QUOTE CHAUCER IN FINE STYLE!]

"Your new SCA (or is it now SCS? [It's becoming SCS]) categories are most reasonable, and I make a lot of sense EXCEPT for the breakdown of data noise into X, Y and Z. For the life of me, I can't see what you hope to accomplish by this. How is the layman supposed to be able to accurately distinguish between 'medium' and 'slower' speed data? . . . And what about different baud rates, bit inversion, and other numerous variables? Finally, who is going to go through all the current 'X' SCAs and determine which ones should be recorded U, Y and Z? I think you have completely missed the point! What you SHOULD be trying to do is to determine WHAT the data is (stock market quotes, digital paging, etc.) rather than delving into the mechanics of how it is transmitted. I think ALL data noise, including telemetry, should continue to be coded X until such time as you are able to issue definitive, unequivocal guidelines on how to positively identify each of your arbitrary data types."

FCC-FM

[Thanks for your comments, Nick, which I will carefully consider. For data, I believe the mechanics are more important than the content. Many of my customers are into computers and are more interested in being able to decipher the codes rather than having any interest in the content. One of the data sources we know can be cracked by an existing demodulator, and I am trying to promote piracy or refine existing information, whichever way you want to look at it. And I will be the one to decide on which category to put the data into. I think our knowledge of the different data categories is already precise enough to go ahead; and based on what I hear from an audio decoder, from descriptions of data systems in published forms and from tapes I expect to get, I think the system I have devised is the best in the industry—and will stand the test of time. It can be added to, if need be. For data on which I have little information, I can continue to use the "X," which is also defined as "miscellaneous data."] Nick then asked "Does telemetry ALWAYS have a warbling or chirping sound, or can it also have a sort of humming sound (as on the SCA of WANS-FM 107.3 Anderson SC)?" Yes, it can have a humming sound. That is called low frequency data, and is often present (superimposed, or should I say subimposed?) on other forms of SCA. Thus, KRNY-FM 96.9 Kearney NE had low frequency telemetry which had almost no effect on its Muzak. Finally, Nick says "Hope you've gotten settled in your new location. I thought you moved to Nebraska to get away from Minnesota—it's interesting that you have now moved back." [Nobody in their right mind would move to NE to get away from MN; NE is comparatively scenic and its summers are hotter and more oppressive, possibly even than GA. I went there because of a job, but found after I left it, I could no longer get computer runs done, like I can in MN, and the postal service gave me problems. We had to mail books either bulk rate or out of state, since the Omaha post office declared my publication a "directory" and not a "book." Lack of tropo or even locally-available public radio were factors, too. The mentality of NE commercial broadcasters in opposing tax-supported public radio was hard to take, too.]

Peter Taylor sent an ad for KFOG 104.5 San Francisco, their "latest quality promotion." It shows an ugly mouth with the words emanating therefrom: "KFOG Mouth-off Screen Test," winner to be flown to Los Angeles to appear in their next "Remarkable Mouth" television commercial.

Ralph Strobel sent much IN, OH and KY news this month, and an article from the Munice paper explaining why stations east of the Mississippi River start with W and those west of that river start with K, and the fact that this country could use up its reserve of call letters starting with A and N if it wished to, for commercial and public broadcasters. Old taboos are gone, so you can now license stations with call letters of presidents (remember WFDR 104.3 New York?) and federal agencies (remember KFBI AM Wichita KS?), and the article talks about stations with unusual call letters, including Las Vegas' KBET, KENO, KLUK and KFUN. Robert Grant says "the station that should never have been built," WWHK (AM) Mount Clemens MI has been heard testing with a dead carrier; "they might go back on, perhaps with the g bounced by WLQV (now WCZY(AM))." Robert has a list of FM stations in the Lille area of France, so if anybody wants that send an SASE to him at 5775 Bishop, Detroit MI 48224. Another MI reporter, James J. Nahrniak, sent a list of current slogans and formats from the Detroit area. "All the high school FMs are off the air for the summer, so I left off all those I am not absolutely sure about. WPHS '89.1 broadcasts Warren city council meetings during the summer."

