
FINAL CONVENTION UPDATE

OTHER STUFF

The Canadian information above is from a few issues of *Broadcast Technology*, Canada's answer to *Broadcasting & Cable*. It's 2-3

months old, so some of the stations listed may already be on the air-or may have already been deleted. Unfortunately I don't expect to get regular information from this source.

The MITV applications are for rebroadcasters (Canadian for "satellites") of CIHF-8 Halifax. Channel 7 in Moncton would take over the facilities of CHMT-7 there; CHMT would move to channel 27 (hence the channel 27 application for NB Broadcasting Co.); and to fill the coverage gap from CHMT moving to UHF, CHMT would add a broadcaster in Buctouche. The CBC (with which CHMT-7 is affiliated) is opposed to the plan.

In Wheatley, Ontario, the new station will be a semi-satellite of CFPL-10 London, although it will also originate some of its own programming. The channel 16 assignment is a rumor from Saul Chernos via Greg Coniglic; a clipping Greg sent from the Toronto Star says the calls will be CHWI. FCC's database says channel 16 is assigned to Chatham, which is close enough to Wheatley.

Wheatley is 12km E of Leamington on Hwy. 3, between Windsor and Chatham - and very close to the site of Global's CIII-TV-22. CHWI will probably use the same tower.

London's channel 69 is to be a rebroadcaster of CFMT-47 Toronto.

FCC engineers have developed a plan to change the way "T-band" (470-512mHz, shared with TV channels 14-20) land mobile spectrum is used, and reduce the power allowed for land mobile stations in this band. The move may allow the Commission to open up new TV allocations in these channels.

Startup of must-carry regulations on June 2 appears to have gone smoothly in most cases. Broadcasting & Cable interviewed representatives of several cable systems, most of whom either didn't have to drop any cable signals to accommodate must-carry stations, or only dropped one. The most complicated situation cited was in Orange Co., California, where a 38channel cable system was required to drop The Movie Channel and a pay-per-view service and switch several other cable networks to part-time occupancy, in order to

accommodate 4 new broadcast signals.

However, in parts of the San Francisco area, must-carry has become a moot point. A U.S. judge has issued a temporary restraining order preventing enforcement of the regulations against several Viacom systems in the area.

Most cable systems are continuing to say they'll refuse to pay stations for retransmission consent, and many large stations are saying they'll insist on being paid. In some cases, however, compromises have been reached.

One Missouri station has proposed that, in return for payment, they'd give their local system permission for carriage and roughly fifteen free commercials a week, which the cable system could use to advertise their service.

Another, undisclosed, station is reportedly negotiating to accept, rather than a cash payment, a second channel on the cable system. Fox (on behalf both of its owned-and-operated stations, and its affiliates) has already reached a similar agreement with major cable firm TCI.

There is now only one HDTV system. The three groups competing for selection as the U.S. standard have agreed to work together to develop one system. While most of the technical specifications are still somewhat up in the air, the real advantage of this move is the years of litigation that will probably be avoided.

In Valdosta & St. Louis, the listings reflect LPTVs moving to new channels; in Alexandria, K47DW switched primaries from KADN-15 to its satellite WNTZ-48.

FORUM

Saul Chernos, Orillia (?) ON, via Greg Coniglio, Williamsville NY:

Besides the info on new CHWI-16 above, Saul sent Greg an item from the *Globe & Mail* regarding a dispute between CKCO-13 and Baton Broadcasting over Toronto Blue Jay baseball games.

Baton, owner of Blue Jays flagship station CFTO-9, as well as the new owner of CFPL-10 London and CKNX-8 Wingham (and incidentally, also owner of new CHWI-16), dropped Electrohome's CKCO Kitchener from the Blue Jays network, citing overlapping coverage with Baton's own CFPL. However, Baton doesn't have any affiliates in the area north of Barrie; this area had been served by CKCO's channel 11 rebroadcaster in Huntsville.

CKCO offered to carry the Jays games on the Huntsville rebroadcaster only, in return for some commercial time, but was refused.

