

TRIPPING INTO FALL



A TARDY FAREWELL... Ever wonder why people leave the club? Mike Jeziorski tells you his story: "Hi all!. After an enjoyable five years I'm sorry to let my WTFDA membership lapse, but various circumstances have kept me inactive at the dials for a while. The most recent change was moving from St. Augustine, FL to Oueretaro, MX in March of this year. I now have a research position at a neuroscience institute of UNAM, the largest university in Mexico, where my wife Aurea also works. Struggles with mastering Spanish cause enough trouble for DX, but the primary drawback here is that the mountains of Mexico are not nearly as forgiving as the Atlantic coastline. I was lucky to enjoy the benefits of coastal trop from three directions in St. Augustine, and the relatively uncluttered dial allowed me to get away with primitive equipment (an old stereo receiver with a flimsy dipole hastily thrown up). The St. Augustine log rests with 625 stations heard from 36 states plus DC, 3 provinces, Mexico, Jamaica, PR, DR and Belize. Favorite catches include KPAC-88.2 San Antonio via trop and KYGO-98.5 Denver and Belize-88.9 via skip, as well as KZFM-95.5 Corpus Christi by both modes within a 24 hour period. We talk about one day returning to St. Augustine which I regard as a nearly perfect place to live. If that should come true, or if I finally summon some technical expertise and actually put up an antenna, I'll blow the dust off the logbook and send in my check to start up again. In the meantime, if you have any questions about central Mexican radio or any unIDS I can help you with, don't hesitate to email me here (jeziorski@calli.cnb.unam.mx). Just don't expect very good Spanish, at least not for a while. Best wishes, Mike."

ANTENNA PLANS. A while ago I got a letter in the mail from Alexeis Cruz down in Holguin, Cuba. One of the things Alexeis wanted to know was if I or anyone had plans for an FM yagi antenna he could build. I have decided to show you a drawing he sent me that diagrams his antenna set up. What you are looking at is a basic dipole. Each end is ten meters long. Three hundred ohm lead takes the signal down




to a 300/75 ohm splitter which feeds into his receiver. I would like to ask any of our WTFDAers who are into antenna design to see if they could come up with some simple yagi FM designs that Alexeis would be able to build at home. Mail or email your yagi plans to me and I will either print them in the VUD or mail them myself to Alexeis. Some people just are not as fortunate as those of us who use APS antennas or Probe-9s. By the way, this diagram was drawn by Alexeis and scanned. Thank you in advance for any help you can give.

THE DUDE CHECKS IN! A nice email from Aaron Mitterling: "I just received the August issue of the VUD a couple of days ago. I was very impressed with how many loggings everyone sent in (1 know...some of us are really DX crazed-Mike). During the late part of June and early part of July I was receiving Es into the FM band like crazy! On the fourth of July I had a spectacular opening from mid-Texas into Colorado (Aaron is in Ft. Wayne, IN -Mike). I can remember in the May issue of the VUD you had said for me to keep watching for those "unforgettable" dark lines on the low band VHF channels. Coincidentally, on May 11, after reading that at college, I came home and started scanning around on the TV, knowing Es was around the corner but didn't expect it at the time, and got just that...the first Es of this year! Talk about good timing, huh? (Hey, am I good or what? -Mike) Unfortunately, it was bad timing for me because in a half of an hour or so I had to get around and go to work (work...a necessary evil...-Mike). So what I did was I let the VCR record it while I was gone. You can probably tell I was anxious to get home to see it! During the past few months I have got a lot of loggings but was not able to send them in because they lacked the exact format of the loggings. However, I do have a wealth of video clips of IDs of TV stations I have recorded so far this year. So if you would like, I could send you some pictures to fill the "Photo News" section in the VUD. I will try to send them as soon as I can get everything together. What I plan on doing is plugging a VCR into a computer and use a freeze-frame device. This way I will be able to find the best picture out of each frame." Well, I emailed back a reply to Aaron, but since he sent his email from somebody else's computer, I have no idea if he ever got it. Aaron, if you can get some pictures for Photo News, send them direct to Jeff Kruszka. Write or email Jeff and you guys can work out the details. Help keep Jeff busy in the off season.