Ernie Cooper wrote with a question. He heard skip on 96.7 and the station sounded like it was in the Missouri area with calls like KXEBM (but that is a Minneapolis station on 88.5); he does not think it was KMEM Memphis MO, but I wonder. Some announcers slur their speech (just as some DXers can slur their hearing!), so I really think this is the Royals or Cardinals network station he heard.

A Minneapolis customer wrote me about my SCAtization of his Panasonic radio. "The RF2900 arrived back here Monday, and the SCA performance is fabulous! The adapter is working like a charm, and the squeel feature in this model is working beautifully! I'm sure many of my 'ham' friends in this area will be very interested in this unusual conversion, and I'm going to let them know about your fine work of installing the SCA adapter." It praises go on even more, which reminds me that I never quote from letters of complaint. Maybe someday, if Chaucer can wait.

An interesting letter with enclosures came from Marty Barvinchak in the Pittsburgh area. "Most of what I can bring you up to date on in this area concerns college band stations like WYEP Pittsburgh. I've checked through my VUDs back to Feb. '84, and I have not found any notation of the following: 1) In April 1984, WRCT *88.3 raised its ERP to 100 watts horizontal and vertical. WRCT is owned and operated by the students of Carnegie-Mellon University (60' HAAT). The University of Pittsburgh introduced WPTS on *98.5 Aug. 26, 1984, with 10 watts [19 watts radiated h & v; 500' HAAT]. I thought there would be some mention of WPTS on 98.5 since this required, according to the Pitt News, a 'first of its kind decision' by the FCC." [I am sure I have the c-p listed for WPTS, since the station is on my database—but the information you sent in the article on WPTS being the first educational station in the commercial band without having first been a 10-watt in the educational band was news to me. The FCC did this so that the WPTS application, and one by WRCT for 100 watts, would not conflict. The problems of WYEP *91.3 trying to go stereo are mentioned, with the cable to their new 17,000 watt transmitter burning up May 30. "They still do not broadcast in stereo. Although I haven't heard them at all times of the day, I believe they are operating on their normal eclectic schedule. . . I have heard some programming that was taped, but most of it is live. . . WVCL at 100.7 is still at 20,000 watts. The station is called 'Classy-101' (whoopie) without announcers, etc., and they still ask the listeners to call in and tell them what kind of music, news, etc., etc., they want to 'program your station' with. They should be going to 50 kw soon, and I expect that they will drop the Pittsburgh-New Kensington ID and just ID as Pittsburgh then. I spent my later teens and early 20s listening to the 'free-form' FM radio of the 70s, which is a forgotten era when disc-jockeys were allowed to be creative with variety as opposed to format. I've since been exiled to the low power stations of the college band, which all leads me to the ongoing discussions on format classification in VUD. Quite seriously, some of the format definitions in the FM Atlas are seriously out-of-date. Take 'p' for progressive rock." Marty mentions WHFS 99.1 Annapolis MD as the last bastion of it on the commercial band, but I point out that many college stations have it, and perhaps commercial stations like KKCY 98.9 San Francisco, programming to people who like the 60s music, might resurrect the format. The categories he proposes occupy two letters each, which is more space than my columns or keypunch cards will allow for formats. I think my data, with letters like r, p, m or combinations allowing up to two letters, are precise enough, and meet the four criteria I mentioned in my WTTFA convention talk last summer. Thus program formats must be:

- 1) Exhaustive
- 2) Mutually exclusive
- 3) They must stand the test of time
- 4) Readily communicable to a wide variety of audiences; not "jargon" that only people in the industry understand.

