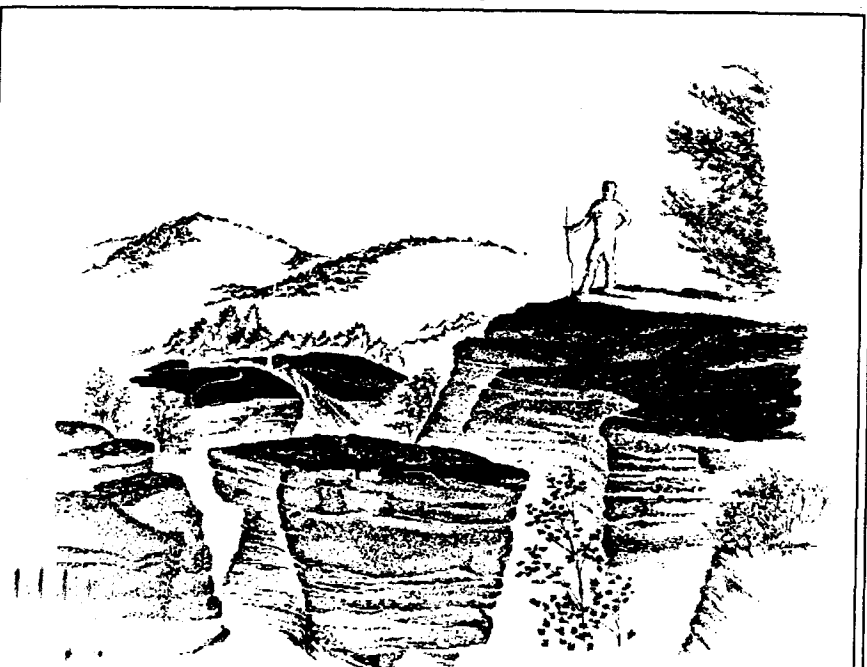

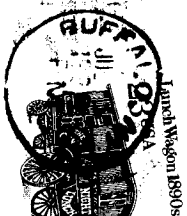

FROM THE STAFF:

E-SKIP IS BACK: Mediocre seems to be the most accurate word to describe the onset of the 1998 sporadic Es season. Although there have been reports from nearly all sections of the U.S. and Canada, it appears that the number of openings has been somewhat below normal. This month's columns will enlighten you as to what's been reported thus far. Good luck to all.

THEY'RE HERE: The 1998 parade of club conventions is led off with our annual affair less than a month from now. Preliminary registration, according to Dave Nieman, has been sluggish; however last minute signup has become more the norm than the exception. Based on recent convention trends, there will be a good crowd the weekend of the 31st in southwestern New York state. Basic information on all club conventions appears below.

NRC TO LEAVE ANARC: The National Radio Club announced in the June 15 issue of "*DX NEWS*" that it would not be renewing its membership in ANARC, the umbrella organization for over a dozen radio hobbyist clubs in the U. S. and Canada. The NRC cited several factors which prompted the decision to sever their long relationship with the Association of North American Radio Clubs. Similar questions have arisen regarding ANARC's value to the WTFDA, and our ANARC representative Jim Thomas is in the process of briefing members of the Board of Directors on the situation as he sees it. You have probably observed that the decision making wheels turn quite slowly in WTFDA, therefore it will most likely be fall before any official statement regarding this development is made by our Board. What is likely, in view of the allegations by an organization with which we share strong ties, will be a thorough review of our ANARC affiliation. If you have any thoughts on this, please pass them along to any Board member or send them to Mike Bugaj for publication in *MAILBOX*.

Reading last months Mailbox regarding QSLing was Fred Vobbe, chief engineer of WLIO-35 who writes: "In these days of dwindling verifications, it's nice to know that some stations do verify. At WLIO television, all accurate reports are verified with a card and usually some extra items. As an active AM/FM/TV Dixer, I offer a card which will verify reports of not only our tv station, but also the auxiliary services in the 450 band, and the 26mhz IFB channel. In addition to this, there is also a QSL for reports on the amateur repeaters at WLIO which operate on 6, and 2 meters and 440. So far the furthest report I have received for WLIO is Madison, WI. For the UHF two-way it's Chicago. The 6-meter repeater was heard in Paris, TN, and the 26mhz was heard in Cincinnati OH." Thanks Fred for your input.

GET READY FOR IBOC?

There is a new station on the air, and this one is just a bit different. A couple of people have heard the new station with the calls WD2XAB, operating out of Columbia, MD. WD2XAB is an experimental station on 93.5 with a license to test the IBOC (In Band On Channel) digital broadcasting system. This system lets broadcasters transmit a CD quality digital signal with an analog signal at the same time. Of course you will need a new receiver to pick up these digital signals, and a new IBOC receiver will be introduced in the year 2000. US Digital Radio is hoping that over time broadcasters will turn from analog to Hybrid IBOC (analog and digital simultaneously), and then turn off the analog signal at some future time and keep the All Digital signal. USDR's web site is www.USDR.com. Ain't technology great, or what? Have a great month.

