



POWEL CROSLEY, JR.; the man

CROSLEY BROADCASTING; the legend

PRELUDE: Although the history of WLW and Crosley Broadcasting is long and ilTustrious, I was intrigued to learn that the man who founded it was even more fascinating that the broadcast giant itself. With that in mind, this synopsis of one of America's most famous operations opens with a look at Powel Crosley, gr. His life and career were as unusual as the spelling of his given name. Only the highlights of his long and productive career are included here; a more comprehensive biography is available in the 1971 Prentice-Hall book "Not Just A Sound...The Story of WLW" written by Dick Perny. Because of the extreme importance of Crosley's widely varied business empire, this month's column will dwell on the early years, and we'll move into the television aspect next month. Please bear in mind that attempting to condense Crosley's story to two pages is tantamount to trimming both volumes of "TV Factbook" to the size of a postcard!

Powel Crosley, Jr. was a complex being. His first love was cars, and he raced them as a young man. He began his college career in engineering, but was pressured by his father to change to a law curriculum. At one point he quit college to become a chauffeur, simply so he would have a car to drive. The law studies were short-lived, and Crosley eventually received a degree in engineering. Other career branches included a job selling bonds; telephone lineman, and advertising copywriter. He built his first car, the "Marathon Six", in 1907. The prototype cost him \$10,000; but the production model was to sell for about \$1,700. World War One ended that project, and he drifted from job to job in the automotive field in cities in Michigan and Indiana.

Returning to Cincinnati in 1911, he started his own shop to Fabricate auto accessories. One of the gadgets he conceived and marketed with great success was a flag holder which mounted on auto radiator caps. He is credited with inventing the first automotive fuel additive, "Gastronic". These and several other products turned out to be big sellers, and Crosley was well on his way to becoming a wealthy man prior to his first brush with radio in 1921.

In response to pleas from his son, he went shopping for a wireless receiver. Shocked at the \$100+\$ price tags, he wound up buying a 25¢ book and \$30 worth of parts; and built his own! One of the first things he heard was KOKA in Pittsburgh. He was hooked!

Crosley was so intrigued with his \$30 radio that he took it to the crew at his auto accessory plant and had them duplicate it. He felt that if he could mass produce a reasonably priced receiver, thousands more people could be introduced to the new medium. He was right. The initial selling price for the first Crosley radio wes \$20, including earphones.

Now...why should people buy his radios? Crosley figured that he ought to begin transmitting programs to stimulate demand, and started 20 watt experimental station 8XAA in 1921 to do exactly that.

The idea clicked. Radios were selling like hotcakes. Crosley immediately began designing and manufacturing improved (but still moderately priced) receivers. At the same time he quickly expanded his broadcast facilities. Just a year later (1922) he was granted a commercial license and the call letters WLW. By 1928 the station had become one of a handful of 50,000 watt giants!

It didn't stop there. Crosley reasoned that people would enjoy radio in their cars as well as at home, and in 1930 he patented the "Roamio"...America's first battery powered car radio. Convinced that the more people his station could reach, the more radios he could sell; he lobbied for and was granted an experimental license permitting WLW to transmit with 500,000 watts. The super-power operation began in 1934 with President Franklin Roosevelt pressing a telegraph key in the White House to fire up the 500 kW monster. WLW was heard around the world...no other station was as powerful!

The dominance of WLW came under fire from the press and other broadcasters (all green with envy, I presume), and 5 years later, in 1939, the experimental high power grant was rescinded and the station was forced by the government to return to 50,000 watts.

No matter; the radios were still selling like crazy; and so were a lot of other Crosley products. There was the non-electric ammonia activated "ICY- BALL" refrigerator. The X-ER-VAC scalp massager (also touted as a hair grower). A FAX-type transmission system to deliver news to homes and businesses. An unsuccessful attempt at a 35mm camera. Several types of clocks. A bottle cooler. A pharmaceutical product called "Peptikai" (no word on what it was for). There was "Tredcote", a tire patching compound. A cross between a tricycle and a stroller called "Baby-Go-Bi-Bi". Or how about "Driklenit"...an auto polish? The tinkerer-turned-broadcaster was cranking out new products at an incredible rate...and marketing them on his radio station. He even bought the Cincinnati Reds in 1934 and, of course, broadcast their games on WLW. Profits went through the roof!

Strangely enough, the loss of the super-power status dampened Crosley's enthusiasm in radio; and in 1939 he decided to remove himself from day to day operations at WLW so that he would have more time to concentrate on his first love...cars. But this time, it was a specific car...one of his own design..the Crosley. His devotion to the Crosley line of mini-cars was all-consuming; so much so that in 1943 he sold WLW to business partner AVCO. He pursued the auto venture until 1952 when (after three years of million dollar per year losses) he sold the auto plant and went into semi-retirement. Powel Crosley, Jr. died in 1961 at age 75.

This fascinating man was a bit of a mystery. He married four times. Many described him as cold and hard, but others spoke of him as kind and gentle. He was a shrewd businessman and surrounded himself with competent associates. In a way he was a genius; in another sense an oddball. He had a reputation of being a frugal employer (the WLW staff roster was somewhat of a revolving door), and yet he would spend millions on ideas thought by many to be totally unrealistic. His entry into the broadcasting field was a quirk, and the business was never the apple of his eye. He had an insatiable thirst for power, and was thought by many to be an extreme sgotist. [I can't help but feel that this man was the Ted Turner of the early days of radio!]

AVCO, WLW's new owner, picked up where Crosley left off; and went on with innovation upon innovation in both technical and programming areas. The company first dabbled with television in 1939, and developed and sold two receivers under the Crosley name until the early 1960s. Serious involvement with television began in 1946 when WAXCT (experimental) was on the air for an hour a day. Operation expanded to 20 hours a week in 1947, and the company was granted a commercial license for WLWT channel 5 in 1948. That's where we'll pick up the story next month.