He then lists a variety of pirate stations that have existed from time to time in the Pittsburgh area, occupying frequencies like 88.7, 88.9, 89.3 and 90.5 "after 1 a. m. when the regular stations occupying those frequencies sign off. . . I live in the north hills section of Pittsburgh, so I may not be aware of all the pirates in the area." [I recall Clarke Ingram taking me to a pirate station on 98.5 when I visited him in Pittsburgh; broadcasting was from an attic, and it was in stereo; that was before there was a WPTS on *98.5.] And Jim Pizzi sent a listing of Australian FMs through Don Voegelé, who lived in Australia. Stations range in frequency from 89.7 through 107.9, so the band is the same as ours. They have translators, full power stations (up to 120 kw for 7ABC 93.3 Launceston, horizontal only), with some stations listed as vertical only and about half as mixed polarization. Australia has both commercial and public FM. Since I got the space, I'll print this version. WARNING! The Surgeon General has determined that reading this column can damage your eyesight; use proper magnification, and see Tim McVey's comments below.

Phil Boersma sent a clipping, "Children's format cheers up AMs," in which the target audience is children 12 and younger, and said to represent 15 percent of the population—a group excluded from the ratings. Phil comments: "AM is dying, fast! Talk about desperation!"

"WQKZ here in Bolivar did not 'embrace the Lord'. In fact, the air personality that did that survey left the station altogether," notes Tim McVey. "Also, I had reported WQKZ at 97.4, well after I left it was reported to have drifted, over several weeks, to

Valley City Television Associates (specified West Valley City). Preference was given to Salt Lake City Family Television Inc. on integration grounds between ownership and management.

TX Wichita Falls; KJTL, ch. 18- went on the air 5/17/1985; 2820 kw max; 1080' AAT/1034' AG/2146' ASL; TL about 2.8 miles southwest of Grandfield; coordinates 34°12'06"/98°43'44"; address: Thornberry Television Ltd., 3800 Callfield, Wichita Falls, TX, 76308. Independent station.

OH Shaker Heights, WOIO, ch. 19: to settle the controversy (see FORUM), the station signed on the air 5/19/1985.

WA Seattle; KTZZ, ch. 22+ went on the air 6/18/1985, and began regular programming 6/22. 5000 kw max ERP; 894' AAT/610' AG/1020' ASL; TL 18th Avenue, north of Pine Street in Seattle; coordinates 47°36'57"/122°18'26"; address Seattle Broadcasting Corporation, 945 Dexter Avenue North, Seattle, WA, 98109. Independent station.

AL Huntsville; WZDX, ch. 54z went on the air 4/14/1985. Current data not available, but one reference had 2223.31 kw ERP at 1692' AAT. Address: Community Service Broadcasters, 6025 Nastin Lake Road, Huntsville, AL, 35810. Independent station.

TN Jackson; WJMT-TV, ch. 16+ went on 4/18/85; 215 kw max ERP; 538' AAT/465' AG/985' ASL; TL Norton Hill, Jackson; coordinates 35°31'33"/88°47'10"; address: Golden Circle Broadcasting, 364 North Royal, Jackson, TN, 38301. (No information on network affiliation, if any. I think CBS and NBC need a station in that area, but I suspect that the station might be a religious-oriented independent station.)

FORUM

HQ forwarded a letter from David A. Sinclair of Vancouver, B.C. He says that KTZZ-TV, ch. 22 in Seattle, WA, signed on 6/18/1985 as an independent commercial station, with its first full day of programming on 6/22. He can receive a reasonably good signal from his QTH. They are transmitting five million watts.

Christopher Hanley confirms that WGGT-48 picks up any CBS programming dropped by WFMY, ch. 2 in Greensboro, NC. But WGGT dropped CBS morning news in favor of cartoons. WEJG, ch. 20 in Lexington, NC, should be on the air soon.