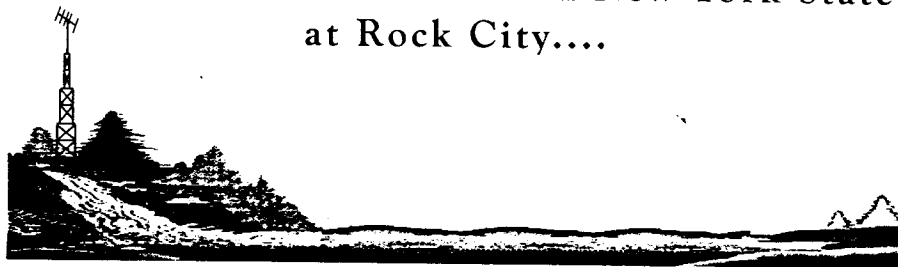

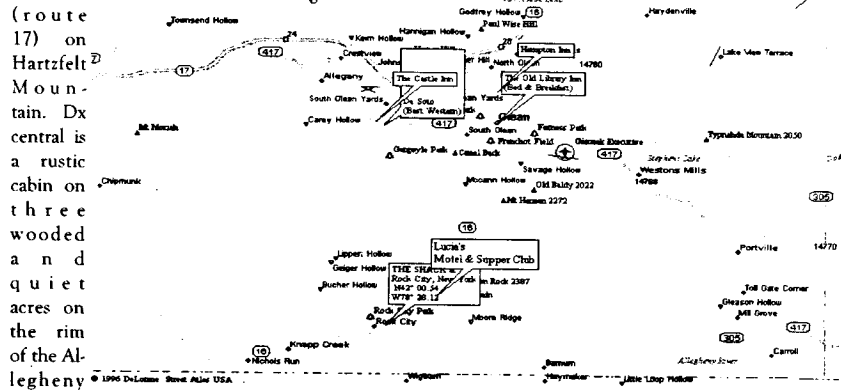

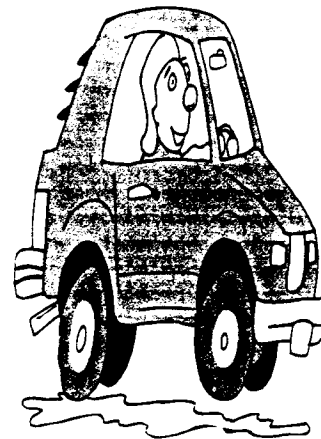

• The National Hockey League (NHL) asked for temporary FM licenses in Detroit and Washington in conjunction with the Stanley Cup playoffs. These would be indoor arena broadcasts during the series, with the calls "WN2XHL". Frequency would be 88.1. So if you heard an unusual broadcast near these areas, this is what it was. No word on exactly how they intended to use the license.

• Dan Cashin sent in some interesting articles on radio from the *Philadelphia Inquirer*. One article describes WVLS in Monterey, Va. which signed on the air in 1995, with only 200 watts (89.7) in this small Shenandoah Valley town. It's sister station is WVMR-1370 Frost, W.V. from which WVLS gets its programming until 6 p.m. The format is varied, anything from country to new age, to rock. WVLS signed on as part of the three station "Allegheny Mountain Radio Network" and operates with a \$52,000 annual budget. The station proved very useful during the serious flooding of 1996, for this area where local radio and TV is so sparse. In case you were wondering, WVLS stands for "Virginia's Little Switzerland", a name given to the Highland County area, because of its high elevation, and very snow winters (for Virginia) .. Another article deals with the recent demise of classical music radio WFLN, 95.7 in Philadelphia (they're now "modern AC" WXXM "Max"). There has been a trend in recent years towards commercial classical music stations giving up the format, which troubles some fans of that type of music. Dave Conant, of the former WFLN, is more optimistic, however. When WFLN changed

format, public radio station WRTI 90.1 picked up Conant and some others from WFLN, and added classical music to their schedule from 6am to 5:30pm weekdays, and Saturdays from 11am to 6pm. This paid off for WRTI, as they beat Philly's two other public radio stations (WHYY 90.9, WXPB 88.5) for the first time ever in the ratings. Despite a backlash from some listeners for restricting its popular jazz programs to fewer hours, WRTI's revenue from its membership drive increased from \$150,000 to \$340,000. The station now plans to move into Temple U.'s new Apollo sports complex. WRTI may also be gaining assistance from the fact that WHYY 90.9 is moving away from classical, and more towards a news and information format. WWFM 89.1 Trenton (with a translator on 107.9 serving parts of Phila.) runs classical programming from syndicated sources, such as WFMT's Chicago Beethoven Satellite Network, but WWFM's signal does not reach all of Philadelphia... Another article in the *Inquirer* discussed Stephen Dunifer of "Radio Free Berkeley". If you have not heard of Stephen, he operates that station in Berkeley, CA, with mostly what could be described as activist-oriented programming. He has also taken up the "cause" of promoting micropower stations all over the country, of which he thinks there are now upwards of 1,000. (his web site: <http://www.freeradio.org>). Another interesting twist in this case is that he is the only one that I know of, at least, that has won the battle against the FCC, so far. Twice, a federal judge in California has refused to grant FCC's attempts for an injunction against Dunifer's station. U.S. District Judge Claudia Wilkin has yet to rule on Dunifer's broader constitutional claim for "free broadcasting".

