

I'll eventually get my hands on a word processor, and finish going through 100+ hours of taped 2400+ mile tropo DX, and write up all the details of the fantastic California/Hawaii duct. See Forum for more information on channel 55 in Lake Dallas. In the Pittsburgh area, WPCB-40 is moving to channel 16. It will then sell its channel 40 facility to Paxson (INtv) for \$35million, and turn over half that money to WQEX's former owners. (who will still run WQED-13)

OTHER STUFF

I'm introducing a new symbol in this column this month. The caret (^) symbol indicates a digital TV station. Since DTV stations have no offset, this symbol will appear where the offset would go.

OTHER STUFF

The Canadian trade magazine *BT* indicates new CIVT-42 Vancouver has also been granted a rebroadcaster in Victoria. I've seen nothing on this, and the CRTC database is no longer available on the Internet (at least not where I last found it) so can't look it up there. CIVT itself is expected on the air in September. In Quebec, the switch of CKMI-5 to Global (and the signon of its transmitters on channel 67 at Montreal and channel 11 at Sherbrooke) is also scheduled for September 1. This would imply a new station (relaying CBMT-6) would sign on in Quebec City at the same time. I haven't seen a channel or power for that operation though. Finally, the new "A-Channel" stations in Alberta also expect to sign on in September. These are channels 2, 5, 20, and 51; maybe someone will see one on late-season skip?

The U.S. and Mexico have signed a "memorandum of understanding" on the subject of digital TV. The two countries plan to assign a second channel for all existing TV allotments. (this has already been done on the U.S. side; it will now also be done in Mexico.) This agreement also establishes distance separations for DTV allotments, and establishes a 275km zone on either side of the border where DTV allotments are subject to international consultations. The FCC is now concentrating on concluding a similar agreement with Canada.

I've had to condense the type & drop some of the LPTV information this month — the column was just getting too big! The FCC has deleted the NTSC Table of Allocations to allow for DTV; it looks like they don't plan on issuing any more construction permits for new NTSC stations. However, they were supposed to begin accepting DTV applications on May 1. So far, I haven't seen any, but I expect them by the end of the summer. Not only will the DTV applications themselves appear in the Public Notices (and this column), but so will many modifications to NTSC facilities triggered by DTV. As many as half of all existing stations will have to move their NTSC transmitting antenna on their existing tower, replace it with a shorter antenna (which will change both their ERP and HAAT), or in situations where they're leasing tower space from another station, they'll often have to move to a totally new tower.

FORUM

John Lentz, Muskego WI: Neil Kazaross, suburban Chicago IL: Bill Draeb, Kewaunee WI:

All three of these members have seen WOCH-LP Chicago on its new channel. With 47KW at 357m HAAT, (on the John Hancock Center) this station has as much coverage as many full-license stations. John says he's seeing it with The Box music videos parallel to WMKE-LP channel 8 in Milwaukee. Bill has seen The Box, and also a blank screen with ID supered. And Neil is seeing ethnic programming mostly in Korean - in the evenings. This station should be a good target for lake tropo.

John Lentz also had a few comments about digital. He writes, "I think once the changeover is complete, thus so it ends TV DX'ing. I believe there is also a plan to change FM over to digital. Once that's over, thus also ends the FM DX hobby and will probably end the WTFDA club as well since there will no longer be TV and FM DX." John wrote before the "DTV Q&A" appeared in the VUD; I'm hoping I've changed his mind! Seriously, I hear a lot of DXers expressing doomsday sentiments about digital being the end of DX. I believe digital will no more end VHF/UHF DX than the elimination of the 250-watt minimum for night operation of AM stations eliminated AM DX. Digital DX will be different, and in some ways more difficult, but it'll be there, and in some ways it'll actually be easier.

Chip Kelley, Dallas TX:

"Global Shopping, in its buying spree to start another shopping network, is buying news KNWS-51 Katy/Houston. Apparently, the actual switch date will be in June. KNWS has let go all its news anchors and is dropping all the local news in favor of just using ANC and Bloomberg's feeds until the change occurs." Chip also says the owners who are selling KNWS are the same people behind the new licensee of channel 55 at Lake Dallas. KLDT has, in fact, lost its license renewal, but the license doesn't expire until August. It's still on the air with Shop-At-Home. According to Chip, the original plan was to have the Dallas station also be an all-news operation, sharing programming with KNWS. However, the Houston operation wasn't profitable, and infomercials were being folded into the programming mix.