Bill Draeb logged WSAV-TV, ch. 3 in Savannah, GA, and says it is still ABC as of 6/2, despite earlier reports that it changed recently to NBC. Can anybody clear this up? Maybe the change is scheduled for a later date. WOIO, ch. 19 in Shaker Heights, was seen on 6/7. He says they may have been testing a few months ago when he saw them. Locally, WLRE, ch. 26 in Green Bay, WI, was sold for 4½ million dollars, but there is no change in their programming. It uses multiple city identification with Green Bay and one of any number of the many communities covered by the station. In the 6/85 VUD, Bill corrects me that WAVE-TV, ch. 3 in Louisville, KY, changed its HAAT, not ERP, from 914 to 1820. WSCO, ch. 14 in Surging, WI, raised \$5224 in monthly pledges; their goal was \$15,000. They now have one full time paid employee.

Dave Nieman reports that WOIO, ch. 19 in Shaker Heights, OH, was on as of 5/20/85 with stereo. He sent a news clippin from the Buffalo News for 6/13/85: The New York State Supreme Court threw out a challenge to the Colden Town Board's approval of a tower site for WNYB-TV, ch. 49 in Buffalo. Apparently they think the tower would be unsightly.

Robert Grant also logged WOIO, and adds

that the station adds a little humor when it signs on: "What you have just seen is static, followed by what we in the industry call test pattern and tone." Robert also says, "From what I have seen, their programming lineup is pretty good...they will give WUAB and WCLQ a hard run for their money. Cleveland television is much better than Detroit's, with a PBS down on 25 (instead of 56) and three indies in heavy competition with good program line-ups (not 'Wrestling Women vs. The Aztec Mummy' on ch. 62)." "WSMH-66 in Flint is on the air, but has a very weak signal here... but strong enough to mess up K66BV. THAT'S RIGHT!! K66BV in Detroit is still on the air (about 55 miles from Flint). I can't believe FCC would leave these stations to co-exist." "In other news, Paul Gaines reports catching a new LPTV on ch 22 in Ohio

Back to Dave Nieman's article about WNYB-TV, ch. 49 for some more info I missed: "The tower, planned for a site 2,500 feet off Partidge Road and 1½ miles from Center Road, is planned for use by Channel 49, a recently licensed (sic) station."

While we're on the subject of calling anything from vacant channel assignments to construction permits a license, let me blow off a little steam. Paul and Sandra Engle bought out eight other competing applicants for a LPV on channel 8 in Hammonton, NJ, thus allowing them to avoid a FCC lottery. That means the FCC can now go ahead and process their application. The Philadelphia Inquirer comes up with this beauty: "TV STATION TO GO ON AIR IN S. JERSEY" "A new television station, Channel 8, may be on the air in South Jersey by October, with advertiser-supported programming...." "Channel 8 Inc., which received a low power television license, will broadcast from a transmitter in Hammonton, Atlantic County, with a signal that will cover Atlantic, Burlington, Camden, Cumberland, and Gloucester Counties...." "Low-power television, which has a limited-signal coverage area, is designed to provide television service to areas that do not have full-power television stations." (like Raleigh, Nashville, Shreveport, Des Moines, etc.) "The new station, which has yet to receive call letters (or a construction permit -wbv) will emphasize news and in-depth reporting on South Jersey, particularly stories not covered by other media...." (like WRBV used to do before it went bankrupt.) "Low power licenses generally are awarded by lottery."

Speaking of WRBV, its now WSJT. Its new logo appears above. It had to find some kind of promotional gimmick, since all of its programming consists of bottom-of-the-barrel stuff the Philadelphia stations didn't want. "TV65 is ahead of its time. Even our 8 o'clock movie starts at 7:30." "Introducing Channel 65. It's a brand new television station. With different programs and different times. Even our late news comes on at 10 PM - an hour earlier than other stations." "TV65 has programs for the whole family. Including your favorite television shows from the 50's, 60's and 70's." Wow! "And of course TV65 takes you to the movies, three times a day." Of course!

This must be pick-on-WTVS month. Robert Grant stated that K66BV should move to channel 56 so that it wouldn't be bothered by interference from broadcast stations. WTVS is on channel 56. Now Paul Gaines says that Bob is upset about WEDU-3 possibly moving to UHF because he won't be able to watch PBS anymore. He gets WEDU by skip better than WTVS. Wasn't it Saul Chernos that thought the Canadian TV Guides should carry WPBT-2 in Miami during the skip season? Paul Gaines also says that WOIO, ch. 19 in Shaker Heights comes in well in Detroit. Paul logged his first LPTV: W22AB in Bucyrus, OH. (But Robert already told us about that before I got Paul's card in the mail.) Sorry, Paul.