• Some updates from Dennis Smith: he confirms some recent format changes, such as 107.3 in Grover City, CA becoming smooth jazz KQJZ, and KOJJ 100.5 being all Spanish, as "La Maquina" .. The 106.9 Santa Barbara translator of KMRO 90.3 continues to have trouble with interference from XHTZ90.3Tijuana. And thanks to some sentiment in the area, 107.7 returned to the more traditional calls of KIST ("Kissed"), which were in the area on AM for 60 years. A station spokesman said "Our listeners missed the KIST call letters so we applied immediately to reclaim them." Dennis also noted the May 19th demise of the Galaxy 4 satellite. While listening to an apparent new LPFM on 100.9

in Wasco, Dennis heard conjecture that it was a solar flare that disrupted this satellite. He has heard that solar flares can retard Es in the summer time, and notes that there was not very much skip in that period. (Can anyone comment on this?)

• In recent testimony before the Senate Subcommittee on Communications, on June 10th, FCC Chairman Bill Kennard spoke about the pirate situation. He claims that the FCC has shut down about 200 stations, and has a "state-of-the-art" inventory of the remaining pirate stations, which he estimates at about 100. Pirate radio advocates, however, place their estimate closer to 1,000.

• Speaking of pirates, David Cox has an update on the "WSGN" pirate mentioned earlier this year in FM NEWS. This pirate, on 1630 & 100.1 in the Birmingham, AL area was running Tuesday evenings from 7 - 10 p.m. David checked the final Tuesday and May and found no sign of WSGN on 1630. However, he did hear a 100.1 playing 60s music, but jingles, commentary, or commercials - just dead space between songs. Since WSGN played 60's music, and the signal strengths were similar, David suspects this is still WSGN-FM. Thanks for keeping us posted!

• More pirate news (I didn't think I would have that many, so didn't make it a "formal" part of the column this time, but maybe I should have!) ... Ken Simon reports that 96.1 in W.Palm Beach, "WILD", is still active with an urban format, and acting just like a commercial station. One spot urges listeners to contact the FCC, demanding WILD be granted a license.

• Chip Kelley notes that most of the Shreveport market stations use a dual ID of "Shreveport-Bossier", even though the latter city is actually Bossier City. I've noted this a few times myself, I believe. In a somewhat similar example, some of the station on the Niagara Peninsula of Ontario (generally defined as between Hamilton and the Niagara River), ID as simply "Niagara", rather than St.Catherines, Welland, etc. Chip was also kind enough to send a wealth of format and slogan information from TX-LA-MS, which appears above in the appropriate states' listings.

• Doug Smith sends information on digital radio grants in Toronto. The following conditions of licensing were placed: "the undertaking use no more than 20% of the digital capacity of the 1.5 Mhz channel specified for use by the geographic grouping of broadcasters to which the undertaking belongs" (Doug comments: "Three

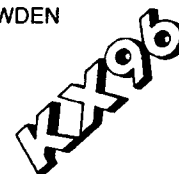
of these frequencies accommodate five stations each. Limiting each individual station to 20% of channel capacity ensures that all five stations get a fair share of the bandwidth). Another condition: "each digital radio signal broadcast by a transitional DRU associated with an existing AM or FM undertaking be broadcast from a single primary digital radio transmitter that is located so as to ensure that the resulting digital radio coverage area does not exceed the lesser of (a) the licensee's corresponding FM or daytime AM coverage areas (that is, the 0.5 millivolt per metre coverage area for both AM and FM stations), or (b) the digital coverage area allotted to the licensee under the Department of Industry's spectrum allocation plan, unless otherwise authorized by the Commission."

WDPG 89.9 OH Greenville, has been off and on sporadically, due to transmitter problems. What the hell is wrong with WAYK 88.3 MI Kalamazoo and WUFM 88.7 OH Columbus? I've tried for both these stations hundreds of times and no trace of anything! They must have extremely weak power in my direction, if they really are on the air.

MUNCIE'S 107.5 FM IS BUSTED BY FCC

Last fall a car was seen being driven in Muncie with a sign in the back window reading 107.5 FM. It finally dawned on someone that a resident in the northeast section of Muncie had a huge tower in their backyard. A quick trip to this residence and - bingo! Not only was the car in the driveway, but a blue paneled truck was also in the driveway with a sign in the back window reading 107.5 FM. A quick trip to the Ball State library showed that residents at 1405 E. Robin Lane were David L and Carolyn Costello. Then a look in the Ball State directory proved even more interesting. David L Costello in the Chief Engineer for VIS (Video Information Systems), in the basement of Bracken Library on the Ball State University campus. VIS is a service whereby a faculty member can take a video to the library and have it shown in the classroom where you are teaching. VIS also has the capability of picking up satellite TV stations for viewing in buildings on campus. Therefore, this is right up Mr. Costello's alley!