Fred McCormack, St. Paul MN:

"I don't know if the KNRR-12 Pembina situation has been resolved yet in your column. I was recently out in North Dakota and while I did not get near Pembina to check its signal, I noted that KNRR is listed in TV Guide and on the ID slide of KVRR-15 Fargo."

Regarding Lorianne Crook-Owens' LPTV problems in Branson, Mo. as reported in May, Fred's more complete LPTV records list K05JQ and K17DL there as being licensed to Ms. Crook-Owens.

"I was interested in your comments on programming of second PBS stations. I wonder if any others are programming like local KTCI-17, which carries aviation (radar) weather Sat-Sun 0530-2400 and Mon-Fri 0530-1700? This programming should certainly make KTCI stand out in a tropo opening."

It sure should! I know of no other station doing that, but several Midwestern PBS stations carry the 162.x NWS weather radio on their SAP second audio program channel, a practice that should make it easier to ID those stations. In East Tennessee, WKPT-19 carries their AM radio station on the SAP; this is also of considerable help in IDing this station.

Keith Smith, St. Ann MO:

Going back to the KNRR-CHMI interference situation, Keith writes: "Technically, there is nothing wrong with this allocation. CHMI is about 80 miles straight distance from KNRR, more than the mandated distance between two channels." True. Tom Bryant later told me the channel 13 allocation has existed in the Winnipeg area since before KNRR came on the air.

"Frankly, I don't understand why Red River Broadcasting needs four Fox affiliates in a market like Fargo/Grand Forks - there are only two each of ABC & PBS, and only one each of NBC & CBS." I can't read the minds of Red River management, but I suspect the reason is that the open channels available to them wouldn't provide adequate coverage of North Dakota's cities.

KNRR-12 is obviously an attempt to cover Winnipeg, as Pembina (population 642) is the largest U.S. community in the station's Grade A contour! KVRR-15 was a "4-letter LPTV"-- at the 22kW ERP with which it went on the air. it covered Fargo & Moorhead, but nothing else, and even as a fullpower station, its Tansem, Minn. tower site doesn't cover Grand Forks: thus, KBRR-10, which does cover that city. (and also has a very appropriate callsign for a station in northern Minnesota!) Finally, KJRR-7 fills in the gap in the Jamestown/Valley City area. Fargo's other commercial stations (KXJB-4, WDAY-6, KTHI-11) all have towers west or northwest of the city, thus providing at least some coverage both of Grand Forks and Jamestown/Valley City.

"Why are we who aren't borderarea U.S. citizens not allowed to see programmes on CBC, CTV,... and other Canadian services on our cable systems, while Canadian cable subscribers can see ABC, CBS, NBC, and PBS beamed in from Detroit? Either our cable systems, the CRTC,

or the Canadian networks are at fault..."

I see two reasons. First, cable systems are limited in the number of channels they can carry; each added channel increases the cost of the booster amplifiers & other equipment used to distribute the signals. While there are some interesting programs on Canadian TV, (and indeed, I'd probably subscribe to cable if I could get the CBC) they don't appeal to most Americans. It would be interesting to know, for example, how CBLT-5 Toronto does in the Buffalo and Rochester ratings.

Second, Canadian networks carry a lot of U.S. programming. Much of this programming is covered by "syndicated exclusivity", a regulation that requires cable systems to blank out programs on distant stations if a local station carries the same program. A U.S. cable system carrying CTV or a Canadian independent would likely be carrying a blank channel much of the time!

Tom Bryant, Nashville TN:

Tom has worked in radio in the Winnipeg market, and still has contacts up there, so I passed him a copy of Keith's letter & asked for comments. Referring to why Canadians get U.S. networks, but we don't get theirs, Tom writes:
"It's unlikely that many people in this country (USA) are the least bit interested in Canadian originations, much less full-time availability of CBC, CTV, or any other programmers north of the horder."