Fred McCormack straightens me out on my misunderstanding of his report in the 6/85 column. He did not say that KO6LD in Fargo is now KO2LD. The translator was never on channel 6, and never in Fargo. The translator in question is KO2LD in Fergus Falls, MN. The FCC Data Base mistakenly listed it as KO6LD, but operating on channel 2. They probably got the channel and location mixed up because of its primary station, WDAY-6 in Fargo, ND.

John Combs reports that WHBR, ch. 33 in Pensacola, FL, is on the air. He also says that I ran his previous letter twice, in two different columns. I probably filed it away instead of discarding it after I was finished with it. I'll make sure that doesn't happen again.

Bruce Elving forwarded a newspaper clipping sent to him from Ed Warner. It's from the 6/8/85 Charlotte Observer. Public Television station WTVI, ch. 42 in Charlotte went off the air on 4/29/85 to install a new transmitter and antenna. The station's coverage area should increase from around a 29-mile radius to around a 36-mile radius. (According to data on record, they are increasing from 214 kw to 1393 kw ERP.) The station was scheduled to resume broadcasting on 6/11.

A few articles from W.R. McIntosh about sales of some of the stations in his area. Rupert Murdoch, who owns part of 20th Century Fox and several newspapers, plans to go ahead

and purchase the six Metromedia stations by himself now that partner Marvin Davis dropped out of the deal. He will have to raise about \$150 million for the deal. But he will have to sell his New York City and Chicago newspapers because of FCC rules against ownership of newspapers and broadcast stations in the same community. Meanwhile the Securities and Exchange Commission approved of Ted Turner's plan to offer high-interest securities for CBS stock in his planned \$5.4 billion takeover of the network. Ever get the feeling you're in the wrong type of business?

This article was in the Philadelphia Inquirer a few months back. "When United Satellite Communications Inc. began transmitting pay television from a satellite directly to homes in 1983, one leading market-research firm forecast that by 1986 it would be collecting \$620 million a year from 2.4 million subscribers." "But things went wrong with this promising idea in the 17 months that USCI sent five channels of sports, movies and music videos from a high-powered satellite...to one-meter-wide dish antennas on subscribers' rooftops. By April 1, when USCI's satellite signal was switched off because it had not paid its transmission bills, it had just 10,000 subscribers, mostly on the east coast. USCI also left its customers, more than 1,000 of them in the Philadelphia area, receiving only TV snow on their satellite equipment. At best, these customers, who were paying \$34.95 a month for an alternative to traditional broadcast television, are wondering what to do with the satellite dish and receiver they were leasing from USCI. Worse off are other customers who paid from \$300 to \$800 for now-useless satellite hardware."

SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS

The FCC couldn't decide which of the two contenders for channel 23 is best qualified, and neither of them wants to give in to the other. So San Antonio Educational Television will operate on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday and alternate Sundays, and Hispanic Community Educational TV Inc. will operate on Monday, Wednesday, Friday, and alternate Sundays.

HAZELTON, PENNSYLVANIA

WOLF-TV, ch. 38 in Scranton, is now on the air. WOLF-TV, ch. 56 in Hazelton was scheduled to go on the air about the same time, as a satellite of WOLF-TV. So expect it to come on the air soon.

CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

I learned that WSNB-TV, ch. 44 in Chicago, is a SIN affiliate as of 7/1/1985. Supposedly that station lost its license renewal.

CHANNEL SWAPS

Peggy Charren, president of Action for Children's Television, is upset about the proposal for VHF educational stations to swap with UHF stations for their channels. "With a smaller audience, there will be fewer children served by the alternatives public broadcasting provides." Besides, some of those kids can't count that high.

