



Readers' Reports

W. R. McIntosh sent an item about KCLU *88.3 which wants to build a tower in a residential area to be DXed far and wide from Thousand Oaks CA. Problem is that some of the residents are opposed to the tower for this still unbuilt station, owned by CA Lutheran U. But the station has hired consultants who have assured neighbors that there won't be harmful radiation and any interference to their reception will be taken care of by station engineers, wielding filters. Mc also sent word that KPWR 105.9 and KIIS-FM 102.7 top the L.A. Arbitron ratings among DXers, and he clipped the newspaper column mentioning program formats, "Are these the same classifications you use?" he asks. They're not, but I have no trouble converting. For example, it shows KMAX 107.1 Arcadia as "foreign language: other," while I list it as "ethnic," and suffering from the disease of being monophonic.

Mike Hawk kindly supplied a lot of station news (some of which will also be in next month's column) and he received the new FM Atlas. "It looks real good, and it will definitely help me log a few new ones this summer. I had been using the NRC FM log, which has its good points, so I'm not going to toss it, just put it on the back shelf." He discovered two listings in my book which are fiction: KPQB *88.1 Omaha has not vet a-built, but I hold my breath that this Family Stations outlet will be on the air in glorious stereo by the time FM Atlas-15 is out. Likewise, KNOD Harlan IA continues its sleepy ways monophonically on 105.5, not yet having activated its FCC-authorized construction permit to move to 105.3.

Doug Smith read in "Broadcasting" that WNYE *91.5 New York is for sale by the school board for a \$3 million minimum bid, "Wanna bet it ends up religious?" he muses. WPLN *90.3 Nashville does kill its stereo pilot for monophonic talk shows from NPR. I am told WEDW-FM *88.5 Stamford CT also subscribes to this commendable practice. Commenting on the introductory essay in the new FM Atlas, Doug would like to see rural stations licensed to a county and city stations licensed to a metro area, allowing some flexibility to move studios and transmitters, without creating interference to other stations. He also feels in-band DAB might be a ploy on the part of the NAB to keep stations where they are (and maybe by DXers wanting to keep FM/DAB in VHF!-b.e.). This could possibly result in low-quality DAB. And translator "abuse" might happen if a broadcaster brought in via satellite a format already repeated in the local market. In public radio there is some swallowing up of other stations, such as WI Public Radio taking over the operations of student stations at Superior, Eau Claire, La Crosse and Green Bay, while at Stevens Point "the students successfully fought them off." He'd like to see a Chicago-area transmitter map, such as the FM Atlas had many editions ago. "I wonder how the Chicago flood affected FM/TV? I understand power was off in the Sears Tower for an extended period." Perhaps area WTFDAers feasted on a lot of

Shocking news out of northern VA. Eric Voytko says of WRCY, misidentifying as "Washington's Rockin' Country Thunder 107.7," which illegally is not giving a station break mentioning its city of license, Warrenton. "The station is a strict nonIDer, mentioning calls only at 10 minutes before the hour with no city of license. Eric recently bought "two copies of the 14th edition FM Atlas, and I must say I am impressed with the sheer amount of information compressed into this one, easy-to-use book. FM Atlas makes FM DXing less intimidating in this time of nonlDers. . . I also enjoy your FCC-FM feature, which combined with the Atlas makes an indispensable pair!" If WRCY continues in its miscreantal ways, the FCC'll have to be siced on 'em. Go to WRCY, some area reader, and rub this column in their noses!

Bill Nienajadly sent word on NYC FM ratings with WRKS 98.7 on top, but with WPAT-FM missing because of failure to list it combined with WPAT AM. Ratings for the two stations alone were not enough to cut it, but combined it would show. At one time, WPAT-FM was #2 in the market. It is one of the rare stations you can DX in a major market having beautiful music, and possibly a national treasure. Bill comments on "lame/ safe/mix" type stations and their lack of appeal to many DXers. Such stations do not include WPAT-FM, incidentally. "Another joke is that all these 'AC/mix' stations assume that everyone works in an office during the day and that's why all the stations, not just 'ac-mix-lite' go limp from 9 to 5. Doesn't anyone who owns a station realize that there are others who want to hear all the hits 24 hours a day? Not just endless Michael Bolton. Gloria Estefan, Phil Collins and unbearable recurrents by Whitney Houston, Madonna and Dirty Dancing soundtracks. The only way to hear all the hits is on your cassette that you made at home; not on the radio. It's a shame!"



