

#### SPRACHMAN'S CORNER: DBS IS HERE!!

By the time you read this, the first DBS (Direct Broadcasting Satellite) transmissions to the home will be in operation. The first DBS satellite, called DBS-1, was launched in December, and tested in March and April. Two separate services will be using DBS-1, "Direct-TV" and "USSB." Each will use the new Digital Compression technology. Receiving equipment will include an 18 inch dish and a "receiver/transcoder/descrambler." This equipment should be available nationwhide by this fail.

There are still many unanswered questions. First, both services will be providing different programming. Assuming that the receiving equipment can neceive both Direct-TV or USSB, can a consumer choose which programmers to subscribe to on an a-la-carte basis? USSB has announced at least two "free" channels, but you must receive authorization first. I would want to know if I could get authorization without subscribing to any other USSB services. If it subscribe to no other service on either Direct-TV or USSB, can I could get authorized for the free channels?

And there's more! A second satellite, DBS-2, will be launched later in the year. It will be used solely by Direct-TV and will allow Direct-TV to provide up to 150 channels (or more correctly, 150 "data streams"). What if, in a couple of years Direct-TV vants to have a greater channel capacity and they decide to do what the Europeans do which is to launch another satellite in the same orbital position with a different set of frequencies. Can the receiving equipment be up-graded? Several other companies have announced DBS projects at different orbital locations. One company has announced that their service will compliment the programs provided by Direct-TV. I would want to know if these new DBS services will be compatible with the Direct-TV and USSB expect to have 3 to 5 million subscribers within the next three years. #### OTHER STUFF

First, note the new address & phone number above. The new location is 30km north of the old one, and is already proving much better for DX- for one thing, I've already (May 17) logged four Es signals on TV- my first TV skip in three years! The electronic mail address has not changed. (I have, however, written it in Internet format for the benefit of potential electronic contributors on systems other than Compuserve.) If you've already submitted something to 14 Brookside Court, don't worry: the post office will forward it.

Also, I've acquired a fax modem. Which means I can now accept faxed contributions, provided you call first so I can turn the auto-answer on. (I've only got one phone line, which has to be shared between the fax and voice calls)

The call change for WKCH-43 above is not 100% certain, it came from Matt Sittel's sister who wasn't sure she had the new calls right.

Finally, there have been some questions about whether the TV database I had at last year's WTFDA convention will be available. I do plan to have something ready for general distribution by the end of the summer. It'll list USA and Canadian (and some border-area Mexican) TV stations, including LPTVs, by channel number & state, providing networks, power, tower height, and transmitter location. Also planned is a call-letter cross-reference. I don't really know yet how much it's going to cost to print but I'd wild-guess the price to be on the order of \$25-30.

A letter to the editor of Broadcasting and Cable from the general manager of WJKA-26 (now WSFX-TV) notes the process of changing affiliations isn't quite as fast as recent reports may make it seem. The chronology:

Jan. 12: CBS announces at affiliates meeting they've lost NFC rights.

Jan. 13: WKA GM meets with Fox executives

Feb. 15: GM informs owners he's investigating a network change.

Feb. 22: GM informs CBS of potential change.

Feb. 22April 6: GM contacts Nielsen, their sales rep, and six existing Fox affiliates to ask for opinions.

April 4: WSFX-89.1 Nanticoke, PA gives permission for callletter change. (Other Stuff, contd.)

April 6: WJKA GM meets with CBS, requests 500% increase in compensation.

April 12: GM signs Fox affiliation contract.

April 13: CBS sends note revoking affiliation.

For the record, WJKA's GM indicated overlapping coverage (presumably from WBTW-13) was the primary reason for the network swap.

The new Paramount Network has announced some programming plans. Programming will begin sometime after January 1995, and will start on Mondays and Tuesdays between 8 and 10mm Eastern.

Fox has added two new affiliates: KJWA Grand Junction, CO (I have no listing for any unbuilt CPs in Grand Junction..) and (currently-dark) KVCT-19 Victoria, TX. A third, unannounced, primary affiliation was signed in late April.

