anare Update

WHAT'S BOING ON AT ANARC?

It's been over a year since I submitted my last ANARC UPDATE. Over that time it looked like ANARC had expired, only to be revived on a respirator. Work had been going on to rebuild the organization with very little enthusiasm generated. Several meetings were held at various

non-ANARC DX related functions with few ANARC reps bothering to attend.

Then came the letter. In November I received a note in my mail that there was a certified letter at the Post Office. I figured either I won the Publishers Clearing House Sweepstake or the State of New York was laying me off due to Budget cuts. It turns out it was from Sheldon Harvey at ANARC. (I was hoping I had won the \$7,000,000. Think of the great DX set up I could have purchased.) Sheldon starts off by complaining about the lack of enthusiasm among the clubs and their reps. At the last ANARC meeting held at the Monitoring Times Convention in North Carolina, only 4 clubs had reps (WTFDA not being one of them.). This was followed by demands. Some of the demands were reasonable. Others were a little harsh. Each club was expected to pay dues and give an annual donation based on the "benefits recieved from ANARC". Each club must run an ANARC club list in their bulletin, print the phrase "member of ANARC" on the bulletin and include ANARC information to all new members. Each club must designate a member to attend at least one ANARC meeting a year. There were 13 demands in all.

The letter brought an outcry from the clubs. An ultimatum was included— do this or get out. Most reps like myself are volunteers. We work, have time and financial constraints and family obligations. I know of no ANARC rep who is subsidized by their clubs. And what benefits have we received from ANARC over the last year? Have we gotten any new members through ANARC?

The internal politics of ANARC began to move after the letter was made public. The

Executive Board ousted Sheldon and replaced him with Richard D'Angelo.

At this point in time I feel that WTFDA should remain a member of ANARC. Let's give it another year. Let's see what type of organization developes. And let's see what benefits we receive from ANARC. I've decided to take my roll as ANARC rep more seriously in 1992. I will report back to you from time to time on the progress that ANARC makes. I'd like to hear comments from the WTFDA membership. How do you feel about our membership in ANARC? Are we paying for something we may not get any benefit from or that we may not need? I want to hear the pros and cons!!

SPRACHMAN'S CORNER

I've been able to join the ranks of the serious TV DX'ers. In September we had a new antenna installed on the roof of the house. Now I get almost everything from Hartford CT to Trenton NJ under the worst conditions. Within a few days of the installation, I was able to increase the number of stations I have received. I added Maine and New Hampshire to my list of states. I plan to start reporting my logs to the Eastern TV DX column. My wife thinks I'm crazy because I am spending more time watching television. There's a lot to watch out there.

I now pick up about 30 channels. Four channels are LPTV's. On channel 53, W53AA New York features programs in Korean, Japanese, and Chinese. W44AI Hicksville and W38AM Long Island City have an eclectic mix of psychics, Haitien programs, Arabic, Iranian and Greek programs and music videos. With W54AY Brownsville (Brooklyn), they call themselves WNYX. Often the programming is different on W38AM with much of its broadcast day made up of psychics charging \$2 a minute on a 900 number. I caught W36AS New Brunswick NJ one night. They have programs for (Asian) Indians. They seem to be on from 8 to 10 pm, Friday to Sunday. The ads are for restaurants and businesses in Northern NJ and Western Queens. I wonder what their actual signal range is? Anyone out there have any info on W36AS?

WPIX-11's translator on channel 17 W17AC has a person doing sign language during the 10 O'Clock news on weeknights. W60AI New York has the Home Shopping Spree. They do ID on the

hour, usually with audio and occasionally with a video ID.

I purchased the book "Radio On Wheels" as advertised in the November VUD. It was a little different from what I had imagined. The book lists various stations along each Interstate highway. On top of the page is a map of a segment of the highway. Below is a chart of the stations listed by format, giving frequency, call letters, frequency of newscasts and special

programs. The large metropolitan areas are listed in a special section.