Readers' Reports and Stereo Happenings

W. R. McIntosh came through with the news I was waiting to hear-that KKLA 99.5 Los Angeles retains stereo! This is great news for DXers, since that red light will be blazing as KKLA helps fatten your logs. The station mainly has "one religious talk program after another," says Mc. "Problem is I can't stand listening to them." But later that evening, Mc reported: "Yes, they have music-a beautiful program of spirtuals tonight." While music may be endangered on 99.5, let's hope the species does not entirely disappear, so that the station has a reason for keeping that beautiful stereo light on people's receivers.

Steven West corrects on the nonIDs (misIDs?) of WMYJ 106.5 Pocomoke City MD and WKRE 107.5 Exmore VA. They're MY 106 and MY 107. "Maybe I heard it wrong but it sounded like Y106 and Y107. The narrow IFilters may have caused the mistake through distortion of the audio." [Filters that degrade the audio-horrors!] He said WIBF-FM 103.9 Jenkintown PA is being sold, and I just heard from Jarad Broadcasting

near NYC (WDRE) 92.7) that they are buying it subject to 92,100 FCC approval. This is causing all the eth-

panic and head for the SCS hills. If you're local area fansof WIBF-FM's ethnic programs, better get yourselves an SCS unit!

Mike Hawk reports that KIWR *89.7 Council Bluffs will continue to be a DX target through the end of the year. The college has granted them more time to get their financial act together, "In response, KIWR has had many fund raisers. . . Even their bumper stickers cost \$5 each! There was a good response from the public, so IWCC gave them an extra six months." Mike notes that KRGR Albert Lea MN has not yet moved to 94.9, still 95.3, but KNOD Harlan IA has migrated from 105.5 to 105.3 and added the exciting dimension of stereo to its emissions. "All of us on the 'Big O' Team (NRC DX '92) thank you for your mentions of the convention in your section in VUD. . . Even though there was a last minute change of sites from the Quad Cities to Omaha (the original host had to resign from hosting it), we hope for a good turnout. The half price airline tickets helped boost support."

A buyer of my "FM Atlas," Chris Cuomo, notes "a diminutive station on 90.5 KGNR (in quotes) with .1 watt at 30 meters in Englewood CO. Is this station licensed? My guess is that it is an unlicensed 'Part 15' station that assigned itself its own call (thus the quotes). . . I have a Ramsey FM-10 stereo .1 watt transmitter for 88.7 mz [in Verona PA] which I will use once I get some programming material in line. . . Is the experimental KA2XXZ Columbia FL still on the air? I have heard that KA2XXZ is off the air, incidentally." [Perhaps DXers in north FL can check to see if KA2XXZ is on or not l

Bill Cheek, Commtronics Engineering, sends a press release about an RS-232 interface to control scanners, such as the Radio Shack Pro-2006. If you can tolerate FM DXing on that unit (I can't!), then you might be able to benefit from his interface. It's a \$169.95 + \$5 shipping item, so you might want to write PO Box 262478, San Diego CA 92196-2478 for his fliers.

AL FM changes are the subject of a letter from Madison C. Brumbach, who mentions the new WLBI 98.7 Warrior AL, serving Jasper, and nearby WFFN 95.3, having been on 92.9, while many AM stations in his area are having financial troubles. "Some AM stations just ought to close up shop" because all they are doing is duplicating FM. "Some AMs are needed though because of news, but news can be transferred to FM or can be watched on TV anyway."

Douglas E. Smith says WNOX 99.1 Loudon and WJFC-FM 99.3 Jefferson City are parallelcasting in b (although M Street Journal says "m"), with billboards in Knoxville promoting as Double 99 FM with exact frequencies given. "I think this solves someone's unID of a month or two ago [in the VUD]." TN's WAYA 93.9 is the only secular "Way" station Doug's ever heard, and W291AA 106.1 Knoxville is on the air, as is a WXST 105.3 Loudon translator in Knoxville on 96.7.

Don L. Moody corrected an erroneous call letters listing for Little Rock that was in the VUD a couple months ago. "Whoevergave you the information on the 89.1 and 90.5 call letter change gave you the wrong information. I support both KUAR and KLRE. Each year both stations have a fund raising festival. . . I receive the KUAR and KLRE program guide. . . Nothing has been mentioned in any of the guides about any call letter changes. I listened to both stations [recently] and found the 89.1 frequency using the KUAR call letters and the 90.5 frequency using the KLRE call letters. . . I like the larger print listing of formats at the back of the book better than the ones on page 8." [The 13th edition had the larger print formats at the back. About KUAR-KLRE, I wonder if they jointly publish the same program guide?] Don goes on to mention two AR stations which are silent: KSNE 104.3 Marshall, its FM translators and AM affiliate are "no longer on the air. . . Marshall is a small, poor town in the Ozark Mountains of north AR, Population 1318." And KLRA-FM 96.5 (and AM) England is still off the air.

When I DXed WWIS-FM 99.7 Black River Falls WI earlier this summer, they wrote back and sent a copy of a letter Greg Coniglio sent them, reporting reception in Williamsville NY. It seems FM stations remember

Ken Onyschuk said WVVX 103.1 Highland Park IL "still dominates with ethnic format," and probably does its dominating because of being monophonic, and sticking out like a sore toe to DXers. Ken got the letter to me with a 2¢ stamp on it, marked "1st Class Mail, Ref. 1789 U.S.

Statutes at Large." Now, Ken, you shouldn't cheat the postal service like that!

Somebody sent a NY Times article July 5 on architecture-radio towers as art! It pictures several of them without identifying the broadcasters involved, as "upstart," "lioness," "triplets," "dream," and "lion."

