And Gove City has no cable system since the cable TV people say it's not profitable to set up a system there. In this town you need at least a 35' tower and fringe antenna to get anything at all. About a dozen homes have satellite dishes to pick up some decent viewing, but the drawback here is that there is no local programming on the satellite so residents are not crazy about using them. Gove City has the the perfect requirements for a stupid trip. It's miles from anywhere, has no TV, almost no people and nothing to do but DX and do bandscans. You gotta love it. TO QSL, or not to QSL...THAT IS THE QUESTION

Some of us send out reception reports; some of don't. I did a long time ago and I bet many of you did too. DXers today are finding a troublesome situation. Not many stations reply anymore. Recently member Mike Condon posted a question to the DXers in the amfmtvdx@qth.net to ask why this was so. From a reply rate of 99% before the 90s, and then dropping dramatically, he felt something was wrong in the world of qsls.

Our own Tom Bryant replied to Mike, and I pass this on for all of you to digest and comment on. Tom said that to begin with, stations don't owe you a reply. Here's Toms top 5 reasons stations don't reply to your requests: 1) No time. Too few people with too much work to do. 2) They don't care. If you are outside their coverage area they don't need you. 3) Contract engineers. Since there's no chief engineer around, you will find no one person who wants to handle reports. 4). Ignorant employees. Have no clue what a reception report means and throws them in the trash. 5) Cost cutting. Budgets are so tight that there's no money to reply to you. And add to the mix that many younger engineers are computer-teck types who have minimal knowledge of rf gear. So, what do you think? If you would like to put in your two or three cents, this is the place. If you send out reports, how is your situation going? An abatement of new digital channels this time around, but a few surprises. The recently launched PanAmSat at 58 west has lit up with an ID slide at xpdr. 22 - and also an array of digital channels running from 700 - 713. Most of these are not identifiable, but one has color bars and 710 is IDing as Union Radio - La mega - Caracas with incredibly horrible US music mix, 711 - white noise, and 712 - an all news station carrying CNN Internacional en Espanol, BBC en Espanol as well as others - location is unknown. There are also digital channels on a newly added CF satellite whose location is unknown as well as a Ku-designated bird - KF with channels 100 - 350 - no video noted will keep you informed. Please note that when ever I list a channel and designation it may not be "in the clear" - but has had some form of identification. Consider the array recently listed for Telstar 5. All of these are part of a TCI Cable thing and are not now in the clear or, for that matter identifiable.

WFLX-DT's power appears in the FCC Public Notices as 21601KW, obviously a typo. It's correct in the database, as 216,01KW.

A directional antenna will probably be required to protect WICU Erie, PA and possibly WJRT Flint, MI. (Ontario DXers, it could have been worse: there were rumors they'd planned to move to channel 3 instead!)

WFHL [23] changed to WCPX, then changed their mind & decided to get WPXU instead. (freeing up WCPX for use at a co-owned Chicago station) Again, all the PX stations are with the new PaxNet network, and the KBD- calls were randomly assigned by the FCC. (and will probably be changed before the stations go on the air.) For what it's worth, as of late March, 511 LPTV stations had replaced their alphanumeric calls with -LP calls. That's a little over 7% of all LPTVs.

OTHER STUFF

The Telecommunications Act of 1996 required the FCC to, every two years, review its multipleownership regulations. The Commission has issued a Notice of Inquiry asking for comments on seven specific regulations:

- National TV Ownership Rule. This rule limits one owner to stations reaching 35% of all TV homes. (but only half of these homes count for a UHF station, see below)
- UHF Television Discount. This policy means that only half the viewers to a UHF station count
 when determining whether an owner is exceeding the 35% of the national audience it's allowed to
 reach with multiple stations.
- Dual Network Rule. This rule prohibits common ownership of any two of the major TV networks (ABC, CBS, Fox, NBC), or of any one of the major networks and either of the minor networks. (UPN, WB)
- Daily Newspaper/Broadcast Cross-Ownership Rule. This rule prohibits one company from owning a daily newspaper and a radio or TV station in the same city. (however, it's frequently waived)
- Cable/TV Cross-Ownership Rule. This rule prohibits ownership of a TV station and cable system
 in the same market.
- . Local Radio Ownership Rules. (as the name suggests, these don't affect TV)
- Experimental Broadcast Station Multiple Ownership Rule. This limits how many experimental broadcast stations may be licensed to the same owner.

(which prohibits common ownership of a radio and TV station in the same market. This rule is often waived.)

Many TV engineers are discovering some surprises in the new digital tables – their stations are being required to use directional antennas for their DTV operations. Some of these DTV patterns are extremely tight, and some engineers fear it may not actually be possible to build the antennas required. Under the existing regulations, the nulls in the directional pattern of a TV transmitting antenna may not exceed 10dB. (15dB for UHF) I've plotted a few DTV patterns using data off the FCC Web Page, and they're reminiscent of patterns used at AM stations! (if you aren't familiar with AM directional antennas, many have nulls of 30dB or more - sometimes so much more that there are places where you can see the transmitting antenna but can't hear the station!)

