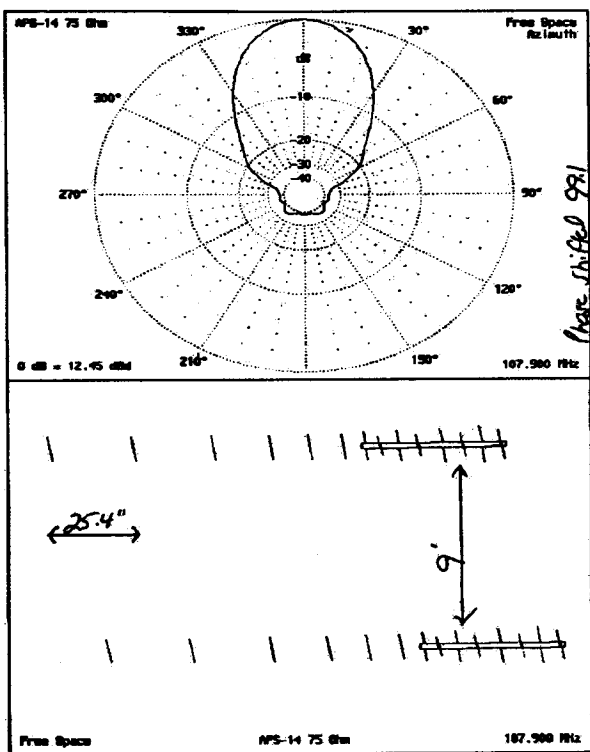

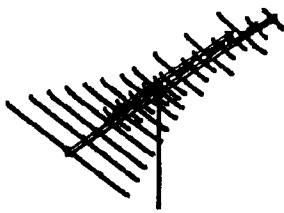
### APRIL SHOWERS BRING...?

And I look out my window at the thermometer and wonder "what am I doing here?" Jeff Kadet returned from Nepal hungry for a Big Mac. More about Jeff's trip a bit later. Mike Jeziorski emailed to say that he is moving from Florida to Mexico, just where he didn't say. Good luck, Mike, and try to stay with us if you can. And if you get lonely, there's always email.

**IS THERE A WEBMASTER IN THE HOUSE?** And we're not talking here about one who specializes in the study of ducks' feet either. We are going to revamp and upgrade the WTFDA site. As you know, Dave Austin set up the site and has been administering it, but now finds that he doesn't have the time to keep it running and updated. Dave is willing to hand over the reigns to anyone who can continue on with it. The club has received some great input as to what changes we should do to our web page, like a section devoted to DX photos, more color, tech articles and an "alert" area where you could go to get late-breaking news and info (like news that the VUD is going out late, for example). If you have ideas about how to improve the web page and you haven't told anyone, do it now! If you have done some web pages yourself and feel like you could tackle this job, let the club know about it! **ALL YOU NEEDED TO KNOW ABOUT NEPAL.** This is not all DX related, but interesting anyway. This is from Jeff Kadet: "Kathmandu, also known as Kantipur, population 800,000 is one of the most interesting cities in the world and it is situated in a beautiful lush green valley. Unfortunately, the breathable atmosphere is a stinking, choking, air-polluted mess. A good percentage of the population covers their faces with masks or cloth in the worst affected areas. An article in the Kathmandu Post says beggars are leaving the city because the air is so bad and the quality of tourism has gone down. It is not the number of internal combustion vehicles that is the problem, but rather the black exhaust from the buses, taxis and 3 wheeled auto-rickshaws (are we talking about an inversion here? -mike) My advice: see the sites around Kathmandu and then get outta there. The rest of the country is beautiful. Frequent power outages make for ideal low noise band conditions. I doubt if the 220v in Sauraha was pumping out even half of that. I saw more livestock in 3 weeks than all previous years combined. If you want a cheeseburger or a milkshake you get water buffalo. I saw no ham antennas." Jeff noted FM stations on 96.1 (Kantipur FM in stereo), 97.9 ("Kath"), 100.1, 102.5 and 106.7 from Sauraha, and no other FM elsewhere in the country. As far as TV, Jeff says: "their bug is 'NTV' at the bottom of a pagoda. Upper left of screen. Mostly boring discussion programs and news with some bad lighting. There are Nepali music videos. MTV Asia now has two pathetic imitators: *Music Asia* and *MCM*. Other cable channels not seen before: PTV World, Pakistan cable channel w/some English and many commercials, HOME TV cable channel from India, INDIA TV, ZEE CINEMA (both India -mike) and TSN SHOPPING NETWORK (India), same logo as our HSN. Zero offset on PAL looks the same as on NTSC. The reds look better to me in PAL. Is this in my imagination, or is there a reason for this?" (Yes, Jeff, there is a reason for that. There is a reason for everything. The truth is out there. Thanks for the interesting report, Jeff, and where are you going next year? -Mike)