The "Big 3" TV networks have stopped, at least temporarily, the viewership move to cable. In the 1993/1994 Nielsen ratings season, network TV's share of viewing rose from 60% to 61%. Viewing of independent stations also rose 1%, from 9% to 10%; PBS viewing was flat at 2.3%. Fox lost, going from 12% to 11%, though one can expect that trend to be reversed next year with the football contract. (note that Nielsen's definition of an "independent" includes all "superstations" except WTBS) Advertising sales 6 revenue are also up at over-the-air stations.

The FCC has told the U.S. Court of Appeals it will attempt to rule by May 23 on whether Rainbow Broadcasting, licensee of WRBW-65 Orlando, violated the "ex-parte" regulations. (these regulations prohibit private meetings between Commission officials and applicants in disputed cases) If the charges, brought by the owners of WKCF-18 there, are upheld, the Commission will likely rescind their extension of WRBW's construction permit, preventing it from going on the air as planned.

WYVN-60 is for sale. The ad in the May 9 issue of Broadcasting & Cable indicates the station is currently off the air.

#### FORUM

#### Dave Nieman, Akron NY:

Dave forwards an item from the May 5 Buffalo News regarding a potential network swap in that market. The report indicates WIVB-4 officials are negotiating for a NBC affiliation; the station

has been CBS for over 40 years. As the market's third VHF station, WKBW-7, is owned by ABC, a WIVB-4 change would almost certainly end up with WGRZ-2 going CBS.

While CBS is still the #1 network, a WIVB switch to NBC would bring the station the Buffalo Bills games (recently lost by CBS), as well as NBA and baseball programming not available on CBS. Also, the Today Show does much better than CBS's offering in Buffalo.

(interestingly.. the photograph of the station published in the paper is of WBEN AM/FM/TV, which I believe was owned by the paper at the time— the FM station has been WMJQ, and the TV WIVB, for at least 10 years—)

Another item from Ernie Wesolowski (I think) via Keith, from Omaha, notes the NTV network (KHGI-13, KWNB-6, KSNB-4) plans to expand into Lincoln. K22CX, which has been authorized for years but never built, is finally in the works. The article indicates many Lincolnians currently watch KETV-7 from Omaha, but KETV management doesn't seem concerned about competition from the new translator. KCAN-8 Albion (which has a pending application to move to Lincoln) says its plans to move haven't changed either.

NTV management also says they're interested in carrying the Fox NFL games. I'm not sure how this will work with KTVG-17 in the same market planning a Fox affiliation— but the same article indicates NTV is working on an LMA with KTVG, which might allow this.

On a similar subject, the Columbia Missourian notes that both KRCG-13 and KMIZ-17 there are in negotiation to carry the Fox games. The market's fourth commercial station, KNLJ-25, is a religious outlet.

Keith has been looking at some TV Guides & notes that both Scottsbluff, Nebraska stations (KDUH-4 and KSTF-10) carry "Rush Limbaugh" and "Cheers"— and indeed, both carry "Cheers" at the same time! He also wonders whether their primaries (both stations are satellites) KOTA-3 Rapid City and KGWN-5 Cheyenne are aware of the anomaly. I suspect they are & really don't care, with

Scottsbluff being a relatively small market even by comparison to Rapid City & Cheyenne.

Another thing he noted was religious programs on KBDI-12: "Is this legal for a PBS/ETV?" Probably, if noone complains. No, my understanding (and Keith's) is that stations which receive funding from the government are not allowed to air religious programs; this would be considered government support of an establishment of religion, which is unconstitutional.

But to my knowledge, KBDI does not receive federal funding. It's a "viewer-sponsored" station, similar to the Pacifica FM stations. (KPFA, KPFK, KPFT, WBAI, etc.) As such, it's free to air any kind of religious programming it chooses to. I understand KBVU-11 Provo, Utah (which is owned by the Church of Latter-Day Saints) also airs religious programs, for the same reason.

Interestingly, I have heard religious programs on radio stations (WOI-640 Ames, Iowa and WVCP-88.5 Gallatin, Tenn.) which I believe receive government funding. I suspect they get away with it because noone's yet complained.