Note that a CP has now been granted for the long-awaited new channel 2 in Fredericksburg, Texas. Whether a NTSC facility will actually be built on this channel is a good question.

Please note my new email address. The old Compuserve address will be phased out soon. Thanks to Chip Kelley, Fernando Garcia, Ernie Wesolowski, and Mike Lazaro for information appearing elsewhere in this month's column. According to Chip, KXAS-DT [41] began operation on the last day of March with the Texas Rangers' home opener.

FORUM

Jeff Kadet, Macomb IL:

Jeff has some information on TV in Indonesia. The country has six TV networks:

- Televisi Republik Indonesia (TVRI)
- Rajawali Citra Televisi Indonesia (RCTI)
- Andalas Telvisi (AN-TV)
- Indosair
- Surya Citra Televisi (SCTV)
- Televisi Pendidikan Indonesia (TPI)

TPI, RCTI, and Indosair carry non-Western programming and are heavily Islamic. The other stations carry a variety of American and other Western programs (including Ricki Lake, which Jeff found quite surprising in such a conservative country). Also aired are soap operas, a Family Feud clone called Famil 100, many children's shows, and "Hindi movies badly dubbed into English with Bahasa Indonesian subtitles."

An evening newscast is carried on all six networks in parallel. Normally, stations sign off around 1am. But during Idul Fitri (an Islamic celebration of the end of Ramadan), they stay on all night. My understanding is this is common practice for broadcast stations in all Islamic countries. Indonesian TV is fully commercial, with most ads for household products and beauty aids. Jeff's motel room sported a rather unusual TV antenna. I've forwarded the photo he shot to Jeff Kruszka for Photo News; maybe one of our members can identify it?

Fernando Garcia, Monterrey NL:

The bilingual religious LPTV network in south Texas has changed its name from "Family Television Network" to "La Familia Television Network". K30FF, K55GJ, and K67HC operate in parallel with Spanish-language religion, though the ID doesn't mention K55GJ. K52FR shows "La Familia Television Network" on their ID too, but programming is Worship and Network 1.

Danny Oglethorpe, Shreveport LA:

Danny sent more excellent ID photos, especially from Mexico. He also sent word his local LPTV K15EG seems to be on regular schedule now, with NET. Another item from the Shreveport *Times* hints at the programming of KNTS-LP [17] Natchitoches. The station expects to be on the air about the time you read this. A satellite network is planned, but the station manager wouldn't tell the paper which one.

DX ETC.

Congratulations to Sheldon Remington on his record-breaking tropo reception! To the best of my knowledge, this exceeds by over 1000km the longest tropospheric reception ever reported, on any frequency and by any radio service. One has to wonder, how much further can this duct go? Honduras? When will someone in California log a Hawaiian station?



From his northwestern Illinois location, he has clicked the shutter almost 3500 times. No matter that some are less than perfect; they're a DXer's dream...and many are historic.


Bill was kind enough to bring his collection to Nashville so I could scan, store and digitally enhance them as much as possible.












Postscript from your editor:

TV DXers face a number of problems identifying DX stations which they receive. The greatest problem is probably that the stations identify only infrequently and some incorrectly.

As editor/publisher of *The 50 MHz DX Bulletin*, I receive and publish many reports of radio amateur's DX reception of TV video carriers, and occasionally of TV sound.

Some transmissions betray their country of origin by their frequency, but usually there are many stations on the same frequency within a country or group of countries.

How much information must a TV DXer have before he can count an ID for VUD listings? (Your editor is a newcomer to all this!)

The most obvious ID to me is the call letters on the screen, which may be photographed. At one time I thought that was the only ID that counted. Most program content is carried by several stations simultaneously. News and local commercials are an obvious exception. The sound is a further aid to identification, but is it sufficient by itself? Can I just tune my R-7100 to the TV audio frequencies without even knowing if a picture could be received and count that as a TV reception? Sounds more like an FM station reception, but you don't see such reports in our FM columns. How about non-broadcast TV? Like studio to transmitter links and remote trucks? Do they count? (Probably, not, I don't see satellite TV reception reports here either!)

There are additional identifying parts of a TV transmission, call letters appearing in the vertical blanking interval for instance, multiplex, and second audio program (SAP). Is reception of any one of these alone sufficient?

If any of my readers has been putting off getting his feet wet, and starting TV DXing, I offer the following words of encouragement. Now (or earlier) is the time to start, before most of the UHF channels (in your area) are swallowed by digital and high definition TV.