OTHER STUFF

With the WIS-10 call change above, Bill notes that the FCC usually requires TV stations with 3-letter calls to keep the -TV suffix. (thus making them technically 5-letter calls) However, there <u>are</u> some 3-letter calls on FM without the -FM suffix, KSD-93.7 St. Louis comes to mind.

The Glendale application for channel 63 in Monroe, Ga. conflicts with Trinity's WHSG-63, which recently came on the air. Glendale is the organization which challenged the renewal of TBN's WHFT-45 Miami.

The WJZ-13 move to reduce ERP to 215kW is interesting, as was WHIO-7's reduction to 100kW. (March *VUD) I wonder if these are actually auxiliary backup facilities being reported in the wrong category by the FCC?

The L.A. riots are not known to have affected any TV stations, although a production company was burned down, and at least one radio station temporarily broadcast from alternate studios. Six L.A. stations have been subpoenaed by the FBI, which wants their tapes of the rioting, reportedly for evidence for a grand jury probe of the L.A. police department.

Despite criticism in some corners of the recent Commission decision to relax multiple-ownership rules in radio, the FCC is working on also relaxing the rules for TV.

Currently, one firm may own up to 12 TV stations, as long as they cover no more than 25% of U.S. TV homes, and no two stations have overlapping coverage.

Relaxation proposals include:

-Increasing the national total from 12 to 24.

-Allowing a firm to own one VHF and one UHF station with overlapping coverage.

-Reducing the permissible distance between co-owned stations.

-Repeal of the "one-to-a-market" rule that prohibits common ownership of a radio and TV station in the same city. (waivers of this rule seem so routine that it's hardly worth the paperwork to repeal it!)

A World Administrative Radio Conference (WARC) recently concluded in Torremolinos, Spain. Most issues discussed involved shortwave radio or digital audio broadcasting, but two microwave bands were allocated for satellite HDTV. In ITU Region 2 (the Americas), 17.3-17.8GHz will be used; in Regions 1 and 3 (the rest of the world), 21.4-22.0GHz was allocated.

Broadcasting reports that the Video Jukebox Network is changing its name to "The Box". Additionally, they're adding more oldies, and the price is declining.

TV Marti ran a 1-day experiment in daytime broadcasting, during a period when the channel 13 station in Cuba is running a test pattern. (something eastern TV DXers are all too familiar with!) Large-scale retaliation against U.S. AM stations resulted; no word on whether the TV Marti signals were able to overcome the Cuban test pattern...

Semi-locally, WKNT-40 Bowling Green has been relaying WGRB-34 Campbellsville's programming. Tom Bryant called the station in late April, and they said the relay will be reversed soon, with WGRB becoming a satellite of WKNT, and both stations becoming Fox affiliates. According to a NYC Post article sent by Bill N., WKNT becomes Fox's 139th affiliate.

(As of early May, this swap has occurred. The stations are using the slogan "Kentucky's Newest Fox". They do have separate IDs.)

Tom & I have both received our copies of Dajja Enterprises' (Box 24, Cambridge WI 53523) TV Station Log. This is a pretty decent TV reference, showing HAAT, ERP, station address & phone number, network, and transmitter coordinates, and is quite reasonably priced. Publisher Mike Knitter promises LPTVs in a future edition.

On the downside, there are a number of obvious errors and omissions, for example, most KY Educational TV stations being listed as "independent", KMSP-9 listed under channel 6, and most religious stations listed as simply "IND". (admittedly, it's sometimes hard to tell which indies are religious) All told, a worthwhile reference, at least until the Database comes out, and at a much more reasonable price than the Broadcasting Yearbook and Television Factbook!