On a beautiful sunny October afternoon, someone walked down the railroad tracks behind the Costello residence with a polaroid camera. Pictures of Mr. Costello's 200 foot tower and the satellite dish he was using to pick up the American Freedom Network in Denver, CO were taken. The pictures, Mr. Costello's residence and work phone numbers, license plate numbers of his car and truck, as well as an easy to read map directing the FCC to 1405 E. Robin Lane, were all sent to the FCC by the informant. In late November, David L Costello received his letter from the FCC to cease and desist. Finally, on December 2nd, the 107.5 signal was gone. I don't know if the letter scared him off or if it was the fact that the building housing the American Freedom Network in Denver was gutted by a huge fire. The fire was attributed to an overheated hot plate that had been left on in an apartment in the rear of the building. However, on Christmas eve at 1700 EST Mr. Costello put his signal back on the air. This time he was rebroadcasting a religious station mentioning KMAK 100.3 in Orange Cove, CA. This time the signal was about half the strength that he was originally broadcasting with. Even so, it was detected immediately. The informant was so mad he went to a pay phone and telephoned the Costello residence. Apparently, the Costellos were not at home, as all he got was an answering machine. The following message was left on his machine: "We know you've put your pirate FM back on the air! You have no license to operate an FM station legally. Therefore, we are giving you five minutes to turn off your signal. If it isn't off in five minutes, we are phoning the FCC in Chicago tonight. So turn the xxx xxxx thing off! It took about five hours for the signal to be taken off the air. Needless to say, it hasn't been on since! I predict Mr. Costello was operating with at least 8 watts of power at 200 feet above average terrain. This was no Ramsey kit operation, that's for sure!

Now a message to Bruce Elving: If you want to comment on this in FMedia! that is fine, but please don't mention my name. The Music building at Ball State is next to the library, and I don't want anyone questioning me about this situation. I've promised the informant I would never reveal his identity.

Now to top it off, Muncie has four more pirates on the FM band! These stations are called "Companion Radio." They are satellite feeds for a nursing home here. They are on the frequencies of 101.3 103.5 105.3 and 107.9. Power is estimated at one watt. Residents living near the nursing home in a half mile radius can not pick up 101.3 WFMG Richmond, IN or 107.9 WPTI Indy. The same informant wrote the FCC about this, but nothing has changed as yet.

Whoever told Bruce Elving that a WCER on 88.1 with 3kw was on the air in Indy badly mistaken! Never, with WRTV-6 there. The two pirates on 90.5 with one-tenth of a watt are still on. They are weak and don't bother anything. *13-Ralph*

Three stations so far for the year, but I am not complaining. I only had 10 new catches for all of 1997. New to me is WCUP 105.7 L'Anse MI with stereo, country. I called them and they said the transmitter is in Herman MI, which I cannot locate on the map, with studios across the peninsula in Ontonagon MI. They were surprised to have a listener west of Duluth. Received 05-15-98 after I noticed tropo was up, at 0003. Earlier in the evening, while trying for skip, I had WIAA *88.7 Interlochen MI off the back of my antenna.

One of the outstanding tropo openings to central Nebraska was the morning of May 18, 1998 when I received the new call letters for Columbus NE, KKOT. It was previously heard as KTTT-FM. Its ""Coyote" nonID is not strict; usually they say the call letters. Received with perfect stereo for several hours. Also heard KRVN-FM 93.1 Lexington NE with stereo, ""Lite 93" mentions and legal ID at 9 a.m. CDT. It was clearly enough heard that I could tune in their 92 kHz and hear KRVN (AM 880) which is relayed on that subcarrier. I previously talked to chief engineer Vern Killion and promised him if I ever hear KRVN-FM I would write. So ends a better than 30-year quest to receive that station in northeast MN. Also heard NE on 102.3, but by ID time at 11:01 it was KOLK Onawa-Sioux City IA that was received. KOLK has stereo, country and strict nonID: Colt Country.

My main 10-element FM antenna and rotator blew off about 2 months ago in a storm, so I am using a smaller yagi antenna attached to a short pole off the back of the house. The tower stands; I had the antenna hoisted too high above the tower and knew it might crash down some time! I plan to file an insurance claim and go for something even better. What do you and the membership think of Ed Hanlon's APS 14 antenna? My tuner, incidentally, was made in or near Buffalo NY. It is a Fanfare FM, modified with more selective i-f filters— I believe with a 150 and a 110 kHz.

Skip May 28 brought KGCB *90.9 Prescott AZ, \$, gc. Other AZ frequencies heard were 88.1, 90.3, 91.5 (with KJZZ replacing the KMCR calls I had there from years ago). KJZZ had two SCSES, 57 kHz RDS data and the 67 kHz "Sun Sounds" reading to the blind. John Ebeling tipped me off, he was getting Flagstaff 92.9 over local WSCDuluth.

Skip June 1 brought one new station, WSCQ 100.1 West Columbia SC, Stereo, 5:12 p.m. CDT, and WHRO-FM *90.3 Norfolk VA. I am not counting WHRO-FM as a new station, even though I previously received it on 89.5. Also heard WETA *90.9 Washington DC (previously heard with its former WETA-FM call letters) and WHYH *90.9 Philadelphia PA (previously heard as WUHY). I FAXed John Doran, c.e., WHYH- FM-TV my 1975 verification of report of reception of WUHY for his amusement.