#### Randy Miltier, Ashland OR:

Randy sent a large stack of information from Oregon. First, regarding "Dark Stations", he notes KAEF-23 Arcata/Eureka, CA and KMVU-26 Medford, OR are both on; KAEF as a satellite of KRCR-7 (ABC). KMVU was a satellite of KZ5AS ("KLSR"), the Fox affiliate in Eugene, but on May 3 Randy noted them relaying KOBI-5.

The Ashland, OR Daily Tidings TV listings include a "3 ANG" 42 and a "KTBN"-57. The "3 ANG" is actually Three Angels Broadcasting, though Randy says they ID as 3 ANG. I don't have a listing on this station. "KTBN"-57 would be K57EK Medford; while all these TBNs are at least partially satellites of KTBN-40 Santa Ana, I have yet to see a KTBN ID anywhere outside southern California.

From the San Jose area, Randy notes a "KBI-TV"-31 with an all-news format; reportedly their transmitter is on Monument Peak, above Fremont. (KICU-36 and KSTS-48 are also at this site) "They actually do a pretty good job for a LPTV station...better than some UHF's I've seen!" Sounds like my new local, W43AG Hopkinsville, Ky., which also does an excellent job with a news format. I'm having some difficulty figuring out what this station is though- K31BI is licensed to Kingman, Arizona. Could this actually be K30BI, which is licensed to Palo Alto?

An item in the May 1 Portland Oregonian notes that the paper will now carry listings for "WatchTV". This network consists of a transmitter on channel 19 (K19CT) at Camas, Wash.; on channel 56 (K56EI) on Mt. Scott in Portland; and on channel 66 (I've no listing) at Newberg. The three transmitters provide coverage from Salem, Ore. to Longview, Wash. Programming includes National Empowerment TV, Seattle Mariner baseball, and local programs. WatchTV president Greg Herman says more LPTVs are planned, for Eugene, Newport, and Bend.

Finally, Randy sent the May 7-13 Oregon State Edition of the TV Guide, which confirms the existence of relatively new stations KEVU-34 (which is a non-Fox independent, in a market where the Fox affiliate is a LPTV!), KMTZ-23, KFTS-22, KDKF-31, KMTX-46, and KEPB-28.

#### John Combs, Orlando FL:

Well, it happened yet again ... WTTA-38 Tampa, while airing a rerun of "Gunsmoke", managed to cut in 9 seconds of video of group sex. An unidentified employee resigned the next day; station management believes the employee was watching the sex film in a control room & inadvertently threw a switch putting the program on the air. Personally, I find it hard to believe TV station employees still dare to watch this stuff at work, after the number of incidents of this type reported.. though that might not have prevented the other incident John saw on WEVU-26 shortly after their signon; a hard-core pornographic movie had been shipped in a canister labeled for a Lloyd Bridges film.. (even then, wouldn't you think someone would at least spot-check a movie before putting it out for air?!)

Also, John reports seeing WRBW-65 testing in early May with ID 3/4 bars & program audio! He said their signal was very noisy, even with his antenna (and preamp) aimed directly at the tower. Apparently the tests weren't using anywhere near their authorized 5000kW power. The station is already listed in the Orlando TV Guide (though to my knowledge it still isn't running regular programming) with standard reruns. An item in "Other Stuff" above indicates WRBW's legal problems continue.

#### Fred McCormack, St. Paul MN:

Referring to Bill Draeb's report on WXGZ-32 returning to the air from its original tower, Fred notes a March 29, 1994 permit shows new coordinates. The old tower was at 44°21'32"N, 87°58'58"W, with the new one at (Forum, Fred McCormack, contd.)
44°21'30"N and 87°58'48"W. Fred speculates there may have been a double typo on the FCC's or Factbook's part, though I note that the second set of coordinates are the same as those of WGBA-26's tower. It had been earlier reported that WXGZ planned to go on WGBA's tower; now I'm not sure where they're going!

Fred also noted Joel Rosenberg's logging of a channel 63 translator of WNYB-49 (TBN) and asks "Do you know if he was referring to W63BM, Rochester?" (no, I don't know) "If so, I believe there are now two WNYB-49 translators there." Interesting, yes, there's already a TBN (W59BV) in Rochester- and W63BM is on the same tower as W59BV. I can't find any other 63s in western NY State which could be translating WNYB, unless one which had been translating something else changed.