Neither Chip nor myself know why KLDT was "un-renewed". When it was controlled by a well-known national preacher, the minister's staff was caught discarding unopened mailed prayer requests. However, I don't think that's grounds for non-renewal of a broadcast license. Chip says there was some question about the true ownership of the station, whether it was truly controlled by the woman whose name appeared on the license, or by her son. That's a more likely ground for non-renewal. At this time, the new station still hasn't acquired the old KLDT facilities; their CP still calls for construction of a totally new station.

Robert Grant, Detroit MI:

Construction hasn't yet started on WWJ-62's plans for new studio facilities or the new transmitter. (Robert, the answer to your question about WWJ is above under "changes granted". The coordinates given aren't the same as WWJ-AM, but they're very close and definitely on the same premises.) Robert believes the station is still being operated by remote control from NYC by satellite!

The slow upgrade has spurred a variety of rumors about CBS's future in the market. One suggested CBS would buy WKBD-50, which already has a news department and a larger tower. Another suggested the network would purchase Post-Newsweek's stations including WDIV-4. The most exotic rumor was that CBS would trade WCBS-2 to Post-Newsweek for WDIV, then have Post-Newsweek sign a 10-year CBS affiliation contract for WCBS! Robert doesn't believe there's anything to the latter rumor, and I fully agree! To be honest, I don't think there's much to the other two either.

When WGPR-62 became WWJ-62, the ethnic programming it used to carry was supposed to end up on Dearborn LPTV W68CH. Robert isn't seeing even a carrier on this channel, and asks "I assume the CP has been cancelled (has it?)". Yes, the CP was cancelled on March 12 of last year, but a petition for reconsideration was filed last April 10. The FCC still hasn't acted on that petition, so W68CH is not yet dead.

Going down to Florida, he comments on "fake channel" IDs in the Fort Myers market. You've probably read about WZVN-26, which calls itself channel 7 in all logos and IDs. Robert says WBBH-20 there is doing the same thing. Their cable channel is 2, and their IDs use a "2" logo in a red square, with the NBC peacock.

Roy Barstow, Teaticket MA:

Roy has some info on a number of stations in his area.. Starting on WOST-69; Roy called the station. He was told the station is currently operating only four hours a day (just enough to keep its license) — apparently the owners don't even care which four hours. A sale to - you guessed it - INtv is being discussed. On to WLWC-28; Roy has been unable to find any telephone listing for this station. However, while testing the week prior to its regular-schedule signon (April 7), Roy noticed many different test patterns — including color bars with a WJAR-10 ID. Their newscast (wow, not many WB affiliates have local news!) is promoted on WJAR, and the monitors on the set show WJAR programming. I have read that WLWC is operated by LMA to someone, and now I think we know who! Finally in the newstations department, WHCT-18 is operating "bankers hours", 9am-5pm only, with Worship. This station's license is still in dispute at the FCC, with claims that a fraudulent claim of minority control was made to save it from a license challenge years ago.

Now for the "it doesn't have a license" department.. Roy is still seeing the station from Elizabeth City State University (North Carolina) on channel 18. The station airs scrolling text of university information, with audio from WRVS-FM 89.9. It IDs about every 10 minutes as W18BB, and Roy sent a photo of ID color bars showing those calls. Problem is, W18BB is no longer in the FCC Database! It does appear in the 1995 TV Factbook, but it hasn't been in the database since the first of the year. It should be said, that the FCC has been known to "lose" stations before - stations that actually held valid licenses have simply disappeared from the database. As the Factbook says W18BB began operation in 1993, its license can't have expired, so either it never applied for an operating license or the FCC indeed "lost" this station.

Another mystery is a "WPEN" on channel 24. There is a WPEN-LP on channel 68 in Hampton, VA. (formerly W68BI, Driver) Roy called WPEN (757-722-9736) and was told they operate channel 68, a channel 51 (W51BH Gloucester), and a channel 62. (W62CN Virginia Beach) They know nothing about channel 24. (nor did the person he spoke with know about the application WPEN-LP's owner has filed for a new station on channel 21 at Virginia Beach. However, she did tell Roy they're taking over WJCB-49 Norfolk. This station has an application for a substantial power increase, and they told Roy they expect it to be on the air by November. There are an awful tof applications for channel 21, and I guess WPEN figured they didn't stand much of a chance<griin>.)