BOSTON DTVs. I found this post on the amfmtvdx list from Peter George: "Well, digital TV is growing in Boston. Picked up WFXT-DT on channel 31 this morning. The signal is the typical "different" digital white noise already seen in Boston on WCVB-DT 20 and WHDH-DT 42. WCVB-DT 20 seems to be a part-time operation. Apparently they do not operate past midnight. Well, considering that there are NO reveivers out there...why bother!

AND NOW...THE REST OF THE STORY! Everyone by now should be aware that FM Atlas

#18 is ready and available from Bruce Elving. If you read this column you might remember that Bruce has had some computer problems that delayed the publication of the FM Atlas. Here are some of the gory details from Bruce: "Before I knew how to format this computer, I was chained to an ancient Data General 64K modified with a planer board that I installed in an elegant old IBM ESC Composer. The Data General broke down a little over half way through the process of printing the master copies of the new book. There resulted a three-month delay while information was keyboarded into this system. The old system was not compatible with anything else; a local computer store took disc drive zero that I removed from the old machine plus several control discs to the local university where several experts there could not get it to come on, or to work with any other system. It was believed to be the last operating system from the defunct MIC Technologies on New York City in the world; two others that I had contact with had long since junked their old systems. I had another identical Data General MPT/100 computer that I cannibalized parts from, notably the keyboard. Virtually every key had worn out its sponge rubber




backing, and I had to periodically go into the keyboard and replace the new sponge rubber. So, rather than regret what was lost, I'm glad to have embarked on this newer technology".


THIS MONTH... MORE OF THE CHARLES BURNHAM TEST PATTERN COLLECTION.....



W2XBS was RCA's experimental pioneer in New York City. The NBC flagship station later became WNBT, and is currently WNBC-ty: channel 4.



W6XAO became KHJ-tv and for several years shared operating hours on channel 9 in Los Angeles with KFI-tv. Now it's known as "California 9" KCAL.



The WMAR-tv "Indian Head" pattern has hints (you won't be able to see them) that the Baltimore station may have adapted it for use with rudimentary color test signals.



Not too many miles up the road, WFIL-tv opted for this unique design which incorporated the logo of the station's owner, The Philadelphia Inquirer.



This predates network o&o KNXT (2) as the CBS affiliate in Los Angeles...and like many early television stations KTTV was owned by newspaper interests.

The Hauppauge DTV Card!

For the past few months, WTFDA member Jeff Kadet has been quietly beta-testing a new digital-to-analog conversion card from Hauppauge Digital on Long Island. Somehow Jeff discovered that this new card was available, emailed the company giving them information on his antenna system and noted his status as a long-time amateur radio operator, and asked to be allowed to test a card. A few days later a card was delivered.

The Hauppauge DTV card is a circuit board that is installed in the expansion slot on a computer. Initially Jeff encountered a few problems making the card work with his 166mhz Pentium computer loaded with Windows 95.

and for a few shaky weeks he even wondered if the board would work at all. He found Hauppauge recommends using the card with Windows 98 with a processor of 300mhz or better for best results. With his computer he has to have most applications turned off or the program freezes. This bug probably would not occur with the recommended system. However, the converter card DOES work, and you are seeing the first DTV photos shown in the VUD.

Jeff says "All I can say is that consumers are in for some interesting digital light shows if they are not getting rock solid reception. It is not just random squares, but an endless array of splotches of varying colors and characters an size. If the signal fades the last image received will just stay there

The chip is made by Phillips and the blue screen cannot be defeated in any way, shape or form. The technicians at Hauppauge Computer Works cannot even do it."

More from Jeff about the Blue Screen: "This ruins the card as a serious NTSC DX tool which is a shame because it is about as sensitive as the Zenith or Icom on UHF. Having to put up with the blue screen probably doesn't matter much with DTV because there wouldn't be a decodable picture there anyway. A DTV signal must have both VSB sync lock and VSB Eq lock to present a picture. Days can go by with the VSB sync lock light coming on, but without enough signal to make the Eq lock light come on."