FORUM

Tom Bryant, Nashville TN:

Tom called the night before my deadline to note that WTVW-7 is now also including a channel 35 logo on some of their promos. Presumably, this is a translator, and due to the proximity of WKMA-35 Madisonville, Ky. (about 70km S of Evansville), it must be a fair ways north of Evansville- maybe Vincennes, Ind., or Olney or Lawrenceville, Ill.. My LPTV lists don't show anything likely. Ideas?

Tom Yingling, Dundalk MD:

(via Bill Fahber) Reports Towson State College's W61BT Towson, Md. signed on April 14 with Channel America. Transmitter power is 10w, with plans to go to 1kw.

Keith Short, Columbus OH:

Keith mentions the appearance of W62BE in Columbus on March 25. It's carrying the All News Channel, and signing "WCLS-TV". An accompanying newspaper article from the March 27 Columbus Dispatch says the station's antenna is on the WOSU-28 tower in southern Delaware County, northnortheast of Columbus. A phone number (614-899-6262) was supered on the screen, asking viewers to call in with reception reports.

The station was sold within 24 hours of going on the air (?!), and the new owners plan local programming. (however, a <u>lot</u> of LPTVs have said that before!) Former owner Paul L. Parshall probably wrapped up the financial condition of the LPTV industry— and the broadcast industry in general—in one sentence: "You make money by buying and selling companies, not by operating them."

Keith asks whether it's legal for a LPTV to use a 4-letter callsign like WCLS. Strangely, yes. A broadcast station (LPTV, full-power TV, AM, or FM) can sign any call it wants, as long as it uses its real call for the on-the-hour ID. As

LPTVs are allowed to ID in Morse Code, you may <u>never</u> see the real callsign.

I know of no allocation table for LPTVs; my understanding is that they can operate on any channel that wouldn't interfere with a full-power station or a previously-authorized LPTV. Keith mentions that channel 56, allocated (but not used) for full-power use in Columbus, is being used by W56CA in Delaware, Ohio: LPTVs do often choose unoccupied allocated full-power channels, nowdefunct W55AS Milwaukee being another example. Probably the best reason is that these channels have already been proven not to interfere with existing full-power stations, and will be protected from interference by future stations. Also, I'm sure some of these LPTVs plan to some day upgrade to full-power service. The downside is, that if someone else gets a full-power license for that channel, the LPTV is bumped.

Keith also sent an article from the April 8 *Dispatch* mentioning a "get-rich-quick" scheme involving wireless cable TV, also known as Multichannel Multipoint Distribution Service, or MMDS.

The MMDS system itself does work; it involves using microwave transmitters (in the 2000MHz area) to transmit cable-type TV programs to consumers with small dish-type antennas. Licenses for various geographic markets are being issued by a FCC lottery; anyone desiring to try for a license sends an application with a detailed engineering and interference study, and a \$151 filling fee.

Telemarketers are offering to prepare the studies in return for a \$5,000 fee, and promising a rapid and large return on one's investment, through selling the license to a multi-system owner. Problem is, you have to demonstrate to the FCC that you have the financial and technical resources to build; and the lucrative large-city licenses have already been issued.

Bill Nienajadly, Clifton NJ:

Yet more news from the NYC Post:

On April 15, the 400 employees of the cable service "The Monitor Channel" were laid off. The channel will continue to air reruns until June 15, hoping to find a buyer.

And on the 21st, an article mentioned the razzing 3 NYC TV weather forecasters took for being 30 degrees off with their Easter weekend forecasts! One, Irv "Mr. G"

Gikofsky of WCBS-2, says he's writing a book-"Don't Blame the Weatherman"! To further harass the poor weather guys.. On April 28th, a cartoon was printed, showing a NYC weatherman, on the air, being handed his 5-day forecast-- by a crew of apes...

Fred McCormack, St. Paul MN:

Fred sent some LPTV notes via Compuserve;

Regarding John Marx's comments about W54BH possibly moving to channel 8 (I got their calls wrong-K54DB was used briefly, after their move from channel 5), Fred says W08CK's CP holder is "Healthy's Inc.", while W54BH is licensed to "WSSM-TV".