**WHAT YOU NEED IS A GOOD....** antenna, or a pre-amp, or whatever. Rich Wertman checks in to let everyone know that he still has available antennas from Channel Master, Winegard, Antennacraft, Blonder-Tongue and Delhi, as well as hardware such as coax cables, connectors, amplifiers and a load of satellite equipment and parts, new and used. **MORE DIGITAL TV INFO.** Info from Doug Smith that relates to Dxers. "Only those stations which held a license or construction permit on April 3, 1997 will receive a second channel for DTV. Stations whose application was granted later (even if their application was filed before April 3) will not receive a second channel. They will, however, have the choice of using the channel they were granted for either DTV or NTSC. And, if they choose to start with NTSC, they may choose to switch to DTV on that channel at any point during the transition period. This means quite a few new stations (KBEJ-2 TX and Salt Lake City-16) will not receive separate DTV allocations. Since they only have 3 years to build, I'm sure most of these stations will begin with a NTSC operation; how they'll handle the DTV conversion I don't know. If it was my station, I think I'd be looking to buy some LPTVs to supply a second channel.

In another ruling, where a station is granted a NTSC power increase after April 3, 1997, they will NOT receive an automatic DTV increase to replicate their new NTSC coverage. They may request a DTV increase in a separate application, and if it can be granted without causing interference, it will be granted. Also, applications to modify NTSC stations will only be granted if there would be no interference to either NTSC or DTV stations."

**APS-13 RAVE REVIEW.** A post showed up on the qth.email list by Neil Kazaross regarding the APS-13 antennas. Here is some of it: "I do want to stress that the APS-13 antenna is awesome and beats anything else for FM DX, due to more gain, narrower beam, good side nulls and great front to back ratio.

Several guys who post here use APS-14s, but the new 13 has even better side nulls. The APS-14 was clearly superior to my constructed Antennacraft FM13s. The new APS antennas are about 200 inches long and professionally designed with state of the art Yagi programs. Clearly, an antenna more than 1.5 times as long as commercially available antennas designed 20 years ago will have more gain. This is NOT an ad for APS products. I have no financial interest in APS. While their antennas aren't cheap, it is important to realize that a larger antenna contains much more material than a small 120 incher.

My FM set-up here will soon be a triangular stack of APS-13s with a 4.5db more gain and half the beamwidth of a single one. Assuming it can stay up and work as calculated, I will add a second stack for phasing." Also mentioned on the post was a note that said that Toko 110 khz filters are now down to 90 cents each from Digi-Key (1-800-DIGI-KEY). And Neil, we need to have a photo of that monster when you get it finished.

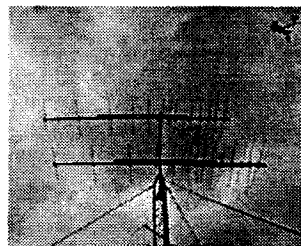

# STAGGER STACK 'EM

## what Rick Shafton did to his APS-14s

My antennas are stagger stacked, as a matter of fact, so that the top antenna is physically 25.4 inches in front of the bottom one so that the signal comes to the top one a quarter wavelength quicker than it hits the bottom one. Then the cable is also longer, which I believe delays it another quarter wavelength. Being half a wavelength out of phase should, I would think, double the signal strength in one direction and cancel it in the other.