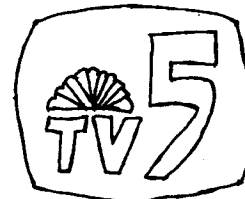

The season this year is characterized by many short lived, many times intense skip openings that rarely get above ch.4. The unusually stormy spring with bad intense thunderstorms and even tornadoes has resulted in absolutely no tropo so far. Today, 6/22, is also the first date of the season that I have noted any skip into FM, quite late I must say. 1985 though is a notch better than '84 when even ch.2 DX was in short supply. Our new independent channel 38 came on the air w/programming on Monday afternoon 6/3. They are super strong here and produce slop on my channels 48 and 54 among others. I have some traps on order.

On June 11 I came upon a rather strong two hour tropo opening to the south of my QTH, predominantly to the Philadelphia area. Tropo reception of Philly V's here is frequent during the prime months, but rarely have I seen their signals so strong and steady as they were on 6/11. What's more, as time passed, the effects of tropo were increasingly visible in the VHF high band which, in my opinion, makes this 6/11 duct noteworthy.

At 2300 EDT, when I tuned in my normally TASO Grade 1 semi-local WRGB-6(Albany, Schenectady, Troy) for the news, a mini-cam interview labeled "6 Live Action Cam" from WPVI-6 Philadelphia overtook the screen, leaving only traces of WRGB's audio. (Is this condition referred to as "C.C.I." in DX reports, Bill?) (Yes, it stands for co-channel interference-wd.) Swinging my antenna to the south unearthed a treasure chest of VHF tropo. In solid with full color registration was WPVI-6 "Action News" and WHY-12, the Wilmington, DE PBS affiliate. In fact, WHY-12 stayed with me consistently through sign-off at 0030 EDT, June 12. By 2330, Philadelphia's CBS outlet, WCAU-10, joined the force, gaining strength to a colorful TASO Grade 2 picture. At 2345, I witnessed uncommonly strong C.C.I. on local xltr W42AE(WMHT-17), so I scanned the UHF band for activity, too. Grainy images appeared on chs. 21, 29, 47 & 69; in solid, though, was Philly's WTAF-29, with WJMT-52 and WTIC-61 slightly weaker. Chances are I would have gathered more UHF action if my antenna was better positioned. However, until my new UHF system is completed, the CS-9095/7477A combination remains mounted only 25 feet above ground. A check of VHF tropo to the east at 0015 EDT revealed a strong resurgence of WCAU-10/WHYY-12 during the antenna's sweep, and a brief appearance by WJAR-10(Providence RI). Semi-locals WFSB-3 and WTNH-8 were practically overloading at this time! By 0100 EDT, June 12, the night's opening faded out on the UHF-VHF bands. Within a few hours, heavy rain and lightning entered the Hudson Valley.

This column had an early deadline, but that doesn't seem to have reduced it's size. There is so much DX in this months column that it is impossible to adequately summarize it. You should read it all as there are all kinds of interesting loggings included and a number of questions which could perhaps be answered by someone.

Reports seem to indicate that the E skip season has been an improvement on that of recent years. Openings seem to have taken place on most dates with some rare late night (after midnight) openings.

For the first time since I have been editing this column, we have a report of a TV translator being logged by E skip. Check William Eckberg's report for details.

There is also a great deal of DX in this months column which will be of interest to tropo enthusiasts. For the really long, 900 mile plus, loggings check Jim Pizzi's and Pat Dyer's reports. Pat had UHF (and some VHF) at those distances on May 29, 30, and 31, and on June 1 and 6. Jim had 900 mile plus on May 30 and June 2. There are a lot of dates with super tropo of lesser distances observed by many of the reporters.

It seems that June 8 was a quite good date for tropo over a wide area. My loggings have been previously reported in the July column, but I think it may be of interest to note that a tropo opening (although probably two openings) took place to the same area from both Fargo, North Dakota and Lovington, New Mexico simultaneously. I was astounded to note from Jim Pizzi's report that on the morning of June 8, both he and I watched the sign/on of KCPT-19 in Kansas City.