The trop opening on May 28-29 only yielded KICT 95.1 outside of a 250 mile (402 km) range, but a lot of new stations on the air in Illinois, including both full power relays for WIBI 91.1 (WBVM 89.7, taking out regular KYMC, and WSCT 90.5, next to local KWMMU), a few adjacent channel stations in central and southern Illinois, and a station that has moved from AM to FM (WTIM 97.3, which moved from 1410 kHz).

The Es opening on June 1 began with severe CCI on locals 2 and 4 (the latter nearly obliterated). So, I checked the FM band and sure enough, several New Englanders and Quebecois (using Quebec's native language) were in! The first sign was CBJ-3 on 93.1 from Dolbeau, airing a talk show from Societe Radio Canada (SRC, which is CBC's French Network). Also noted WOKG 97.5 (x-WOKQ) with mentions of an upcoming charity concert, and one of the businesses mentioned was Frisbie Memorial Hospital in nearby Rochester, NH. After 1830, the action pretty much shifted to the mid-Atlantic states, with the first stations in from Washington, DC (finally penetrated the Beltway!) in the form of WMZQ 98.7, WKYS 93.9 and WGAY 99.5. Another Baltimore station was added to my book in the form of WPOC 93.1 (already have WRBS 95.1), and the first Virginia station heard at this QTH (WBQB 101.5). The skip may have even reached TV channel 7. 73, Eric (NOUIH)

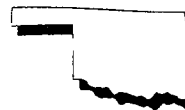

Comments: The ICOM R-100 is a welcome addition
to my UHF shack, as WJWJTV would never have
been caught with 16 WBOC MD in firm control of TV.
WUNJTV was almost overlooked as being Allentown,
PA until I noticed that area was shut out of this
opening and was wrong offset so I took a second look.
The night before, I saw Boston weather predicting a
stalling high from Cape Cod to Florida (and a high to
my east). I called Roy Barstow after catching SC. He
noted NC in good at 11:00 a.m. and the next morning
Florida blitzed his location.

Radio Caracas TV has a new look upon it's
WELCOME visit to New England. It has several easy
ID's. One is a "revolving ball" with RCTV wrapped
around it. The easiest ID is a "sombbrero" in LR
corner. I heard their "yelling music" at ID time(s) so
many times I have it memorized. Also seen was a
commercial selling some kind of pills for what
appeared to be a fortune. Oddly with everything in
Venezuelan language (both video and audio) at one
point it showed "TV Store" in English even though all
other writing was "spanish". At another time during a
cartoon, a promo for "Runaway Angelica" showed on
the screen (Runaway in English). also saw promos
for Third Rock from the Sun in spanish. I saw "TIO
RICO" (Uncle RICO). I saw "De Bolivares" on the
screen. I don't know if this refers to Ciudad Bolivar or
if it has some other meaning. Many Venezuelan
words aren't in my Spanish dictionary. I saw an
apparent phone number 800-30-800 and cartoons. I
saw no sign of Trinidad and Tobago Television this
time around. Two years ago they had a logo lower
right with three non-capital t's in an oval block. When
in weak, it looked like a cement block with three holes.
They spoke English.

PR Ided with "T" for Telemundo many times also. I
made a quick call to Roy when it started and when
RCTV came in he was getting RCTV also. (We
compared tapes.) With 5 RCTV stations on CH-2 in
Venezuela I don't know if we were seeing the same
station or not. Roy's 2 Es report will be in next month.
The VHF antennas fed into an A-B-C switch into my
VCR was a major improvement. PR came in best on
the horizontal stacked antennas, probably because
the vertical was picking up too much coastal skip.
When Venezuela came in it favored the vertical at first
then it was pretty random after that. The next day my
local station showed a big storm had been in the
Caribbean during this event. This storm effect has

This report is for May 1998. Any times are PDT.

I was looking forward to lots of summer skip. Some was seen in Santa Barbara on an indoor whip antenna:

May 16 1845-1930, only 1 stn, KMID-2 Midland TX (1000 mi), ABC, 1900 Big 2 News. MUF ch 3 (offset CCI u/local KEYT)

May 19 1805-1820, ch 2 CBS, ch 4 signal. no IDs

May 30 1800-1810, ch 2 weak. No IDs

I was in Wasco on May 1-3 and 21-25, where I have outdoor 4-bay UHF and 1-bay VHF conicals. Expected good Es openings, especially in late May, but nothing. How come? Here is a possible explanation.

Widespread news reported Galaxy 4 satellite went out of control May 19, approx 3:30 PM Pacific Time. Some radio, TV, and lots of pagers affected. No report as to why the malfunction. Then, on May 22 in Wasco, I listened to a new LPFM in nearby Delano with satellite connections and the only place I heard the following report, whether factual or conjecture, about a solar flare hitting the bird and frying its computer circuitry, effectively killing it. The approaching sunspot cycle was also noted. If I remember right (is this correct?), a solar flare off-season can produce immediate Es (same day), but if it occurs during the summer season, it retards Es, along with the sunspot cycle increasing. So, I'm wondering if there was a start to summer Es season which was suddenly interrupted by this apparent solar flare.