FM filters' king Bill Nienajadly sent diagrams on how to install filters in parallel, "Bruce, I really think if you start producing Tim McVey's five filter IF amp board circuit (see Nov. 1990 VUD), you will get quite a bit of sales! You could produce boards for \$12 each and sell them for \$20 less filters. Give it a try." I'm not trying to look for ways to get more involved in getting money out of DXers, but I will save Bill's information for possible

for the convention has been changed to September. there is a good chance that I may be able to make it after all. . . The W4XA station was NOT a WLAC effort. but was owned by the National Life and Accident Insurance Co. (owner of WSM). Execs at the Insurance Company were concerned that WSM was not airing enough classical music and cultural programming; and the upshot was the shortwave transmitter which was on as being a translator for WBAB 102.3 Babylon NY.] the air for about five years. Regarding your reference to it as an 'Apex' station; I don't know. I had never heard that term before. W4XA (noncommercial and experimental) gave way to W47NV, the city's first (and I believe the region's first) commercial FM station late in 1941. Interestingly enough, the original transmitting antenna for W47NV remains mounted atop the WSM AM tower. That operation continued until 1950, and was discontinued at about the same time WSM-TV (4) began operation.

"The present WSM-FM (95.5) originally began operation as WLWM FM. The low-power facility was put on the air by Mr. Webber Parish, purchased by WSM in 1967 (simulcasting AM programming for about a year) and upgraded to 100 kw with separate programming in late 1968. Well, what was supposed to be a minor correction in ownership turned into a station profile. I know you're a stickler for accuracy, thus the correction plus the additional info." [I believe the calls for W47NV changed to WSM-FM by 1948. My Summer '49 "White's Radio Log" lists WSM-FM as being on 103.3-b.e.]

"Thanks for the recommendation of the Worldwide TV-FM DX Association that you made in FM Atlas," writes Paul Kohanski. "In the April Digest I noted a listing that WCPN's [Cleveland 90.3] subcarrier was silent. Since I had not checked it recently, and found it without a program one evening, I assumed that the service for the blind had ended due to the massive

budget cuts taking place in Ohio. I am happy to report, however, that the 67 kHz is fully active with programs for the blind. Recently I purchased a Recoton FM 200. It is amplified and also has a tunable stage that makes it a great indoor antenna. I have used it for tuning into 89.9 from Windsor, the CBClassical service [CBE-FM]. A Kent OH station on 89.7 was wiping out the Canadian station on most days. The tunable stage of the FM 200 enables me to detune most of the splatter from 89.7 and the gain stage then allows me to boost the Canadian. Reception is mostly mono on my Pioneer receiver, but I am thrilled with the results. I enjoy your column in the Digest."

KFAV 99.9 Warrenton MO is stereo, Walt Breville reports. It IDs at about :55 as "KFAV Warrenton, St. Charles, St. Peters," and does so "real quick and soft" enclosed clipping. Of course, they meant AM 650, but so DXers hardly notice it. "Warrenton is a rural town, population 3300, definitely beyond the St. Louis suburbs on I-70. St. Charles and St. Peters are in very fast-growing populated areas" just NW of St. Louis. Disregard the format change, below, for KATZ-FM 100.3 going all jazz. It is still sj, "all jazz, but of the soul variety, not big band." Also off the air: WXJO 95.5 Bethalto IL, while KSLH *91.5 is the only station Walt hears which lacks stereo. "It's more tj than tm, playing Stan Freeberg '50s novelty pop stuff as well as old big band jazz."

"W232AL Pomona NY, 94.3 translator owned/operated by WNEW-FM chief engineer Gerry Turro, is now spewing horribly distorted copies of WFDU and WNYU 89.1 on a 24 hour a day basis," reports Karl Zuk, "The carrier seems clean, but the modulation is way overdeviated and the stereo subcarriers are just filled with garbage-totally unlistenable!" [Do let me know if this is a "permanent" change in primaries for W232AL-I list it "Please don't give up your newsletter! You are irreplaceable-and a great void would remain if you left. Please reconsider!" Karl exhorts, "All the best,"

OTHER STUFF

Another call with Steve West, and comments he relays from Bill Nienajadly, indicate that the facilities given for WGTW-48 above are probably wrong, as the station is much weaker than the listed facilities would indicate. The above listings are the latest stuff I've got.

The WPBO-TV application is probably to cover for the new transmitter installed in June, as reported last month.

WHIQ-25's TL change is probably just correction of inaccurate coordinates: the description of their TL hasn't changed.

WZTV's change involves replacing an old transmitter with a new one with higher power.

The Meridian, MS new station application is mutually exclusive with existing WTZH-24 there.

I expect to see a lot more old CPs cancelled in the near future; as Bruce Elving and the National Radio Club have reported, the FCC has been cancelling dozens of unbuilt AM and FM CPs.

Frequent E-skip catch KKTO-2 has reportedly been sold to KGSW-14 in Albuquerque. My best guess is that KGSW-14 will go off & move its programming to channel 2; whether the KGSW calls will also be moved, I don't know.

In late July, the FCC prohibition on common ownership of cable systems and telephone companies was relaxed. Telephone companies are now allowed to transmit video as common carriers without having to obtain a municipal franchise. They will also be allowed to take up to 5% financial interest in the programming their systems carry.

Estimates are that NBC lost between \$50,000,000 and \$100,000,000 on the Olympics. Network executives claim the promotional boost for their regular schedule was worth it. The pay-per-view Triplecast appears to have been a flop, with the most optimistic estimates being 500,000 buyers, and the

least optimistic being well under 250,000. Triplecast operators had hoped to sell 2,000,000 subscriptions.

Semi-locally, QSI of Memphis claims to have been ready to demonstrate their system for simultaneous transmission of HDTV and NTSC on the same 6MHz channel. WREG-3, who was to carry the demo, denies involvement. Kinda makes one wonder if Elvis is involved...