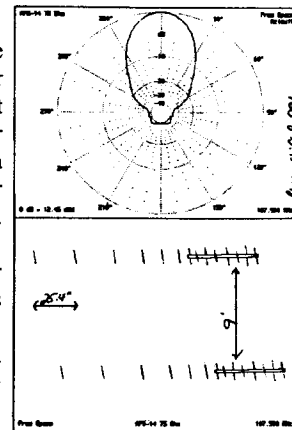
In practice, the gain off the front end seemed down about 2dbs in gain off the regular vertical stack, but the drop off the sides more than compensates for it. With a f/b ratio of 28db versus 20db on the vertical stack, the pattern has a null of at least 25db except in the main lobe which is 108 degrees. In other words, there is a null of at least 25db (up to as high as 40db) anywhere outside of 54 degrees off the main beam.

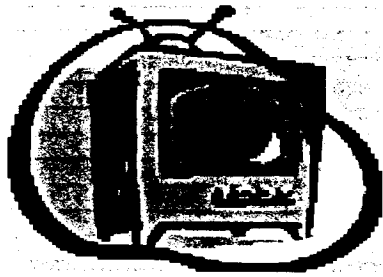
That vertical stack has the same numbers for a 20db loss, although besides the big back lobe are ones about 120/240 degrees off beam attenuated about 13db more with the stagger stack. The 3db beamwidth for the vertical stack of APS-14s here is about 36 degrees, an incredible amount sacrificed only slightly to about 54 degrees with the stagger stack in exchange for eliminating side lobes. Compared to the two vertically stacked Antennacraft FM-13s that used to be the main DX antennas and are now used for phasing, the stagger stacked 14s had an additional gain of 10db and 12db more gain on the vertical stack.

The difference in the two antennas is price. The FM-13s can be had for around \$50 each while the APS-14s ran \$225. Consider that two 13s plus stacking bar and Radio Shack rotor could be put up on a roof for under \$200 while the APS-14s require a stronger base, preferably a tower, a bigger rotor and probably a professional to do the dirty work, particularly if you're stagger stacking. You could EASILY do \$1000 for the system, or more.

For example, raising 30 feet of tilt-over tower looks much easier until you actually do it. We needed a block and tackle which was strung up 30 feet high in a tree. The guy rope is 3/4 inches thick. Raising and lowering this thing is a nightmare and takes about six hours from start to finish. Let me say one thing. Even a simple installation is done better by a professional with the right tools and it's always worth whatever you pay for it. Most of these guys are older dudes being put out to pasture by cable TV, are happy to do the work, give you a great price and do a fantastic job...much better than the crappy installations I used to attempt on my own with no ladders, etc.

The drawing on the right shows a pattern for a 7 foot stagger stack, as designed for Rick by Ed Hanlon, WTFDA member and owner of Antenna Performance Specialists. The photo on the top is an actual photo of Rick's stagger stacked APS-14s.

**PIRATE WATCH:**

• **MISC:** M Street Journal reports that the FCC closed down pirates in a variety of areas: Howell, Michigan, and the Bronx, in New York City. No other information is available.

• **Bill Kennard**, FCC chairman, is apparently quite serious about his Low Power FM (LPFM) proposal. He recently appeared as a guest on WMUC, 88.1 in College Park, Maryland. WMUC is an existing low power FM station (10 watts) operated by the University of Maryland. The station was granted in the late 1970s and was grandfathered in: before the FCC stopped issuing low power licenses. Audio of the interview is available on-line, at [www.wmuc.umd.edu](http://www.wmuc.umd.edu). Opposition to the LPFM proposal is really lining up, including the NAB (National Association of Broadcasters), and nearly every state broadcasting organization. Many are proposing to extend the deadline for public comment on this issue, from April 12<sup>th</sup> to July 12<sup>th</sup>. There will surely be more to come soon on this issue ...

