

Below is a comprehensive list of previously advertised CDs of data from NGDC's Solar-Terrestrial Physics Division. For your convenience, an order form is provided on the back of this flier. The prices listed here are valid through September 30, 1993.

GOES Space Environment Data: This CD-ROM contains X-ray, Magnetometer, and Energetic Particle data measured by NOAA's Geosynchronous Operational Environmental Satellites (GOES). These data are an excellent resource for studying solar activity and its effects in near-earth space. Previously announced under Data Announcement STP-92-5 Price: \$203

Neutron Monitor Data: This is a "write-once" CD-ROM written in ASCII text files containing cosmic ray data from neutron monitors operating in many parts of the world with data going back to 1953. Previously announced under Data Announcement STP-92-3. Price \$203

Flares In Hydrogen-Alpha: This is a "write-once" CD-ROM written in standard ASCII text files containing solar flare records grouped by year from ground based observations. Data include reports (1938-present). events (1955-present), patrol (1955-present), and indices (1955-1980). Previously announced under Data Announcement STP-92-4. Price: \$111

Regions of Solar Activity: This is a "write-once" CD-ROM written in standard ASCII text files containing records of Ca plage regions and sunspot groups. Records are grouped by year and by station. Plage observations are from Big Bear (1981-1987), Hale (1979-1981), McMath (1942-1979), AGD Table (1969-1982), and Indices (1970-1987). Sunspot observations are from Catania (1978-1987), Greenwich (1874-1982), Mt Wilson 1962-1991), Rome (1958-1989), and US Air Force (1981-1991). CONVENTION REPORT

Hot Temps, Hot Trops, Hot Times in 'Music City'

(As co-hosts of the Nashville Convention we found it difficult to be totally objective in preparing this summary. Please excuse us if we seem to be tooting our own horns...but it WAS a helluva good get-together!!

Shortly after 9 AM on Friday July 23 WTFDA's 1993 convention officially opened for business. As club members arrived they were presented with a name tag and a bag of goodies including bumper stickers, caps, T-shirts, key chains, coverage maps, tourist info, etc. Local broadcasters were generous with their contributions, and the retail value of each sack was between \$10 and \$15.

Three monitoring posts began to take shape about noon, and were up and running by 1:30 PM. Jim Dietrich brought antennas, rotors, baluns and pre-amps; and Doug Smith supplied tripods, masts, and setup help. Another club antenna expert, Doug Allen, pitched in to get the whole thing operational. Tom Yingling made a major contribution by letting us use his tv receiver and ICOM tuner. During the first half of the gathering the FM setup utilized a Carver tuner on loan from Dave Nieman; and Doug Smith's Technics tuner saw duty for the remainder of the weekend. Another setup at the other end of the convention room was dedicated to tape playback.

The 9th floor convention site was ideally suited to our group. Small tables in the one-time skytop bar were filled with photos of dx catches along with historic QSL and promotional material. Two larger tables housed extra giveaway items and a display of RDX Labs products. The UHF and VHF receiving sites were located side-by-side at the north end of the large room, and the FM installation was about 15 feet back toward the west side. The bar area was stocked with soft drinks and snacks. There was plenty of elbow room, and in spite of the 100 degree + heat index, the air conditioning system managed to keep the large glass-enclosed room comfortable.

By late Friday afternoon about half of the group had arrived and the 9th floor of Days Inn Central was buzzing with activity.

During the course of the convention many of our quests spent time away from the meeting site to explore area points of interest. Several went to the Friday Night Grand Ole Opry; some headed for the big regional shopping malls; and a few ferreted out antique shops. A small group made a pilgrimage to the WSM-AM transmitter; a large number enjoyed the German atmosphere and food at the Gerst House Restaurant; and one carload even made a side trip to Bowling Green, KY to visit stations and get T-shirts!

Late Friday evening everyone eventually made it back to our meeting site to visit, dx, and enjoy the spectacular view of the Nashville skyline. Fortunately, there was a lot to look at any yak about; because the dxing was mediocre. Normal tropo activity produced catches in the 200-300 mile range...certainly nothing to get excited about. (Note: although some CCI was spotted on 2 at times, no Es was logged.) By 2 AM the crowd had thinned considerably; and by 4 AM everyone had given up for the night. Maybe tomorrow would be better!

When the convention room re-opened Saturday morning, activities resumed almost as if there had not been an overnight pause. Tour groups were organized and headed out for WSMV (channel 4) and WSM AM/FM. After a noon lunch break the second set of station tours got underway; and by 4PM everyone was back at the Days Inn Central in time to get ready for the banquet.

Tom and Doug had decided that a southern flavor would be a nice touch for the banquet menu, and the results were excellent. In a cozy meeting room on the first floor, 33 dxers and guests were treated to generous servings of southern-fried chicken, southern-style green beans, potatoes and gravy, and a yummy peach cobbler. The hotel banquet staff came through with flying colors (Confederate flags..maybe?)!