An article in the August 10 issue of Broadcasting notes that the football games of the Buffalo Bills are carried on cable TV-- with permission for non-commercial WNEQ-23 to simulcast the games!

FORUM

Dave Sinclair, Vancouver BC:

Dave is still looking for comparative info about Channel Master & Winegard antennas: write him at 6565 Brooks St., Vancouver V5S 3J6.

He reports hearing over KTBW-20 that TBNs K60DS Rochester, MN and K57?? (can't find it in my database) Atwater, CA are now on.

Dave also reports that, to the best of his knowledge, KSKN-22 is still off.

Finally, he passes along some clippings about TBN's attempt to get started in Canada.

In the May 10-June 6 Christian Info News, it's reported that two Alberta TBN relay operators have filed suit in Edmonton, challenging Canada's 63-year-old policy of not licensing religious broadcasters. Russell Pearson charges that this policy "... violates the Religious Freedom provision of the Charter (of Rights and Freedoms) and the essence of the Constitution.'

A January CRTC hearing in Edmonton turned out 800 citizens in support of the Canadian TBNs.

Another article, from the May 27 Vancouver Province, notes that the Royal Canadian Mounted Police shut down unlicensed TBNs in Winnipeg, Saskatoon, Medicine Hat, and Three Hills, Alberta. Several other unlicensed TBNs have been ordered to shut down & complied voluntarily. All these stations have been operating on UHF. (which means, if you log a TBN from an unlikely direction, don't rule out Canada as its location!)

Mystery Contributor, Columbus, OH: (Dave Moody?)

Someone from Columbus sent copies of the WPBO-42 program and transmitter log forms, and the transmitter meter readings form, along with a WPBO-42 coverage map (forwarded to HQ for possible use as a VUD cover) and a clipping from the July 15 Columbus Dispatch.

The latter clipping mentions a lightning strike on the tower of WOSU-34 and WTTE-28. The tower was hit about 1:30am on Monday, July 13. "Both stations limped along on low wattage for a while Monday. Then transmission was stopped so repairs could begin." It's unsafe for tower workers to climb past an operating antenna; more thunderstorms also posed an unacceptable risk to further work.

WTTE-28 expected to be back on the air on the night of the 15th, with WOSU hoping to be back sooner, on the 14th. Microwave and fiber optic gear borrowed from WCMH-4 and others permitted both stations to reach cable subscribers in the area during the tower work.

Steve West, metro Philadelphia:

Steve called the evening of Aug. 12 to report WGTW-48 back on with a test pattern. (thanks!) After calling Steve back on the 12th, he reports what appears to be their regular schedule, with something called the "American Entertainment Network", from Denver, with "Channel America-type programming, mostly old black & white Westerns, etc.. Their slogan is "Good Television to Watch"...

He's also seen an unID LPTV on 24, with the All News Channel. I'm passing along to Matt Sittel -don't have any real solution for him here! Is it possible that WPAJ-24 Danville, VA is on?

John Combs, Orlando FL:

Sorry John; I managed to misplace the item you sent regarding an LPTV going dark...

Nothing exciting here on TV, just a few unID FM bursts in the Perseids. (though there was a new tropo logging on the tape!) But fall-like weather is descending on the South; looks like tropo season!

NOTE 2 (06 June 1959): This new translator had terrible audio, and much weather than the 90.5 (same site). It was only on for a few days, and now has been gone for over a month NOTE 3 (07 June 0000): I finished spending 2 days sorting a reconciling my DX totals with the new FM ATlas, something I've needed to do for a couple of years. I wasn't satisfied until my log "physical count", my Atlas "count" (both map & frequency) all tied out EXACTLY. Oh to have this in a computer! Finally, everything added up to 1,849. Other specifics sent to Fred Nordquist. Thankfully, I did it when I did! The incredible blitz of DX June 8 to 19 would have made the initial project that much more intimidating, and more difficult NOTE 4 (10 June 1900): I had to log something here-I feel confident that I chose the exact translator I was hearing, though there are 4 possibilities. KBUT 90.3 was not heard, so I doubt K202AR Crested Butte; KKXK 94.1 was in but all Grand Junction were gone so I doubt K202BI Parachute or K202BJ Rifle which are even farther north than KKXK. K202AQ is near Montrose and has a fairly clear horizon (i.e a lake) in my directon. NOTE 5 (10 June 1908): Weather for Wasatch Front, Salt Lake City temp, into All Things Considered. This was not KBQA SLC because g stations do not carry ATC, instead this is KUER 90.1. As in note 4, there are four choices for KUER tlators, and I had to log something. Orangeville more a "guess" than Note 4; it was merely the cloest to the Es action (still more than 100 miles away), but near the near total lack of "regular" FMs in eastern Utah makes pinpointing more difficult. I should make some observations here (next page-gc)

FRANK MERRILL'S REPORT continues

A. This shows how, under rare circumstances, the conscientious DXer can make mistakes. If the station had faded out after the SLC temperature and before Corporate (?) Things Considered (hi), I would have probably logged it as KBQA! I don't believe I've logged any such red herrings, though. I remember an even stranger example in 1981 in Ohio, during simultaneous Tr and Es, when I was getting KDCR 88.5 IA announcing a program produced by "KTEP in El Paso" and the Es opening was to El Paso!, but the MUF was on and off FM. [can't remember if I actually heard KTEP on that date or not, also on 88.5!

B. Now that I've logged KPRNt and KUERt on 88.3, I will not be able to log any of their other 88.3's (such as the Rifle KRPNt) unless I hear two distinct signals fighting. Audios could indeed differ during such an Es opening, as one site could be getting skip interference, etc. This does get interesting, indeed.

