Outside of the Pacific Northwest and the Los Angeles area, I can't find too many people who are unhappy with the amount of Es they received. I hope everyone got so much Es that it'll take them months to sort our their logs.



A couple of longtime Dxers are back in the fold. A big WTFDA welcome to Tim McVey and Danny Buntin. Very glad to have your smiling faces back here! And a great big thanks to all of you for renewing for another year: Edward Ritchie, John Johnson, George Jensen, Frank Aden, Alfred Laun, Charles Bernth, William Eckberg, David Austin, Ron LeBlanc, Mike Lapinski, Jeff Lockwood, Mike Hawk, William McGuire, James Paige, Greg Coniglio, Rod O'Connor, Stan Weisbeck, Robert Ross, Jeff Kruszka, Al Tobia, Jeff Wolf, Neil Kazaross, Roderick Jorgenson and Mark Humenyk. The current membership is now around 244 people.

MORE DTV WOES! All right, Jim Ayers, make yourself comfortable on the couch and tell Dr. Mike and all the rest of us about it: "I have four digital locals on-air. Have not seen any of them decoded yet, but their signals on an analog set are as distinctive (from analog) as they are devastating to DX. One digital local (ch10) is adjacent to full-power analog 11. I sometimes note what I assume is a het on 9 which is a mixture of the two signals on 10 and 11. That is, I see analog 11's signal plus the dark snow from digital 10. Fortunately, this is usually only on bearings toward their (shared) tower. Meanwhile, adjacent channel overload from a local appears to not be as severe, generally, from a digital signal as from an analog local.

Those locals relocating from UHF to UHF or from VHF to VHF don't present an adjacent-channel overload problem yet, anyway, because they are lowering ERP substantionally. Relocating from VHF to UHF, however, is a different issue, since ERPs are higher than stations moving within VHF or UHF. For instance, local channel 2 is also on 39 with 490kw. I sometimes get overload on channel 38 and 40. However, local channel 5 is also on 27 with 846kw and I'm NOT seeing any overload to adjacent channels. The two towers are at 13 and 11 miles, respectively.

When it comes to overload, perhaps this is what we Dxers have to fear the most from DTV...NOT just the locals moving from V to U with their higher power than stations moving within V or U, but rather the big slate of UHF locals who can apply to increase their digital power from, say 75kw to 1000kw, as WDSI is doing. What's to keep every digital on UHF from applying for the maximum 1000kw? Great for DX, I guess, if you have any channels left on which to DX!"

GREETINGS FROM THE PAST. An email came in from former WTFDA member John Combs currently living in Florida. John informed me that he has a collection of old VUDs from 1972-1996 (with a few gaps), as well as copies of old AIPA bulletins from the 1950s and early '60s, that he plans to put up for bid on eBAY sometime around the middle of August. At the present time John is not interested in selling to any one person (I told him I would take some but he was not interested), but wants to go the auction route. IT'LL MAKE YOU CRY! From Bill Mitchell: "I have a Carver TX-11 FM tuner that had its front end damaged during a thunderstorm, losing about 95% of its sensitivity. I sent it to Carver service, and it was returned as "repaired", sadly with only about 20% of its original sensitivity. I do not know how they missed this in checking out the unit (I do -Mike). I tried to return it, but in the meantime Carver and its service folded. Everett Audio in WA picked up repairs, but not tuner repair. So, I am stuck with a TX-11 that works with 33db of system gain ramming a signal through its front end. Is there anybody in the membership that is aware of anyone or a facility that can repair these units? This is such a fine RF performer that it is sad to se it relegated to receiving only locals with all of that antenna gain and preamplification." Can anyone help Dr. Bill? LIGHTNING DOES STRIKE TWICE! You might remember an article in the May 1998 VUD



about a lightning strike at the home of Mike Condon. Well, would you believe it happened again! It happened on the first weekend in May. Here are parts of Mike's email: "Things could have been much worse, now that I reflect back on it and I'm grateful it happened as it did. I lost 4 VCRs, a video switcher and several of those Radio Shack remote switching relays that plug into the wall outlets from surging, and one 14" monitor which works but looses it's mind when it gets overheated.