As the tables were cleared, Tom Bryant welcomed those attending and introduced the first guest speaker, Mr. Aaron Shelton; retired Chief Engineer of WSM; Incorporated. Aaron spent the next hour sharing memories of his nearly 50 years in the industry. His talk ran the gamut from humorous stories about Opry stars to the early days of AM; W47NV (claimed by WSM to be America's first commercial FM station); the shaky startup of WSM-tv; and a host of technical innovations along the way.

After Mr. Shelton's talk and a short break; Doug Smith spoke briefly about several upcoming industry developments including HDTV.

There was a drawing for door prizes, then a DX QUIZ based on VUD items published during the past 12 months. The quiz produced laughs, gasps, and groans; and seemed to be a popular feature. There were prizes for low and high test scores; plus some confusion as to how to award them as the hosts (Bryant, to be specific) hadn't planned on any ties.

After the quiz, the formal portion of the meeting concluded as we all paraded by NRC member Ernie Wesolowski's camcorder to say howdy! (Ed. note: Special thanks to Ernie for his assistance in helping a WTFDA member who experienced major car trouble. Ernie is truly a credit to our hobby and the human race!) A special invitation had been extended to the radio-only clubs, and several IRCA and NRC members joined us for the weekend. Ontario DXer Dave Whatmough showed up in his much-traveled "DX-Mobile"...a real treat for those who hadn't seen it before.

By 9:30 Saturday night the 9th floor convention room had filled up again and the non-stop gabfest was back in high gear. Trops were up, too! Nobody said much, but you could sense the vibes that big things were going to happen...and they did!

About 2:30 AM Sunday morning all hell broke loose...and an opening the likes of which had never been seen by Nashvillians filled our screens (and FM gear) with a non-stop parade of tropo visitors from Arkansas, Oklahoma and Texas. There were still about 10 people up at the time, including dx 'king' Bob Seybold who was reeling in new loggings at a frantic pace. Greg Coniglio and Matt Sittel were getting equally amazing results at the FM outpost. Oddly enough, the crowd increased as word of the big opening spread. People actually got out of bed to get in on the action! By 5 AM we had seen and heard stations from just about everywhere in the Lone Star State...but only a few hard-core nightowls were on hand to witness the grand prize catch...a Texas U at 790 miles.

A total of 22 VHF, 71 UHF, and approximately 75 FM loggings was recorded during the three-day period. Convention Technical Coordinator Doug Smith compiled the following report assessing our facilities; and the major catches of the weekend.

The DX installation had its advantages and disadvantages. The high elevation and short feedlines made for no real problems with physical obstructions or line loss. But, the presence of 9 TVs within 10 miles (including 3 LPTVs less than a mile away) and 12 FMs meant some strategy was necessary to avoid overload. For awhile on Sunday morning, the preamp on the UHF antenna was replaced with a balun to allow DXing the lower UHF channels without excessive overload from WZTV-17.

Local LPTVs were playing games with us, with W68CG choosing to move, the week before the convention, from a site 12mi. away, to one less than a mile away. They also went off the air several times during the convention, allowing logging of WKMJ-68 Louisville, but they were on, and a pest, for most of the Texas opening. W36AK, also within a mile of the convention site, was off for most of the convention; their primary, WPGD-50, was also off quite a bit, and spent several hours Sunday morning sweeping their transmitter.

There was an excellent tropo opening to the west on Saturday night; this cost several DXers most or all of a night's sleep. The opening centered on the Dallas/Ft. Worth area, with 5 FMs and 7TVs from that market logged; a variety of other Texas FM/TV stations were logged. Best FM DX was KCWS-102.7 Merkel (777mi.), just west of Abilene; best TV DX was KVDA-60 San Antonio at 790mi. Also logged during the opening were a number of Oklahoma TVs and Arkansas FM/TVs. Someone (I believe it was Greg Coniglio) logged an Arkansas Class A at 352mi.!


Before and after the opening, other less exotic DX was seen and heard. Because of overload from the Knob Rd. tower (WSMV-4, WZTV-17, WSM-95.5) and three LPTVs downtown, most DXing was done to the north, with most stations heard being in the western 2/3 of Tennessee and Kentucky, or in southern Indiana and Illinois, though WRGT-45 Dayton and WINM-63 Angola stretched the paths in those directions.










Host Tom Bryant in doorway; co-hos Doug Smith to his left.

Obviously, the FCC is on vacation... Actually, so is the CRTC...

The deficit reduction bill has hit broadcasters, and other FCC licensees. FCC user fees will be charged; in TV, the annual fees will range between \$4,000 for 100+-market UHFs, to \$18,000 for top-10-market VHFs. Cable systems will pay \$0.37 per subscriber. Non-commercial stations are exempt. (hams note: I've heard nothing about these fees extending to amateur radio)

Regarding last month's Canadian items from Dave Sinclair, the CRTC action permitting religious broadcasting specifically says that rebroadcasters of U.S. channels (TBN) will not be licensed.