NOTE 6 (13 June 2100): I actuall did not want to log this on Es, but there it was. I was nearly tempted to "toss it back in". Why? Cause I've considered this to be my most likely VA tropo catch, and when I get a new Tr state it's niceif the station is a new logging, to, not just a new mode. Now it is likely WVTF 89.1 Roanoke. I am unlikely to have such a luxury with Tr to new states such as FL or CO, since I have logged most of the closer higher powered stations

NOTE 7 (14 June 1430): No ID heard, merely talk about Faust and Wagner. Verified by phone call (SD was carrying this, but so was local WIUM 91.3). There are no other NPR stations on 97.1 (WLIC-MD is g) and this area was strongly in; I would have never counted this if it was on say 91.1

NOTE 8 (16 June 0922): Very strange propagation! I had assumed this as Es backscatter (though it was still thre at 1038), it was very weak and extremely fady, like turbulent Es reception. Afer the big "blowout" (starting on UHF 6/16) to 6/19 (both Tr and Es stuff), this reception was immediately totally forgotten until right now, as I post DX data to my log. Since then I've become aware of similar unusual reception by Mike Hawk in Omaha, and explained to him that I think he was having "his end" of the Tr duct tossed asunder by the turbulent weather occurring in that area. I can't really figure why my only sign of this was KGLS, except perhaps for the fact that the stations are so very sparse in that area. I am now calling this tropo.

NOTE 9 (17 June 0246): This is my undisputed personal Tr distance record. Formerly I had 3 personal Tr distance records, all clustered around 830-840 miles (one here, in Toledo, and Milan, Mich), and I never felt I knew my true record. Since this station is a "San Antonio" station, they cannot have their transmitter far enough NE of these to leave this in dispute. It also "couldn't happen on a nice freq.". ANYTHING besides WYLL-IL (a weak station itself) is either Es or "heavy duty" Tr reception

NOTE 10 (17 June 1642 & 1653): These 2 were heard on the car radio, on opposite sides of Monmouth, IL. I am 30 miles from there. I am still counting these, because their probable signals persisted (in and out) as I approached my 25 mile contour, and because both freqs are toally open in Macomb

NOTE 11 (19 June 0330): I believe this is the "deepest" into the middle of the night FM Es that I have ever experienced! I now need only the 0400's and 0500's to finish off my FM "skip clock"

NOTE 12 (29 June 0303): This, my 18th Tr on 106.7 (only 95.9 and 104.9 with 20 each, have more) gives me a total of 9,059 Tropo miles on 106.7 Has anybody else ever had this many Tr miles on one FM frequency? WKJR Sullivan, IL is still on 106.3; as far as I'm concerned they can take forever to move to 106.7!

What a strange season! Apparently, it "crashed and burned" just as summer officially arrived. This reminds me of the 1984 season, except that in 1984 I MISSED all the late May/early June ES because I was travelling to Newfoundland (great place!) That year there was also a lot of Es before late June and little after. The 1 May Tr was my first significant FMtropo logging in almost a year! There was that little Nebraskta TV last August, but that was rather lame. Then there was January's WSTZ 106.7 MS (NO other apparent FM Tr), heard only due to the clear frequency. If the pace had kept up, 1992 would be my best DX season by far, but there's still time for good Es openings, and even more time for good Tr. Why has there been so much Tr to Texas? That's not supposed to happen the time of year! Texas Tr, I associate more with Sept. thru January. (We have been getting winter type weather in the northeast (fast moving low pressure tracks) maybe that is part of it-gc). Before 1992 I'm not sure I've ever had long haul Tr in a more south than west direction outside of the cooling off months. Tr to Oklahoma/Kansas seems to normally happen once every August in a massive opening. DXers plagued by locals and semi-locals (yeah, like there are some that aren't!) should note that my "low antenna" allows me to often get ES through stations 30-40 miles away, which is often difficult on the high antenna. I'm not convinced that this system seriously surpasses the "Bolin phasing system", though, and in fact the phasing is probably superior to my arrangement. I am certain it's better for getting Tr past locals, as Bill Nienajadly and Ralph Strobel have proven. So, I hope to get a Bolin box before the year is out, and I'll finally be able to explore the true scientific limits of Macomb FM DX. But a point has been made here: if you cannot put up a tall FM antenna, ort the 2 required for phasing, or if you must "hide" the antennas in the backyard, the resulting low antenna may give ashtonishing Es results. Totals now 1,963 from 47 states (need CA!, which has the most FM's of any state) I have 17 "duplications" (more than one type of propagation) 73

It's been quite a long time since I last reported to this column. I've been somewhat lax about keeping my log up to date but, hopefully, I will find more time to do so now. 1992 has, so far, been quite a productive year for DX here. FM skip has been good. Was in well past midnight on one occasion. Add to that another nice tropo opening into the deep south. On the down side, however, six new semi-locals have come on the air since the first of this year, with more on the way. Oh well, I suppose I shouldn't complain. For the past couple years I've been using a Phillips model 673 FM tuner. This is a tuner from the late 1970's, which I later modifired with the McVey IF amplifier board (see November 1990 VUD). Earlier this year, I purchases a new Onkyo T-9090II. Both tuners are connected, thru a good quality antenna switch, to a Channel Master FM antenna at 45' AGL. I have not tried to fo any modifications to the Onkyo because it is under warranty. My impressions of the two are as follows: The Philips seems to have a yery slight edge in sensitivity. Although weak signals can be heard with either tuner the audio is a little more intelligible on the Philipa. This is with very weak troposcatter. The Onkyo, in the super narrow IF mode, may have a slight edge in selectivity. Although the Philips is an analog tuner and can be tuned slightly off frequency for better adjacent channel reception. So it's really a close call. The Onkyo tunes in discrete 25khz steps, and one step up or down seems to be a little too far off center of channel to get really usable audio from extremely weak stations. On the other end of the scale, the Onkyo doesn't overload as badly as the Philips with very strong signals. And for critical listening the Onkyo has much better audio, especially in the wide IF mode. I can't tell any difference between the two as far as capture effect. My main complaint about the Onkyo is that it takes too much time to step up or down thru the frequencies. For example, to get from 101.1 to 101.3 one must tune thru eight different steps. Of course, tuning accuract is far better than one could get with an analog tuner. In summary I would say both the T9090II and the modified Philips are good DX machines, but I find myself reaching for the Philips a little more frequently during a hot DX opening. So far I haven't tried any kind of antenna phasing system here, mainly because I haven't room to put up another FM antenna. However, I have seen what phasing can do, and am very impressed with the system that Raiph Strobel had installed at his location in Muncie, IN. Hopefully I will find a way to get something going here. FM total is 1291. 73s, Bob