The only other Wasco DX noted were three new LPTVs, all new regulars.

May 2: A new Channel 28, VCC shopping, good strength. Direction and strength are similar to the Ch. 42 TBN Coalinga (northwest), so I suspect this is also Coalinga (approx 80 mi).

May 2: A new Channel 25, 3ABN, Bakersfield direction (southeast). If it is Bakersfield (25 to 45 mi), it may be usable right there, but anywhere else in the region (such as Wasco), it is sandwiched between KCEE-24 Fresno and KMPH-26 Visalia. In Wasco, with tricky tuning, I could get almost no usable visual and somewhat good aural.

May 22: A new Channel 42, southeast (25 to 45 mi). Color bar test pattern with ID which I think was (consistent though weak) "K42EJ Bakersfield."

Note 1 - Barely legible graphics announcing coming programming, with background test audio from KZBL 100.7 on ch. 17 only.

Note 2 - Initially thought I had Tampa (WFTS-28, ABC) off the back, then saw a 28 with a star in the middle followed by a Lubbock ad, and my jaw

dropped to the floor! This followed by KOCV-36 in Odessa, and I thought I must be dreaming! Furthest DX to the west. What's next...Amarillo? El Paso? New Mexico?!

Note 3 - I don't know why I haven't seen this one before! Either they are not on the air very often, or else this was some very isolated opening. I don't even see how anything else could block its reception, not even KVTH. Strange.

Note 4 - A very interesting local morning show, with a guy hosting it on location from the back of his pickup truck! Taking phone calls from Alex(ander) City (//station on 64) and Montgomery.

Note 5 - Thanks to a tip on-line from Bill Hepburn's forecast! I logged this one while I was chatting live on the wtfd chat, I couldn't contain my excitement! Fox 41 news, "Kentuckiana Ford dealers," Carriage Ford in Clarksville (IN) ads. New tropo state.

Note 6 - Wow! 3 Mexicans simultaneously on ch. 7! XHAB had signed off for the evening and was running color bars, and then I could see a separate "TV Azteca 7" in the sync bar floating over them. Then, as I turned the antenna further, I heard "TV Azteca trece (13)" audio from the SSE! Almost had to be the Yucatan peninsula.

Note 7 - Another one logged while on the chat line. Fortunately, Tom Bryant of Nashville was there to help me ID new WZTV and WUXP LIVE!! (Thanks, Tom!).

Note 8 - The station with an identity crisis (WNGM-34). This one fooled me, as I was unaware they were currently "the Box." I thought I had a new LPTV up until I saw the ID.

This month has been **unbelievable!** I don't know if the tropo was related to El Niño, the Mexican forest fire smoke, or just a very stable inversion, it was unprecedented. It definitely goes down in history in my books: most consecutive days of tropo (15), most days of tropo in one month (24), 34 new tropo logging, furthest west U.S. tropo (KOCV-36, 670 miles), and furthest north tropo (WDRB-41, 620 miles). The most consecutive days of strong tropo prior to this that I can remember is **four**. Many days, the openings lasted through the afternoon and on into the next evening. It seemed like it opened up to a different area every night, allowing me to log stations in many new cities. Lubbock!? Odessa!? Louisville?!? I would never have believed I'd see these cities! Most of the new stations were logged because I was looking out for the stations; I have a "Most Wanted" list printed out, as well as a regional list of LPTVs. DXers, take note: it helps to be prepared! It wasn't a great month for E-skip, though I hardly even cared (I'm not sure I would have even been able to distinguish Es from all of the heavy tropo CCI on lowband anyway.)

The IRC chat line has become an invaluable tool for DXing for me, and I'm lucky to have others who are on the transmitting end of my DX! (Lucky, too, that DX has occurred in the middle of regular chat sessions!) I hope other DXers out there will take advantage of it, especially in this E-skip season. If you have a computer, it's very easy to set up.

I forgot to mention the April trip to Fernando's QTH in last month's report. I spent four days there. The tropo wasn't as great as in May, but I was still able to see my locals one morning which was impressive. The meals and hospitality, however, were outstanding! Gracias, Fernando y Irma!

Note 2 - At 0745 CDT there were religious rock music videos here from the direction of Wichita Falls TX.x At 0902 CDT Jenny Jones was here. At this time the Wichita Falls-Lawton stations were weak. The direction appeared to be a little south of Oklahoma City.

Haze is in the air and the temperature is about ten degrees above normal. Most of all, tropo abounds! I've seen XHAB-7 and XERV-9 snow-free during mid-day numerous times lately, and that is not normal.

The opening on June 1 may have had a MUF as high as channel 7, as some weak E-skip was noted there. Right now, I am listing WHDH and WJLA as tentatives. Local KMOV-4 was nearly obliterated during the peak of this opening by WBZ, as I also noted some French Canadians and new Englanders on the FM band. By 1830, the E-skip shifted down the coast to the Washington/Baltimore area, as WMAR-2, WRC-4 and WTTG-5 were noted under my locals for a new TV state (Maryland) and the District of Columbia.

A Guide to UHF Television Reception

Presented by The National Association of Broadcasters, and PBS.