The single point ground did it's job and shunted most of the two strikes, one at 8pm and the other at midnight, to ground. I did lose the VHF amp up on the tower through rf saturation even though it was

not on and disconnected. After investigating fully for days, it turns out that the cable TV company did not ground their system. I blame myself for this because I just neglected to cut their lock and look into their box on the side of the house. When I did so, I became very angry to see that they did not ground, but did pull a small wire in with the coax from the road 200 ft away. Who knows if it even did go to ground out at the road box. I then cut into the system and added my own ground cable and ran it two feet to my system which was right there to catch the house and phone systems. I also grounded it at the panel in the basement where it distributes to the other rooms of the house. I also installed a surge shunt device in the electrical panel with the circuit breakers. I then installed ground fault outlets where any electronic equipment may be connected. In retrospect, the lightning came in on the cable and found it's way through the VCRs on the shield of the coax to the neutral of the house electrical system back to ground." Mike estimated the damage from these strikes to be around \$2,500. Mike also says "Jim Detrich sent me a story of a fellow who had his house set afire by a strike that hit the house downspout for the gutters, which set off the fire alarm of the neighbor's house who came and put the fire out. Those folks were lucky. Jim has doubled the prices of the RDX Labs amps, so I installed a Channel Master VHF amp this time. Don't see much difference in performance."

US TELEVISION IN EUROPE? I received this from a Dxer in Germany in response to a question he posed on the European email list regarding US TV reception in Europe. Have US stations ever made it there by Es? You might find this interesting: "It is possible, but more likely with multi-hop Es than F2. Over the years we've had some freaky observations, but no 100% proof of US/Canadian stations. In August 1986, during a strong Icelandic opening, Dxers in Finland noted weak stations (with music only) on frequencies that match with those of St. John Nfld. Also in 1989 (if I remember right), a Norweigian Dxer heard two stations fading with each other on 88.9, both spoke English with an American accent. Hams have also reported (in QST magazine) a Transatlantic opening on FM between Spain and New York area, I guess that was in 1988. The best TV conds ever were in June 1988 when North American stations were widely seen in England on all band I/II channels. The furthest station was from Atlanta, GA on ch A2. There are many Dxers around Finland with the same dream...but to hear NA stations needs good equipment and patience; the signals are often very weak after having travelled so far." This response came from Jukka Kotovirta in Finland. If you are a East Coast TV Dxer...doesn't this make you want to swing your antenna eastward and keep it there?

LAST, BUT NOT... Thanks everyone for contributing. I have to hold over some items for next issue. The FM Atlas was to go the printer on June 22nd. IRC has been loads of fun this summer. PIRATE WATCH:

- DENVER, COLORADO. On July 13th, the FCC shut down a station operating in the suburb of Federal Heights, on 89.7. It was running about 30 watts into an omnidirectional gain antenna about 50' AGL. According to the FCC, it could be received throughout the Denver area. The station, "The Flick", was automated, and being run out of a pager sales office at W 84th Ave & Pecos St. According to an employee at the pager business, the station owner claimed that he received a valid license for his station on the Internet! (Source: Rick Lewis AMFMTVDX list server)
- DES MOINES, IOWA. M Street reports that the FCC shut down a pirate in this city operating on 90.5, after a warning to voluntarily shut down.
 No other information about format or power is available.
- Steve Dahl, a Chicago-based radio host (WCKG 105.9) who is syndicated, was not happy with his measly 0.4 share rating on his Detroit affiliate WKRK-FM 97.1. So he pulled

- the plug on the broadcast to that station, literally! This was all broadcast live over his program. After calling WKRK GM Steve Sinicropi some choice names, he personally when over and pulled the cord out of the patchbay linking Detroit! WKRK was his only affiliate outside Chicago.
- The FCC has recently redesigned its web page. This is hoped to clear up some technical issues that have been plaguing the site. Check it out at http://fcc.gov
- President Clinton has nominated FCC Commissioner Susan Ness for another five year term. The appointment will still need to be confirmed by the Senate.
- Here's an FCC fine that should help DXers! KXOJ, Inc. (KEMX 94.5 Locust Grove, OK, KEOJ 101.1 Caney, KS. And KXOJ 100.9 Salpulpa) was fined for messing up its legal ID! The station was inserting "Tulsa" before the correct city of license. The city of license must follow the call. Some information, such as the frequency, the licensee name (i.e. "Chancellor Broadcasting") may be inserted between the calls and city, but no "impermissible information" such as another city. It was a rough day for KXOJ - they were also fined for not keeping a studio within the station's primary contours. The station claimed it had to move the studio to Tulsa for economic reasons, but the FCC did not accept that. The station did, however, contest the FCC's assertion that it did not keep a local or toll-free number so that those within its community could call without a charge.
- WTFDA member Peter George (1995 Lake Placid Convention host, and up-coming host as well!) writes to tell us that he is now the chief engineer at WBIM 91.5 Bridgewater, MA (180 watts), and WSHL 91.3 Easton, MA (100 watts). He will gladly QSL if you hear his stations! During the summer months, these two college stations mainly broadcast the "Massachusetts Reading Network", a radio service for the visually impaired. The network has a legal ID every hour, but WBIM and WSHL insert local Ids every top of the hour (Thanks, Peter, hil grc). The full list of stations on this reading network is:

- Chip Kelley notes that KLTY 94.1 Dallas has been sold from Suburst (which paid over \$60 only a few months ago) to Hispanic Broadcasting (formerly known as Heftel). The new owners plan to install some form of Spanish language programming on the 94.1 frequency.
- KLTY had been one of the most successful contemporary Christian stations in the U.S. The old KLTY format may live on, however, on Suburst's future move in to the Dallas market: KRJT 100.7. Stay tuned to this column for updates from "The Big D".

It will instead become a relayer of CKNY-TV [10] North Bay, with a small amount of locally-originated programming. One might presume a call change, probably to CKNY-TV-1, will also follow.

Forum & Other Stuff

Thanks to Dave Zantow, Neil Griffin, Robert Grant, Dennis Smith, Tim Noonan, Fernando Garcia, Keith Knipschild, Tim Caldwell, Bill Dvorak, and Eric Bueneman for information appearing elsewhere in this column.

A number of "high channel" translators have applied for renewal this month. They include the Leakey, Texas system of K70FD/K72DN/K74DP and K74BO Santa Rosa, NM. Robert Grant says WDWO-LP [44] has been displaced by WWJ-DT and not yet reappeared on any other channel. It holds a CP for channel 18 though I wonder if that has been bumped by WHTV in Jackson? The WBKP [5] translator in Marquette, MI mentioned in last month's column is W28BX, according to an email reply from WBKP's general manager.

Neil says the Colquitt, GA and Ottumwa, IA wireless-cable systems are not yet operating. Neither are LPTVs W19BT, W35BN, and W47BZ in Tallahassee; W02CI and W02CE in Cairo and Camilla, GA; or full-power stations WBIF [51] Marianna, FL or KWKB [20] Iowa City.

Danny Oglethorpe has seen KNAZ [2] several times this summer, after their purchase by KPNX [12]. He says channel 2 relays the noon and 5pm KPNX news, but the 6 and 10pm newscasts are local to Flagstaff. The quality of the Flagstaff newscasts seems to have improved somewhat as well. Unfortunately Danny has a local on channel 6 so we don't know how (and if) this change has also affected co-owned KMOH [6] Kingman.


Jeff Kadet and Eric Bueneman both report K49FC on the air in St. Louis. This is a 3ABN (religious) affiliate and a LPTV displacement, formerly K48ER. Michael Lazaro reports that the WMHQ [45] switch to WB, reported last month, has not yet happened. Fernando Garcia is seeing new K68FU Laredo, Texas. So far, they're only running color bars with 80% of an ID. (It reads "K68F"!) WAOE [59] Peoria is scheduled to come on the air July 21 with UPN.

Jeff also has some offset notes. He relays a report from Frank Merrill that CHAT-TV [6] Medicine Hat, AB is operating on minus offset. According to Industry Canada, they're supposed to be zero offset. (They do have one relay station also on channel 6 at Maple Creek, but it's supposed to be plus offset and in any case, is only 10 warts..) K64FO in Fayetteville, Arkansas also seems to be operating on the wrong offset; Jeff finds it between minus and zero, while the FCC thinks it's plus. He's also seeing unID color bars towards Huntsville, Alabama on channel 52+. I see nothing likely. (My local W52CT is running color bars, but with an ID - albeit with the wrong calls W59AW - and they're supposed to be zero offset though I don't have equipment to confirm that.)

Finally, Jeff has a bit of good news to those with DTV locals. He's reported several Dxers have succeeded in DXing narrowband FM audio through DTV interference, even when no video is present.