Figure 3 WNDU-DT 42(poor signal)

And more: "Contrary to what I said last time, the card does not automatically decide if a DTV or an NTSC signal is present and then decode it. Rather, you have to program in each channel for either NTSC, DTV or both. What I've done is program NTSC channels 2-69 in memory channels 2-69, and DTV channels 2-69 in memory channels 2-69.

The card is supposed to be released in early October for around \$250 - \$300. It does not have the ability to pick up the proposed sub-HDTV channels that I can see, just the 6mhz wide DTV. The DTV image, when it is solid, looks identical to NTSC quality to me. It is not supposed to deliver a HDTV quality picture as this is only a converter. I'll take a little fuzziness and save \$7,000.

These are the first photos of this type printed in the VUD, thanks to Jeff Kadet. This digital to analog conversion card is developed by Hauppauge Computer Works, a subsidiary of Hauppauge Digital, Hauppauge NY 11799. Hauppauge Digital has a webpage at www.hauppage.com.

Jeff's Observations

More DTV Information

You can use the Hauppauge remote control to turn the Win2k program off and on, mute the audio, decrease and increase the volume, go up and down channels and punch in channels. So, for all intents and purposes my computer monitor is a TV. Convergence is here, now. The card also has S-VHS outputs."

Other observations: "The converted HDTV image is slightly worse than NTSC in my opinion. It may be snowfree, but it looks slightly fluzzier to me. The color is not quite as good as the NTSC either. I don't know why that is. This Philips chip is going to be used in a heck of a lot of set top boxes, I think. Normal humans may not notice either.

As stated previously, the NTSC picture on this card is the best I've ever seen in my life. A graphics quality Sony Trinitron monitor with 6 million colors makes NTSC look awesome and the card makes the interlace lines vanish.




Figure 2 WFLD-DT 32 Chicago

It appears that if a DTV signal is at least S6 on the Icom's S meter (not greatly strong) and there is no visual NTSC CCI, then the signal will decode. NTSC can be there but it has to be visually obliterated by the DTV snow. Also adjacent channel NTSC CCI can kill reception if it is too strong. To get a totally glitch free Dtv signal it must be S8 or greater on the Icom. S4 and S5 will present video which is mostly gibberish. S6 will give a watchable picture which breaks up a lot. S7 will give a watchable picture that occasionally breaks up. If some NTSC video sneaks in, the DTV image will freeze until the NTSC goes away.

I continue to be fascinated by the various digital artifacts that occur with borderline reception. Besides all the bizarre colors and patterns, sometimes people's faces and bodies will appear to "morph". Also the sound can get way out of synch with the images.

By the way, I hate to say it but I think DTV will be a success. I can almost see all this happening by the end of 2006 as scheduled, if the manufacturers-broadcasters get desperate enough and really lower the prices of set top converter boxes.

Thanks to Jeff's beta-testing we now know:

*digital television is Dxable
*what weak digital signals should look like
*the future for digital TVDXing is bright

Forum & Other Stuff

Thanks to Danny Oglethorpe, Jim Ayers, Matt Sittel, Ron Wing, Eric Voytko, Fernando Garcia, Tom Bryant, and Dennis Smith for information appearing elsewhere in this column. I'm afraid most LPTV information had to go again, this time due to lack of space.

Ron forwarded an article from the Wichita Business Journal about new station "WB-33" (KWCV) there. The station is operating temporarily with a tower atop the Garvey Center in downtown Wichita, but is building a new tower near Colwich, Kansas, where the other Wichita-market stations transmit. The article says the tower will be 1100', but one of Ron's co-workers was told it will be more like 1400'. In any case, a good tropo target! - provided you can wait nine months. Tall towers are not built quickly, especially these days with tower crews very busy with DTV (and mobile-telephone) work.