The 650 watts ERP mentioned for W04CQ last month is probably in error-- Fred's records show 65 watts, which makes more sense for a VHF LPTV. (VHF LPTVs are limited to 10W transmitter output; it'd be pretty difficult to build an antenna with enough gain to get 650W ERP)

Fred comments on the "over the air Cable TV" in southern Minnesota reported by Randall Tripp last month; "Closer reading (Oakland transmitter site) made it clear that these are the LPTVs granted to Austin MN. The remaining channel which has been granted to this operator at Austin is channel 43." (this is where the 7th basic service will go)

A series of LPTVs doing this kind of thing in Appleton are licensed to "Prairieview TV Inc.", 6545 Cecilia Circle, Minneapolis; the Austin/Oakland LPTVs are licensed to "Teleview Systems of Minnesota"—at the same address. This address is, I'm sure, familiar to any Midwest broadcasters in the WTFDA; it's also the home of equipment supplier Todd Communications.

Mike Stone, Clarence IA:

Mike mentions that he, too, has seen the Madison, Wis, weather radar over ham TV station WJ9H on 434MHz. (cable channel 59) That's not bad DX; ham TV stations are limited to 1500w peak output (1.5 times what UHF LPTVs are permitted), but very few even approach this power, 30-40 watts being more common, and I believe WJ9H-TV is running on the order of 8-10 watts! If you're in the Madison area & have a VHF-Hi scanner, (or ham 2m rig) Mike says there's an amateur voice net discussing ham TV on Sunday nights on 146.94MHz.

Speaking of ham TV, the British ham magazine Radio Communication reported on an amateur who built, from scratch, a complete portable TV station-- right from the homemade CCD color camera to the 1-watt 1300MHz transmitter to the antenna. John Stockley (G8MNY-TV) carries the entire station on his person; in March, he used it to transmit live video of the Radio Society of Great Britain's VHF Convention to ham viewers throughout the area, via a higher-powered "repeater". (ham term for translator)

Dave Sinclair, Vancouver BC:

An article in the Christian Info
News for March 23-April 11 confirms
my suspicion that 100% religious
stations are not currently permitted
in Canada. A group of potential
religious broadcasters met in
winnipeg recently to attempt to
change this, by founding the
"National Christian Broadcast
Association". This, in light of
recent CRTC hearings in Vancouver
aimed at several operators of pirate
religious TV stations in western
Canada—some of which have been on
the air for 8 years!

FCC RULES PRIMER

Of course, the coverage area of a TV (or FM) station depends on the height of the antenna, as well as the transmitter power. A TV station running 100kW ERP to an antenna in a valley won't have the coverage of a station whose antenna is atop a mountain.

Tower height isn't a good measure of coverage; the station in the valley could use a 300m tower and still have its antenna well below where the mountaintop station would be with a 20m tower. Height above sea level isn't much good either—2535m above sea level (KDUH-4 Scottsbluff, Nebr.) sounds like a lot, until you realize the entire city is 1925m ASL! On the other hand, in Orlando, WCPX-6's 510m ASL is quite a bit, given that the city itself is only 20m ASL.

Because of this, the FCC came up with the concept of "Height Above Average Terrain", or HAAT. The tower heights of FM and TV stations are regulated in terms of this, rather than the physical height of the station's tower.

To calculate HAAT, a station first plots its transmitter location on a topographic map. Next, 20 radicals are plotted, extending 10 miles from the transmitter, starting due north (0°) and appearing every 30°.

Then, points are marked on each radial, at 2 miles from the transmitter, and every mile after that, up to 10 miles. Using the ground contours on the topographic map, the elevation above sea level of each of these points is determined.

Finally, the elevations of all 180 points are averaged. The result is the height of average terrain, in feet above sea level. HAAT of the antenna is then calculated by determining the height above sea level of the antenna, and subtracting the height of average terrain from it.

