JULY NOT AS GOOD AS JUNE, ES-WISE

If June's hectic Es pactivity raised hopes of a very busy July, then they were largely dashed. Most of the July Es concentrated during the middle of the month, leaving the rest of July weak. The mid-month Es openings were good enough for distances up to 1626 mi.

August DX, so far, looks uneventful.

MONITORING TIMES GOOFS: Giving a poor response to a question about our hobby was Montoring Times. The question: "Driving through Cape Hatteras, NC, in June we heard a station on our PM dial sign, Commerce, TX'. Isn't that a little far for skip on FM?" WT's response: "It sure is. While ducting (waveguiding by the ataosphere) can occur for hundreds of ailes at VHF, true skip over this distance at 100 NHz is rare, but not impossible. It can be produced by meteor scatter, aurora borealia ("northern lights"), unusual solar influences, strong weather fronts, or you may have heard a tag at the end of the broadcast crediting the source of the program rather than the transmitter location." While it's easy to agree that FM Es is rare, though not unusual it was heard in June, most any FM DKer would know that the distance the listener heard was really quite typical for FM Es and not at all "a little far." MT's response could be further critiged, but let's just hope in the future that FM DKing gets a more enlightened representation in the press.

The signal levels on this bird vary widely in this area. When testing - the new Ipdr 10 was of fair to good quality with excellent sound for the Radio Felicidades subcarrier. Since going into regular service, the video is almost non-existant and Felicadades has moved back to Ipdr 2.

Both audio and video on 2 have improved lately while the remaining Ipdr 14 remains good as always. I still have not noted any K service here. Has anyone in So. Cal. have anything else new with this bird?

Galaxy 3

Endr 18 is Viewers Choice II and is not available even to VCII owners. The other Viewers Choice channel (21) is. Both MTV, VH-1, Nickelodeon are scrambled but in Fixed-Key mode for the time being. The Weather Channel at 13 is ir the clear.

Intelsat - 53*W

Kpdr 18 - Peru - In the last column I had indicated that the service was TV Peru Channel 7 from Lima. It seems that this xpdr is also shared with Ch 5 in Lima in the AM's. The sign-on of this service is perhaps one of the most detailed I have ever seen. They show considerable views of their facilities and give incredible details of same. They show their Harris transmitter giving the model number and power outputs, the height and location of their tower and details on other stations in their network. Comeras and studio facilities, master control, etc. are also shown. This satellite uses several types of beams at the same time for the various transponders. Epdre 1, 3, and 23 (24) Argentine use the West beam. Also 12 (England) and 18 (Peru). Supposedly Chile is also on this bird, but uses a global beam which is too weak to be seen here. Signal level certainly is not as strong as a U.S. domestic satellite, but is strong enough to get good color and clear usually undistorted sound. (unless PAL is used as it is with Argentina and ingland)

Intelest - 27.550

Many services are on the K-Band leg of this bird including the Buropeam MTV. Many new services are also moving to the C-Band area as well. NBC London feeds as well as Ch. 5 from Caracas, Venezuela have been hear for some time as well as World-Net - The USIA service. I have not yet been able to identify these new-commers as this bird does NOT put in the signal here that the 5300 one does. The K-Band will not be viewable here as it is totally beamed to Europe.

At this writing has been set for September 11th/
Using this bird will be RAI I and II, Televerket - Norway, TVE - Spain,
Televerket - Swedem and 2 British services.
TWTA power levels should be 20 watts.

TV DX THRTY YEARS AGO

OCTOBER 6, 1957 Vol 4 #10 - EDITORIAL (Bob Seybold, President) - DX surprises in September included widespread E skip and some of the best trops of the season. Moved into a new house; installed Winegard Colorceptor CL4X and four-bowtie UHF. Write for special free AIPA DX report form which will save time, effort, and make your reports to editors "more official." Welcome to new member Donald Ruland. Note from Tom Hidley: "All people operate as individuals; no one always sees eye to eye. We must consider the rights of others and respect all their righteous endeavors. We should use bulletin space to promote our AIPA - we are selling TX DXing, a wonderful hobby that pays off in self-satisfaction."