I speculate this is another case of "phantom translators", much like Roy's reception of WTVD-11 on channel 37 last year. Translators exist at two sites in eastern Virginia, repeating the four major Norfolk stations. One of these translators, W52AB Craddockville, translates WHRO-15 onto channel 52. A second translator, W25AA Onancock, translates WHRO-15 onto channel 25. My speculation is that W25AA doesn't actually receive WHRO-15 directly, but rather on channel 25. My speculation is that W25AA doesn't actually receive WHRO-15 directly, but rather on channel 25 from W52AB. If this were the case, then a strong channel 51 signal (for example, from W51BH, which is really quite close to Onancock) could also be translated the next channel down - and come out on channel 24. If this is in fact the case, one should also expect the other three Onancock translators to be capable of phantoming. W25AA could translate channel 51 and 53 signals to channels 24 and 26 respectively; W41AC could translate channels 62 and 64 to channels 40 and 42; W44AD could translate 57 and 59 to 43 and 45; and W60AL could translate 67 and 69 to 59 and 61. Yes, this could be very confusing! Just because a translator is listed as carrying a particular station doesn't mean you won't catch it translating something else, possibly even on the wrong channel!

DTV Q&A & CHANNEL LIST

Doug Smith, TV News editor

Karl Zuk of suburban New York had a few comments about DTV Q&A as it appeared in the May VUD. Karl has first-hand experience with DTV as an engineer with CBS, operators of WCBS-HD channel 33. Addressing some of the specific questions, and quoting Karl:

"What do you see with an analog TV? You have to have sharp eyes and a old analog tuner. The DTV signal looks like a just above noise level slightly different pattern of snow. The center frequency is actually the center of the channel, so if you have a digitally tuned TV, you won't be able to see anything."

I totally forgot about that! Modern digitally-tuned TVs lock on to the visual carrier of the station. DTV stations don't have visual carriers. Another reason to avoid those blue-screen muting receivers!

"I really doubt the first DTV tuners will have a frame store to capture the last good frame. That kind of technology is still reserved for devices like broadcast quality frame synchronizers."

Karl may well be right about the first DTV receivers. However, I'll be surprised if they wait very long before introducing frame stores. The cost of digital memory chips has plummeted lately. And I'm seeing a growing number of low-cost consumer devices containing at least crude frame stores. The "Snappy" modules sold for capturing TV pictures into a PC are a good example. It's not high-definition, but it's not bad either!

"Noise, like lightning, will definitely interrupt the signal. You'll see it go to black if it's over a certain duration dependent on the redundancy of the data."

True, but probably at a considerably higher strength than is necessary to generate annoying speckles in an analog picture. And until the noise becomes strong enough to cause the picture to go black, you won't see it at all.

The DTV allocation table has now been released. It's too long to print in one part. It'll appear in installments over the next few months. Each new channel listed in this table is assigned for the exclusive use of the station listed. However, two stations may voluntarily swap assignments as long as short-spacing regulations aren't violated.

Channels 2-46 or 7-51 are "core spectrum". Judging from some of the allocations in this table, I would say the FCC is probably going to choose the first option. Stations operating outside this "core spectrum" will have to change channel again when the conversion to DTV is complete in the year 2006.

To create this table, the FCC deleted all unused assignments in the old Table of Allocations. In fact, the old Table is now completely gone and useful only as a piece of history. It appears that most of the new-station applications filed early this year were also ignored in creating this table, those applications don't appear here. The FCC does appear to have assigned a DTV channel for every NTSC channel assigned in Alaska and Hawaii, whether that channel is in use (or even applied for) or not.


GONE FOREYER!

CATCH A WAVE!

FM DX audio recently took a new step forward. . . . into the world of multimedia. If you consider your-self computer-literate, if you happen to own a computer and have an audio (sound) card or are capable of installing an audio card, then Sound Blaster 16 (SB 16) WaveStudio may be just your ticket to capturing those illusive FM station identifications. On the other hand, if computer-stuff is not your cup of tea, then we presume your tape recorder will continue to be an important asset in your dx shack for getting 'hard copy' of important audio information.

Two years ago I began experimenting with SB 16 and WaveStudio 2.0. Ive been FM dxing for over 20 years and up until WaveStudio, documenting was done by logbook and tape recorder. For me, the tape recorder seemed cumbersome, and for that reason, ive missed out on capturing and saving many significant signals. Whenever I submit dx reports to the Southern FM-DX column, I note significant dx that has been recorded with the SB 16 WaveStudio. I recall one time Danny Buntin asked me to explain that terminology to the computer illiterate. Hopefully this article will do that, and also enhance the "fun" computer operators of the club are having.