Dennis forwarded a wealth of California LPTV information and bandscans - most of which will have to wait for later, when there's more space. I had to delete most LPTV information this month as it is; there's just too much DTV activity. With a fair (but late) E-skip season this year, there will be plenty of DX reported this month...



Would you believe that Virginia dominated the Es logbook July 6? Plenty of Hampton Roads area stations were in during this opening, plus a pair from Richmond/Petersburg and a new one from Fredricksburg. The skip started in New England and the mid-Atlantic states at 1710, then progressed further south as time went on, finally wearing off around 2100. It was replaced with trops,

Well, so far 1999 does not get high marks in the skip area. May was a total bust, though that may not have been all its fault. In April we replaced the roof, so the only FM antenna was the ancient 9-element Channel Master @ 7' off the ground in the garage (high winds preclude putting anything in the back yard) until June 13. The baby bird perch went up May 1, but the heavy-duty ham-grade rotor began popping fuses May 2 with the antenna aimed approximately at San Francisco (WSW, the stop point, since the only station I like there is KDFC 102.1 and their Concord booster has trashed them beyond repair here). With time it proceeded to north, which did allow what I suspect was CFMM to boom in one day (see below). The only antenna installer in the county then injured his hand, his assistant had the flu, it was windy (note the amazing direction shift above!) whenever he might have tried the job, etc. And I couldn't get on the roof, even if I felt competent to handle a 14 element antenna. I had major surgery May 19 and am on disability until August.

Another problem is that I still have only rabbit ears for the TV, so my early warning system is not the best, but the fellow wanted some \$200 to remount the VHF antenna, which has an intermittent break in continuity (it fades badly when the weather's dry, like May-October), and we're moving in September anyway (to Auburn WA).

One good point about the new setup. The FM antenna is now 10' higher, with the 20' mast now extended for the first time. Before, I left it lower so the 3 antennas would all be at different heights and not conflict (40' for UHF from ground, 35' for the VHF, 30' for the FM). City rules say max 30' above ground, but it's not enforced rigorously. (What would someone with a 2 story house do, anyway? Mount the antenna below the ridge just to meet that silly standard? Any such standard should be based on height above the roof, shouldn't it?)






Onkyo tuner, 6 element yagi @ 25'. All new.

Not a bad month of E-skip, even though I didn't get as many ID's as I'd like. The night of June 26th looked explosive from the way everybody was talking on IRC. I may have even had an unid NBC on ch. 7 briefly I'll never know for sure if it was Es, but it sure came in strong for about 30 sec.

This report is for May and June 1999. I have observed almost no skip this summer, except for the tiny bit on May 31 from Santa Barbara reported last month, and the following:

After all of these years, I may have had my first taste of auroral Es, on June 1 in Wasco. (I have not yet seen nor heard actual aurora DX.) TV turned on aprox 2000 PDT, and signals were noted 2003-2120. Ch 2 looked like typical Es except not quite as strong the entire time. What was unusual was that no definite MUF was determinable, weak signals wer observed through ch 6), and the only direction from which I could receive signals on my 1-bay conical was north. I heard no local IDs; but the one station on ch 2 that predominated the entire time was an apparently unmanned transmitter of English CBC Canada with

lots of promos for CBC programs and ID as "CBC Toronto". I didn't even think about the possibility of auEs until the next morning.

Also in Wasco, a new ch. 55 was seen Mar 27 with unmodulated test signals. (If was not yet on Mar 25). On May 14 it had what appeared to be ACN (American Collectibles Network) shopping. It is north of here, possibly Fresno (90mi/145km), is consistent, and has heavy CCI from K55CN Bakersfield (35/55). Also in Wasco on March 25,27 and May 14-16 was a new ch. 48, unID, consistent, but only as herringbone, maybe K4BDY Coalinga (70/115)? It is sandwiched between strong KJEO-47 Fresno (100/160) and KNXT-49 Visalia (80/130). On May 14, K50CL, McKittrick (25/40) was seen back on, now as "Bakersfield College Instructional Televison."

In Santa Barbara, there is another new local on the air. On June 15 it was first day testing with color bars with "K38DX TV 38 Santa Barbara CA" ID. On June 16 it was sending program material as a translator of KJLA-57, Ventura.