As for CHMI-13 preventing carriage of KNRR-12 on Winnipeg's cable system: "It's simply a matter of politics...if Winnipeg cable operators REALLY wanted KNRR on their systems (one of which is owned by CKY-TV 7) I'm pretty sure they'd find [or make] a way to do it."

Like most other cable systems in Canada, Winnipeg's systems receive most U.S. programming from Detroit via satellite. (however, WDAZ-8 and KGFE-2 from North Dakota are carried) Tom says it's rumored that the systems have asked for permission to replace all the Detroit signals with North Dakota over-the-air pickups, presumably KTHI-11 and KXJB-4. "Excessive violence in Detroit news and feature reporting is among reasons

cited...plus the fact there is nothing of area interest in the MI originations."

Tom speculates that, if this were to happen, "...a series of LPTV relays would pop up northward from Grand Forks to the border to deliver a grade A signal for the Winnipeg system to pick up offair."

On a slightly related subject, Tom also sent a clipping from the Winnipeg Free Press noting the extreme displeasure expressed by Canadian cable executives at the CBC's plans to provide programming to the DirecTV DBS system. CBC and Power Broadcasting of Montreal have agreed to provide an international version of CBC Newsworld and an entertainment service; these programs will be available to DBS dish owners on both sides of the border.

Canadian cable operators call DBS satellites "death stars", fearing that they'll be unable to compete with the satellites. Canadian Cable Television Association president Ken Stein accused CBC of joining forces with the enemy-- but a CBC representative denied that the agreement would undermine Canadian broadcasting, and would indeed provide valuable international exposure.

Keith Short, Columbus OH:

And sticking to the subject of cable... From the May 22 Columbus Dispatch; "Tiny station seeks FCC aid to stay on cable". The Newark, Ohio cable system was planning on replacing WHIZ-18 Zanesville with WOUC-44 Cambridge on June 2, the effective date of the new must-carry regulations. Newark is technically in the Columbus market and thus is required to carry WCMH-4, the NBC affiliate in Columbus—but not required to carry WHIZ, as Zanesville is a separate market.

Newark Mayor Frank Stare told the paper "WHIZ is probably the closest thing we have in Newark to a hometown station. People have told me they are disappointed about it being taken off the cable here, and I am, too. I would encourage people to call (the cable system) and express their concern and opinion about it."

The Cable Act requires cable systems with 13 or more channels (virtually all of them!) to set

aside up to 1/3 of their channels for over-the-air stations. Thus, assuming that Newark's Dimension Cable had 36 channels (a popular size), they'd be required to carry up to 12 over-the-air stations. There is a separate provision for non-commercial stations, of which I've been unable to locate the text.

Keith writes "Everybody that has a cable TV system between television markets can expect to see more than one noncommercial education(al) television station within 50 miles of the cable system's service area... For example, Middletown is between the Cincinnati and Dayton television markets but it is served by the Cincinnati market. Under this new FCC rule, it would have to carry WPTO-TV 14 from Oxford, WPTD-TV 16 from Dayton, WCET-TV 48 from Cincinnati, and WCVN-TV 54 from Covington, Ky. since these noncommercial educational stations are within the 50 mile radius. I must say that such a duplication is a waste of the cable system's channel spacing."

As far as I can tell, Keith's assessment is accurate. Although there are provisions that protect a cable system from being required to carry two stations that carry the same programming 100% of the time. For example, a cable system located between WKPD-29 Paducah and WKMU-21 Murray would not be required to carry both stations, since they have exactly the same programming. I believe WPTO-14 and WPTD-16 also simulcast, so the Middletown system wouldn't have to carry both stations.

Keith also asks whether a cable system would be expected to carry all LPTVs in a market. Usually, no. There are specific situations under which a cable system will be required to carry a LPTV, but only in small markets. Unfortunately, again I don't have the details.