E-skip continued very poor during all of July. Even on 10 meters (28 MHz), it rarely opened during the first weeks of July. The quad is about 6' lower than the former setup. I probably need to raise this array to at least 30' before it will operate efficiently. However, it does a better job on nulling high powered stations (100,00 watts @50 miles when the array is pointed directly at them. For example, I can null WCVE on 88.9 and get WEAA in Baltimore whose power is 12,500 at 67 meters at a distance of 180 miles. I constructed an FM-13 from some 20 year old scrap antenna parts. Surprisingly, this FM-13 is more directive than your regular FM-13 In fact, the F/B ratio is significantly higher, and this antenna will run circles around a normal FM-13. However, some of the elements are a little crooked and the directors are a tad longer and shorter. But it works to perfection! 73's and good DXing and phasing.

I have noticed when tuning in the narrow FM mode, you can hear the Tv station SAP channel audio. For example WMPT-TV 22 Annapolis, MD audio on 523.76 Mnz., the SAP audio is heard on 523.84 Mnz., mixed with regular audio. back home I still don't have the dish back up since last year 7-6-91 when a thunderstorm took it down. but Im getting close to putting them back up. I got the VHF up with my VHF Ham beams, & the dish is next.

Well thats all for this time, i did get the VHF-TV antenna up with my VHF Ham antennas. I got a limited channel UHF-TV antenna up with the PA-4975 amp, the antenna is what I think is an cable TV grade type limited channel tuned to ch. 54, but works OK from ch 43 to 63. I got that in the middle of the VHF -TV antenna & the 440 mhz hambeam. So, its going something till I get the dish till I get the dish back up. Last year my two tripods were damaged bad from a thunderstorm. i just got the the Channel Master 5 foot tripod up for the Ham stuff, and had room for the TV. Now my mother says this fall, we are going to have the roof re-shingled, and have to take them down then. So, the bigger tripod, Create Design 6 foot tripod will hold the 6 foot dish and 10 meter beam. The Tv skip has been little, but I really miss my UHF DX . I hope to report some more TV DX soon. I'm going now (to) Ocean City MD for vacation next week, and in two weeks more, going to Pittsburgh, PA! 73's till then. Regarding your questions in the July ETVDX, I.F filter mods for TV: Most inexpensive TV's don't have the "mono lithic" filters used in AMVFM radios, they use instead, L-C tuned circuits, as they were used in radio for years and these can't be easily replaced, though they can be retuned with the help of test gear. Newer and more expensive TV's often do have replaceable filters, but since there's no application for narrowband TV filters, they aren't commonly available, they are available for for TV sound, cellular phones, & foreign broadcast. For adding video modulators to scanners: You need to demodulate the video first. the front end RF amp, mixer, and synthesized local oscillator from the scanner are indeed useable, from that point, you'll need to provide your own IF amp & AM detector. (The scanner's Am detector, if it has one, won't work, because the IF filters are WAY too narrow) Or you could provide another local oscillator & mixer, & convert the scanner's mixer's IF output up to a TV channel. As for defeating muting: Yes, I see no reason it could'nt be defeated the same way as with radio. Do be careful, there's a lot more higher voltages floating around a TV set then a radio. Defeating AFC/AFT: TV's & VCR's already have a switch that is activated when you open the door over the tuning controls. In digital TV's/VCR's, the frequency is set by the "reference crystal" : you don't want to diddle with that. Take my word for it! And adding channels with jumpers: Probably not. The more channels a cable ready set covers, the higher it has to go in frequency. For example, my VCR, which covers only through ch 36, goes up to about 300 Mhz. Expanding that range to 400 Mhz adds about 16 channels, up to 52 or so. It costs money to expand that range: UHF transistors/circuits aren't all that cheap. Channels aren't missing becase governments don't want you watching certain things --- they're missing because adding them would raise the price. (Thank for the info & answers, Im sure this was of benefit to TV DXers-me too! Again thank-BN)