• **In Toronto, Ontario**, new Top 40 station "Power 92" (CISS 92.5) used that slogan only for a few weeks. (You may have read about this format change here last month, or seen the items regarding this issue on the internet on amfmdvx). The issue was CKDX 88.5, in nearby Newmarket (part of metro Toronto), has been using "Power 88.5" for a number of years now. CKDX threatened legal action, and CISS relented, now going by the handle "Kiss 92". Ironically, the station had been using that slogan as a country station, even since its sign on in 1992. Word is the station is out a lot of cash, having invested quite a bit in "Power 92" paraphernalia!

• **Bill Draeb** sends an update on WAUN 92.7 in his hometown of Kewanee, Wisconsin. A few months ago, he wrote to inform us that they were silent. Well, they have gone bankrupt, and a recent newspaper article indicates that they should not be expected to come back on anytime soon. Bill sends us some other local news: WBDK 96.7 is now originating locally, rather than using the Jones satellite service. The musical format continues to be oldies from the 40's, 50's, and 60's. A recent phone book, and letterhead from the station, lists WRLU 104.1 (Algoma) and WRKU 102.1 (Forestville) at the same address as WBDK (P.O. Box 339, Luxembourg, WI 54217), though Bill has not

noted either station on the air. Thanks for the update!

• **Bruce Elving** writes with comments about last month's Minnesota Public Radio story. The article mentioned how newly elected governor Jesse Ventura was proposing to end state aid to the organization (which did not really represent very much of the MPR budget, thanks to a successful marketing strategy). However, Bruce notes that smaller Minnesota public radio stations that are not MPR affiliates could be more adversely affected by the plan. This would include stations such as KAXE 91.7 Grand Rapids, KUMD 103.3 Duluth, and WCAL 89.3 Northfield. Bruce says "They are members of AMPERS, the Association of Minnesota Public Educational Radio Stations. I heard from Paul Schmitz at KUMD that MPS has \$23 million in the bank, and loss of funds for outstate translators or new main stations (in Grand Marais up the north shore of Lake Superior near the Canadian border) could easily be made up by MPR's vast wealth". Some stations are very publicly fighting the proposal, including KVSC 88.1 St. Cloud. A copy of their statement is available on the web, and can be found by searching for "MN-WI Broadcasting Page" on Altavista, according to Bruce. Bruce also wonders about the call letters of some of the Mexican information I listed last month. He thought XEYI was actually XHYI, XEEP should be XEEP-FM, and that XHOM is on 107.5, not 107.9. He also notes a typo on my entry in Big River, SK: they relay CJLR 89.9, not "CJRL".

• **KBEX 105.1 Billings, Montana** is on the air after all. I had reported them as "NO-GX" last month, but John Johnson notes they have been on the air since last November. I have noted such erroneous reports in the past as well. Perhaps they are filings with the FCC that are just being discovered now, but in the meantime the station has come on the air?

• **More Canadian Info ...** from Doug Smith (thanks!!) He notes that the CRTC received applications for new FM stations in Brandon, MB, Lloydminster, AB, Red Deer, AB, Taber, AB, Saksatoon, SK, and Chatham, ON, but no further information was available at this time.

Two other low-power channels at Hobbema, Alberta changed from WTVS [56] and TNN to WUHF [31] and A&E - unfortunately, I don't list any stations there as having carried WTVS or TNN, so I don't know which ones changed.

### Forum & Other Stuff

Thanks to Fernando Garcia, Pat Dyer, Chip Kelley, Fred McCormack, Victor Frank, and Jeff Kitsko for information appearing elsewhere in this column. A lot of LPTV information had to be deleted this month, as the sheer volume of displacements was too great.

WLI-624 & "WLI-625" (latter call assumed, probably wrong) are studio-transmitter links. They use very directional antennas and will be quite difficult to DX unless you're in the right direction. I'm sure there are more of these out there, not sure how to figure out where they are!