Also in Canada, the CRTC is asking for applications for a new province-wide TV service in Alberta. Cities involved are Edmonton, Red Deer, Calgary, and Lethbridge. Channels aren't given. Two firms, including CanWest (owners of Global in Ontario, of CKVU-10 Vancouver, and CFSK-4 and CFRE-11 in Saskatchewan), have announced plans to apply.

A number of bills have been proposed to limit violent programming on TV. Maybe the most interesting would require TVs to contain a "V-chip", which would allow parents to block viewing of programs rated for violence.

Terry Shockley, who's challenging the license renewals of Wisconsin stations WKOW-27, WAOW-9, WXOW-19, and WQOW-18, claims that bankrupt owner Sharad Tak no longer actually controls the stations. If the FCC agrees in a hearing later this month, they could deny "renewal expectancy", a preference that usually quarantees license renewal.

If the "expectancy" is denied, the chances of Shockley being granted the licenses improves considerably. Tak's creditors, mostly banks & other financial institutions, have no record of successful operation of broadcast stations, while Shockley does, having operated the same four stations until Tak purchased them in 1985.

Tak and his creditors may, however, have another weapon. In late July, the owners of bankrupt KTVD-20 Denver filed in Federal Court to block a competing application for KTVD's license. Their argument is that any action that diminishes the value of a company in bankruptcy is a violation of bankruptcy law.

The Commission is considering a partial return of the "anti-trafficking" rule. Before 1982, if you received a broadcast license, you couldn't sell it for 3 years. The proposed change would resurrect this rule, but only for licenses granted by a comparative hearing. In situations where there's only one applicant, there would be no minimum period.

After a second crash, and five months for repairs, TV Marti-13 is back on the air. Broadcasts resumed on August 4. Actually, TV Martibroadcasts continued via satellite while the channel 13 balloon was

down, but since Cuban law prohibits the private ownership of satellite dishes, chances are only government officials saw the broadcasts.

In a move guaranteed to confuse DXers... KYW-3 Philadelphia has decided to preempt NBC on Fridays between 8 and 9PM. They'll air a 60-Minutes-style news magazine program.

However, West Coast DXers will be "un-confused" by the decision by KRON-4 San Francisco to end its experiment with 7-10PM prime-time. KRON will return prime-time programs to 8-11PM. KCRA-3 Sacramento is expected to do the same.

CABLE ACT

Several cable systems have taken the must-carry rules to the Supreme Court. Their petition claims that the rules are an attempt by Congress to control the editorial choices of cable operators. A hearing isn't expected until next spring- unless the Court refuses to review the case.

Several broadcasters report they've reached retransmission-consent agreements that do involve cash payments. The broadcasters won't reveal which cable systems are involved, but so far they say only small cable systems are involved.

In Wellford, SC, the city is delaying renewal of TeleCable's franchise. Wellford Mayor Hubert Odum wants the system to guarantee they'll carry the Greenville/Spartanburg/Asheville stations. In nearby Greenville, it's reported that the franchise agreement requires carriage of the local stations; if TeleCable doesn't reach retransmission-consent agreement with all the over-the-air stations, it could be in violation. That agreement doesn't expire until 2007.

A special appropriation of \$11.5million has been made to the FCC. The money will pay for administration of the Cable Act.

The Springfield, Mo. cable system has moved KOLR-10 from cable channel 9 to 32. TeleCable VP Gordon Herring says they're simply getting customers used to KOLR's new dial position, but KOLR's GM believes it's because the station has hired a consultant to handle their retransmission-consentnegotiations. The move hurts KOLR not only because of the disruption in viewer habits, but because non-cable-ready TVs will no longer be able to receive the

station on cable without a converter box. (also, at least presumably, the other Springfield over-the-air stations are on low dial positions)

It's rumored that NBC may offer cable systems consent to carry their owned TV stations in return for carrying one or more of three new cable networks they're starting. Two of the networks would be new, one news/talk and the other sports; the third would be their existing Spanish-language news channel, currently available in Latin America. Additionally, NBC has reportedly offered their affiliates a financial interest in the news/talk channel in return for allowing NBC to handle their retransmission-consent negotiations.

A NAB survey released in mid-July shows that roughly 93% of all stations affiliated with one of the "big-3" networks have opted to negotiate for retransmission consent on at least one cable system. For Fox affiliates, the figure is 98%; for non-Fox independents, it's roughly 20%.

The Commission has established a "Cable Information Telephone Line". This service carries information for subscribers, local governments, and cable systems, on the Cable Act. The numbers are:

Again on the KOUS-4 IDs seen on channel 3, Tom passed along a letter from an employee of KTVQ-2. He writes that commercial breaks on KYUS-3 are run from Billings. He also confirms that the KOUS tower is still in place 18mi. east of town; it's used by FM station KDWG.