TECH NOTES (Schafer) - "Junkyards on Roof, II" - Take down, inspect, clean, and repair antenna every year; replace every two or three years depending on environmental conditions in area. Replace all broken/bent elements, bolts, clamps, and insulators. Use electric drill, saw, or in extreme cases (with great caution) use burning to remove dead rivets. Don't remove too much! Clean with Brillo soap pads. Use sandpaper only on pitted areas. Carefully clean where lead is attached to working elements. Use special plastic spray to matching terminals only — to use on entire antenna would lessen chances for weak DX. Coat all bolts with motor oil. Paint saddle clamp if rusty. All this should improve performance for life of antenna.

FCC NEWS (Collins) - WBUF-17 went dark; trying to sell their \$2 million plant while WKBW-7 in Buffalo will start in December. Other new stations include: CFCL2-2, Ont.; CKBL-9, Que.; WTOL-11, Toledo; KUAT-6, Tucson; and WJRT-12, Flint. WABD-5 NYC now WNEW; WABT-13 Birmingham now WAPI. WTRI-35 Albany to 13 and WKTV-13 Utica to 2.

RANK COLUMN (Spaulding) - Page of info on verie signers and sign on/off times. KPRC-2, Houston's card says it is "the nation's DX station." Christina Payne is the signer for WJBF-6 GA, Mary Schippers for WKZO-3 MI, and Elizabeth Bain for KSTP-5 MN. Five of seven Los Angeles' VHF stations sign-on between 0700-1000; the rest later! Sign offs for CA range from 2300 to 0215 for KTTV-11.

EASTERN DX (Seybold) - Longest of 23 reports on 2½ pages was 92 Es, trops, and MS loggings by Billy Draeb, WI - with 16 new his log at 178. Bill Nieman reported 13 new (all trops) with log at 161. Ferdinand Dombrowski reported aurora on Sept. 4 and 7; WILL-12 new on August 12. New member Don Ruland has 91 stations with one new this month. Bill Eckberg, IL, logged KETV-7 to bring totals to 162.

TECH NOTES (Rauch) - "I was walking the antenna along the roof while my wife was watching the TV inside. Hold it — its swell, she yelled! Unfortunately the antenna now lay broken on the ground!" On a more professional basis, the page was illustrated and devoted to building your own cut-to-channel yagi from aluminum tubing.

SPECIAL FEATURES/DXING HINTS (Broomall) - No reception records reported for 20 low band stations, these mainly on channel 6. "Logged any Es on channel 7?" - no reports! "What did you think of 1958 Es season? Six of nine respondents said "poor." Morris Foote suggested naming a "TV DX Station of the Nation" based on reception reports. If "money were no object" Gordon Simkin would get \$400 single-channel, high-gain low-noise converters for several channels, separate TVs for each standard world-wide...and move away from all locals!

METEOR SCATTER (Howarth) - Five reports filled the page with 92 loggings by Tech Notes Editor, Barney Rauch; mainly WCBS-2, WMAR-2, WSYR-3, WBTV-3, and WRC-4.

INTERNATIONAL DX (Simkin) - Heinar Tammet of Estonia, USSR, logged Switzerland on rabbit ears. Ferdinard Dombrowski interested in \$5 kit to convert Heathkit FM-5A to tune 40 - 60 mhz. Doris Johnson, WA reports get a verie on CKCW-2 via F2. CQs Propagation Editor says trans-continental and trans-oceanic F2 on six-meter (50 mhz) should last from mid October through April. Last year first F2 on 35.58 was September 11; this year it started August 28. Look for very ghosty (but very strong) 2000+ mile F2 on channel 2 this winter with sunspot count to 200. Gordon then gave extremely detailed F2 predictions by date and hours. Gordon offered to trade detailed Es logs (for research) for copies of European test patterns.

WESTERN DX (Johnson) - Just six short reports with mystery propagation on Sept. 25.

CO-CHANNEL INTEFERENCE (Brown) - Unideds included "The Green Grass of Texas" movie, Sea Hunt, As the World Turns, Tombstone Territory, Beat the Clock, Houseparty, Anybody Can Play, and Ozzie and Harriett. Sign off of "Daily News and Globe Times" station.

TRANSATLANTIC E-SKIP SOME OBSERVATIONS

by W.H. EMERSON

It is interesting to read (August '87 QST magazine, "The World Above 50 MHz") that a few contacts were made by amateur radio operators between Northeast USA and Europe on June 6, 7, and 8, 1987, via the 50 MHz band - and to see what was reported on these dates for FM and TV in the VUD covering this period (August issue).