Matt Sittel, Tallahassee FL:

Matt provided a bunch of the LPTV info this month. He also logged an unID channel 2 CBS with a logo resembling WBAY's on May 15-however, WBAY was to have switched to ABC following CBS's purchase of WFRV in that market. Does anyone know if WBAY had indeed switched to ABC by May 15? (they have switched as of this writing, on June 9, as they took an ad in Broadcasting &

Cable calling themselves an ABC affiliate)

Bill Nienajadly, Clifton NJ:

(Congrats on the new ham call!) A jury has been chosen to hear the securities fraud case of "Crazy Eddie" Antar. Uh, oops, wrong side...

AT&T told the NY Post that they've come up with a "video server". This device, installed in a telephone company central office or cable system headend, would allow "video on demand", where a viewer could order a specific movie at a specific time.

Also, Garfield the cat has been accused of ratings tampering. The oversized feline opened the May 22 episode of his Saturday morning cartoon show by saying "Hi everyone, and a special welcome to Nielsen families!". Appealing directly to ratings diary keepers is a serious no-no... CBS told the Post they weren't aware of Garfield's misdeed, and will "toss the segment in its corporate litter box..."

Dave Sinclair, Vancouver BC:

"Enclosed is an interesting item about wireless cable television which just recently came to my attention." From the March 20-27 Toronto Star TV section, "Rural viewers must wait a little longer for more choice"...

While there are, according to Dave, approximately 80 operating systems in the USA (formally known as Multichannel Multipoint Distribution Systems, or MMDS), the CRTC has yet to authorize widespread use of the technology in Canada. Problems include a shortage of frequencies, pending changes in technology (mostly, video compression), and the ongoing government review of Canadian television.

CONVENTION

TV STATS COLUMN DEFINITIONS:

LOG TOTAL - Total number of TV stations logged from DXer's location (all loggings should be received within 25 mile radius of this location to count). Call letter changes don't count; channel changes do count as a new station.

UHF - All stations logged on channels 14 thru 83 including low power television (LPTV) and translators (xtlr) as per FCC definition.

LPTV/xtlr - All stations logged on channels 2 thru 83 which fall under that FCC definition.

NOTE: Count a station once and only in the original mode of propagation it was received in.

Es - Total number of stations logged via E-skip (single or double hop).

No good tropo yet as unsettled weather and fast moving weather systems have not allowed any ducting, but I'm ready! For the first time, I think my UHF DXing antenna and receiver equals my FM DXing equipment which has worked very well (FM-13 and IF modified tuners). I'm still fishing around and finding new LPTVs and translators with the Channel Master dish and R-7000. The call letters are from my database which may be out of date since some stations seem to change affiliation frequently, and I assume they change call letters when they change affiliation such as Colorado Springs K38CU "Jukebox"

Doug Allen (continued) which has changed to TBN. (They do not change call letters unless a permit/license is cancelled and a new applicant goes through the process of applying for and receiving a new permit. This does not happen when a permit/license is transferred. fm)

The Channel Master 7' dish, a gift from a ham friend, is more ruggedly constructed than the Antennacraft version, and in side-by-side comparison, I found signals on the channel Master dish to be in all cases at least as strong as on the Antennacraft dish and in some cases a little stronger.

Lots of E skip on channels 2 and 3. Some of my neighbors blame the frequent E skip interference to Denver channel 2, KWGN, on my ham radio (50 MHz) communications! That I had such power! Some neighbors do experience TV interference when my legal and properly functioning 50 MHz or other amateur band signals "overload" their TV receivers or even their telephones and or other electronic equipment. Both they and I are victims of design compromises (insufficiently shielded and filtered electronics), and the FCC holds me blameless. Oh great, but I have to live with my neighbors, so I've voluntarily spent over \$150 providing cooperative neighbors with high pass and other filters which eliminate or substantially reduce the interference due to what the FCC terms "improperly functioning" TV receivers that overload when strong out-of-band signals are present. In the case of telephones and other electronic devices that are not intended to be receivers, the FCC advises me to tell the consumer to contact the manufacturer for modification of the defective design. And you thought you had problems! Anyway, very little tropo here beyond the normal tropo scatter range. Looking forward to seeing you all in Nashville, 73, Doug

The begining of the Es season has started "not with a bang but with a wimper". The most active days of skip were May 9th (FL to Nicaragua and Honduras) and May 25th. MUF has rarely reached above 87.75 MHz. Tropo has been good but not great. May 6th (MD to NC and NY to IL) and May 17th were a couple of the better days for tropo.