Three important new DTV rules have been enacted:

- Only stations which held a license or CP on April 3, 1997 will receive a second channel for DTV. Stations whose application was granted later (even if filed before) will not receive a second channel. Such stations may choose whether to use the single channel they were granted for NTSC or DTV broadcasts. If they choose to start with NTSC, they may switch to DTV at any time during the transition period. This affects quite a few recent stations, including the new channel 2 operation in Texas which now definitely will operate on channel 2 - though whether as analog or digital remains to be seen!
- Stations granted NTSC power increases after April 3, 1997 will not receive an automatic increase in DTV power to replicate their new NTSC coverage. They may apply for a DTV power increase in a separate application, which will be granted if no interference would be caused. Applications to modify existing NTSC stations will only be granted if no interference - either to NTSC or DTV operations - would be generated.
- Minimum-schedule regulations have been established. DTV stations built before the deadline for the station's market size have no minimum operating schedule - they may take long dark periods if they desire. After the deadline passes, the DTV station must be operated for the same hours as the associated NTSC station.

In a separate action, the FCC has finally deleted the channel 32 allocation at Kansas City and replaced it with channel 29. KCWE [29] has been operating on that channel with a special temporary permit; technically, it's a channel 32 station and is listed that way in the FCC database. However, channel 32 cannot be used at the Kansas City antenna farm. (it's too close to KBIN [32] Council Bluffs, Iowa) In a similar situation, WXTV-LP Philadelphia operated on channel 35 for many years until it was bumped by WYBE [35] there. It moved to channel 42 under special temporary authorization, and is still there today. (though listed in the FCC DB on channel 35) It is now about to be bumped from channel 42 by WTXF-DT, and has filed an application for channel 28. This station will have operated on channel 42 for nearly 10 years, but will never officially hold a channel 42 license!

One of Dan Oglethorpe's locals in Shreveport has taken up a rather boring programming format... KADO-LP [15] had been running "America's Voice" - then, for a few weeks, a continuous Dish Network infomercial. In early March, they just started broadcasting a black screen - occasionally interrupted by John Hagee's religious program from San Antonio...

More interesting unIDs at Fernando Garcia's location in northeast Mexico... One on channel 40 has been seen airing Azteca 13 on a Laredo heading. During a tropo opening to Florida, two more were seen: a channel 69 with continuous prayer and a (918) area code phone number (this sounds like the Oral Roberts program, I'll bet it's W69AY Alachua) and a channel 57 with The Box.

"This channel 17 on Long Island joins 4 other translator/LPTVs which I have added to my database, but which appear to be completely absent from the FCC database." Those are previous TV News editor Fred McCormack's comments after reading about this "mystery" channel 17 station. The other four include a channel 28 in Aberdeen, SD relaying KDLV [5]; a channel 47 in South Shore, SD also with KDLV; W64CG in Hessel-Pickford, MI (WGKU [45] translator); and W43BR Baraboo, WI with America One.

I suppose the "TransGuide" LPTV in San Antonio on channel 54 would fall into this category. A few months ago, Pat Dyer noted it had added a logo and the calls K54FA - calls which are not in the FCC database. The logo and calls have now been removed from the channel 54 signal. I note that KTRG [10] translator K52EA has applied to move to channel 54..

Chip Kelley alerted me to the "Z-TV" LPTVs in South Texas adding a Pax logo to their web page. Fernando is now seeing K20FK, indeed with Pax. Their station in Laredo is K15EZ with an application to move to channel 25 - I do not have any indication that the application has been acted on, but their Web page says the station is, in fact, on channel 25. The FCC does act quite quickly on LPTV displacements.

On a similar subject, Fernando has also seen W56DV Tallahassee, Florida - on channel 51. This was W51CO, but is being displaced by WBIF [51] Marianna, FL. It's already been granted a move to channel 56 and new calls. However, it would appear they have not yet completed the move. I would expect to see more of this, LPTVs "disappearing" from the database because of channel displacement, and showing up on the "wrong" channels.

The skip season is just about to fire up; indeed, the first openings should hit before you get your next VUD. Here's hoping for a bam-burner!