As a postscript to the station list in June WTV, I have noted the following CA stations in Santa Barbara in past years: Tentative KSBW-8 Salinas (180/295) one morning ca 1955, CCI wKFMB-8 Salinas (180/295) one morning ca 1955, CCI wKFMB-8 San Diego (175/280), big anterna at grandparents' house; KKOG-16 Ventura (20/33) ca 1960s, now off; KHOF-30 San Bernardino (140/220) ca 1960s, big antenna at TV store; K08FK Carpinteria/SBarb (xltr KEYT-3, 17/25) ca 1967-71, now off; K53AT Buellton (xtlr KTBN-40, 15/25) ca early 90s, indoor & portable, now off; probable K59AL Torrey Pines (xltr KPBS-15, 175/280) ca early 90s, CCI u/local K59CD (4/7), indoor antenna; K0CE-50 Juntington Beach (110/175) ca 1993, outdoor antenna at temporary house; and finally presently, whenever tr is especially good (summer 98) on indoor antenna, K35DG La Jolla "UCSD TV" San Diego (175/280) and XHBJ-45 Tijuana (200/315).

Listed in June WTV were all stations received in April in Santa Barbara and close vicinity up to ~250' elevation. Those, along with the following, were noted on May 22 & 27 with portable TVs on 3985' La Cumbre Peak, ~4mi/7km (air) north of Santa Barbara. Tropo on mtn: none on 22nd, very good on 27th. From past experience, all of these are consistent (regulars) on the mtn (except the very good tropo May 27 to San Diego/Tijuana). [Tr-duct signals are found to be strongest at the layer boundary at whatever elevation it is at the time; signal strengths taper off gradually above and below that.] Stations in San Bernardino/Riverside could possibly be seen in Santa Barbara with bigger antennas than I have. One station not seen on the mtn is KKFX-LP 24 St. Barbara, even though its city xmtr pole is visible from the mtn top 4 mi away. Most interesting are Visalia & Fresno stns, consistently good even at distance & with irregular terrain in between. However, closer Bakersfield is weak or lacking, apparently because of a higher mtn in between (8831 Mt. Pinos). XHBJ-45 appears to be with a network now (formerly Mx videos), I fear my Tijuana stns pgm info is dated. Aprox distances are in

TV COMES TO FARGO

(Randy Miltier sent me this piece shortly after it was published in WORLDRADIO magazine in 1992. While it was written about WDAY-tv in Fargo, North Dakota, it's a great tale of startup horrors that probably occurred on almost every station's premiere live broadcast. I met the author a couple of times back in the 50s and while I don't think he remembered me, he did grant permission to re-print the material here. Edited to conform with VUD space limitations.)

Opening Night... A Glaring Success At Channel 6

Life is full of high points that stick in your memory like crazy glue can stick to fingers. Moments during my African deventures, soloing an airplane, getting married, and the first night's broadcast of WDAY-TV hang in my brain tenaciously. There is no erasing these events.

In 1952 I joined Fargo radio station WDAY to help put together a new local TV station, the first in the area. Because my background was in photography and motion picture work, the station management had offered me the lob.

During the waiting period for the FCC construction permit, the company sent me to RCA school in Camden, New Jersey, to learn the fundamentals of TV operation. At that time I held First Phone

and Second Telegraph licenses and I was eager to learn about the new broadcast medium.

When I returned to North Dakota we began to build the first TV station in the Fargo area. Our startup target was June 1, 1953; but we had a problem. Due to a severe rain storm the previous year, the studio building we were in the process of erecting had suffered flood damage that caused a basement wall to collapse. So the partially constructed studio building sat quietly through the winter until spring came to the prairie again. If we were going to make our startup deadline we had to make some temporary facility arrangements.

We had purchased a defunct FM tower and transmitter building (KVNJ-FM) so we decided to add a large three-car garage to the transmitter building and use it as a temporary studio. The film, photo and business operations were conducted from temporary downtown offices.

Equipment for the station had been optioned before the license grant was made, so we were in good shape to get the TV transmitter and studio gear. However, certain items were in short supply and therefore we had to make adjustments for the shortages. But all-in-all we managed to get the test pattern on the air in May, and WDAY-TV was ready to broadcast its first program on June 1.

The sign-on broadcast was scheduled for 6:45 p.m. that day. The general manager thought everyone would be through with dinner and therefore we would blast off with a full audience glued to their sets.