Due to the odd weather, this season has produced a lot of small short lived openings not always when you expect them. It is odd to look at the paper ans see on some days that Yellowknife is doing better (and not just cool days either). At the start of the 6/14 opening, the tropos would be strong towards the east & North East then switch to the West & SW ten minutes later and switch back again after that. My unid ch 30 from 12/10 appears to be WXMT 30. I got a letter from Tom Bryant the same day the VUD with the last CCI column arrival. They agreed. There was a 17+ with it, which fits Nashville- but not enough details to count it. my second close call with WZTV. WXMT is a relog. W39BC, Buffalo NY is on with a religious net called 'Family Net'. this station speaks volumes about FCC engineering standards. most of the time, they are out of sync. When they are in sync, there are usually one or two kinds of CCI-like patterns on the screen. I've seen skip thats more watchable. Haven't heard a code ID, either ** (Editors' comments- Personally, I see at least 2 major FCC rules being broken, the FCC has been cracking down with very high fines for such serious violations -fines as high as \$10,000 per violation are being levied. It is up to us,-we DXers to report these violations to the FCC. Maybe sending a video tape of the stations not adhering to FCC rules and not properly ID-ing to a FCC field office-for evidence: would ensure that these stations comply to the FCC rules or face high fines. As long as these "LPTV's" with no real entertainment value clog up the TV dial with useless programs and then go to create interference and fail to ID, then maybe we should in fact report these to the FCC. If they can't meet broadcast standards....they should go off the air until they do! This comment was the ETVDX editors' & and not of the reporter or the WTFDA-BN)** I noticed Bruce Hall's remarks about skip on U.S. Memorial Day There have been trops opening on U.S. Thanksgiving. I would say that June and July have been faily good for Es, considering the limited time I have to pursue DX'ing. This is my second skip season, thus many stations are new loggings. From my perspective it has been ten times better than '91.0n July 28 I logged my shortest skip ever, via VCR taping, off the back of the antennal It pays to set your VCR on a lowband channel while at work. The short tropo on July 27 was unspectacular, but brought some freakish signal strenghths.WEMT-43/WLYH 15,85 miles, were over 40db on the Icom's meter, outperforming the Baltimore U's.I even had a picture image of 43 on 38, unusual for a station that distance(At least for Me)

My recently resurrected PA4975 died again, this time for good apparently. I'm using a CP4800 as a backup and it works well, but overloads more than the the 4975. Michael Parks directed me to Ford Electronics, who still have a few PA-4975's left, but am also considering the RDX amp.

Jeff Kruszka also wrote that he said there should be a VJN (Video Juke Box Network) channel guide printed in the VUD like CHA and TBN channel guide/station listings were published in the VUD some time ago. There are no changes for narrative reports, except try to keep everything in order, In narrative you CAN use "Scranton 16,22,28,38,56-etc, Not on column format. If I get anymore reports where the time of your DX catches where not in successive order and even some dates (!) of the catches were not in order. If I get anymore reports with catches listed like 2120,2114,2117 2112-etc, your report will be returned to you to be corrected. 98% of you have been following these guidelines already, and I thank you. Note # 1 - 0447, 01 May - This one was "down in the mud" (weak floater with WIFR-23) with other D-FWs nearly or totally snow free, yet John Combs' mileage printout shows this Dallas suburb station as 85 miles (!) closer than the Cedar Hill antenna farm. Where is their tower? (3720 Marquis Dr in Garland - about 620 miles from your house. fm).

Note # 2 - 0540, 10 May - Satellite feed ruined by microwave tropo ducting CCI.

Note # 3 - 1029, 05 June - I noticed that their ID slide co-IDs with the new channel 2 in Jackson, Wyoming, so when I get this again (VERY rarely) I'll certainly be checking channel 2 for parallels on any local stuff.

Note # 4 - 0159, 08 June - Call 346-TIPS for "News Center 6" news tips. Not WCSH-6, Maine, (I tried) so unlikely needed, but would still be nice to know. (WRGB-6 has a 346 prefix. fm)

Note # 5 - 0205, 11 June - Heavy "translator-type CCI" against WWTO-35 It may have briefly been on top. If so, they're also TBN, but I couldn't really tell if WWTO ever yielded. Is this or somebody else in Iowa here now? (K35CF was licensed 06/19/92. fm)

Note # 6 - 0700, 12 June - Super-enhanced 300 mile tropo all directions except

northwest.

Note # 7 - 1700, 14 June - This station does not appear in the WTFDA Data Base, but I later noticed it was on the John Combs mileage printout. I called CBC-Winnipeg 15 June to find out what I had, and they said their only SRC net on channel 5 was this 72 Watt outlet. Has this station ever been DX'ed before? This is my lowest power E skip logging though I surely had a brief Idaho(?) channel 3 translator several years ago around 0300 or 0400. Seven new E skips in one day is "unknown" for me, nowadays. Five new channel 5s in 44 hours made me feel like I'd just started a new log! The period June 12th to June 18th is probably the "most interesting" seven day period I've ever DX'ed, though the "best" would still be the massive tropo opening around Thanksgiving 1986.

Note # 8 - 2232, 15 June - Spanish newscast causing "bizarre CCI" to KTVI-2, with "Cadena de la..." in the lower left. Veracruz? Double hop E skip? WBRZ-2, Louisiana, conspicuously absent. I don't recall ever seeing this

CCI before.

Note # 9 - 0647, 16 June - This is my closest E skip ever logged, giving Miami ("My-am-uh") and Ponca City temperatures. Former closest was KSNC-2, Kansas, 455 miles.

Note #10 - 1605, 1636 16 June - Where are these Cubans, anyway? I've never seen a trace of these on the rare occasions I've had 3-5-6 Cubans and today there was no trace of those others.

Note #11 - 0000, 17 June - Channel 34-. Both nearby TBNs are channel 34+. No aural

ID. "In and out most of the night."

Note #12 - 0019, 17 June - This is strange! Audio was 23+ and carried Univision or programs that are carried by that network. Jeff Kadet wrote to Glenn Hauser who ID'ed the tape and said that KUVN, Garland, Texas carries Univision. This all sounds fine and dandy, except that KUVN is 23z! So what was this? Perhaps a wrong offset in the Data Base for KVEO or something.

Note #13 - 0530, 17 June - This one ran an ad for "KBSC" Radio which I do not have a listing of. It could have been KRRT-35, Texas, but I doubt it - the other Texans had faded by now. Perhaps a translator in Arkansas?