Remember the event a year or so ago when two different FM stations in Asheville, NC both thought they held valid licenses to broadcast on 96.5MHz, and jammed each other for a few days until the FCC stepped in? It almost looks like something similar is happening on channel 25 at Santa Maria, California. Two different stations - K25DX and K25FV - are both authorized to use channel 25 from the same site. What makes this situation different is that both are licensed to the same company... At first, I thought they might be using highly-directional antennas in different directions, but a check of the patterns shows both stations have the same pattern. Tower heights are also identical, and the powers are very close (16.2 vs. 16.7KW).

My guess is that the licensee inadvertently allowed the K25DX permit to expire, and decided to file a new application with the same technical parameters to replace it, and was assigned K25FV. The FCC is slow to delete expired permits from the database (they are sometimes "resurrected" on appeal). On the other hand... Dennis Smith says the station had in the past been IDing as K25FV, but recently changed to K25DX. He also says that co-owned K38DK Santa Barbara was IDing as K38DX while testing, but has now switched to the correct calls. Both stations, along with K44DT Simi Valley, are translators of KJLA [57] Ventura.

Finally, Dennis relays a request from Fred McCormack, former editor of Western TV-DX. Fred is working on a historical database of past TV stations. I'm sending him some information I have from 1966, but I suspect other years would be much appreciated. You can write Fred at Box 65666, St. Paul MN 55165-0666.


W63CO is, for the time being, a true DXers' friend, airing a continuous legal ID. It's not very high-tech though. Eric Voytko noted the station on tropo on 3 September. Someone had written "W63CO Philadelphia" on a big board, placed it on the edge of someone's balcony, and taped it on a camcorder. They then put the tape in continuous loop mode, playing the ID, complete with the tape counter and remaining time indicator. When the tape runs out, it rewinds (on the air) and starts over. At least it's easy to identify!

Tom forwarded an item about new stations KXND and KNDX in North Dakota. The item also mentions stations being built in Dickinson and Williston, but I have no records of such stations - not even any applications for LPTVs.

Some areas of the north have already had some pretty good tropo - here's hoping it's in where you are!

Another very short column. There just isn't a great deal happening lately. As reported last column as a probability, The Prime Time 24 West Coast feeds on Spacenet 4 - KNBC, KOMO and KPIX - were dropped. It is now fack that The Military Channel which had moved to Galaxy 7 is no more and will probably never reappear. DX has been great here, with skip great into early July. The last day of skip was July 7 with WSCI *89.3 and WRJA *88.1 Sumter both heard in the morning, WLPT *88.3 Jesup GA in stereo, and WCQS *88.1 Asheville NC, along with its SCS radio reading service.

Tropo July 22 brought in KLND *89.5 Little Eagle SD, KMNE-FM *90.3 Bassett NE, and the best one, WNFA *88.3 Port Huron MI. Also heard Detroit on several frequencies, notably 97.1, which I note still has stereo, despite their calling selves "FM Talk." The stereo was music, or at least theme music between talk featurettes.

WNXR 107.3 Iron River WI was off the air for about a week, and I received KIOW Forest City IA, KNUJ-FM Sleepy Eye MN and vestiges of Lexington MO. Aug. 27 in the morning tropo was outstanding, smashing through most local frequencies without phasing. Thus KLQP 92.1 Madison MN through nearer stations, such as WWAX 92.1 Hermantown MN, KPHR 106.3 Ortonville MN, and K215CD *90.9 Windom MN with AFR programming, stereo. The record fell for the first time with the logging of WCML 91.7 (besting the previous record, set in 1998, by 45 miles/72 km). Within 11 hours the record fell again! WDCX 99.5 bested WCML by 105 miles (169 km)! WDCX is also the first New Yorker heard via trop! My Michigan totals were fattened up on this opening, along with my Wisconsin totals (hi Doug!). First, some activity at Wasco, overlooked from last time. I did a little DXing in Wasco July 9-10. July 9 night saw some tropo from such as these, by channel:

15: CCI under local K15CO Porterville (40 mi), most likely from K15ET Merced/Fresno (KFTL-64 Stockton translator). ~150 mi.