Regarding FM - this was one of the more dead Es periods with the only one a California - Midwest being reported on the 8th for FM.

Regarding TV - Low Band TV reports give further evidence of the same Es cloud giving rise to the above FM dx but suggest it is larger in size (large enough for some reported propagation into Canada, Mexico, and East Coast USA) for these lower frequencies (as would be reasonable). I had thought I might find FM and TV evidence of high Es over Northeast USA to account for the first bounce of the ham signals toward Europe but nothing showing (except perhaps page 16, William Wyllie, Franklin MA report June 7 unidentified ch 3 as Newfoundland?).

It is presumed that the nam contacts were via multiple hop sporadic E. So what does the above tell us if we want to get TV dx from Europe at this point in the sunspot cycle? Perhaps the following -

- *** If hams can do it at 50 MHz from Northeast USA with power 1 kW or less, there is hope for reception of the TV stations in European countries operating in the 45 to 60 MHz range. Trouble is that the percentage of time they may be expected to be in via multiple hop Es is disappointingly small but finite (with best opportunities in or near June).
- *** Opportunity for reception of TV from Europe via Es may come at a time when there is little or below-average of TV or FM activity in the USA in evidence.
- *** One would rightfully guess however that reception of TV or FM signals from Nova Scotia, Newfoundland or other regions in the direction of Europe would provide clues worth pursuing.

Since the good ol'days, the audio of a TV station has been staggered among stations in frequency on a given channel so as to reduce interference during conditions of extended propagation. Each channel has three different (but closely separated) frequencies for the audio and video (+10 kHz, 0 kHz, or -10 kHz offset from the standard channel carrier frequencies.) Such information could provide a clue to the identity of a station of questionable identity...I'd be interested to know if TV stations in South America, the Caribbean, Central America, Europe, and the Mideast use slightly different frequencies for audio or picture on a given channel which would give an additional clue for identification.

I'm especially looking forward to further reports on evidence of Es during the period June 6 - 8.

COMMENTS: In 1986 I logged 75 new stations. As of Aug. 29th, L've logged 140 NEW stations so far this year. E-skip was better than ever. And listening to static brought me some new meteor scatter loggings.

The July 17 Es to the Maritimes was one of the best skip openings I've ever had from that area. I've heard those Canadians before in previous years. This time, I've decided to count them. With the help of the FM ATLAS, it is possible to tell because of E, F, mono, or \$. If anyone feels I counted something incorrectly, please let me know.

Can anyone explain why I'm getting some stations so frequently by MS? KVNE and KENW dominate 89.5. What I need on 89.5 is KPRN-CO - WPKN-CT (they are very highly directional, apparently to protect WSOU to the SW. With WSOU off, WPKN is very difficult to detect on the channel here at 76 miles -jf) - WYFS-GA - WVTH-MS - WSOU-NJ (0300 ELT s/off -jf) -WSLU-NY - WUNY-NY - WTEB-NC (they packed up their bags and moved...to 89.3 -jf) -WVPR-VT (are they on overnite? -jf).

Getting Es to the New England area here is rare. The only state I need from the east is Delaware.

And we talk about hot openings: that was real hot (no air conditioning in car). The best classical signal heard in NE that day was KING, solid for 15 minutes in stereo! (Yet they were unusable at motel in Everett WA on 8/7. The Seattle area has the worst multipath I've ever heard.) As for the OR stations, only KAGO has been logged here, though most are within 350 miles. And KYAX hasn't been logged

here, either. Did finally get away from those pesky locals!

Regarding XHHB, it's listed in the FM Atlas as a Ciudad Obregon station. That was my own tentative placement from logging in 3/84 (they gave their address on Calle Obregon then, without a readable city name), and the current hearing positively places them in Hermosillo. (Wonder what's the name of the state highway thru Hermosillo to Cd. Obregon!)

K205BM, by the way, consistently breaks into KUSP Santa Cruz at several locations in town, including a signal just 4 blocks away. But I can't get them here with the S-probe aimed right at them, though they're cosited with KDFC, KRQR, & KEAR, all of which pin the meter. I suspect K205BM is vertically polarized only & that is the reason for the anomaly.