So, for those that speak 'computerese', you may be chomping at the bit to find out where you sign up for WaveStudio. First, we need to get an overview of WaveStudio and see if it will fit in your computer' system.

The Basics

WaveStudio makes it possible for you to record, play and edit <u>wave forms</u>, a graphic representation of your recorded dx signals. You can cut or copy a segment of a wave form and paste it back into the wave form at a different location - or cut or copy a segment of one wave form and paste into another. Such would be the case if you had just recorded five minutes of dx and one minute was all you wanted to save. You would simply cut and paste the selected 'save' portion and save it under a name, then delete the remaining unwanted portion. This eventually becomes necessary to preserve space on the pc hard drive.

Sound Basics

This small section may be considered a primer by many, but there are some fundamentals of sound which should be covered. Sound is represented by <u>sine waves</u>. A <u>sine wave</u> displays the <u>frequency</u> and <u>amplitude</u> of the sound. <u>Frequency</u> is the number of vibration cycles per second and determines the pitch or timbre of a sound; the higher the number of cycles, the higher the pitch. <u>Amplitude</u>, represented by the height of the sine wave, determines the volume or loudness of a sound; the greater the height of the sound waves, the louder the sound.

A WaveStudio wave form represents an <u>analog</u> sound as a continuous sine wave, a line. A <u>digitized</u> sine wave is translated to a series of dot patterns that resemble the shape and size of an analog sine wave line. <u>Sampling</u> is the process of converting an analog wave form to a digitized wave form. The <u>sampling rate</u> is the number of times the translator, such as SB 16, looks at a sound to create a digitized sound wave image. For example, recording an FM radio signal (or any other sound) at 4 kHz creates 4,000 digitized images or samples of the sound wave in one second.

WaveStudio allows you to record at sampling rates of 11 kHz to 44.1 kHz. The sampling rate determines the quality level of the recording. The higher the sampling, the better the sound. For example, CD audio is high quality and has a sampling rate of 44 kHz at 16 bits.

To use WaveStudio effectively, you need to know the amount of memory needed to run WaveStudio, how to manage your files, and how to work with compressed files. WaveStudio requires about 1 MB of memory. The memory requirement increases when you playback and record wave files - sufficient memory is needed for the buffers. Run WaveStudio on at least a 386-based systems with 4 MB of RAM and Windows 3 X.

When you open a file for editing, WaveStudio allocates a certain amount of memory for storing the necessary information and does not load the entire file into memory. The file is edited directly from your PC hard disk - you can edit files as large as your hard disk can hold.

Toolbar

The Toolbar comprises several buttons and control boxes for file and wave operations.

The buttons on the Toolbar are:

- Opens a new window containing no wave data.
- Opens an existing wave file.
- Saves the active wave file.
- Cuts the selected data of the wave file.
- Copies the selected data of the wave file.
- Pastes cut or copied data onto the wave file.
- Plays the wave file that is currently active in WaveStudio.
- Stops the playback of a wave file.
- Pauses/resumes the playback of a wave file.
- Records a wave file.
- Sets the default recording format
- Activates Creative Mixer.
- Activates the CD player. Note that this button will only appear if you have a CD-ROM drive installed

The control boxes on the Toolbar are:

- id Displays the starting position of the wave data selection. You can specify the position by typing a numerical value in the text box or use the scroll arrows to select the starting position.
- hill Displays the size of a the wave data selection. You can type the size in the text box or use the scroll arrows to increase or decrease the size.
- Q Displays the zoom ratio of the wave file displayed. You can type the ratio in the text box or use the scroll arrows to increase or decrease the ratio. The smaller the value the larger the magnification.

You can use the above control boxes to select a portion of wave for playback or editing; to select a portion of the wave, specify the starting position and the desired size of the wave data you want to work with and press enter.

You will see the selected portion of the wave data being highlighted in the Edit Window. For more details on selecting wave data, please refer to the section on the Edit Window.

File management

When you record your dx wave data, WaveStudio will store recorded data directly to the hard disk. High resolution recording of data, particularly 16-bit data at 44 kHz, would take longer to write to your disk if it is not optimized for speed.

You can reduce the amount of time your system spends reading and writing data by compacting your hard disk using a disk-compacting utility such as DEFRAG and installing a hard drive cache such as SMARTDrive.