From the Nashville Tennessean, an item about my employer... WSMV has decided to request cash for retransmission consent. The proposal would ask for \$0.50 per cable subscriber right now; when cable rate regulations are relaxed in late 1994, the rate would bump up to \$0.75, increasing to \$0.90 by 1995. Reportedly, no other Nashville station has requested cash, but some have said that if other stations get cash, they also want it.

WSMV (and all other TV stations) have until Oct. 6 to reach retransmission agreements; since cable systems must notify subscribers of stations being dropped 30 days in advance, the real deadline is Sept. 6. Viacom, and other Middle Tennessee cable operators, continue to insist that they won't pay cash for consent, but Viacom GM Stan Smith told the Tennessean "I remain confident that all the broadcasters will be on Oct. 6, but we've got a lot of work to do this month."

Among the other Nashville stations:

WKRN-2 has requested cash in return for a second, cable-only, channel. They also want cable systems to agree to buy advertising on channel 2, and provide WKRN with advertising time on the cable systems.

WTVF-5 has reached a no-cash initial agreement with Viacom. Details weren't provided but don't include another cable channel.

WZTV-17 and Viacom have signed on to Fox's nationwide deal, whereby WZTV will be carried without charge, in return for Viacom carrying the new Fox cable network; part of the fees paid by Viacom to Fox will be turned over to WZTV.

WDCN-8, WXMT-30, WHTN-39, and WPGD-50 have all chosen must-carry.

Bill Nienajadly, Clifton NJ:

(Hey Tom, how many people got #15 right on the DX Quiz?) Bill sends a clipping from the August 2 Daily News, with two items in one. First, an editorial questioning the need for government regulations on violent TV programming— and even questioning whether it is too violent.

Second, an item regarding a Riverhead (Long Island) resident concerned about the possible disappearance of NYC stations from his local cable system if retransmission-consent negotiations fail. The reporter writes "He simply can't receive the signals where he lives. If he can't get them on cable, he can't get them at all."

According to my calculations, Riverhead is only 70 miles from NYC, 35 miles from WTNH-8 (New Haven, CT), and 60 miles from the other Hartford, CT stations- certainly no problem for outdoor antennas! The resident interviewed. Tom Mosher, has a more

American solution-- if the cable system drops the NYC stations, he plans on suing...

Another item, from the July 19
Post, reports that NAB-produced
announcements arguing the
broadcasters' side of retransmission
consent have begun airing on WNBC-4.
The spots say "Local broadcast
television is what makes cable
television worth watching".

And finally, "SCUD Stud" Arthur Kent, fired by NBC shortly after the Gulf War, has found a new iob. He's returning to his native Canada to host a weekly CBC documentary on "ethical & moral dilemmas in modern life".

(Bill, congrats on the Extra! You going to take your chances on a new callsign?)

William Draeb, Kewaunee WI:

Bill has several news items from Northern Wisconsin.

First, regarding the network swap in Green Bay, the switch occurred on April 15; on this day, WFRV-5 switched from ABC to CBS, and WBAY-2 from CBS to ABC. Presumably, WJMN-3 and WLUC-6 made the same swap at the same time.

Second, regarding WJMN-3, Bill says they aren't a 100% satellite of WFRV-5 anymore. They run their own commercials, and occasionally their own newscasts.

Also on the subject of WFRV-5, Bill writes that that station is now carrying the Milwaukee Brewers network, preempting the CBS baseball games. He asks how strict the networks are about this kind of thing, and whether they have some kind of double-standard for affiliates & owned stations?

Honestly, I don't think so. Few CBS affiliates have aired the network's late-night programs (though that may change with the Letterman show), and when I was with CBS affiliate WISC-3, we would routinely preempt CBS programs for U.W. hockey broadcasts, and occasionally for other programs. WSMV occasionally also preempts NBC for local programs or Billy Graham specials.

WIIM-8 Iron Mountain and WHTA-5 Calumet, Mich. are not on yet. (a list I have from Eric Voytko/Bill Fahber lists a call change on the former station, to WDHS)

There does appear to be a new LPTV on 31 at Wausau. As Bill reported to the August Western TV-DX column. Three Angels and TBN programs were seen on June 22 on a Wausau heading. My database shows no 31 LPTV in Wausau; one possibility is W31BA Minocqua though Minocqua is quite a bit north of Wausau & Bill's 7' dish would probably rule that out. Bill hasn't seen the signal since 6/22.

Regarding my speculation that WXGZ-32's old antenna was on WGBA-26's tower, Bill says that they do have their own tower, about 600' west of WGBA's. The tower is still up, but the antenna was removed about 3 months after they went dark. Bill sees no evidence of work to install a channel 32 antenna on the channel 26 tower.

(OK on WAUN-92.7... could be the trops, but they were <u>booming</u> into my Madison motel room in June!)

Greg Coniglio, Williamsville NY:

Greg took a road trip to Memphis during the convention; while there, he picked up a copy of the Commercial Appeal, which carried an item on the sale of WMC-5 (and their AM and FM stations).