(You may think this outdated, however, your new DSS will change your mind !)

Introduction

The purpose of this Guide is to provide information for improving UHF television reception in the home. The Federal Communications Commission originally allocated twelve channels for television broadcasting. These channels, numbers 2 through 13, are in the "very high frequency" or VHF band. (Originally Channel 1 was also included, but was soon reassigned to other purposes.)

The tremendous growth in television broadcasting following World War II made it obvious that 12 channels were not enough. So in 1952, the FCC allocated 70 additional channels above the VHF television band and called them "ultra high frequency" or UHF band. The channels are 14 through 83. UHF signals, however, due to the physics of radio frequency transmission, are inherently less efficient in the conversion of radio waves to the electrical signals used by the television receiver, and are subject to more losses from some environmental conditions than VHF. Good UHF reception, therefore, requires more attention to antenna installation and set tuning than does VHF reception. On the other hand some VHF channels are subject to certain types of interference to which UHF channels are generally immune.

Simply stated, clear UHF reception requires more attention to antenna installation and set tuning than does VHF reception. While the broadcasting industry is working to improve the technical elements of UHF reception, there is much that can be done, at reasonable cost, with present available equipment-and that's what this publication wants to reveal.

Perfect reception for television signals can't be guaranteed simply because there are too many variables involved. However, by following the recommendations in this Guide, the chances for clear reception will be greatly improved.

Improving UHF reception can be a do-it-yourself job. Even if the work is given to a professional, the information in this guide will provide a better understanding of what is needed and what can be expected.

Poor Reception and Poor Antennas

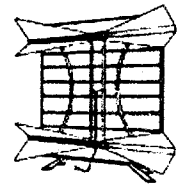
If UHF reception in general is bad, how it's bad can help determine the problem. "Snow" is visual noise caused by a weak signal, poor antenna system, the set itself, or a combination of these. "Ghosts" or multiple images are caused by a signal arriving from two or more directions simultaneously reflected off buildings, trees and mountains. A good antenna system often solves these reception problems. An outdoor antenna is better than an indoor antenna. An indoor antenna is better than no antenna at all. If an outdoor antenna is needed for VHF, you'll almost certainly need an outdoor antenna for UHF. But if good VHF reception can be obtained with and indoor antenna, a loop or other UHF antenna on the set may also work.

Indoor antennas

All indoor antennas can be adversely affected by the walls of a house, inadequate height, and by movement of people in the room-as may be noticed with VHF "rabbit ears." Loop or single bow tie UHF antennas are usually not satisfactory. They are difficult to adjust for maximum signal pick up or for elimination of ghosts. Be sure their lugs are secure to the UHF antenna terminals on the back of the set. The indoor combination VHF/UHF antenna has a multi-position switch to get the best picture. As a rule, this type of antenna is not good for UHF. The rod antenna, or "monopole," is a VHF/UHF antenna found on some portable sets. Normally UHF reception is poor, but can be enhanced when the rod is telescoped to its smaller size.

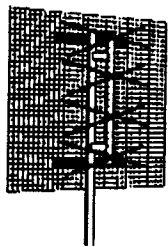
The best indoor antenna

If an indoor UHF antenna must be used, the two-bay bow tie with a reflector screen (pictured) is the best choice. But, keep in mind, outdoor antennas are always better than indoor antennas. Make sure the antenna wires are connected to the UHF terminals on the back of the TV set.



Outdoor Antennas

There are many different kinds of outdoor antennas available in a wide price range. The kind selected is determined primarily by the geographic location of the receiver.



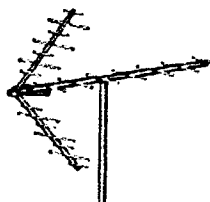
[Recommended UHF antennas: four-way bow tie (pictured), 7-10 dB gain, for metropolitan areas with strong signal. Eight-way bow tie (similar), 10-13db gain for suburban areas with medium signal.]

Television signals are strongest when the station transmitting tower and the home receiving antenna are in line-of-sight. If the line-of-sight is blocked or weakened by mountains, buildings or trees, the signal, likewise will be weakened or lost. The signal will also grow weaker as it travels farther.

"Gain" is the measure of an antenna's *sensitivity*-- and its ability to pick up signals. It is measured in decibels (dB). The farther away from the station tower, the more gain the antenna should have. Gain can also vary from channel to channel. For example, an antenna's advertised gain rating may be at Channel 20, but the gain may be much less at Channel 69. Make sure the dealer guarantees that the antenna purchased is for channels in your area.

Where buildings or other obstructions cause "ghosts," an antenna with good *directivity* is recommended. Directivity is the ability to receive only those signals at which an antenna is pointed. Highly directive antennas have narrow receiving angles (measured in degrees) and high "front to back ratios." To insure the best reception aim the antenna carefully.

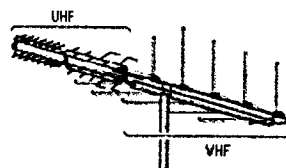
If a good VHF antenna installation is already on hand, it will probably be less expensive to add a good quality UHF antenna on the same mounting mast. The separate UHF antenna also will permit pointing to VHF and UHF antennas independently.