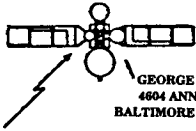

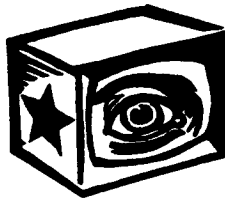

Continuing from last month the bandscan of our motor trip to Portland, OR last Christmas. This is a listing, by channel, of the stations north of Sacramento, CA that we heard. This month, the channel offset (N,-,Z,+) is that assigned, as determined from Doug Smith's FCC listings. The number in parenthesis is the offset in kHz of the video carrier I measured with a R-7100 that has been ~3 kHz high, and was even higher in the car when cold. (The actual video carrier frequency offset is lower than read, probably by 3-5 kHz). Offsets with ± were inconsistent between loggings and may be due to more than one station or drift. Also listed is the transmitter ERP in kW, and the furthest distance in km at which we detected the video carrier.

For one such as I, used to clean T9 spectra, this trip was an ear opener. Multipath, especially on UHF, results in the video carrier frequency being spread over several hundred Hz. Nevertheless, there were some "distinctive" signals; hum (on K55HR, K34DF, K58DA), unstable (K40BL, K48BS, K59DJ), some way off frequency, and some probably carrying data.

Those of you wondering how I reduced pages of logs to the above summary might be interested in the following: I digitized our route from Benchmark Maps of California and Oregon. I had logged checkpoints in the middle and end of each scan, which typically went up in frequency for the video carriers and down for audio and video. I wrote computer programs to interpolate times assuming a constant speed of the car and of logging each occupied channel between these checkpoints. Average speed was used as a check which allowed me to determine "corrected" times and location for each logging. Next time, though, I would like to record GPS data.

I wrote another computer program to look up the six most likely stations for each channel based on the ERP and distance of each transmitting tower from the above locations. To save time, I had narrowed Doug Smith's database to just the Pacific coast states.

The variation of signal strength (which was one of the variables logged) with distance, video carrier frequency, and program content (when determinable) were used to choose between the six most likely stations.

It is quite possible, even likely, that there are some mistakes in the bandscan, probably due to more stations being on the air than appear in Doug Smith's listings. I would appreciate hearing of any of the stations that I have listed that was really not on the air. I have marked most of the questionables with a "t".

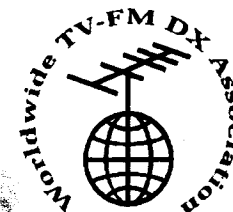

Acquired recently a used R-7000 Icom (nice rig). I compared the R-7000 to the R-100 using the Quantum ant. to a 60db isolation ab switch, 18" coax to both receivers. The SP-20 speaker can handle 2 receivers and has a switch to go from 1 radio to the other so with flicking 2 switches I go from one to the other receiver. According to the specs the R-100 has better sensitivity than the R-7000 on VHF & UHF. I found this to be true - a station will come in sooner on the R-100 and also have a little more pick-up. The R-100 has 3 antenna inputs - the R-7000 one. The audio on the R-7000 has a cleaner resonance. It has less distortion than the R-100, and at lower audio levels a station's I.D. can be picked up, whereas with the R-100 one has to wait until the audio level rises and it then becomes more intelligible. The R-7000 (no longer built) goes for around \$1,000 used and the R-100 can be had new for around \$850. Icom's new receiver R-8500 I understand is not as hot as the R-7000, 7100 or R-100 - going new for around \$1500.

Editor: Yes, Roy, I see the latest AES Catalog lists used R-7000s for around \$1,000, they list a NEW R-7000 for \$1269.95, discontinued but still available from stock (in limited quantities).