Is the book helpful when travelling? I will find out on our next trip. If you take one or two short trips, or tend to stray away from the interstate highways, or you like small town low power radio stations, use your FM Atlas. My biggest complaints are the author's nearly automatic write-off of AM radio, stations not listed in frequency order, and city of license not being included. Finally, one improvement that the author may want to incorporate in future editions is to indicate at approximately where to start tuning to one set of stations, and where to tune out and try for the next set.

Here is this months news to the Satellite TV news column in the VUD. First, let me put in my 2 cents worth on the current scrambling proliferation on satellite. In five years, I expect to see nearly every channel on satellite scrambled with the exception of Religious channels, Shopping Networks and those so-called 30 minute program length commercial channels (where the consumer is constantly getting ripped-off).

It's December 1st and still no sign of the Sci-Fi Channel. I now have serious doubt that they will ever debut on satellite! Every day I have more than a skeptical feeling that the Sci-Fi Channel is nothing more than a "sham". Why has the Sci-Fi Channel kept on delaying their start-up? Why would the Sci-Fi Channel want to keep their proposed satellite and channel where they are to start up a secret? Every day I turn on the receiver and check up on Satcom IR or 4, even on to Cl, just to see if the Sci-Fi Channel is there, but it's not.

I have written to the <u>Satellite Source</u> and to the <u>National Programming Service</u> about 3½ weeks ago to inquire about programming prices but I have never received a reply! I will write again today and hopefully will hear from them. So - see you in 30 - 73's

FORUM

Anyone know anything about a religious LPTV/translator on channel 6 in Chattanooga? I've heard it twice now on the car radio driving through. Modulation sounds about the same as WUTC-88.1, which makes me think this is a pirate FM station rather than a (legal) LPTV. Will have to remember to bring the pocket TV next time..

Another mystery contributor!

"RC". El Paso. TX:

passed along the news of two new locals in his area, shown above. While on the subject of El Paso, I forget whether this was ever cleared up, but KSCE-38 there is definitely a religious station and not PBS.

Bill Nienajadly, Clifton, NJ: sent an AP article from the NYC Daily News:

"Japan began the world's first fullscale high-definition TV broadcasting yesterday; HDTV sets have been on sale for a year here, but only about 200 reportedly have been sold, mostly to businesses."

Apparently HDTV receivers retail for \$35,000, and HDTV VCRs for \$154,000, which probably explains the poor sales! Electronics manufacturers hope to bring the receiver cost down to the vicinity of \$7,500 within 5 years—still kinda steep for my blood.

Japanese promoters of HDTV had seen a \$15.4 billion market in Japan by the year 2000, but now are admitting those were optomistic estimates.

The Japanese HDTV broadcasts are via DBS broadcast satellite.

Matthew Keaper, St. Francis, WI: Wrote asking about reference books to look up DX stations outside his local area.

I've seen frequent references to the WTFDA's North American TV Database; this hasn't been available since I joined about 2 years ago, so I don't have one! (anyone interested in selling one?!)

The reference I use is the Television Factbook. This is published in two volumes & intended for use by TV stations. It's

extremely expensive (I don't know how expensive— I got my used copy from a coworker at WISC-TV!) Each commercial TV station gets a page, with channel, network, visual & aural powers, antenna height data, mailing address, and a whole bunch of other information. Also included is a coverage map showing the grade A and B contours. Non-commercial and Canadian stations don't get the coverage maps, but most of the rest of the data is there.

Another good reference is the Broadcasting Yearbook. It's lacking the maps, the print is somewhat smaller, and it seems to be a little less accurate, but if you DX AM and/or FM, it also includes radio stations. This is also extremely expensive—the 1992 issue is \$160!

Obviously, you have to be awfully serious about DXing to spend over \$100 on one of these references! Luckily, there are other ways to get them...

If you know someone at a TV or radio station, you might ask whether they have any old copies they're willing to give away or sell cheap. That's how I got mine..