Solar activity is increasing each month. It's still been a bit low for E-W 50 MHz F2-layer propagation (in temperate latitudes), but paths that pass over the geomagnetic equator have been open frequently: our southern states to South America, Europe to Africa, and Asia to Australia/New Zealand.

Bob Cooper, ZL4AAA, of TV DX and satellite TV fame, submitted a report after a couple year's absence. From Far North, New Zealand, during the month of March, he received TV video carriers from Queensland, Australia on 46.17 MHz, from China/USSR on 49.75 MHz, and from NSW Australia on 46.24 MHz.

I have been receiving regular reports from Stuart Kingan, ZK1AA, in the Cook Islands of Hawaiian TV station video carriers by transequatorial scatter propagation. When I questioned him about receiving either a picture or sound, he remarked that they were dispersed too greatly to view or understand.

Now I've seen some photos of TV DX, and have heard some radio amateur signals so close to the noise that one had to use no small amount of imagination to pull them through. I wonder how some of our more experienced viewers would do pulling transequatorial TV DX IDs out of the noise. I suspect that audio only would be a lot easier than video.

Lightning--Striking Me Again and Again!

I have been hit by lightning twice directly and once it struck a tree a city block away. My system was the Channel Master 7 ft dish and the 15 ft VHF antenna with a combination Channel Master two piece amp. The system was on and we were watching UHF when the tree was hit. The RF energy was so powerful that it overloaded the front end pre-amp transistor on the VHF side and left the UHF alone. All other equipment was fine.

My first direct hit was a similar system but with separate amps. There were 3 antennas on a thirty-foot tower on top of my garage, because the village, near Chicago, had an ordinance against towers in the yard. The top antenna was a CB ground plane and was not corrected to the radio. The tower was not grounded and it was not the highest structure in the neighborhood. The ground plane was vaporized. The garage door opener brain fried, a light switch in the kitchen blew off the wall, circuit boards in the FM receiver failed, the TV amps fried, both of them, and the picture tube in the 25-inch Zenith TV turned magenta. I was later able to re-tune it. The insurance company had a living fit.


Here at North Star Valley, 30 miles N of Madison WI, I placed the Strato Beam 160 ft system on line at the end of last Summer. It truly is my DXers dream come true. We built a modest house, our way, on top of a hill with an elevation of 850 ft. Brand new antennas, screened UHF dish Neil Kazaross-style, \$400.00 worth of custom-built amps by RDX Labs, and 3/4 inch hard line separate coax as used by cable TV companies. At the top of the mast there is a 1 inch, 4 ft solid copper lightening rod soldered to it above the dish with the 15 ft Channel Master VHF at the bottom.

I was on my way home and had a clear view miles ahead of me when the storm, not forecasted, was in sight. I saw the long single bolt descend down from the sky...which I knew was over my hill. My heart sunk in my chest and I heard myself exclaim "Please God, I just got that system up, not now, not yet, not this soon!" When I got home, my wife Berta was having trouble hearing me speak and the had spots before her eyes. She said "...you won't believe what just happened!" I trambled with fear and I could not bring myself to ask. She was standing in the garage when the tower was struck. It is directly up-against and behind the garage and the cables come in stop the rafter, make a turn, and go into the house. The blast stunned her hearing and she said it was like standing inside a plasma ball, or that white light people see near death. I have three ground fields extending from each leg of the tower, that's one for each leg with two 8 ft ground rods on each field, the second at the end of the 10 ft run. The ground here is sandy and does not offer good grounding. Where the wires - rotor and coax - meet the house, I have quick-connect molex connectors for the rotor, a \$400.00 Yeasu. I did have the separate coax cables disconnected and the equipment in the house was still connected but turned off. The tower and all its electrical equipment was disconnected and nothing was harmed or damaged. Some kitchen outlets were dead and one breaker in the basement was tripped. I had not completed the grounding to the house system yet. It was looking for more grounding. When I related this story to Jim Dietrich at RDX, he was surprised.

My friend Bill Eckberg, also a long time member of WTFDA, once took a direct hit and was not disconnected--and lost his equipment, rotor and control box as well as the antennas. I hope I got that right, Bill.


Once a direct hit has been made, it is possible the ground enveloping the ground rods has turned to glass, making the ground system less effective or just plain no good anymore. This is why radio and TV stations will sink new ground systems every so often. Some TV stations will sink a water well and never install the pump just to use the well casing for grounding. My system is being extended to my well in the next weeks. Some people pour a salt or brine solution where the ground rods are to maintain good grounding.

There is an excellent video shown on The Learning Channel (TLC) that explains what we know of lightning today. Several "feelers" leave the ground and reach up to meet the main bolt on its way down! One more point: it is known from Space Shuttle photos that for every 50 strikes of lightning that reach the ground, there is one that reaches up into the ionosphere. It is now being proposed that these "Sprites," as they are called, are what causes the ionization in the "E" layer, and thus, E-Skip. 73 to all and a good year coming!