The article goes into the valuation of a TV station, something that I suspect most people don't understand. (I should say, I know most people don't understand. Probably the most important question asked of a jury I just served on was to put a value on a travel agency. Two different expert witnesses placed values that differed by 200% & had totally different bases...)

TV stations are valued in multiples of annual cash flow, with a common multiple these days being 7 or 8. So, if WMC generates \$8.5million in cash flow annually, it might sell for 7 times that, or \$59.5million.

New WMC owner Bert Ellis has had several previous successes, including building Act III Broadcasting, a firm which owned several successful Fox affiliates when Ellis sold it about 2 years ago.

Eric Voytko, McLean VA:

Eric sends a postcard noting that WTMW-14 went on regular schedule on August 3, sometime between 10am and 1pm. They run Home Shopping Spree 24 hours, with ID about 3mins. before the hour. The signal is

strong at his location but (luckily!) doesn't splatter over onto any other channels.

Pete Taylor, San Francisco CA:

I stand corrected (again!)... Pete points out that the item about KMOD-97.5/KOKI-23 Tulsa, reported in August VUD, is not, in fact, new; it's what's called a "P.I.", or Per Inquiry, commercial-- I'm told that the ubiquitous "Hooked On Phonics" ads are also P.I.s. (is this new to TV though? Or have there been P.I.s on TV for years too?)

ken Romstadt, Ottawa Lake MI:

Ken sends an item from the Toledo Blade reporting that Channel 21 in Fremont. Ohio (an LPTV, but my database doesn't list one) has purchased a tower from Sandusky County. The 200' tower was built by a now-defunct emergency medical service, and was sold by the county for \$9.200 and the rights to have "...a 911 signal booster will be placed on top of the tower to clarify signals to police and fire agencies in the county". Presumably, that means an antenna for police & fire two-way repeaters.

Ken also writes that the Blade mentioned WXAE-40, but no signon date was given.

And now for Forum Canada...

Dave Sinclair, Vancouver BC:

Dave sent along two Vancouverarea items. The first, from the July 25 Burnaby News, notes an epidemic of vandalism which seems to have struck Rogers Cable in the wake of a lockout of union technical workers.

While the IBEW union claims no connection, cable lines in telephone manholes have been cut. leaving adjacent telephone cables untouched, and cable line amplifiers have been removed.

The union says it was locked out after refusing to accept a 25% wage cut; it had offered a no-increase contract.

And, from the July 22 Vancouver Sun, a note that applications for dozens of new specialty cable channels have poured into the CRTC in the wake of changes in cable regulation.

Deadline: September 5

Skip season is finished without any unusual openings of double hop, high maximum usable frequencies or any extremely short or long single hop distances reported. The best day for skip was 7-11 but many reporters had skip on various days when others in the club had no skip to report. Tropo is on the upswing with July 4, 6, 7, 9, 11 and 12 reported by several members.

The WTFDA convention featured 600 mile tropo to Texas. Did someone order DX from room service or did they make a request to an authority much higher up?

As usual some of the best DX was sited from the Sunshine State. Many thanks to reporters for sending reports in the proper format and especially the reports that are published intact as

submitted. The reports that have required typing by this editor have been reasonable in size. I like to fill empty areas with logos so send them along with reports. You may want to fill areas with comments on programs or anything unusual about a station. Some reporters using word processors and computers have trouble making double columns but as long as the columns (date, mode, time, call letters) are in order and there isn't a lot of empty space that is fine.

Be sure to check the weather forcasts for approaching hurricanes, which can produce the best tropo conditions. More important, don't forget to report your DX.

The more your report conforms to the format the less chance for edits. You are your own editor.

Thanks for the extras sent with reports, sorry I can't answer every correspondence. My mother passed away in July, I've been busy.

It looks like July was a good month for TV-DX. The column has swelled to 12 pages of loggings and commentary (although a significant portion of the column is dedicated to old loggings). E skip was reported by someone on every date in July with the exception of 20, 22, 28, and 31. One hot E skip date was the 14th when Mike Cherry found 6 meters open to "just about every part of the US and southern Canada all at once." Long haul UHF was noted from Illinois to Texas by Robert Delaney on the 25th and 26th and from Baton Rouge to Nuevo Leon by Jeff Kruszka on the same dates. And there was lots more!

The column is being printed on a crippled printer this month. I don't know yet what has happened, but the result is that the bottom row of each character is not printed. This affects the frequently used underline as well as the lower case letters q, p, q, and y. I can't do much about those letters, but this month I am attempting to use bold print to indicate new loggings instead of the traditional underline. I hope it is obvious in

the final production.

E skip season so far has had average number of hours duration, but above average long-haul skip. I hesitate to call it "multi-hop" as this term only applies to SOME long-haul E skip. This is demonstrated by some of the loggings that occurred on July 14 - so far the best of many good days here in the Pacific Northwest. Some of the long-haul E skip experienced on 50 MHz (6 meters) has been of the ducting variety with no signs of intermediate area open for DX.