#### Bill Hale, Boise ID:

Bill forwarded a number of wireservice items. Starting in Canada, the sale of several New Brunswick Broadcasting Co. stations has been approved by the CRTC. CHSJ-4 (which presumably includes rebroadcasters in Bathurst (CHCR-4), Bon Accord (CHSJ-TV-1, ch. 6), Moncton (CHMT-7), and Newcastle (CHCN-6) was bought by the CBC.

Also sold were CIHF-8 Halifax, Nova Scotia and CIHF-TV-2 (ch. 12) St. John. While not mentioned, I'd assume this sale included the other Maritime Independent TV stations, ch. 11 in Fredericton; 27 in Moncton; 9 in Bridgewater, NS; 18 in Truro, NS; and 20 in Wolfville, NS. These stations were sold to Izzy Asper's Can-West, also owners of Global in Ontario, and a number of stations across Western Canada. The move brings CanWest/Global affiliates in all provinces except Quebec, Prince Edward Island, and Newfoundland.

Another item notes Fox now claims 97% of TV households will receive the Fox football games, either via secondary affiliates, regular affiliates, or cable. 42 new stations have signed at least secondary affiliations since the football rights were won.





In checking the dials seriously for the first time in 4 years, one notices the effects of FCC Docket 80-90 which not only created hundreds of new channel allotments but in conjunction with Docket 84-231 in 1984 which relaxed spacing rules, leading the way to intermediate station classes (C2, C3, B1, etc.) opened up hundreds of on and offchannel upgrades and additional petitioner-backed channel allotments often in "rim shot" situations or cities-of-convenience within major metro areas. Springfield, Missouri is probably the most plagued market in the country with these new channels, move-ins, upgrades, etc., some of them with severe coverage flaws. KGVX 105.9 was cont.....

SOUTHERN FM DX Germond, cont. plaqued with shadowing problems from its former site near Pleasant Hill, licensed to Bolivar, MO. When the FCC allowed in certain cases for new cities-of-license to be designated, KGBX successfully petitioned for relicensing to Nixa, MO, another hamlet within the Springfield metro and recently moved to a new, closer-in tower near Strafford, MO which pushes their 70 dBu (3.16 mV/m) contour over all of metro Springfield.

So goes Oklahoma City, so goes Tulsa in FM broadcasting in Oklahoma....OKC country stations KEBC(Keep Every Body Country) 94.7 and KXXY 96.1 became owned by the same broadcasting company last year. Now in Tulsa the company owning KVOO 1170 AM and KVOO 98.5(both country) has bought country KCKI 99.5 Henryetta-Tulsa, a station that once served primarily Henryetta before moving to a higher tower closer to Tulsa. KVOO program director thinks country music is fragmenting into different styles appealing to different age groups. The young crowd just wants the latest in country music with no news while the older crowd doesn't mind some old country with the latest along with some news and information. But what else is going on just reflects taking advantage of FCC rules made more liberal in late 1992. Now a company can own a maximum of 36 stations from 24 and two FM stations from one. I didn't clean up on it but companies like Clear Channel Communications saw their stock more than doubled a year after FCC changes. (DB)

This is my first contribution to the Western TV-DX column since joining the WTFDA. did receive a brief mention in Anthony Mann's report back in the March 1986 Eastern TV-DX column.

In 1979, I installed my first outside rotatable yagi ariel for TV-DX. I was 15 years old and still at school at this time. Within a year of installing the yagi, several countries were noted on TV including BBC ch B1 audio (England), TDF ch F2 audio (France), ch R1 Vladivostok (Russia), ch C1 (China) and ch E2 (Malaysia). I first heard about the WTFDA through reading Roger Bunney's TV-DX column in the English magazine Television. In 1986, Anthony Mann visited my place and gave me selected photostats and spare issues of the DX Digest covering 1978-1986. 

## **ANTENNAnotes**

by Dr. Feedpoint

So by now it's hoped that you all have a deep appreciation of how important a good antenna is for DX'ing on VHF and above. But...how the heck do we know just how good a particular antenna is? You know...how good is it compared to having no antenna at all? How good is it compared to something like a simple pair of "rabbit ears?" How does it compare with that old Sears "\$39.95 special" that Pawent for when he bought that first color TV way back when everyone just had to see what that goofy new "Batman" show looked like in color?