The Factbook comes in two volumes; one mostly TV stations (the one you want) and the other mostly services, including cable. The volumes are sold as a set. It's quite possible that your local cable system has a copy of the "Stations" volume they have no use for & would be willing to get rid of.

Finally, many public libraries have reasonably recent copies of both of these publications.

Readers' Reports

Bob Baker sent a long review of the Day-Sequerra FM reference tuner published in the Dec. '91 "Stereophile." The thing that sets this review apart from others is that the author, Larry Greenhill, is a ham. He mentions using the tuner for DXing and he does some side-by-side comparing of it to such tuners as the Magnum/Dynalab "Etude." Both seemed to perform about the same, incidentally, but the Etude is much less expensive; the Day-Sequerra lists at \$4800, or \$12,800 with an optional "FM Reference Panalyzer," which I gather is an oscilloscope-type display. Bob emphasized in the article that "connectors and coaxial cables in any home tuner installation [should be] in superb shape. Poor antenna feeds can completely defeat a powerful rooftop antenna and a top FM tuner with a supersensitive RF section." The review failed to mention how immune that tuner might be to overload from strong local stations, but it did credit the "FM Atlas" as "handy" for showing the stations.

Bill Nienajadly sent word that WZZV 95.7 Olyphant PA is on the air, op, but not known if stereo. Similarly, WDNO 95.3 Laurel DE is on with stereo and "varied lame format." Lame "denotes soft rock/AC stations with overplayed selections and poor presentations. I personally have not been using that term for a while, but others are using it more and more. I'm off the hook on that one! . . . What is your opinion of the 110 kHz filters?" [So far I have only tried one in a G-E Superadio, and could not tell if there was improvement or not; stations are not as close to each other here in the Midwest as they are in the N.E.-b.e.1 Andy Bolin sent Bill a seven-page write-up on his phase box, which he sells for \$145. "I must say that price seems kind of expensive, but he does have a money back guarantee on it, so I just might go for it." A teenager in Trenton NJ reports being bothered by radio playing through his braces; Bill speculates it might be WKXW 101.5. Other questions about stations having stereo or not-WRAV 94.5 Ravena NY, WKBE 100.5 Warrensburg NY, WTTH 96.1 Margate City NJ? Gerry Turro's Pomona NY 94.3 translator now has WBAB 102.3 Babylon NY, no longer Z-100. Rich Shafton visited Bill and had 110 kHz filters installed in his JVC receiver, GE Superadio and Pioneer Supertuner III car radio, "He didn't notice any deterioration of sound quality and overall selectivity is much better. . . He had 150s in all the units before. He said he had the Philly adjacents driving in the Bronx!"

WRJT Monterey TN now on 106.9, reports Doug Smith, and he says WUTC *88.1 Chattanooga does some of its own programming-not always relaying in stereo the signal of WUOT *91.9 Knoxville. He tried but failed to log Bahamas 104.5 on a recent trip because of FL stations on 104.3 and 104.7. "Heard KA2XXE 107.9 Columbia. Mono, pretty good signal for a considerable stretch of I-75. Columbia isn't on most maps; I thought it was down by Orlando, but your map in the Atlas showed it wasn't as good DX as I thought!"

Harry Helms says he doubts there will be a fourth edition of the book he has done with Hank Bennett, "The Complete Shortwave Listener's Handbook." I wrote him because I wanted my chapter revised if a new edition should be published. "Congratulations on the success of your 'FM Atlas'! Much deserved!" he writes.