My favorite theory for the great conditions of July 4-15 involves the presence of horrendous low-pressure systems (the cause of the severe floods!) in the midwest coupled with the high pressure heat-wave that gripped the east coast. This theory is based on Mel Wilson's excellent 2-part "Intense Sporadic-E Propagation at Mid-Latitudes" to be found in the book "Beyond Line of Sight" by Emil Pocock. The article includes some TV-DX data plus our club's address!

July 4 opening to the Phoenix area on TV occurred while I worked into Mexico City area on 6 meters! I could also hear Phoenix and San Diego operators talking to the Mexicans - the classic "double-hop."

July 14 - what a day!! 6 meters was open to just about every part of the US and southern Canada all at once. Many times the hash on the TV screen was 4 or 5 stations deep with various audio on all 3 offsets on the Kenwood receiver. Here at my new QTH, I have less of a problem with overload from CHEK-6 on Saturna Island (Victoria, BC) and can log the real strong stuff, On 5, semi-local KING-5 is also a problem, but not with the antenna pointed due east and towards north. At 0930 whilst logging a new station and province, 50 MHz was open to south central Ontario and New England as far south as washington, DC.

No openings yet to Alaska on VHF. I'm also watching for signs of E skip on the Russian channel R1 (49.750) video frequencies. I checked FM with a set of rabbit ears during a few openings where the 50-65 MHz got shorter than 700 miles but only heard a brief 88 MHz signal from South Dakota in early June. I hope other members are getting some good skip conditions this summer. No complaints here - except lack of E skip at FM and above. 73's Mike, VE7SKA

Note # 5 - Bullfight in Spanish. "deporty" in upper left.

Note # 6 - Showing a movie with frontal nudity!

Note # 7 - Video on 61 -- to St. Louis switching between Home Shopping and WWTO-35. Cannot conceive what this could be. (For that matter, on 02/08/91 a unIDed TBN was seen on channel 68, also coming from the direction of St. Louis and it has never been IDed. Suspect it had something to do with

the channel 18 which came on a few months later.)

Note # 8 - Lots of interesting Spanish stations in on channel 4. Frank Merrill got the Dominican Republic on double hop E skip. After playing back my tape there appears to be three or four different Spanish stations in there. Tape being sent to Caesar Obijo with fingers crossed.

Note # 9 - The conditions from 1100 to 1200 were a carbon copy of the double hop E skip conditions on July 3 from 1400-1530 with channel 4 still being the most interesting. Tapes from this session being sent to Caesar Obijo also. Tentative Puerto Rico and Dominican Republic loggings today.

Note #10 - KPRC's logo and WESH's logo are almost identical and both stations are NBC and channel 2-. So far at least, it appears that KPRC's "2" is white and WESH's "2" is black.

Note #11 - A TBN translator which actually keeps their ID on the screen all the time.

Note #12 - Selling classified advertising in your own voice ● \$20/week.

Thanks to Tom Bryant and Doug Smith for a great convention! Was another Mexican seen here by tropo on 06/17/92? Joe Gragg who does a lot of work at northern Mexican TV stations mentioned that there is a channel 23 in Nueva Rosita about 75 miles southwest of logged channel 46 in Piedras Negras. There is still an unIDed channel 23+ from that opening which carried Univision. Stay tuned.

It's been ten years since moving to Macomb in July 1983. While it's interesting to see what has been logged from here, it is equally interesting to see what has NOT been

logged. (Frank Merrill concurs with all of these).

By tropo: W67CH La Crosse, Wisconsin. I know this is on the air and it was logged once while still on channel 83, but I have sat on channel 67 for hours while channel 31 up there is pinning the meter, but all I ever get is W67AC. Ditto W62BH Hopkinsville, Kentucky. Channel 43 there can be barreling in, but I've never even seen traces of cci from them. Ed Phelps complains they overload his receiver. WKYU-24 Bowling Green, Kentucky, never even a trace. WDCN-8 - Frank has this, but I've spent hours trying to get it with no luck. Lack of Winnipeg on tropo. Probably the biggest surprise. Figured that in ten years there would be at least ONE opening up to there. Also, still need tropo from New Mexico and Wyoming. Lack of deep Florida tropo - other than a few weak openings into central Florida (WTGL-52, WMOD-43, WFTS-28, WOFL-35) there has been nada. Figured Tampa/St. Petersburg would have been more common here since part of the path is over water. WHNS-21 Asheville, North Carolina - forget it!

By E skip: KTVN-2. At 1535 miles and with a totally clear channel 2 here, this station has never been seen. WSB-2 at 575 miles is another one. I have channel 5 from Atlanta by E skip, but not them. WGRZ-2 is fairly common by E skip here, but WIVB-4 has never made it in. Double-hop E skip to Central America - Frank and I figured this stuff would be common, but neither of us have anything from there. Bill Eckberg has YSR-2. In fact, double hop is down right rare from here. Only KCRA-3 and perhaps a few Mexicans / Dominicans are the only double hop E skip ever seen. KCRA is usually seen at least once every E skip season. Wonder if its circular polarization helps with that? There are tons of West Coast lo-banders which have refused to double hop into Macomb including needed Oregon! 73.