16: A new Ch. 16 station, Mas Musica TeVe (Spanish music videos), possibly K16CW Hanford, apx 65 mi. Not sure if up & down w/varying tr conditions or on & off with xmtr adjustments.

KUVS Modesto (Uni, Spanish), poorly ~175 mi.
 CCI under local K40DQ Tulare (KMPH-26
 Visalia xltr, 80 mi), most likely KTXL Sacramento,
 15 mi

42: K42DT (TBN) Coalinga, regular at ~75 mi. This far-reaching signal may have a regular radius of 90+ miles. See below.

48: The usual regular herringbone btw KJEO-47 Fresno & KNXT-49 Visalia, possibly K48DY Coalinga, ~75 mi. See more below.

51: KNSO "WB51" Merced/Fresno, very good at ~150 mi.

56: K56DX (TBN) Fresno, not a regular, fair-good, ~100 mi.

Then, the next morning, July 10, a little tr from KOVR-13 (CBS) Stockton/Sacramento (215 mi), and somewhat later on car FM from KVIE-6 Sacramento (PBS) at ~190 mi. While on road, checked LPTVs at 20 mi from Coalinga: K42DT snowfree, K48DY (Shop at Home) relatively weak & hampered by strong KJEO-47 & KNXT-49. No sign of K16CW while driving in Hanford area. Back in Wasco that night, more Spanish videos on Ch. 16. Will keep checking when I am in the area.

The remainder of this report is for August 1999, all from Santa BArbara. Here are the tropo conditions in coastal southern CA as observed on TV and FM, along to San Diego/Tijuana, up to 200 mi/315 km. There was cool moise "marine layer" with warmer dry air above all through the month, but the boundary between them varied in intensity perhaps because of extreme temperature changes.

Aug 1-4: Variably poor (continued from July 29)
Aug 5 am: Very poor, deteriorating (only warm inland)

Aug 5 eve - 8am None Aug 8 eve - 15: Very Poor

Aug 16: Poor

Aug 17-22: Fair (Aug 19-22 VHF good)(hot inland) Aug 23-28: Variably fair-good (VHF-UHF)

Aug 29-30: Poor (some cooling down to warm inland

Aug 31: Very poor

As mentioned before, Ch. 19, apparently Santa Barbara, was first seen November 5, 1998 with Mas Musica TeVe (Spanish mx videos), rather weak signal, and changing to color bars March 25, 1999. On August 11, 1999, Ch. 19 was off, and in its place was Ch. 41, with Mas Musica TeVe, still just as weak.

On Aug 19 eve, herringbone was again noted (as it has been infrequently, apparently from tropo, since Oct 17, 1997) on local KWHY-LP 65, indicating a ch-64 aural signal, but as usual, no sound and no vidual signals. Still a mystery.

Starting Aug 17, a new Ch 3 station was seen on tropo, as offset CCI behind local KEYT-3, and most times in late August. KEYT is on 24 hours except early Sat-Sun, so on Sat, Aug 28, turned on TV at 0520 PDT (indoor whip ant) and saw Ch. 3, fair signal, Spanish, apx 0527 Mex nat'l anthem, apx 0529, ID as "ONCE TV" ("eleven television") (no locations given) and upcoming pgm sched in PDT. 0530, a children's program. If this a Mexico City-based network, it apparently has a Pacific-Time feed, unlike other Mex networks I've seen with only one nationwide feed. Perhaps Tijuana xmtr, but don't know for sure. This could be a new Es target for some, pending further info re: location, etc.

Western TV DX Jeff Kadet's report concludes

The Blue Screen cannot be defeated in any way, shape, or form. Hauppauge cannot even do it. The 25 people in the world who probably care about this are greatly disappointed. This ruins the card as a serious NTSC DX tool which is a shame because it is about as sensitive as the Zenith and Icom on UHF. There is a black screen instead of a blue screen on DTV. The last image just freezes there.