Bruce Hall: "Pleasure to meet you for the first time at Dunkirk for the convention. Have enjoyed my little Cool Cube radio with SCS. I use it at work while at my desk. My car radio is certainly a lot sharper after Bill Nienajadly transplanted the 150 filter, although I primarily DX at home." He sent an article on a tourist attraction in Brantford ON, Icomm, which is on a fundraiser to furnish and equip with interactive displaysa "science centre, demonstrating the impact of communications and information technology on our daily





I couldn't come home to DX right away, so DXed on the car radio and found.....
...WKSZ 100.3 Media PA, WSKR 102.7 Petersburg NJ tent with CNN news and sports..
...WIYY 97.9 Baltimore MD, WWSH 97.9 Hazelton PA, UNID 97.9 Country Enfield CT?
...105.1 Country music Ephrata PA assumed, Batlimore 102.7 "V-103" Some of these I could have counted in the Clifton log as these were heard 8 to 11 miles from my Clifton QTH but my personal mileage for counting anything in the Clifton log is a approx FIVE miles, club rules say 25 miles radius is countable but I feel bettar with the FIVE mile limit.

11/8/91 A very strong aurora activity noted on the car radio at 1740 and when I got home, TV was messed up to ch 10+!!! This was far stronger than 3/13/89. I heard there was E-skip later on in the evening on TV but I missed it.

11/14/91 2000+ Very good Tropo/scatter, it was really a comination of both. I heard CHTZ 97.7 St catherines ON at 310 miles, WVOR 100.5 Rochester NY 235 miles, at 2200+ rarely heard WGBI 101.3 Scranton PA (rare do to strong WKCI CT off the back), WPEL 96.5 Montrose PA, WKRZ 98.5 Scranton PA, WDNH 95.3 doing real nice here, WKGB 92.5 way over WXTU in fact WKGB was there for a hour or so, WVOS 95.9 Liberty NY strong for a while (rare), WWDL 104.9 Scranton PA only the second time I heard them, WHWK 98.1 Binghampton NY, 2250 Very rare WPCX 106.9 Auburn NY (near Syracuse), A bit later into the midnite hour I heard WDBA 107.3 DuBois PA at 249 miles along with Utica 107.3 and I did hear some MS bursts on 107.3. The Mod Delco digital is excellent with the TWO 110's, sound quality is OK. Went to Joe Fela's house where I modified his GE Superadio with one 110 khz filter. He bought out another GE Superadio which I modified months earlier with a 150 khz filter. We compared both Superadios and the one with the 110 filter dug out Baltimore 106.5 and Wash. DC 107.3 where as the 150 khz Superadio could barely get, I should mention we were using a whip antenna for this comparison test, trops were up a bit too. At Joes house, in my car we checked out the selectivity of my Delco car radio. He seemed impressed that the Delco in the car using the window antenna could get stations like 94.9 Harrsburg PA (WFME 94.7 is so wide that 94.9 is usually covered up even on modified radios) Also WXMH 99.7 from Central PA, WYOR 100.5 Rochester with WRCH 100.5 CT, All adjacents were in the clear with no adj channel interference, DC, Balt,adj's all perfect, By now you should get the idea how well the 110 filters work. Joe lives 2 dozen miles from NYC were I live only a dozen miles from NYC, so the Delco did perform better there. Those who haven't yet gone on to modify your car radio, by all means do! Find out what you are missing! Goodxing!

The band was loaded with aurora signals the evening of the 8th, but <u>very</u> difficult to copy any thing as several signals were competing on every open frequency and audio was very mushy, typical of auroral signals. I worked about 20 states on 144 mHz during the same period. The Es of the next day followed excellent 50 mHz F-skip to South America, New Zealand, Australia, and Japan, the latter three new for me on six meters.

A friend in Silver Lake, KS, Greg Cerny, has been DXing a lot recently. He has test equipment at work and offered to test and compare the Murata and Toko 150 kHx IF filters. I sent him 10 of mine, plus he already had quite a number of Murata and Toko filters. He says there's no comparison. The Murata filters have less insertion loss, a flatter bandwith, steeper slopes, and are much closer to 10.7 mHz. Whereas almost all Murata filters are within 10 kHz of the 10.7 mHz specification, many Toko filters are 10 to 30 kHz of. From now on, I'm sticking to the Mratas! Greg also built up two 5 filter "super-duper IF amplifiers" described by Tim McVey in his "Technical Topics" Nov. 1990 VUD. Greg reports dramatic adjacent channel selectivity using one of them in his tuner. He sent me the other circuit board which I will install and report on next month. OFF-THE-AIR PICKUPS

MHAT MERE THEY, AND MHY DID THEY EXIST?: Although there probably aren't any 'off-air' pickups used for primary network service today, they were commonplace in rural areas in the 50s and 60s. While the major markets were served by ATST microwave feeds; stations in smaller locales often could not afford ATST's rates, or in some cases, ATST service simply wasn't available. No matter what the situation, the need for live network interconnection had to be met; and construction of a private microwave link was usually the answer.