The function of the antenna is to provide your tuner with signal. The better the antenna, the more the signal-generally speaking. The more signal that the antenna can give you, the more GAIN it is said to have. The higher the antenna gain, the more signal it can deliver at the tuner, for a given signal strength.

Under normal conditions there can be some signals present just about 100% of the time at the level of your roof that are too weak to listen to on FM, or too weak to produce a locked-into-sync recognizable picture on TV if you were sitting up there with a pair of rabbit ears or the ribbon twinlead dipole that came "free" with your tuner as it came out of the box. For the sake of argument, lets just say those "ears" or that piece of ribbon twinlead has a relative signal gain value of "1" on a scale where "1" means "times one."

If you want to have any hope of turning that rooftop ambient signal into something you can use, watch, listen to, sing along with, cuss at, etc., You have got to have MORE of it. This is where the concept of a "gain antenna" comes into play. Years of research have produced those elaborate aluminum arrays we have all come to know and love and lust after, because when properly installed, they will offer significant "gain" over those aforementioned simple rabbit ears and ribbon dipoles.

A top-line "deep fringe" antenna, placed up at the same point on the roof where you were sitting with those rabbit ears, could easily provide your tuner with TEN (10) times the signal that was available from just the ears. This kind of thing makes a big difference. Signals formerly unreadable or unrecognizable now "lock in." The number of signals you can recognize across the band increases. Long distance DX opportunities now abound. Thus, we have demonstrated what increasing antenna gain does.

In our little comparison, we used the examples of the rabbit ears or the ribbon twinlead dipoles as the basic antenna. In practical applications, engineers also have specified a standard reference antenna upon which to base all their gain measurements. This hypothetical standard antenna is the half-wave dipole. The length of an actual half-wave dipole would depend upon its design frequency or channel. Thus, in the real world, such a reference dipole would only be built for a single channel. When built according to a standard design, this dipole would exhibit unity gain or a gain factor of exactly 1.000 at that frequency.

The best way for engineers to communicate gain values to each other came to be through use of the decibel system, originally developed to measure audio power. The decibel (abbreviated as "dB") is used in electronics as a quick and easy way to express the ratio between two values of power, or the ratio between two voltage values across a standard impedance.

The dB system is based upon logarithms, and without getting too deeply into theory, let me emphasize one very important thing to remember in understanding it: when you are expressing something in dB, you are not talking about how many times. With dB, its all relative. On the one hand, 100 volts is 100 volts, pure and simple. Or you could say 1000 watts is 1000 watts, and that's that. However, 10 dB gain means nothing at all in terms of amount UNLESS you first have a reference to base it on. "My antenna has 10 dB gain..." will not have any real meaning as a statement unless it is first understood that the 10 dB gain is referenced to a standard. That standard, for our purposes, has got to be the aforementioned standard half-wave dipole cut for the particular frequency or channel in question.

#### ANTENNAnotes...

The amount of gain that any antenna offers is determined by its design. Most all successful VHF antenna designs, and quite a few of the UHF ones, are based upon the half-wave dipole and its refinement, the Yagi-Uda antenna. There are TV and FM antennas on the market that have 0 (thats ZERO) dB gain or less in their design range. Does this surprise you? Well, it shouldn't. Keep in mind that the dB system of gain measurement is relative, with 0 dB gain equal to UNITY GAIN or a gain factor of 1. Thus, you can have a 0 dB gain antenna and still pick up signals, and in fact, a pair of those aforementioned "rabbit ears" often will only show about -0.7 dB gain on the best channel.

Using an antenna to DX frequencies well outside of its design range or resonance often doesn't produce very good results; the reason why could be seen by measuring gain on the frequencies concerned (admittedly, this is easier said than done, but is possible using accurate test equipment in the shop, such as a field strength meter). You might have a channel 13 cut-to-channel yagi that you try to use for DXing on channel 2. That yagi could offer about 10.5 dB gain compared to a reference dipole on channel 13 (such as the General Instrument J105-13 MATV model). Trying to use it down on channel 2 though, would be difficult. You'd find this antenna's actual gain at that channel to be well into the negative numbers, indicating that even a pair of rabbit ears would surpass its channel 2 performance.