At that time WDAY radio was the leading station in the North Dakota area. We had 23 live musicians and entertainers on staff. Frank Scott, later a piano player and arranger for the Lawrence Welk Show, was the musical director. Our entertainers produced two popular weekly road shows that were broadcast from small town locations in the area. So it was a natural to feature our live talent on the opening show.

The first 15 minutes was film I had previously shot of the mayor, the governor, and a few other dignitaries making short congratulatory speeches. Then we went live into the three-car garage studio where the lights hung about eight feet above the floor and the air conditioning was nil.

Not all the 23 musicians and singers

were on the first show, but you can be certain that most of them performed. The talent ranged from cowboy singers Hank and Thelma to Frank Scott and the big studio band. And all were jammed into that little garage with the two cameras.

The lighting level was about 250 foot candles, and so during the hour show the temperature began to rise like an inflating hot air balloon. The sweat began to pour off the entertainers.

Our country western singers whanged their guitars, yodeled and happily did their stuff. The dance band played the hits of the day, the singers crooned and jitter bugged, and the temperature rose.

The first commercial spot arrived after the big orchestral opening. Nobody had bothered to rehearse the commercial which was for a retail store that sold band instruments. The store had brought saxophones, trombones, comets, and sousaphones, and displayed them neatly on a table that could be rolled out under the lights. The audio was to be supplied by a booth announcer while the camera panned around on the pile of shiny homs. It looked great on paper.

Because of space shortage, the instrument display was rolled in front of the cameras at the last possible moment. The director called for a camera to 'pan around on the horns' as written in the script. Camera one moved over and zeroed in on the horns.

Now you must understand that the image orthicon tubes in the cameras of that day were super-sensitive to specular highlights. Unlike the color pickups used today, the black and white camera tubes of 1953 "bloomed" a black halo around every specular highlight. The brighter the highlight the bigger the bloom! Nobody at WDAY-tv had ever heard of dulling spray, a waxy substance used to dull reflections (I can't remember if it had even been invented at that point in time).

You can imagine what happened to that myrlad of highlights bouncing off those shiny horns; every light in the studio was reflected in the rounded brass and silver plated objects. The screen on the control monitor became bright specks surrounded by a sea of black. Absolutely nothing was discernible in the picture.

"Do something," the director

screamed at the video control engineer.

The poor technician was twisting

The poor technician was twisting every knob on the console trying to rectify

the problem, but nothing worked. It was a one minute disaster in specks and blooms.

"Pan over to the logo card," the director yelled over the intercom. "Get off that shiny junk."

During all this commotion the booth announcer was calmly reading the copy like good booth announcers should do. But the announcer's booth was a temporary box about the size of a phone booth and the walls were not quite soundproof. So, the yelling back and forth by the technical guys was audible to the folks at home. It was a great way to start off a brand new TV operation.

When the camera reached the logo card on an easel, the video was all out of adjustment due to the frantic knob twisting, so it took a bit of time to get it back to a presentable picture. In the meantime, the temperature in the studio climbed and climbed.

The next few commercials were on film, so there was no problem. But when we had another live commercial, the announcer calmly pulled the ad copy out of his coat pocket and read it to the camera. It was exactly like he would do on radio. The thought never occurred to him that TV required visuals in addition to the announcer reading the script.

I would like to report that all the rest of the show went without difficulty, but I cannot. The master of ceremonies, who was also the program director, had to cross over from one side of the set to the other. Instead of walking around the two cameras, he took a shortcut by dropping to his knees and crawling across the back of the set. Just as he reached the middle of the set, the director switched cameras to full shot of the group playing. Yup, there on camera was the MC making like Fido.

We had a cat roaming around in the studio to keep the mice out of the transmitter. There is nothing quite like having a mouse invade your high voltage supply and commit suicide. Well, the cat managed to make an appearance during the show also, but only in a minor role.

And so WDAY-TV entered the life of the Fargo, North Dakota area. It's now a fixture.

TV and FM Receiving Antennas: Fantasies, Fads and Facts

The five major characteristics used to evaluate antennas are 1. gain, 2. beamwidth, 3. front to back ratio, 4. front to side ratio and 5. impedance match.

Most characteristics are derived with the aid of a polar plot obtained by using a pen recorder that responds to changes in signal as received by the antenna. Specifically, a polar plot is a recording of antenna sensitivity with a constant-strength signal arriving from a fixed direction as the antenna is rotated through 360 degrees. Obviously, most antennas receive less signal when rotated away from the signal source.