Bay area log stands at 920; Pleasanton at 826. TN brings political units to 33, & is first new one since 5/84. Unofficial total log to 2175.

A few things I would like to elaborate on. The lightning scatter opening on August 21 was real interesting to watch. A good number of Ohio and Indiana stations were affected. not to mention Michigan stations. It was just like watching meteor scatter, only on UHF. On many of the channels that were affected, there was nothing to begin with until the stations on those channels were affected, and then they suddenly appeared for fractions of a second at a time. Two stations that were affected the most, initially, were WFMJ-21 and WOAC-67. WPTT-22 was affected in the beginning, but not WPGH-53. WPGH-53 showed up towards the end of the opening.

WCLJ-42, Bloomington, Indiana gets out well. They are stronger here than WHMB-40 which is 40 miles closer. They must be running 5000 kW like is shown in the new station

I'm skeptical about the power WLIA-64 is running. Many times they weren't any stronger than WCVK-52, and sometimes weaker. They are supposed to be running 1.4 Megawatts.

My tentative logging in June of a modified Phillips test pattern with "Quebec" at the top and "Radio Canada" at the bottom is definitely CBVT-2, channel 3, La Tuque which relays Quebec City. A Canadian DX'er at the convention said Quebec means Quebec City - no other possibilities.

I also saw the same test pattern on channel 3 only with "Montreal" at the top. With 3 possibilities, I can't count it. Also have seen the latter between 0400 and 0430 via meteor scatter. I've seen five patterns of various stations on channel 3 via meteor scatter to the east in this time frame - only one has a call.

I recently compared a new RCA 19" portable FMR425E with mechanical tuning against my vintage Zenith. It was the hotest new set I could find. Adjacent channel rejection was much better - no spillover on VHF. Nearest lowband local is 61 miles though. Sensitivity at VHF and UHF, a toss up. UHF tuner seemed to overload easier. One big surprise - absolutely no indication of meteor scatter. On my Zenith, 60 seconds was maximum without seeing at least a weak burst. Perhaps this is why little meteor scatter is reported anymore in the VUD. Also with no vertical hold control, picture had to build up to a preset level for lock in. If I could incorporate the improved adjacent channel rejection into my Vintage Zenith, I would have the perfect DX'ing machine.



This is the way it happened. The whole truth. The good, the bad, and the ugly.

THE GOOD: This was the best E skip season this DX'er has ever experienced. The Florida lowbanders were reliable, almost daily, visitors. I may have seen WJXT-4's noon-time newscast more often than some Jacksonville residents. Most frequent visitors this season: WPBT-2 on 28 days, WESH-2 on 27 days, KMID-2 on 21 days, KNMZ-2 on 20 days and WCBD-2 on 19 days.

THE BAD: The great E skip season pretty much came to a halt at the very beginning of August as if someone turned off a switch. Last August was much better with some great

openings.

THE UCLY: The increasing trend of stations not to identify. In the good old days, you could rely on any station ID'ing at least on the hour. Today, however, many stations which carry satellite networks just throw a switch and abandon the studio. Three stations this month were seen which didn't identify. WFLI-53 - I followed this for three hours and not once did they identify. Programming was a Polish movie with English subtitles (an attempt to catch the giant Tennessee Polish population?), frequent Ogden, Utah mail order ads, and ITN Network ID's.

Another new non-ID'ing LPTV is one on channel 54 carrying "Tempo TV" to the south. Heading is just a bit west of WZDX. Also, there's another new TBN on ch 58 to the north at about 10°. Perhaps from the Quad Cities, but it's awfully weak. They don't ID either.

Lowband US still needed within 1500 miles: Ch 2 - KETS, WSB, WJBK, KTCA, WMAB, KGFE, KDKA, WKRN, WSJK, KREM. Ch 3 - KLEW, WJMN, KDLH, KOET, WRCB. Ch 4 - KLBY, WTOM, WCBI, KSNB, WIVB, WCMH, KTVY, WYFF, KDFW, KXLY, WOAY. Ch 5 - KHAS, KXON, KXAS, KTXT, WDIV. Ch 6 - KREZ, KTVT, KPVI, KTVC, WCML, WABG, KWNB, WATE, KFDM, KCEN, KHQ, WVVA. Underlined stations are ones which should be a cinch from here, but after 5 years of DX'ing, they still haven't been seen. 73.