Note #14 - 2201, 20 June/1759, 23 June - One phone call to CIPA-TV (not listed in the Data Base and I forgot to ask what channel they're on) (Channel 9. fm) solved both of these, sort of. On June 20th, I had "CKBI" programming on channel 2. This is a 3 kW transmitter at Spiritwood. My "CIPA-TV" on channel 2 was the Melfort (Star City) transmitter, which is still CKBQ. Apparently the one company owns both CKBI (CBC) and CIPA (CTV). I'm wondering whether this information is correct? My June 20th reception was 2+ offset which is correct for (listed) CKBQ and my June 23th reception was 2- offset which is wrong for them. Also, the Melfort calls "CKBQ" mimic CKBI a lot more than they mimic CIPA. CIPA is, by the way, in Prince Albert, which explains the many Prince Albert mentions seen June 23rd during community notes show. I also wonder whether CIPA had these two "reversed" because, just after "CIPA", I had CKSA. Spiritwood is only about 100 miles east of LLoydminster! It appears that the CRTC is doing the same thing with farly-low power VHFs ("short spacing" them) as the FCC is doing on UHF with translators (such as W24AI Michigan City, Indiana, "short spaced" to WCGV-24, Milwaukee).

Note #15 - 1838, 1901, 04 July - XEX (which carries XHGC) ID'ed by recognizable CCI and the channel 5 parallel. At 1901, a true XHGC ID was seen on channel 5. When I've had XHAJ they always had an XHAJ/XEX ID slide during XHGCs local ad/ID breaks - I have never seen an "XHGC" ID on XHAJ/XEX, until now. Does this mean that I truly had XHGC? To confuse matters all the more, the sky quide in Satellite Orbit Magazine shows transponder 10 of Morelos 1 as belonging to "XHGC/XHAJ. Does anybody know what's going on here?

Note #16 - 0549, 16 July - The "Quebec" test pattern had channel 3+ audio, suggesting CBFT2, but isn't that test pattern supposed to say "Montreal"? I always thought the "Quebec" on channel 3 was CBVT2, but CBFT2 is the only channel 3 + shown in Quebec. More mysterious is the "Ottawa" printed in huge white letters. I couldn't determine its offset. I show a CKRN3-3 in Bearn/Fabre which picks up CKRN, but where does CKRN get its signal from? CBOFT-9, Ottawa? "Ottawa" and a clock are language neutral, so it could have been either a French or an English station.

This has definitely been a strange DX season! There's been recent E skip, but very rarely into FM at all - and no tropo in about a month. The season seems to have crashed and burned as soon as summer officially arrived. I'm surprised, too, by the unusual amount of Canadian E skip this year - and most of the tropo has gone into the "wrong" direction! Before this year, I'm not sure if I've ever had significant "long-haul" more south than west tropo DX (Texas from here: Mississippi, Arkansas, Memphis, southern Missouri, eastern Texas from Ohio) at this time of year, and there's been three of them since April! Jeff tells me I missed some Austin, Texas, while in Indiana. Usually, I expect these in September through January. I've seen some of the typical summer/late spring tropo openings (Ohio, Wisconsin, Minnesota), but none of the most common long-haul summer stuff (CITY-57, WPGH-53, WSBN-47) has shown up yet. So, tropo and E skip (with all the Canadians) are both bizarre this year - why? I'm also surprised how often I see "foothills" E skip from less than 800 miles, such as KOAA-5 (755) seen here 5-10 times since starting my log; similar distances to the east like Washington DC channels 4 and 5 (726) and WFIL-6 (810) are among stations NEVER seen here via E skip! Fortunately, both DCs once came in on a super meteor burst. Even more surprising, I've seen KXAS-5 (646) via E skip three or four times. I've seen Ralph Strobel get Des Moines E skip on FM (300 something), Danny Buntin get FMs in the 300s, etc. Is there something about the Great Plains which encourages short-hop E skip. I never see, for example, New Jersey DXers getting Charlotte or Detroit via E skip. It's probably good (for me) that the season just-up-and-walked-out in June; I already had so much to post, and to report, that the project was awesome and intimidating, and almost became impossible. 73

THE STRANGEST SUMMER IN E-SKIP HISTORY ERINGS NO DX AND RECORD DX AT THE SAME TIME! Summer of 1992 will be remembered among VHF DXing enthusiasts as one that featured long quiet periods between openings in North America. It did not behave anything like an E-skip season usually can be expected to. Summer weather was bizzaro, too, with Mount Pinatubo's eruption getting most of the blame for cold weather in the East and Midwest. What isn't readily apparent though, is the reason for the way that atmospheric jetstreams behaved this season. The Pacific Northwest literally FRIED under unusually high temperatures, and rain fell in record amounts in the Chio Valley. Pinatubo takes the rap for short term cooling, but how do you explain the weird jetstream activity? That's what ionospheric researchers are asking themselves right now, because E-skip patterns vary from summer to summer in a way that often parallels jetsream variations.

But what happened this June seems to be incredible. European DX publications and amateur radio VHF circles are astounded by reports of incredible multi-hop E-skip, reaching 108 MHz and higher, straight across the Atlantic for hours on June 22, and possibly briefly (and much weaker) on July 19th. By far, the session that everyone is talking about was the June 22nd super opening. It may go down in the record books along with the "all time greatest" sporadio-E events.

Two things are worth noting when pondering all this. First of all, these transAtlantic E-skip sessions did take place on days which were notable for having little or no skip on the "usual" paths, as DXer Larry Curcio points out his July V.U.D. article. Secondly, as has been noted many times by DXpeditioners, a location on or near the Atlantic coast of North America was of paramount importance. Although, some of this skip did reach as far west as central New York and Ontario/Quebec on 50 MMz.

If any WIFDAers were in on any of the transAtlantic E-skip—which will long be remembered as the high point of an otherwise very poor E-skip season—please, TELL US ABOUT IT! If you saw or heard anything out of the ordinary, please report it. This activity may go down into the record books with the all-time "greats," such as the October, 1970 "world E-skip opening" cited by the late Mel Wilson in his landmark E-skip research.