If all television signals are coming from the same direction, both VHF and UHF reception can be improved. Choose an antenna according to the distance to the most distant UHF station for which reception is desired by installing an all-channel combination antenna. Combining both antennas in a single mechanical structure imposes design problems which make the selection of a well-engineered antenna very important.

There are several good combination VHF/UHF antennas available. One of the best types combine a "log periodic" VHF antenna with a "yagi" UHF antenna on a single horizontal boom. If the UHF stations to be received are located in different directions from the house (more than 30 degrees apart):

- Either use separate antennas with a mixer or a switch (get professional help for this kind of installation.)
- Or use an antenna rotator with remote control. The rotator is ideal when signals come from many directions.

Lead-in Lines

A good lead-in line installation delivers the signal from antenna to set with relatively little loss of strength. Choose a quality grade of either one. Flat ribbon twin lead, shielded twin lead and solid core coaxial cable don't work well for UHF. Lead-in lines deteriorate over time. Lead-in lines over five years old (or less depending on environmental conditions) should be replaced with new cables.

Twin lead vs. coaxial cable

- is initially less expensive.
- has moderate to poor life; signal loss increases as it weathers and ages.
- foam filled type works best.

Coaxial Cable (75 ohm line)

- costs more initially, but less frequent replacement makes it less costly in time.
- occasionally needs matching transformers at antenna and set, and uses special connectors.
- lasts much longer. Has slightly more signal loss than new twin lead, but loss doesn't increase with age.
- foam core works best.
- is better at screening local interference.
- looks better.

Guide to UHF Television Reception

A good installation can be made using either type of line. Get professional help if you have special problems like local interference or very weak signals. Few sets still have 300 ohm antenna connectors, a matching transformer to connect coaxial cable to the set will be needed.

With separate VHF and UHF antennas, separate lead-in lines are used to connect them to their respective terminals on the television set. Most combination VHF/UHF antennas have a connection for a single lead-in line, and in most locations a single high quality lead-in line will deliver good VHF and UHF signals. However, a single line cannot be connected to both the VHF and UHF 300 ohm terminals. Instead, a good VHF/UHF "splitter"-rated 300 ohms for twin lead or 75 ohms for coaxial is required. Connect the lead-in line to one end, and the two pairs of wires at the other end to the appropriate set terminals.

Splitters (also called "mixers") can also reduce signal strength. So in a weak signal area, use separate lead-ins or add a booster amplifier to the antenna. If a booster amplifier is added, it should be in the line before any splitters, and as close to the antenna as practical.

Installation

The best antenna location

- Higher is usually better. Six to eight feet above the roof should be adequate.
- Buildings or other obstructions shouldn't block the line-of-sight to the TV tower.
- The shorter the lead-in line, the less signal is lost.
- Avoid attaching the antenna to a working chimney.
- Fumes are harmful to the aluminum antenna parts.
- Heed local ordinance.

Tips on Installation

- The dealer can advise what hardware to use to mount the antenna.
- Be sure the antenna is assembled correctly. Read the instruction sheet carefully.
- Check the area to be sure there are no power lines nearby that could touch the antenna, lead-in lines, or metal extension ladder.
- Ground the antenna mast electrically, using No. 6 or larger wire and standard ground rod to help protect the antenna and TV set from lightning.
- Masts taller than 10 feet need guy wires.
- If a separate UHF antenna is used, mount it 4 or 5 feet above the VHF antenna.
- Aim the antenna at the TV station tower. Where this is not feasible, a signal reflected from a large building or other obstruction may work.
- Experiment with antenna height and aiming, because a few inches can make a big difference. Have someone watch the set and report of reception quality as the antenna position is changed.
- Keep lead-in line free of splices and sharp bends.
- Keep twin lead at least three inches from metal gutters and pipes by using "stand-off" devices every three feet.
- Don't run twin lead and rotator wires through the same stand-offs.
- If a rotator is used, leave enough slack in the lead-in line for rotating the antenna.
- Secure twin lead to stand-offs or tape coaxial cable to the mast to avoid strain on antenna connections.
- Twist twin lead 1/2 turn per foot to prevent wind whipping and to reduce FM or other interference.
- Form the lead-in line into a half loop where it enters the house, so rain water will drip off. Seal the entry with a waterproof material.
- Excess line coiled in the wall or behind the set can cause signal loss and interference.

Multiple Sets

More than one television set (or FM radio) may be connected to one antenna by using a multiple set "coupler." Most couplers weaken signals. If signals are weak a coupler and an amplifier may be needed, which substantially increased the cost. It may be cheaper to erect a second antenna.

Booster Amplifiers

All televisions sets, particularly older ones, add some noise or "snow" to weak UHF signals. A booster (or preamplifier) may reduce the snow, but first be sure a good antenna installation is in place. Keep in mind, outdoor booster antenna are more efficient than indoor models mounted at the set.

Maintenance

Regardless of initial quality, antennas and lead-in lines gradually deteriorate with age. Pollutants and salt ocean air are particularly destructive. Check the complete installation and hose the antenna with water yearly.