In the case of Denver, while KCNC-4's antenna may be 874m above the city, the huge mountains west of the city (and just slightly west of the antenna) bring the station's HAAT down to just 450m. On the other hand, with no mountains in South Florida, WTVJ-4's antenna, 303m above the city, is still 290m AAT.


FCC actions <u>do</u> indicate the height of the tower itself, and the height above sea level. Presumably, the height of the tower itself is specified so the FAA can be informed, and can determine whether the tower poses a hazard to aircraft. (a 300m tower in a valley is still a hazard to aircraft flying within the valley, even if it doesn't radiate much of a signal!) I don't know why height ASL is specified.

Sometimes, nonsense data appears for HAAT, AG, or ASL. Often, a station will make changes to its tower- without moving the tower site-and the height above average terrain, above ground, and above sea level will all change by different amounts.

Less explicable is what happened to WIRS-42 Yauco, P.R.. Their original application was for 600m AAT- and 118m ASL, which means that average terrain in that part of Puerto Rico is 482m (almost 1600 feet) below sea level! And they told me Death Valley was the lowest place in the U.S.!

Been seeing hints of E-skip here, also a few tropos— nothing too exciting (though a few new ones have been logged on FM) but enough to show that the DX season is upon us..

CKTV vs CKCK-tv: Yeah, I know this one has been rehashed umpteen times, but let's trot it out once more, because some folks are still confused. About 10 years ago the Regina channel 2 Es mega-hopper went on a promotional binge to establish a new identity as 'CKTV'. The campaign was immensely successful. [I was suckered in, too. While vacationing in Bismarck about 8 years ago I ran into a crew from the station and asked the guys if there had been a call letter change. "Oh, yeah...we're CKTV now!" Hey, that was good enough for me.] Anyhow, in later discussions with knowledgeable WTFDAers, serious doubts about the validity of CKTV were raised; and I finally made a call to their chief engineer. He stated that shortly after the CKTV slogan was introduced, the promotion department (erroneously) got its hands on station update reporting forms from the likes of BROADCASTING YEARBOOK, TV FACTBOOK, WORLD RADIO AND TELEVISION HANDBOOK; and indicated a call letter change conforming to their promotional campaign. It's taken the better part of ten years to get the listings back to CKCK-tv; but even in 1992 publications, there are still occasional references..mainly low-power repeaters..to CKTV. BURN THIS INTO YOUR MEMORY CELLS... CKTV NEVER EXISTED AS A LEGITIMATE CALL SIGN! It was, is, and always has been CKCK-tv.

WXMT: Nashville's channel 30 has completely dropped Home Shopping programming and is now a full-blown independent. The former Fox station went full-time HSN when WZTV (17) snared the Fox affiliation, but began to chip away at the "shop 'til you drop" content about a year ago. With little or no promotional effort, WXMT now offers the standard indy menu of cartoons, sitcoms, sports, movies and religion. I mention this because tropo hounds seem to get this one all over the south, east and midwest..and may not be aware of the non-shopping status.

In last month's article on the Paducah (et al) ADI, I stated that WTCT (27) was owned by TBN. Not true. It is owned by Tri-State Christian Television. That's hardly significant when you consider that WTCT as well as the other three or four stations under this ownership appear to be 24 hour TBN carriers. Mention was also made of the possibility of a different call in the early days of WCEE-ty (13) in Mount Vernon, IL. That must have been a figment of my imagination; but it was pointed out that WCEE-ty did have a previous life elsewhere in IL. It was the original call for channel 23 in Freeport (Rockford)..now WIFR-tv.

(#1)-I have accumulated a mountain of historical information pertaining to Crosley Broadcasting of Cincinnati, and should have it in some sort of usable form in the next couple of months..still looking for a bit more info on the post-Crosley television operation. (#2)-Finally.. the full scoop on the short-lived RCA/Westinghouse swap of Cleveland and Philadelphia facilities in the mid '50s. (#3)-Among comments from readers, the 'PATTERNS' feature [2/91] seems to rank highest in popularity. Good news! I already have enough contributions to do a sequel; and better than that, have connected with a couple of sources who may be able to supply a lot more. Those old circular test patterns sure caught our fancy back in the early days of tv; and they seem to be a hit with the younger enthusiasts as well. Let's Face it..they were a lot more interesting than color bars...especially UN-ID'd color bars!