Figure 1 shows how such a plot is arranged and used. We simply hold the chart parallel to the ground and look down on it just as you would view a compass. The fixed signal arrives at zero degrees. The antenna which is aimed at the fixed signal source, is at the center of concentric circles that indicate the signal pickup ability of the antenna. These circles are numbered 1,2,3, etc., usually out to #10. A chart of antenna sensitivity that extends out to circle #10 would indicate twice the pickup ability of a chart out to circle #5, and ten times the pickup ability of a chart out to circle #1, all on the same plot, of course. These circles actually indicate relative power or voltage. They do not directly translate to distances away from the transmitter over which you can expect to receive a signal. For simplicity only five circles are shown (2,4,6,8,10) but the reader can interpolate since the distance between circles is equal.



An actual plot of antenna sensitivity is shown in figure 2. This dipole antenna plot has its greatest sensitivity at 0 and 180 degrees as indicated by the area inside the dark lines. This area is usually called a pattern. Since the dipole is a "basic" antenna, its gain characteristic, or pattern in 0 degree direction, is usually the basis upon which the gain of any other antenna is compared. NOTE: All polar plots are derived with antenna so mounted that it is not affected by trees, power lines, etc. This "free space" plot is seldom achieved when you mount the antenna in a typical installation. The result may be spurious side bulges or lobes not seen on the polar plot.

Note that the antenna aimed at zero degrees (B). This antenna could not discriminate between equal strength signals arriving from A, B, and C because this antenna has a very broad pattern. However, a signal arriving from D direction only intercepts the



pattern at about line 4, meaning that signal strength would be less than that received from A, B, or C. Antenna sensitivity to signals arriving from directions other than zero degrees produces some of the characteristics to be described later.

of a 5 element yagi. Note that the yagi pattern extends to the outer circle, thus the exact patterns of these two antennas can be compared. This description of polar plots, patterns, etc. will be referred to often as specific antenna characteristics are reviewed.



Antenna gain is defined in textbooks as "the difference of a directional antenna as compared to a standard nondirectional antenna." Using Figure 3, this is rather self-explanatory. The gain in absolute numbers of the 5 element yagi is about 3.3 db. However, a more specific definition of gain, and more accurate and in step with accepted terminology today, is: the ratio of an antenna's pattern in the optimum (0 degrees direction) at a given frequency to the pattern of a cut-to-channel dipole also aimed in the optimum direction (the pattern in the optimum 0 degrees direction is also called the main lobe.)

Some antenna manufacturers, either intentionally or not, list gains that seem to high for that design. Next to a lie, the only way these gain figures could be possible is if the antenna is compared to a "basic" antenna of less gain than a dipole. And this is not really unusual since a theoretical non-directional basic antenna called an isotropic source, once was accepted more so than the dipole.

The isotropic source (which is all directional) has 2.14db (about 25%) less gain than a dipole. Therefore, if maker "A" specifies a 9 to 15 db gain for an all-channel antenna, you can bet this gain was compared to an isotropic source and the actual gain as compared to the dipole reference antenna should be about 7-13db.


Gain is seldom constant over a wide frequency range. In fact, it is seldom constant over even a single 6 mhz TV channel. An antenna with 4 db gain at the video frequency of a TV channel but progressively higher gain up to 9 db at the audio frequency of that channel will produce poor color and improper balance of audio and video. This brings up another characteristic called bandwidth. Since it is linked to gain, however, bandwidth is not called a major characteristic here. Most antennas have adequate bandwidth across any one channel, although gains can vary drastically between far removed channels. What's a good gain for serious DXing? Low band: 6 db average, High band: 12db average, FM: 10db average and UHF: 15-20db average. You cannot directly convert antenna gain into distance over which a particular signal can be received. For example, the 5 element yagi gain is 3 times that of a dipole. But, all things the same, you cannot say that the signal received with a dipole at 50 miles will be the same as with the 5 element yagi at 150 miles. Signal levels diminish by a square law so you need more than triple the dipole antenna gain to overcome losses over a path three times farther.