Controversy continues with regard to what the official call letters are for channel 2 in Regina and channel 2 in Rimouski (in fact, some still question the channel change at Rimouski). I receive reports with CKCK and CKTV for Regina and CJBR and CJRT for Rimouski. I don't know what their official calls are, but to be consistent, I am using CKTV and CJRT, the calls or slogans which they use on the air. Also with regard to calls, you may note occasionally that I have changed the call letters that you have used in your report. This month's changes involve KIDK-3 versus KID-3 and KNWZ-2 versus KSAF-2. I don't know when call letter changes actually take place, but when there are conflicts in the call letters reported by different DX'ers, I have to assume that the new call letters are in use, and I will change them in your report without comment.

One hundred twenty six watt Emigrant translator came in fair for one half hour. Three translators carry KULR-8 on channel 5 - an impossible ID situation. I've assumed it was the more powerful Emigrant translator.

Logged CJBRT on channel 2 (not channel 3) on the same day. Anyone know it's location yet? I have a photo of ID - no QTH.

KLRT-16 runs a slide before sign-on which is a DX'ers delight - very large call, QTH, and channel number. KNLC-24 has been running color bars and ID in the early morning - also a good DX target. According to WOC-6 news, channel 18 in Davenport, Iowa will be on by mid July.

The majority of the E skip so far this season has been rather weak and short-lived resulting in, as you can see, numerous unID's. Most openings started out good and then died out. Stations changes were also rapid. One minute I would have one station in and the next minute another.

KFDX-3 made it's presence known on the 19th by overloading into channel 2. I was monitoring channel 2 when KFDX's ID slide suddenly appeared on the screen with a gigantic 3. I quickly turned to channel 3, and you couldn't have asked for a clearer picture. Of course, I didn't have my camera ready, so I missed getting a photo of it. That put me in a grumpy mood! I had checked channel 3 no more than a minute earlier, and there was nothing there.

KTCA-2 and KMSP-9 are both currently operating at reduced power during antenna replacement. I don't know what their current ERP's are, but they are slightly snowy with the antenna pointed right at them.

I hope someone knows where that channel 16 STV is. I've seen them twice now. They play nothing but music on their Barker channel - no ID's. Tropo conditions here have been absolutely rotten lately, almost as bad as winter conditions. Hope they pick up soon.

Correction from last month: DX on May 31 should have been May 30 instead. Also, my comments on the Teknika tuner article in the June Mailbox column were submitted two months before Headquarters explained why the article had not appeared.

I had a very nice visit at Nate Ely's from June 10-15. Nate is a real ace with his Zenith remote controller and also does an exceptional job trapping out WISC-3.

I installed the vertically polarized Winegard on the 20th. Thanks to Jim Pizzi for installation advice. I made a temporary mast for it by using a wooden dowel and a 90° angle piece of PVC plumbing pipe. It is important that the mast be made of nonconductive material. The antenna works like magic, allowing skip stations through while attenuating the ground wave ones. Sometimes E skip stations on a channel will be stronger on one antenna and sometimes stronger on the other. Other times, two different skip stations will be seen at the same time on the same channel. For instance, on the 23rd, I had an unidentified French on channel 2 with the 1110 while XEPM was coming in on the Winegard. Both antennas were pointed northeast.

Canadian E skip can be awfully confusing to ID. CFQC-3 was carrying news from CFQC-8. According to Frank Merrill, CBCP3-3 and CBCP2-2 are parallel to CJFB-5 although you'd expect them to all have the same call letters. All three were parallel and carrying the CFJB local news. CBKMF-4 gives their ID as 'CBQ9' and what's the definitive deal with CKTV-2? They ID upmost times daily with those calls although they are officially listed as CKCK.