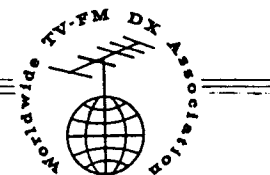
## WTFDA GUIDELINES FOR COMPUTING TV-FM DISTANCE RECORDS AND SCOREBOARD TOTALS

- 1] A TV Station received on more than one channel (when it changes channel, but retains its identity) may be counted once for each channel, excluding change in offset on the same channel. Simultaneous reception of the same station on more than one channel is usually a receiver problem only, though you may present evidence to the contrary. An FM station may be counted again when it deliberately changes frequencies, or varies more than 100kHz from its normal frequency. DXers should be certain they are not counting receiver images or mixing products.
  - 2] Stations operating successively on the same channel in a single city what are clearly unrelated (i.e., with different call letters and a hiatus in occupation of the channel, or non-renewal of the first station's license) are counted as separate stations.
  - 3] A move in a station's transmitter location does not allow it to count as a new station unless the CITY OF LICENSE also changes. Thus, a station starting in a small city and later moving both transmitter and identity to a larger city, if received during both phases of operation, will count twice. Stations moving antenna from downtown to suburbs, for example, with no change in the city of license, count only once. The addition of a city to a station's identity (multiple city station identification) does not count as a new station.
  - 4] A change in call letters per se is not sufficient reason to count that station as new, whether or not a change in ownership is involved in a continuously operation station. Power level or changes in power alone shall have no bearing on these guidelines.
  - 5] Sharetime stations (rare cases of two stations in the same coverage area sharing the same frequency at different times of the day) count as one if they share their transmitter, individually if they have separate transmitter sites.
  - 6] DX received via cable TV may be counted if the station was received off the air on its original frequency at the CATV headend, from which distances must be measured. TOTAL INCLUDING CATV MUST BE SPECIFIED.
  - 7] The precise location of the transmitting antenna shall be the determining factor in computing the DX path distance and tallying the number of political units received.
  - 8] Verifications are not required; however, contributors must be reasonably certain that all stations claimed were received. Those tota limited to verified only should be labeled as such.
  - 9] DX obtained by recording only, and not witnessed at the actual time of the reception, is eligible -- so long as the contributor himself chose the frequency and prepared the recording apparatus. When more than one DXer is present at a DX reception, even as a visitor to another DXer's shack, only those having an active part in the reception may claim the DX.
  - 10] Translators and experimental stations, as well as unlicensed outlets such as pirates and clandestines, are eligible. Harmonics of T video signals are eligible if the fall within another TV band, and those of FM stations are eligible if the harmonics fall within the FM band. But utility stations monitored on FM or TV, and CATV radiation, do not count.
- Note: The above guidelines are to be used for reporting to VUD columns. Feel free to count your station totals any way you like in your own log, but please follow the above guidelines for WTFDA purposes. WTFDAers come from varied backgrounds and differ widely on how to count station totals; without the above, it would be like comparing "apples and oranges" when reading DX report columns. These are essentially the same guidelines in use since the WTFDA began, and comments on them are always welcome—but remember, unless reporters follow the same standard in counting stations, it's very hard to compare their results.)

NOTE: The FM/TV All-Time Distance Records were recalculated using DXer location grid coordinates (City coordinates if exact coordinates not given to me), and the City of License coordinates for all TV/FM Stations to simplify distance calculations. This is a variance to Rule #7 of the WTFDA guidelines for computing TV-FM Distance Records. It would be a very time-consuming task to keep track of all transmitter locations (especially when many transmitters are relocated over all the years that records are tracked. Note: I do have access to fcc databases on the internet for locating hard to find station coordinates. Please check your DX coordinates for any errors. If you have any suggestions on other statistics that you would like to appear in this column, let me know. Fred Nordquist.

## WNBQ WMAQ-TV 1948-1968

### 20 Years at NBC Chicago..

The actual groundwork for NBC television in Chicago was laid on April 17, 1947, when the FCC issued a construction permit. In June of that year, the tentative call letters WNBQ were assigned. Shortly afterward, NBC leased space for TV transmitter facilities on the 42nd floor of the Kemper Building, about five blocks from the station's Merchandise Mart headquarters.

In March of 1948, the FCC permitted the first of the station's two name changes. The call letters were changed to WNBQ because of the phonetic similarity of WNBQ to WMBI, the Moody Bible Institute's radio station in Chicago.

The second name change came in August, 1964 when the present call letters, WMAQ-TV, were adopted to identify more closely with Channel 5's sister radio station.

By February, 1948, the fledgling WMAQ-TV had named Jules Herbuveaux, a pioneer broadcasting executive who had been associated with NBC Chicago in many capacities, to be the new station's manager.

The summer of 1948 was a busy one, with Herbuveaux commuting regularly to New York to help set up facilities, not only for WMAQ-TV, but for the 6-station NBC Midwest Television Network.