Some additional information on the tuner comparisons in last months ETV DX column, selectivity was not compared because some tuners have the ability to fine tune channels, other tuners did not. Results can be used as a general guide, but not all tuners of the same brand and model will work exactly alike because of variables in shipping, storage, use and slight changes when manufactured. An example of this is when car manufacturers say "your milage may vary" which is also true for DXing. The black and white 1971 Zenith TV that outperformed all of the tuners was model E2416Wl and chassis 22DB36,Z. The selectivity on this model was poor but it did the best job on the very weak signals even without the 41 MHz extracted audio from the televisions IF to a low band police radio.

The Icom R-7000 with optional video adapter was not directly compared to the other tuners but it worked very good. The video was not extremely sensitive like the R-7000s audio but it is probably close to the Teknika TVC-22. The cost of the Icom R-7000 with video adapter at approximately \$1400. makes the TVC-22 a bargain considering the video results, but the hot audio on the R-7000 blows the TVC-22 away.

Those wishing to achieve audio sensitivity and selectivity of the R-7000 but can't gather \$1200. should consider the Icom R-100 at \$600. The R-100 has slightly better specs than the R-7000 and covers the entire TV bands. The R-100 is a mobile set which can be used indoors with a small power supply. The set does not receive SSB and other features of the R-7000 but for TV DXing the R100is more than adequate. A video adapter can be added to the R-100 at EEB Electronics in Vienna, VA. Both sets use N connectors for antenna inputs. Both sets have slight distortion in the 15 KHz narrow FM mode on TV sound. The squelch on the sets would be ideal for setting up a VOX to record DX when your away from your QTH. The R-100 also has a built-in 50-900 MHz rf amplifier and attenuator which are selectable and can be stored in the memory for each channel separately so each channel is customized for your best reception.

Results of the Icom IC-R100 bring in audio scatter from WUNP-36 Roanoke Rapids, NC to Glen Mills, PA (280 miles) with a Winegard PA-4975

amp and a 4 bay UHF antenna indoors.

It would be interesting to compare the Icom receivers to the Kenwood RZ-1 which also covers the TV bands. The Kenwood specs are not as good as the Icom receivers but most manufacturers rate conservativly, and bench tests show most sets perform better than the rated specs.

COMMENTS

Z-Skip mostly absent so far, save for old reliable WBRZ, which seems like a local sometimes. I installed an antenna array at my work OTK in Fairfar, VA, and am encouraged by preliminary results. The U-120 w/CP-4800 amp and cheap FM yagi above it are rotor mounted at about 20 ft. The location is super; 10 miles west of home, away from nagging locals on one of the higher points in the county, plus a super veiw of the southern and western horizons. This is where I first saw tropo in 1986, on a wire loop inside the building. I expect to do much better here than I do at home, despite the better antennas and receivers there.

The interesting part was when I logged KIVY via trops after the skip had faded out! In fact I was able to listen to KOOI in the car on the way to school around 1345! I really wish we could have some evening openings, since I can't get away with what I did most days, and more importantly we all need some E-skip to otherwise liven up what has been the worst skip season I have ever seen. June 3rd will certainly go down in my history books as one of my more unusual DX days. It started out with the first Gulf tropo opening ever noted in FL in June, and the best ever to the Dallas-Ft. Worth area. After a couple of hours of this tropo, E-skip suddenly made an appearance on lo-band TV and quickly rocketed into FM, resulting in my briefly having E-skip and tropo to the same area simultaneously -- a first for me in 20 years of DXing! Fortunately, the tropo was fading by the time the skip showed up, so I went by the common, characteristic differences between the two modes (and the apparent MUF) to figure what was heard by which mode. For example, KNTU and KETR exhibited the typical strong, fluttery Es signals while I was still hearing KEGL very weak and steady by tropo. Unreal. Log at 384.