After puzzling over the three bizarre loggings noted above, I believe I have come up with a possible explanation. All three could occur through the errant operation of two KUON-12 translators in Nebraska: K33AC, Pawnee City, relaying KWCH-12 and KELO-11 audio one channel down, and K23AA, Beatrice, relaying an unknown channel 12 (channel 23 output buried by KTMA-23) and KARE-11 audio one channel down. However, I have my doubts about this scenario as both translators are not that far apart, yet each would have to be receiving a different channel 11. This is possible as KUON's transmitter location would have K33AC's receiving antenna oriented almost straight toward Sioux Falls, while K23AA's would be aimed at a point approximately midway between Sioux Falls and Minneapolis. Yet I'm still not convinced. Does anyone have another possible explanation?

K35CY, Minneapolis, returned to the air on March 27 or 28 and is carrying Home Shopping Spree 24 hours a day.

(Your scenarios are plausible, but there may be another explanation for at least one of your unids. If KAKE-10 carries Home Shopping Spree overnight, your unid channel 22 may have been their K22CP in Salina. With 928 Watts erp, at 529 miles from Amery, it would have been an exceptional logging, but certainly not an impossible one. Was KAAS-18 from Salina extra strong?

As for two nearby translators receiving different channel 11s, that is quite possible. At Redwood Falls, Minnesota, both KELO-11 and WTCN-11 (now KARE) used to be received

directly on the same tower and translated to channels 58 and 68. fm)

I've just read Mark McCarthy's article in the May 1992 VUD (page 30) entitled "Eliminating the Weak Link in the UHF Chain" that relates to the deficiencies of 300/75 ohm balun transformers at UHF. Perhaps many WTFDA members are not aware that we offer two commercial quality devices that eliminate the problems of high losses and high VSWR in these components. The model UA-75 UHF Balun has a loss of only 0.1 dB typical and a VSWR less than 1.2 while our model UA-60 VHF-UHF Balun covers the entire 54-806 MHz range with a loss of 0.3 dB at UHF. These devices are made for outdoor use with an encapsulated package that is totally sun and weatherproof. Quite frankly, either of these units represent the cheapest and easiest way to improve any type of UHF antenna system.

In addition, we offer a high performance, state-of-the-art UHF amplifier model UA-900 with features no other amp has such as built-in low loss balun and bandpass filter, GaAs FET amplifier circuitry and a small encapsulated package. The total noise figure is 1.0 dB and the gain is 20 dB, an optimum level at UHF for high sensitivity and overload resistance. The unique package is slightly larger than a conventional outdoor balun so that the amp can be easily connected right at the antenna terminals for maximum performance. Nothing too horribly exciting—just cleaning up on the semi-locals. Did install 110 kHz filters in my tuner, I think they helped though with the ultra strong local signals from WSM-FM and WRVU (antenna line—of—sight) it's kinda hard to tell, and IF filters do nothing for front—end overload. I expect the 110s will be more valuable for portable expeditions, or when I move, later this year. The filters were almost trivially easy to install; just unsolder 3 leads for each of the old filters (I used "Solder Wick", purchased at a local TV parts store),drop in the new ones (you can't install them backwards; they work either way) and solder them in. The only hard part, my tuner already had two bandwidths (400 and 200) so I had to remove one set of filters & turn the tuner on & find out which bandwidth stopped working!

I have also acquired a 12V=110V inverter so I can take the ST-G50 on "DX-peditions" (Land Between the Lakes probably first, also hope to go up Clingman's Dome later this summer), and a new car with a digital—and more overload resistant—radio, making mobile DX much easier.

********Station news now from Todd Brandenburg of Topeka...KXXR 106.5 Liberty, MO is now country KKCJ "CJ-106". They were taken over by 94.1 KFKF Kansas City, KS, using the same sales and management staff but run as separate entities.