By September, WMAQ-TV had installed a coaxial cable link between its Merchandise Mart headquarters and the Illinois Bell Telephone Company. It was the first such intra-city cable to be installed by any Chicago television station.

At the Merchandise Mart, the engineers who were converting a radio studio into WMAQ-TV's first television studio were astounded to discover that their radio predecessors—nearly 15 years earlier—had the foresight to install heavy cable and outlets for TV lights, apparently under the assumption that the studio would one day be used for television.

The magic moment had arrived.

It was 6:15 PM on Wednesday, September 1, 1948...after working hours for most Chicagoans, who were looking forward to the coming Labor Day weekend.

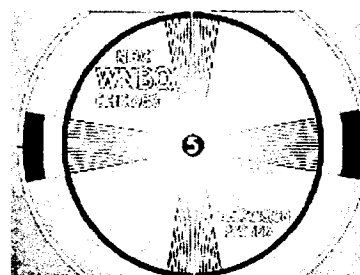
The radio-TV pages of Chicago newspapers that day totaled only 40 minutes for Chicago's two television stations, mostly interviews, baseball and wrestling.

Only the day before, Arthur Hays Sulzberger, president and publisher of the New York Times, had said to a publishers' meeting in Saranac Lake, N. Y., "Television and radio, as I see it, are primarily media of entertainment, and the newspaper, which gives information, is not threatened by them." So few Chicagoans who read the story in their newspapers that morning would have been impressed with what was happening on 42nd floor of the Kemper Building.

After all, it was only an engineer pushing a button.

It was really that simple: engineer Walter Lanterman pushed a button—and a soundless test pattern appeared for the first time on television Channel 5.

No blare of trumpets; no speeches. But I. B. (Chick) Showerman, Vice President of NBC's Central Division won a ten dollar bet from Sales Manager Paul McClure. WNBQ NBC's newest television station, and sister station to WMAQ radio, had made its target air date.

The signal went out to a total potential audience of less than 50,000 TV receivers.

Still, 30 persons reported seeing the test pattern as far away as Valparaiso, Indiana; 30 miles east of Chicago and Elgin, Illinois, a similar distance to the west.

It was a novelty, that first 15-minute test pattern. It was worth talking about. But nobody seeing it that day in Valparaiso or Elgin could realize that in just twenty years, that brief test pattern would grow into an industry giant.

Now, fast forward 8 years.

### "C" Day in the Windy City..

Sunday, April 15, 1956, will always be remembered as "C-Day" at WMAQ-TV. It was described by Broadcasting-Telecasting magazine as "a daring breakthrough the black and white curtain."

At 4:15 PM, Robert W Sarnoff, then President of NBC, pushed a button and ushered in a new era in television. Channel 5 became the world's first all-color TV station as "Wide, Wide World" carried the event to 110 NBC-TV affiliated stations across the country.

The color conversion involved five months of extremely hard work. The project was under the general supervision of Chief Engineer Howard C. Lutgens, who put a special task force of 40 technicians through a "color college" involving around-the-clock special training. The classes ranged from short sessions of several days for cameramen to courses of several weeks for video and maintenance engineers.

Other members of the staff were busy developing new color standards needed for sets, wardrobe and makeup. Weatherman Clint Youle pondered about how to "color the weather". On his weather map, movements of warm air would be traced with the traditionally "hot" colors—red and orange.

WMAQ-TV installed its first color equipment in late 1953. Its first major color transmission was the Rose Bowl parade of 1954. The first local color program was John Ott's "How Does Your Garden Grow?", introduced in March of 1955.

At the outset, audiences were given five to seven hours of color programming daily. This was later expanded to about 10 hours. Included were all local live programs, up to two hours of network shows and some film programs.

Channel 5's color conversion project cost NBC more than \$1,250,000. The Wall Street Journal estimated that Chicago had about 50,000 color receivers in operation at the time WMAQ-TV switched to all-color in April, 1956. At that time, the lowest price for a color TV set was \$595. By late 1968, there were nearly 865,000 color receivers in the Chicago market.