It has been a very disappoliting skip season to date here, with only one opening that was even half-way decent (the June 3rd opening to Texas and Louisiana). The other two times thave had FM e-stip (as of June 10), did not last more than one minute. Even skip interference on channel 2 & 3 has been a rarity this year, something that was not all that uncommon in some years past. During one Es opening on TV, I noted signals coming in on a heading farther north than they "should have". I was seeing the Dakotas, yet the signals were from the NW or even NNW. Several other DXers noticed this also. Does the skip could have to be directly in line with the DXer and the transmitter? Is it something like the false beam trops openings reported in the past by several littnois DXers? Hopefulfy the latter part of June and July will really see a pickup in activity, to prevent this from being one of the worst seasons ever. I have heard theories that Mount Pinatubo is to blame for the lacktuster Es performances in 1992 and 1993, as well as the cool and damp weather-very interesting. As far as trops go, not much there either. The first paryof May was decent, highlighted by a strong opening to Northern Ohio on the 12th, but since then things have quieted down, as we have been drawn into a pattern of low pressure systems moving across the Northern U.S., similar to last summer's travesty, hi. Hopefulfy things will pick up soon. I plan on being in Nashville at the end of this month for the WTFDA. Conference. I hope to see many of you there; i'm sure it will be a great time!

METEOR SCATTER--THE OVERLOOKED DX MODE

It's interesting that most TV and FM DXers seem to consider themselves to be "skip" DXers, but many do not utilize the one type of skip that actually is most common. It goes on all time, day and night, has certain "peaks" that are more like "one-nighters" than seasons and is even used by the Military for certain over-the-horizon VHF communications applications.

What I'm talking about is of course Meteor Scatter. You don't need to really wait for the next opening or Meteor Shower Peak--it happens everyday! It's pretty simple stuff too. On a daily basis, thousands of meteors get pulled toward the earth as we encounter them in our yearlong trip around the sun. Most all of them burn up in the upper atmosphere--right in the vicinity of the good old E-LAYER! Meteors are mostly rock-like hunks of metal--most commonly iron, believe it or not!

It is the exhaust product of the meteor itself, breaking up and burning on its downward trajectory towards earth, that causes the DX. While the meteor breaks up and burns—at hundreds of miles per hour as it streaks into the increasingly dense atmosphere—it leaves behind a trail of ionized gases—a miniature skip opening that lasts anywhere from a fraction of a second to a minute or more, depending upon the size of the "rock" involved, its percentage of metallic material, and the angle at which it plows into the atmosphere.

MS DX is a great way to fill in those gaps in the log. Lowband TV and FM stations that are too close for E-skip, but too far for most tropo opening situations, can be logged via MS if you're patient. The only problem with this plentiful DX mode (can you think of any other that you can depend on day in and day out?) is that each "burst" or mini-opening of Meteor Scatter DX is short fived, sort of something like an E-skip opening in miniature. Avid FM and TV DXers look forward to DXing Meteor Scatter during the major showers that occur (several good ones happen during the year). But don't ignore the *non-shower momings!* These are the random meteor days, days not clearly connected with any specific shower activity. Believe it or not, there's some great DX to be had during these "off-peak" days. Remember that decent antenna gain is important here, too; strong MS bursts have been logged by "rabbit-ear" DXers, and MS bursts have even been heard by DXers in automobiles, but the scatter-level signal strength of most MS DX demands a good antenna.

If you haven't dabbled in MS DX yet, an excellent chance will present itself soon. The mid-summer Perseids meteor shower will peak August 12th. Early-risers should be able to notice an increasing number of meteor bursts on their lowest open lowband TV or FM channel a few days prior to the shower peak. The period around dawn is the best time to check for MS. Try It—you may get hooked on a new DX mode!