(Jeff, could your channel 27 from the southeast with Main Street TV have been W27AN at Murfreesboro, Tennessee? At one time, it reportedly carried Channel America, but maybe it has changed? fm)

This year's E skip season seemed to peak a couple weeks late. I was almost ready to call it a bust. All in all, I would say that this summer was better than last. However, on the tropo front, this summer is worse than last year - a complete bust. I saw more tropo last winter (and it was none too plentiful then)! During July, most of the unsettled, stormy weather moved several hundred miles to the south and has, for the most part, left this area high and dry. This, along with a belated increase in the number of warm, muggy days, led me to believe that the tropo would soon be arriving, but alas, nothing much materialized.

DXers take note: WCCO-4 is now transmitting with a plus offset rather than zero. (This was necessitated by the vacant channel 4z assignment granted to Crandon, Wisconsin a few years ago.) I do not know exactly when the change took place. I had the opportunity to determine their offset with an AOR handheld scanner in early May, and they were +10 KHz at that time. Their new offset was verified on June 25 when they produced a zero beat against plus offset WWL-TV.

Further evidence that WLAX-25's satellite station, WEUX-48, is really a translator; it appears to receive its signal off air rather than via microwave relay. Any technical difficulties that WLAX transmits are perfunctorily repeated by WEUX. Weather watch symbols have been seen in the corner of the screen as well, despite the fact that the watch area affected La Crosse, but didn't come near Eau Claire. None of this occurs with WXOW-19/WQOW-18, another primary and satellite pair in the La Crosse/Eau Claire market. I find is especially annoying that WEUX seems to have no automated equipment for detecting the lack of WLAX's signal and shutting down appropriately. Even though WLAX goes silent after sign/off, WEUX stays on all night with a black screen and a tremendous hiss for audio. Additionally, there are absolutely no commercials for the Eau Claire area iust La Crosse. Since they apparently have no sales office in (or near) Eau Claire. I wonder if they even have a studio of any kind; the only mailing address given on air is that of WLAX's La Crosse studio.

Wireless cable is now available in this area. I have been receiving fliers in the mail trying to induce me to subscribe. But at \$39.99 a month for only 12 channels, I'il pass. I've noticed ads in electronics magazines for wireless cable receiving equipment. Has anyone tried DXing wireless cable stations yet? I wonder where a person could even get basic information on these stations, such as call letters, tpo or erp, transmitter location, etc. I have no idea where the system in this area is transmitting from. The flier gives only a phone number for a sales office to arrange an in-home demonstration. (Wireless cable is included in the Services volume of Television and Cable Factbook. I don't have the 1993 edition, so am unsure what serves your area. fm)

DXers fed up with today's generation of TVs and VCRs and their muting facilities might want to investigate the Sharp brand name. I don't know about their entire line, but the models I had the opportunity to try awhile back (one of each) were not too bad in the tuner department. Although the VCR's tuner could take up to two seconds to lock onto a weak signal, it easily rivaled my Zenith TV's tuner - especially on UHF, a common weak spot in VCR tuners. E skip can cause many VCRs to lose sync, but other than losing the color, this VCR had no problem taping interference plaqued signals. Perhaps most importantly of all, both the TV and VCR had a switch to kill the dreaded blue screen. Sorry, but I don't know what the model numbers were. Until next time... 73, Mike

WNCO 102.9 Morristown, NY (near Brockville, Ontario, in the "North Country" region of NY) is on the air with country. They relay 1410 AM WNCO in Watertown. "They are Big O Country', just like the old WNCO 97.5 Watertown, but probably with a lot less coverage than that 100kw station, hi. WMHR 102.9 in Syracuse, a religious station, now has a translator on 88.7 in Dansville, N.Y. KDJS 95.3 in Wilmer, Minnesota is now on the air. In Connecticut, testing has been heard on 103.3 that is quite likely the new Sharon, CT testing. So look for that one to come on shortly. A widely heard change this season is 91.5 Ft. Myers, now WJYO, "Joy FM", and running parallel to WJIS 88.1 Bradenton, another widely heard station. I don't know if they are always parallel though. In that same neck of the woods, WCMQ 92.3 Hialeah, and WZMQ 103.9 Key Largo are no longer simulcasting, they have seperate programming now. KZEB 95.5 Pleasant Hope, Missouri is on the air with classic hits for Springfield. Slogans of "B95" and "The B" have been heard. 104.5 in Indianapolis has indeed received its new calls of WGRL. They are now country and "The Bear*. Detroit's 99.5 is now WYCD, to go along with it's "Young Country" format. CHYR 96.7 Leamington was heard on the air, with country. WRED Gibsonburg-Toledo is now using the slogan "Toledo's Hit Country Y 95.7". Still WRED though. WRVC 93.7 Ashland, KY has gone oldies. TIPS FOR AVIATION BAND DXING

The VHF & UHF Aeronautical Bands present an especially challenging & unique form of DX for a number of reasons. Many DXers are disappointed in first attempts at DXing this band -- when some stations only 20 or 30 miles away may be difficult to receive. However..good DX can be had -- but you have to work hard at it.