I am counting the CFAC ID seen on channel 3 as CFAC4 although the signal cannot possibly be 225 Watts as listed in the Station Guide. Anybody know their current power? The signal was weak, but it was in fairly steadily for half an hour.

K43AJ had the best of what I think the FCC intended LPTV's to be. It was more like a Class A FM station than satellite programming and '800' record and tape ads. The "Bacon, Eggs, and Me Show" was in progress with two on air personalities, much banter between themselves and an office secretary, local school bus conditions, trivia contests, and miscued videos played in the studio. I wish more LPTV's were like this! Their offset is 0 kHz to WBLN, but in an unusual diagonal sort of way which seems to be typical of some LPTV's. 73.

(Jeff, I think 225 Watts can do quite well on E skip, especially if there isn't much competition from the area. However, the FCC data base from October 1984 indicates that CFAC4 has 409 Watts at a height of 420' from a directional antenna. fm)

E skip has been better than the previous two years, although MUF's are never high enough to suit my taste. It's been pretty much a "turkey shoot" for June with almost daily openings. ID's seemed a lot easier as the skip was more stable in nature. I just sort of picked them off as they flew by.

Mich Wertman did a super job getting me two additional 7206 UHF traps - a great price and a very quick turnaround time. The 7206's work great in tandem. The engineer at Channel Master suggested using 3 traps per channel - one for the picture carrier, one for the chroma, and one for the sound carrier. I've found when using three traps for one channel that the skirts tend to cut into adjacents too much, so I use one trap for each local.

DX'er Jeff "Mad Man" Kadet was here visiting in Madison from June 10th through the 15th. We got along famously, and I'm happy to report that the "Law of Visiting DX'ers" was broken in honor of his visit. We had a good time comparing TV sets and fiddling with TV gadgets. One of the highlights of the visit was a tour of the local cable companies' headend.

I have some plans in the works for souping up my UHF system which I haven't, as yet, been able to pull off financially. Plans include adding a Delhi feed to my dish and using coaxial relays to switch between the 4990 and 4975 preamplifiers. I hope to have everything underway by August, but then again, I've been saying this for months now.

About this last logging - I don't know where it's located. I ran across it accidentally. I turned by antenna south to null out WBAY-2 (local), and all I had then was WBMM-2 which was a little stronger than usual. I watched for awhile to see if something would 'happen', and at 2040, I noticed some zero beat interference with WBMM or WBAY (- or +). At 2058, I saw the call letters CHBX. The call letters were nice and large. The location was underneath, but I was unable to read. Below the location it said Cable 3. When I saw this I swung the antenna around to the north, and I saw the same thing briefly. I looked through all the Canadian information that I have - but no CHBX. I was thinking maybe it was CHEX as there is a CHEX on channel 2+ in Bancroft, Ontario. Any information about this would be helpful.

Channel 4 loggings, such as CBOT-4, are over local KXJB-4. I am using a new VHF antenna this year, and while it is still a simple antenna, it's front-to-back ratio and directivity is enough of an improvement over my previous antenna that I am noticing a lot more co-channel interference to KXJB-4. For the first time, I have found some of the channel 4 E skip stations actually capturing the audio. Now if I could get the KXJB-4 down phasing system set up, I would be ready to start adding some channel 4 stations to the log book.

KMXY-14 is a new on the air satellite of WDAY-6. It is located in Minot, North Dakota and has made Minot a four network town. It, along with previously on the air KBYM-17, make the first likely UHF targets for DX'ers looking for North Dakota. Locally, KYNJ-15 has doubled their power, expanded their schedule, and gone back to heavy promotion. It still will be an impressive catch for any DX'er as their doubled power is 7.94 kW and their tower is still lower than some of the surrounding buildings.

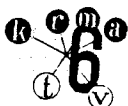
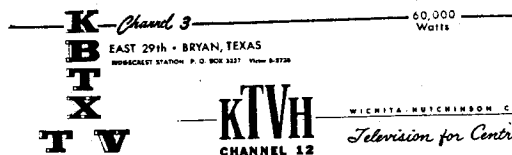