For this account, I'll rely on memory to relate the story of how the NBC television network originally made it into North Dakota.

WDAY-tv (6) in Fargo was a primary NBC affiliate. For whatever reason, AT&T service was not a viable option, so the WDAY people chose an off-the-air pickup. The first step was a tower about 30 miles from the KSTP-tv (Minneapolis) transmitter. A pair of stacked yagis received the channel 5 signal which was then fed into a microwave transmitter and relayed on to the next tower about 30 miles to the northwest...and so on...until the KSTP-tv signal arrived at the WDAY-tv studios some 200 air miles from Minneapolis.

The next segment of this system was owned by the Meyer Broadcasting Co. of Bismarck which had an off-air receiver about 30 miles west of Fargo, and about 5 microwave hops to the KFYR-tv transmitter site 10 miles east of Bismarck. Meyer later extended the system to KMOT in Minot with an off-air pickup of KFYR-tv...and to KUMV-tv in Williston utilizing an off-air pickup of KMOT.

Considering the circumstances, these privately owned off-air pickups and associated microwave systems were relatively reliable. Although the relay towers were unmanned, a warning system pinpointed trouble spots and an engineer could usually reach any relay tower in less than two hours.

HOW DID THEY WORK?: A monitor in the WDAY-tv master control room was dedicated to the off-sir KSTP-tv microwave pickup. The engineer on duty simply watched to see when Minneapolis originations ended, then punched up the circuit to feed the Fargo transmitter.

The Bismarck crews had a more challenging setup. Economics did not allow an additional hop to get a video signal into the studios. Instead, the audio portion of the microwave receiver was fed to the studios over a telephone line to a headset in master control. The master control operator could hear..but not see..the network video source!

Using the clock, an absence of audio on the headset monitor, and intuition; the switch to NBC was made 'flying blind'. If everything down the line was on schedule, viewers were unaware of the quirks of the system. If KSTP was running late, WDAY would hold their ID on screen with no audio until NBC programming began. The guys at KFYR would assume that since they were hearing no Fargo audio..and the clock was correct

for a network 'hit'.. often punched up the off-air link only to find a huge WDAY-tv slide staring them in the face..and being transmitted in all its' glory on KFYR-tv!

COLOSSAL BLUNDERS: As you might have speculated, WDAY-tv IDs popped up frequently on KFYR-tv. That, however, wasn't all that went wrong. Every now and then the ATST link between Chicago and Minneapolis would conk out, and KSTP-tv would display a network trouble slide sporting their call letters. This would catch everyone off guard; and as a result, KSTP would show up on all stations to the west. I should point out that KMOT and KUMV were able to monitor both audio and video from their respective off-air feeds; thus transient ID's (particularly from WDAY-tv) were seldom seen in Minot and Williston.

One weekend in the summer of 1959 I decided to drive up to Minot and Williston to take a look at the KFYR-tv satellite stations (I was employed by KFYR at the time). While in the control room at KUMV, I witnessed one of the most mind-boggling ID displays of all time. KSTP-tv had interrupted an NBC program with a severe weather warning slide (containing their logo) and was about five seconds into a voice-over description of the potential storm hazard when the WDAY crew zapped it with an ID slide of their own. Next came a KFYR-tv ID slide, then one from KMOT; and finally...the guy in Williston punched up a KUMV ID slide. All this happened within a ten second time frame...but it seemed like an eternity. It was quite a sight!