Compressed Wave Files

To work effectively with compressed files, you need to know how compressed files are saved, opened, and edited. In WaveStudio, a basic wave file in a saved, unedited form is shown as a .pcm format. Also, you will need to record your audio sampling as a 16-bit file. Compression is not available for 8-bit files. Once you have edited your file, you can save it as a compressed file, showing that it has an .adpcm extension.

WaveStudio currently supports five compression formats: Microsoft ADPCM, CCITT A-law, CCITT-u-law, IMA/DVI ADPCM, and Creative ADPCM.

When you open a compressed wave file, WaveStudio decompresses the file before displaying it. The file must reside on a drive that has sufficient disk space to accommodate the uncompressed data.

The amount of space required depends on the compression format adopted. For CCITT A-law and u-law, the compression ratio is 1:2 (compressed:uncompressed). For ADPCM, the ratio is 1:4. For example, if you are working with a 1 MB ADPCM file, you need to have a least 4 MB of free disk space.

Putting It All Together

Acknowledging that you have loaded the WaveStudio software into your pc, you are ready to run with your new found toy and begin digitally logging all of your significant dx.....OR ARE YOU?? Let's go back to your tuner or receiver and run the loop. Incidentally, if you use a tuner, a 'hi-fi' amplifier is not necessary, as your pc audio card replaces that piece of equipment - your pc becomes your amplifier. That leads you to understand that you will need volume-adjustable external pc speakers. Of course, Sherlock, may we proceed please. So, you run speaker cable from the speaker or output connections from your radio to your pc. In most cases, your pc connection will require a common single stereo connector. This is the type of plug you find on most headphone sets today and are available at radio and electronic stores. To make the connection from the speaker cable to the single stereo connector, you will need to insert a y-connector, which will join the two pieces together. You're now connected to your pc source. From here, we locate our WaveStudio icon in the Sound Blaster 16 directory, double click the mouse (left button) on the WaveStudio icon to open the program application. You'll view on the monitor what is representative of the toolbar. (see Figure 1)

Below the title bar and the drop-down categories, you will see the WaveStudio toolbar. Reading from left to right, you see **pads** (push buttons) for New, Open, Save, Cut, Copy, Paste, Play, Stop, Pause, Record. Format. Mixer. CD. To the right are position indicators for Start, Size, and Zoom.

At this point the chase is on. Your tuner is on - with your cursor arrow, you push the Mixer pad - adjust volume and tone quality - then close mixer. Then you push the Record pad and it opens the right channel/left channel view screen. At this point you are still not recording. To activate Record, you push the Start pad on the Record screen. Logically then, to top the Record session, you will push the Stop pad. At this point, you will view on-screen the digitized sine wave of the recording session which just took place. This particular session is ready for editing, cutting and copying to another location, and/or saving with compression to your hard disk. (see Figure 2)

If you're into a heated dx session - say you're into some really good tropo or there's a major E-skip opening in progress - there is a good possibility you don't want to keep starting RECORD and STOP for each station. Just like a tape recorder, you push the START pad in the Record mode. At this point, you ARE RECORDING. Immediately push the PAUSE pad. SoundWave is now waiting to record. All that is required is pushing the Pause pad. After this recording session, you will go back and edit. You will also delete any unnecessary information. Also, if you have several stations together in one recording session, you may want to CUT and COPY each station to its own file. What a concept in capturing significant dx audio.



Edit Window

The Edit Window is the area where the content of a wave file is displayed. You can open several Edit Windows at a time and display them in a cascaded, vertically tiled, or horizontally tiled fashion. You can also minimize them to icons.



With different wave files displayed in different Edit Windows, you can perform editing functions like cut, copy, and paste from one wave file to another easily and quickly.

For a better view of data displayed in the Edit Window, use the horizontal scroll bar to select data for viewing and use the vertical scroll or the zoom control in the Toolbar to zoom into (or out of) the data.

To select a portion of the wave data for editing, hold down the left mouse button anywhere on the Edit Window and drag the mouse. Once the desired portion of the wave data has been selected, release the left mouse button. The selected area will be highlighted. To select the entire wave, double-click the wave display in the Edit Window.

Hint

If you want to select data from a specific position back to the begining of the data, hold down the left mouse button at the specific position and drag the mouse (upwards) above the Edit Window.

If you want to select data from a specific position to the end of the data, hold down the left mouse button at the specific position and drag the mouse (downwards) below the horizontal scroll bar of the Edit Window.

Note

When you click the right mouse button on the Edit Window, a menu of commands will display allowing you to perform various functions.