A DTV signal must have both VSB sync lock and VSB Eq lock to present a picture. Days can go by with the VSB sync lock light coming on but without enough signal to make the Eq lock light come on. Sometimes if both lights come on there will still not be an image because the signal is strong enough.

I am fascinated by the various digital artifacts that occur with borderline reception. Besides all the bizarre colors and patterns, sometimes people's faces and bodies will appear to "morph". Also the sound car get way out of synch with the images. Whoever said that you get either a perfect picture or nothing is wrong. You also get every combination in between.

My system care BARELY handle the card. All other applications must be off or it will freeze up. I use a Pentium II, 166 MHz, 32 MB RAM, and Windows 95 It took a lot of time from tech support to get this up and running properly.

Those ch.31 Lumberton and ch.39 Wilmington, NC loggings were hurricane related. The southern edge of the hurricane was just a few miles n of the NC/SC border. There was a little crevice in the hurricane that went from Lumberton to Wilmington that carried the sig. It's always nice to get stations on the Atlantic coast by tropo!

WMBD-31 is off again this am so I made more DTV vs. NTSC observations:

When WFLD-DT is at S7 on the Icom, WFLD-32 is 20db o/S9. Coverage is about the same +/-

WFLD-32 is being severely CCIed by Waterloo so mostly the dreaded blue screen appears (the blue screen is not necessarily related to weak signals, it will also appear if there is too much CCI -what a yucky feature). WFLD-DT, on the other hand, is presenting a perfect picture with minor digital garbage.

To get a totally glitch free pic the DTV signal it must be S8 or higher on the Icom. S4 & 5 will present video which is mostly gibberish. S6 will give a watchable pic which breaks up a lot. S7 will give a watchable picture that occasionally breaks up.

There was no visible NTSC signal on ch.31's digital snow. If there had been then there would have been no WFLD-DT reception at all.

BTW, I hate to say it but I think DTV will be a success. I can almost see all this happening by the end of 2006, as scheduled, if the manufacturers-broadcasters get desperate enough and really lower the prices of set top converter boxes.

New WAOE-59 Peoria is going onto their 6th (?) week running a CB TP w/ ID 24 hours a day. They might have 2 hours of programming a night and that's it. On the other hand, new KWKB-20 lowa City came on the air testing and was on RS all within 4 days.

KWCV-33 on 5/9/99 was not them as they weren't on the air yet. I saw religion with an 800 and a 316 area code on the screen. 316 covers Wichita... Maybe it was KSPR. KWCV has been logged since however. 73, Jeff

More on the Win2K card:

You can use the infrared remote that comes with the Win2K NTSC-DTV card to turn the program off and on, mute the audio, decrease and increase the volume, go up and down channels, and punch in channels. So for all intents and purposes my computer monitor IS a TV. Convergence is here, now. The card also has a S-VHS output, and complete Dolby Surround Sound. 4000 of the cards are supposed to be released in Seot

The converted HDTV image is not as sharp as NTSC. The best way to describe the converted DTV pic is that it looks "smooth". There are no interlace lines. Whites look really white. The picture looks clean. But the converted DTV image is NOT as good as NTSC on a Grade A signal with no ghosting. The digital audio sounds good but I notice no difference between it and analog. When signals are borderline the DTV audio gets out of synch with the video.

.As stated previously, the NTSC picture on this card is the best I've seen in my life. A graphics quality Sony Trinitron monitor makes NTSC look awesome and the card makes the interlace lines vanish.

It appears that if a DTV signal is at least S6 on the Icom's S meter (not greatly strong) and there is no visual NTSC CCI that the signal will decode. NTSC can be there but it has to be visually obliterated by the DTV snow. Also adjacent channel NTSC interference can kill reception if it is too strong. If some NTSC video sneaks in the DTV image will freeze until the NTSC goes away.

The big question is: how much lower does one DTV signal have to be compared to another on the same channel to decode? The worse case scenario sounds bad; the best case scenario sounds bad, too. Super directional ants. will become more necessary than ever.