OFF THE AIR?: Perhaps the most unusual occurrence I witnessed with regard to off-air pickup operation took place in the summer of 1957. Without werning, the WDAY-tv transmitter went off the air.and stayed off! That, of course, meant a disruption of NBC service to the three stations west of Fargo. KFYR-tv popped up a trouble slide until the program director showed up with a half-hour travelogue film to kill time. The filler stuff continued for another hour, then we loaded a feature film to really eat up the time. Meanwhile the front office had been in touch with WDAY and learned that their transmitter man had found the trouble, but that they didn't have a spare part on hand. Later in the day WDAY advised us that the faulty component was indeed an odd duck...RCA didn't have a replacement either! As a result, WDAY was off the air for over two days while the elusive part was flown in from Austria!

While filler programming continued to grind through the film projectors in Bismarck, the master control operator noted the presence of NBC sudio on his headset. What was going on? A call to the KFYR-tv transmitter engineer verified that there was NBC video on the off-eir link; but that it was from WDSM-tv (also on 6) in Duluth.

You guessed it! Tropo conditions were up full blast, and the 250 mile distant WDSM-tv signal was hitting the high gain off-air receiver west of Fargo like a local!

No one had run into a situation like this before...NBC was available via the Duluth signal...but could we carry it? After some frantic calls to the FCC, NBC in New York, and WDSM; we were assured that it would be OK to use the unusual source on an emergency basis as long as the signal strength was adequate.

Well, we went back to NBC via the WDSM signal at the next regular break...and with the exception of a couple of hours (when severe fading occurred) we carried the unorthodox NBC source for the better part of two days. Oddly enough, there never appeared to be any CCI from Duluth on the off-air pickup when WDAY-tv was on.

Eventually the off-air systems gave way to ATST feeds, which in turn were rendered obsolete by satellite distribution. Although a few regional networks continue to use terrestrial microwave between their affiliates; the days of the off-the-air pickup (with the exception of a few LPTV's) remain only as oddities in the pages of television history.

The VHF-UHF DIGEST TECHNICAL INDEX is now complete and updated from 1979 to 1992. (The first version of this index appeared in the Dec 86 VUD, pages 2-6.) There are just over 200 entries, covering every edition from June, 1979 to the present. Now, it is possible to locate information about 'most any topic of interest to DX'ers. (To conserve space, the categories on beer, football, and poker tricks have been omitted.) There has been some superb talent contributed to the WTFDA club over the past several years, and there's no reason for those efforts to go unrecognized or unused.

This index is organized by topic, with separate headings for the "Technical Topics" column of Bill Thompson, the "Antenna News" column of Doug Dornbos, the "TV Time Tunnel" column by Tom Bryant, and some of Bill Fahber's "Television News" columns. Every entry has its own reference number, title, author, page number, number of pages, and VUD edition. For example:

Any of the items in this index are available as reprints! This extremely popular service will be continued indefinitely. You may have noticed the three-digit number preceeding each entry. This number can be used to order reprints. In addition, it ranks the articles in chronological order.

TO ORDER REPRINTS...just order as you would from any mail-order catalog. Send me a note with the numbers of all the articles you want, plus ten cents per page. Use the number in parentheses to total up page count. Note that I need log per page, not per 2 pages as before. This is due to extra postage and copying costs; I do not make any profit doing this. I cannot cash checks payable to WTFDA.

Since starting this reprint service back in '87, I've sent out over 10,000 pages of material to over 100 requestors. At first, I was handling about one request every week; a couple of people even asked for a copy of everything! Every item has been requested at one time or another, reflecting the diverse interests of what many would see as a very narrow-interest club. Antenna articles are always the most popular, as well as equipment reviews, although many of these are becoming obsolete. I urge anyone out there with ideas for articles, pieces of gear or antennas that you are very happy/unhappy with, or new opinions about old topics, to write it down and share it with others. You could achieve immortality on the next index!