Most DXers probably would not go to the trouble of using a cut-to-channel antenna for each channel or frequency of interest. The optimum installation would have antennas for each <u>band</u> instead. This means TV DXers would use a broadband antenna for 54 to 88 MHz (TV channels 2 through 6), another one for 174 to 216 MHz (TV 7 to 13), and finally a UHF model for 470 to 806 MHz (TV 14 to 69). FM DXers need a model to cover just 88 to 108 MHz—and would do well to avoid DXing that band with most kinds of broadband TV antennas, since the models designed for TV often show sharp gain "roll-off" above 88 MHz. In fact, some of them are designed to do this on purpose, to minimize potential FM broadcasting interference to channel 6 TV.

Gain is a concept best understood by the engineer and the technician. For that reason, antenna manufacturers seem to go out of their way in avoiding it when it comes down to dealing with consumers. This leads us to the somewhat sad situation, in the mid-1990's, of most all "top-line" antennas marketed more to the installer than to the consumer. What this has produced is bizarre "mileage" ratings for TV antennas sold at Radio Shack, Wal-Mart, etc. These ratings are also, in and of themselves, relative. The Radio Shack approach is to display the antenna something like this: "Model VU-110- for reception up to 110 miles." Hunh? Does that mean 110 miles in free space? Over water? On the moon? Nobody at Radio Shack seems to know. Their best model for VHF is called the V-185. Trust me--you won't meet too many people who use it to regularly to watch TV signals over a 185 mile path. If RS ever finds out about E-skip, will they start calling it the V-1200? Actually though, Radio Shack just followed the trend in making mileage claims for their antennas; this kind of thing started a long time ago when the "marketing guys" for many manufacturers realized that the general public really doesn't know how to interpet dB gain claims and ratings.

So the do-it-yourselfer, and this means YOU, the DXer/experimenter, has to "dig" a bit to find out the "specs" when it comes to antennas. Actually, thats not such a bad thing. The more you understand about antennas, the better the choices you are qualified to make. Remember the above example of using the channel 13 yagi to DX channel 2? Well, it may seem like a good idea at the time, but understanding how lousy the gain at channel 2 actually is on a channel 13 antenna is enough to prompt you to make a better choice - like actually whipping out those rabbit ears instead, or better, getting yourself a lowband or broadbanded antenna better suited to the task.

Getting the spec sheets on a particular model of antenna is often tough-to-impossible for anyone who is not a dealer/installer. That's usually not too much of a problem for all but the most fanatical enthusiasts. A better way is usually to find out what kind of top-line antennas other enthusiasts are using with good results and to get one for yourself. It's important, too, to consider the fact that most moderate sized all-channel antennas will be capable of receiving some DX signals. Serious DXers found out long ago that the best VHF results can be had from the top-line VHF-only antennas offered by major manufacturers such as Winegard, ChannelMaster, General Instrument, AntennaCraft, etc., often coming within a dB or so of each other on the gain curves, but with important differences in other specifications such as bandwidth, beam patterns, and so forth. These differences are all due to the variety of designs each company uses to maximize gain. In fact, most TV and FM antennas are actually "hybrids" of the Yagi-Uda and Log Periodic antenna principles.

Finally, you will find that boom length will always play a big part in the design of a high performance antenna. Usually, the longer the antenna boom is, the better it tends to be for DXing, and for reasons more than simply increased gain. Problems arise when a manufacturer takes an antenna design and shortens overall boom length to reduce the unit cost. True, the number of elements in the antenna are what, for the most part, determines the antenna gain; but proper spacing of the elements is most critical in the Yagi-Uda to achieve the best gain for the length of boom involved.

In the next column, we'll look at some other antenna specs you might encounter—and what they mean.

#### LIGHTNING AND E-SKIP: 'CULPRIT' REVEALED AT LAST?

Sporadic-E type signal propagation is the thing that brings in long distance channels 2 to 6 DX, FM broadcast band DX, and AERO band DX most mornings in late Spring and early Summer. But all the "official" findings published about what causes it deny the obvious, which has been suspected by many people for a period of many years. It's like who really killed Kennedy... somehow, you know THEY know but they won't admit it.