The characteristic of beamwidth (not to be confused with bandwidth) is the distance in degrees of the main lobe over which the antenna gain is at least 70% of maximum. This is nothing more than a magic number that someone said relates angular distance to useable gain. For example, in Figure 3, the beamwidth of the 5 element yagi is about 40 degrees because the pattern intercepts the 7th circle at about 20 degrees and 340 degrees, which is a 40 degree span. Beamwidth relates antenna directivity because the more directive the main lobe of any antenna, the narrower the beamwidth. A typical log periodic all-channel antenna, for example, with a 90 degree beamwidth at LB will deliver 70% of its maximum voltage when it is rotated 45 degrees either side of the point where maximum signal is received. This rather wide front lobe makes it more difficult to distinguish between signals arriving from nearly the same direction. In itself, the beamwidth tells you nothing about other characteristics except that a very narrow beamwidth implies high gain in most antenna types because most signal pickup ability is concentrated in a long, narrow main lobe. A decent beamwidth for serious DXing is about 40-50 degrees at HB and 50-79 degrees at LB, obtainable with antennas that produce the gains noted previously.

Going on vacation? Forget about taking that portable, pack your best FM tuner along with you, and build this ultra-simple 2-element Yagi for the FM broadcast band



Included below is plans for a fairly portable 2-element yagi for use in the FM broadcast band. It provides 5 dB of gain over a quarter wave groundplane antenna, and can be adjusted for an SWR ratio of better than 1.5:1 (



Parts List:

- 1,2,3,4: 33-inch or longer telescoping replacement antennas (available at Radio Shack)
- 5,7: 24-inch sections of .5x1" (or similar) wood
- 6: 24-inch section of .5x2" (or similar) wood
- 8: length of coax with connector at one end
- + misc hardware (nuts & bolts, etc.)

Instructions:

- 1) First mount the telescoping replacement antennas on parts 5 and 7. Mount them so that the ends meet at the center of each piece of wood and are spaced about 1/2 inch apart.
- 2) Now mount parts 5 and 7 on part 6. I used a pair of bolts for both pieces to keep parts 5 and 7 perpendicular to 6. The ARRL antenna book recommends parts 5 and 7 be separated by about 0.2 wavelengths. I'd use about 24 inches of separation if you're at the low end of the band (88MHZ) and 20 inches of separation if you're at the high end of the band (108MHZ). Shorter separation results in more antenna gain at the sacrifice of a lower feedpoint impeadance.
- 3) Next, strip one end of the coax and solder the ground conductor to the inside end of the telescoping replacement antenna on part 7 and the center conductor to the inside end of the other antenna.
- 4) Finally, short out the two inside ends of the telescoping replacement antennas on part 5 (the reflecting element) by soldering a short length of wire between the inside ends of the two antennas.

This completes construction of the 2-element Yagi. You might also want to buy a length of dowel (1" diameter or larger) to mount the antenna on. I screwed a stud into the dowel on mine and then drilled a hole near the center of part 6 above and used a wing nut to mount the antenna on the dowel. I sharpened one end of the dowel which allows me to stick it into the ground with easy at my transmitting site.

Further refinements:

If size isn't a concern, you can pick up another 2 dB of gain by adding a third directing element. This element should be a few percent shorter than the length of the driven element and spaced the same distance apart from the driven element as the reflecting element is spaced from the driven element. You'll need two more sections of telescoping replacement antennas and be sure to short them out as with the reflecting element.


Note that when mounted horizontally, this antenna gives horizontal wave polarization. This is optimal for listeners with horizontally polarized receiving antennas such as the ubiquitous FM dipole antenna. It will give poorer results for listeners with vertically polarized antennas such as many automobile antennas. If the antenna is vertically mounted, it will give vertical polarization. If you mount it at a 45 degree angle, it will theoretically be cross-polarized. I haven't tried this in practice yet, but if it gives a reasonable SWR, it's probably worth a try.

Tune-up:

First, determine the length of a 1/4 wave section of antenna for the transmitting frequency. Use the following formula:

Now, set both driven elements to the length indicated above. Next, multiply the above length by 1.05 and set both reflecting elements to that length.

An example should make things clearer: If your transmitting frequency is 88.1 Mhz, your length will be 2808/88.1 or 31 7/8 inches. Extend both driven elements until each element is 31 7/8 inches long. Now, multiply 31 7/8 inches by 1.05 to get the length of the reflecting elements. This comes to approximately 33 1/2 inches. Extend both reflecting elements until they are 33 1/2 inches long each. Now, connect the antenna.