If you think of how this band is used -- the reason behind all this becomes quite clear. The primary users, of course, are aircraft usually flying at 5..10..all the way up to 40000 ft. Now at 40000 ft., line of sight extends out to 265 miles! In order to serve a 40-100 mile radius of an airport, aeronautical ground stations require very little power. Most stations use only between 5 and 25 watts -- with 100 watts used by many of the longer-range enroute Navigation Aids with weather broadcasts.

UHF/UHF UTILITY DX This month we have news on numerous new Weather broadcast stations that have recently hit the airwaves -- most of them AWOS stations (Automated Weather Observation Stations). More and more of these computer-accented robot stations are being installed at smaller airports everywhere. Expect to see some of these stations to start up in Canada in the next couple of wears as well.

Distance Calculation by Computer

Several people asked at the convention how I calculate the distances to DX stations logged. The short answer is, by computer. The long answer is the program below...

Lines 2040-2090 are required only to calculate the bearing; if you're only interested in distance, you can leave them out. (you'll then also need to modify line 220 appropriately) Also, if you want distances in kilometers, change the number in line 2030 from 3952 to 6367.

The "meat" of this program is the subroutine between lines 2000 and 2100. This can be used in other ways— with a calculator, to manually calculate distance & bearing; for spreadsheet formulas or calculated fields in a database of FM/TV stations; or as a basis for converting the program to other computer languages. (or for making this BASIC program more "user-friendly"!) I've already written a Windows version of the program, and placed the formulas into a MS-Works spreadsheet.

If you've never used the BASIC in your IBM/compatible before, here's how to enter this program: First, you need to get a C:\> prompt. From Windows, go to the Main group and double-click on MS-DOS Prompt. If you aren't using Windows, you're on your own... Type GWBASIC and press Enter. A (mostly) black screen should come up. Type in the numbered

program lines as they appear above. When you've finished typing, press F2 to run the program. Check that it works, by calculating the distance/bearing to some stations that you know the distance to. (your locals will work.) If there's a problem, most likely you mistyped something; double-check what's in your computer against this article.

Once you're satisfied that the program is working, make one change: change the word END in line 1000 to SYSTEM. This will cause the program to return to the C:\> prompt when done, rather than returning to the BASIC screen. Then, save the program: press F4, type DXC (or whatever other name you want to give the program), and press Enter. Now, to run the program in the future, get a C:\> prompt, type GWBASIC DXC, and press Enter.

This program is based on program 5.2 in the book "Amaleur Radio Software, by John Morris GM4ANB. The book is published by the Radio Society of Great Britain, and should be available through the ARRL, 225 Main St., Newington CT 06111, or call 203-666-1541. Better-equipped ham shops probably also have it. This book has a number of programs relevant to the FM/IV DXer, including troposcatter path loss calculation, MUF calculation (for F2 skip), antenna and circuit design aids, satellite location, crude recordkeeping programs, and even a simple electronic circuit analysis program! Also included are tips on converting BASIC programs from the rather generic "dialect" used in the book to whatever version your computer uses. If you have a computer, I highly recommend that you check this book out

Of course, once you have the program, you need a way to find out what the DX station's, and your, geographical coordinates are. For your own coordinates, the most available solution is a US Geological Survey topographic map; these are available for all areas of the USA and show geographic coordinates. Try looking up the USGS in your phone book. (unfortunately, I don't have any more details, as I've never had to use one of these maps!) A second choice, and one I recommend if you live in one of the states covered, is the "Atlas and Gazetteer by DeLorme Mapping Co., 800-227-1656. These are currently available for about 15 states, and contain topographic maps of the entire state, plus virtually every road & street. Besides locating your coordinates, this Atlas will help you in finding your local stations, that little-known fishing hole, whatever... A third solution, and the one I'm using here, is to pick a local broadcast tower within a mile or so & look up its coordinates, and use them.

Finding the DX station is another problem. For FM, the only answer I know of is the official FCC database. My copy was purchased from Buckmaster Publishing, 703-894-5777, as part of their "HamCall CD-Rom. Some computer "massaging" of that raw data is necessary. For TV, the HamCall CD works; so does the "Television Factbook, available at most libraries.

I've written two "embellished" versions of the above program, one for DOS (which allows batch processing of large numbers of DX stations, just the thing for that mega-Es opening..) and the other for Windows. I'll send a 3-1/2" 720K floppy with both programs and a Microsoft Works spreadsheet with the same formulas in return for a disk mailer (no disk required—I've got a lot of used 3-1/2" disks) with return postage, or \$1. I can also provide 360K or 1.2MB disks, but you'll have to send a blank disk along with your mailer.


MURPHY'S LAWS (of DX)