Well the cats' now out of the bag; so to speak. VHF ham radio operators observe and use Sporadic-E skip themselves, mostly on the 50-54 MHZ 6 meters ham band, usually at the same time we DX'ers have good TV skip DX.

Ham Radios' excellent magazine CQ has been featuring the "VHF PLUS" column of Joe Lynch, N6CL, who hit the nail right on the head during this winter when he first revealed the publication of research on the very thing we DX'ers have suspected all along.

Aviation Week magazine, the famous and well respected aerospace publication, featured a report, "NASA Confirms Odd Atmospheric Flashes," in its 10-18-93 issue (it can be found in many libraries). The report details how two ionospheric scientists, Drs. David Sentman and Eugene Wescott studied and even managed to photograph HIGH ALTITUTE lightning flashes during summer '93. Around the Kansas/Nebraska border at an altitude of 40,000 feet along a line of severe thunderstorm activity, extending very high into the ionosphere! Of interest is the fact that there appeared to be about one "upward" strike for every 300 of the conventional cloud/ground or intercloud lightning flash.

It is theorized that these flashes extend upward as high as the 60 to 65 mile height of the "E" layer, the place where, of course, sporadic E skip ionization clouds or "patches" were heretofore somewhat mysteriously formed! Everything from meteor dust to wind shears usually is blamed for causing E skip cloud or concentrated ion patches to form in the layer. These patches are the actual "mirrors" that reflect DX signals back to Earth.

TV DXers very often see stations coming in from an area where there seems to be heavy thunderstorm activity either (a.) imminent or (b.) occurring. In fact, in typical late spring/early summer sporadic E openings, this seems to happen more often than not. Personally speaking, my longest and shortest E-skip catches from Lynn, Mass. were stations that just "happened" to be showing severe thunderstorm and tornado warnings, such as I've seen on Omaha, Nebraska and Wilmington, North Carolina channel 3 stations.

I have also noticed that the early morning "Today Show" type weather maps they show daily often will give you a good idea of where a day's E-skip is going to come from. Just watch them, and notice the areas posting severe weather warnings. Later in the day, usually starting about 10-11 a.m. you will see and hear E skip DX coming FROM THE SAME AREAS! Coincidence? You be the judge.

More research is being conducted, and exciting developments include suggestions that somehow the "D" layer of the ionosphere may also be involved in the process that results in sporadic E skip. Up to now, that was the "good for nothing" layer that absorbed signals, often hampering signals at the HF (SHORTWAVE) frequencies Final "official" conclusions may still be years away-but I personally feel that now the "lid" has been blown off the so-called sporadic E skip "mystery." Now, if those of us involved in DX research would only look closer at previously ignored trans-Oceanic E-skip openings, maybe the whole story about sporadic E-skip can finally be told!

#### URBAN SIGNAL DIFFRACTION EFFECTS

I read Frank Aden, Jr.'s article on knife edge refraction (KER) propagation in the October 1992 V.U.D. with great interest. I have seen the phenomenon while vacationing in Colorado, and can attest that the effects really are remarkable, with TV stations one should nor be able to receive being watchable in places where one might least expect! A similar effect can be heard on a car FM tuner, although it should be noted some Denver area stations have extremely high transmitting antennas, adding to the results.

I wonder, though, how many DXers outside of large urban areas are aware of similar effects caused by man made structures. High-rise office buildings and water storage towers do produce some interesting results. Science tells us that electromagnetic waves of all lengths diffract when they have a radiopaque object such as a building or mountaintop in their paths of travel. Much of the ghosting one can see in a TV picture, especially in the New York City area and to a much lesser extent places like Boston (and even Albany, New York with its South Mall State Office Complex) is due to such buildings. Yet, there must be away to exploit the existence of these buildings to the DXer's advantage. If any of our reporters out there has been able to use a building, or water tower, etc., as a DX reflector, getting long distance reception reflected from the structure in a situation where it could not be seen on a direct path, I would like to see details of this. Perhaps someone can come up with formulae that we could all use to predict where this effect might take place, based upon the height of local
